The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Melyn's first attempt at colonization ended in 1649. He then returned to the Netherlands in Europe, and there formed a partnership with the Hon. Hendrick van der Capellen in a second undertaking to take emigrants from the Netherlands to develop a settlement upon Staten Island.

Among these emigrants were Barent Driessen, his wife, Aeltie, and their infant son, Jan Barentsen, who came directly from Oostenengh, an estate near Ahmen, a few miles north of Zutphen, a town or fortress on the Yssel River in the province of Gelderland, Holland. They were members of Melyn's "people" as he described them, and are in the list of persons sent by Van der Capellen. They came with Patroon Melyn in the ship *New Netherland Fortune*, to renew the settlement of Staten Island, where that vessel arrived on December 19, 1650.

Barent Janszen Van Driessen and his wife were murdered in an Indian attack on Staten Island in Sep 1655. Their young boy, Jan Barentsen, survived the massacre. His name appears in a list of survivors reported at Zuphen on the 14/4 November 1657 by the wife of Captain Adriaen Post and by the farmer Jan Aerentsen van Heerde: *Noch een Jonge van Berent Driessen van Oostenengh woont op t'lange Eylant by een Bouman* [translation]: Also a boy of Berent Driessen from Oostenengh lives on Long-Island with a farmer.

The farmer of Gravesend, Long Island, into whose care Barent and Aeltie Driessen's young son, Jan Barentsen, entered soon after the murders on Staten Island was Lourens (sometimes written "Lauris") Jansen. He was not one of those driven from Staten Island across the harbor to Long Island. He was a prominent Dutch citizen of Gravesend who, five weeks after the affairs on Staten Island, signed, with Anthony Jansen van Salee, the letter to Peter Stuyvesant on behalf of the inhabitants of Gravesend appealing for protection against the Indians, which letter reveals that Jan Barentsen escaped one calamity, only to be menaced by another.

In November, 1655, Lourens Jansen was appointed a joint guardian of both the boy, Jan Barentsen, and the boy's inheritance, by the Surrogate Court under the Dutch,

Barent's father, Jan Barentsen, died intestate; as eldest son, Barent Johnson, became administrator of the undistributed estate on February 28, 1706/7, over eight years after the death of his father. The part so remaining for distribution probably was personal property, as the real estate had been sold by the widow and her eldest son, Barent, the heir. During that period, 1697-1706, William's mother, Jannetie (van Borculo) Barentsen, received the portion of the estate allowed her by law. She sold a part of it and then married, secondly, on December 15, 1699, Elias Hubbard, to whom she conveyed by a recorded deed her remaining portion of the real estate. Under the English law of the province of New York, the remainder of the real estate fell in 1697 to her eldest son, Barent Johnson. To his brothers, Jan and William, and to his sister Margarietje (sister Cornelia perhaps being dead), was left for division only their shares of the two-thirds of the personal estate, the inventory of which is not now of record in the office of the surrogate of the county of New York, filed papers in that office having been allowed to disappear. Thus the estate was practically settled before the younger children, William, Margarietje, and perhaps Jan and Cornelia, if she was alive in 1706, became twenty-one years of age. Doubtless they lived until married or of age with their mother and stepfather, Elias Hubbard, on the estate that had been their father's. This seems particularly clear because their eldest brother, Barent, long before they became of age, sold all of his inheritance in land (being the entire two-thirds) to his stepfather, Elias Hubbard, on January 4, 1703. Barent was then twenty-two years old, Margarietje eight years old, and their brother, William Johnson, between ten and thirteen years old. The eldest son, Barent, is the only one of the five children whose name appears in connection with the land that had been their father's, the others having no claim to it under the law. Barent could and did sell it without their signatures being added to his conveyance. This conveyance, recorded in Kings County Conveyances, III, 188, put into the hands of Elias Hubbard, the last remainder of the real estate of which Jan Barentsen (van Zutphen) died possessed, viz. (abstract): Barne Janse of Gravesend, yeoman, for £130, sells to Elias Hubbard, lot number 11, of twelve acres in Gravesend in the neck; also lot number 34 at Hugh Garrisons, called the point in Gravesend; also meadow adjoining thereto number 27, all formerly in the tenure and occupation of my father, John Barentson, deceased; dated 4 January 1703. (Signed) Barne Jansen. John [J.L.] Lake (his mark). Jochem Gulick.

Barent Johnson, (1740-82), was commissioned captain of King's county militia and was at the battle of Long Island. He was taken prisoner in the Jersey campaign and died from the effects of the confinement. He was born in Brooklyn, N. Y., where he died.

3 Dec 1779 Barent Johnson quit claim-- Know all men by these presents that I, Barent Johnson of the township of Brooklyn in Kings County in the province of New York do hereby confess and acknowledge that I have received of William Johnson and Johannes Lott both of Kings County aforesaid, two of the executors of the last will and testament of my father, John Johnson of the township of Jamaica in Queens County in the province aforesaid, deceased, the sum of seven hundred and thirty pounds current money of New York. Being in full for the legacies given unto me in and by the last will and testament of my said father John Johnson. And also in full for the one fourth part of the legacies given unto my brother Johannes Johnson and my sisters Catalina and Catherine all deceased, in and by the said last will and testament. And I do by these presents forever acquit release and fully discharge the said William Johnson and Johannes Lott, their heirs executors and administrators and every of them of and from the same and all legacies debts duties and demands whatsoever which I, my heirs executors or administrators may have claim challenge or demand of or against the said William Johnson and Johannes Lott, their heirs executors or administrators by virtue of the last will and testament of the said John Johnson, or out of the estate of the said John Johnson, deceased. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventynine. Sealed and delivered. Barent Johnson in the presence of Johannes Lott Jr., Christopher Lott.

Jeremias Remsen, in his will dated 26 Sep 1776, made his wife his heir, and after her death or remarriage, left his real estate to Barent Johnson, who was to pay certain legacies to the brothers and sisters (or to their children) of said Jeremias Remsen. He also mentioned "...the eldest son of said Barrent, to wit: Jeremias Johnson...[and] the three youngest children of said Barrent, to wit: John, Jeromis, and Catelina."

In his will, he wrote, October 2, 1782, Barent Johnson, farmer, Wallabout, Township of Brooklyn, Kings County, New York, to my wife Anne, the dwelling house I now live in, my whole estate, real and personal, lying in and being in the Wallabout, Township of Brooklyn, to be her use and benefit, she supporting and giving education to my children during her natural life or remarriage; in case my wife remarries, I give her £400; the one half of this sum is a legacy given to her by her deceased father's last will and testament; Also one negro wench, named Nan, one silver teapot, six silver tablespoons, one set best china, one cupboard, one chest, one brown dining table, and six chairs to be in lieu of her dower; to my eldest son, Jeremiah, and his heirs, my silver tankard, fowling piece, one riding horse, saddle and bridle for his birthright; to my son John, one Dutch Bible, one riding horse, saddle and bridle; to my son, Jeromus, one English Bible, one riding horse, saddle and bridle; to my son Martin, one English Bible, one riding horse saddle, and bridle; to all my children, namely, Jeremiah, John, Jeromus, Martin, and Cathalina, and their heirs, £300, to be paid to them and each of them when he arrives at legal age. Out of my personal estate, I authorize my executors to sell all my real estate lying in the Township of Bushwick, Kings County, at public or private sale, six weeks after my decease; and the moneys so arising to be equally divided among all my children, Jeremiah, John, Jeromus, Martin, and Cathalina, and their heirs, as they shall arrive at legal age after the death or remarriage of my wife. I direct my executors to sell or convey all the remaining part of my estate, real and personal, lying in Wallabout, Township of Brooklyn, or elsewhere, at public or private sale, six weeks after the death of my wife or her remarriage, and the moneys so arising to be equally divided among my five children when they shall arrive at the legal age, share and share alike. If any of my children should die before they arrive at legal age, and without lawful issue, that share of the one dying shall be divided equally among the surviving children or their heirs, share and share alike; my executors to sell my negro man Jacob, in case he be disobedient to my wife. I appoint my brother, Martin Johnson; my brother-in-law, Jeremiah Remsen, and Rem A. Remsen, Executors. Witnesses, Albertus Van De Water, Mary Murray, John Van der Voort, schoolmaster. Proved, July 6, 1786.

22 Jan 1664 --Elias Janzen appearing declares, that there was a pound of candles in the mill, which was missed, and that Jan de Witt would have it that he took them; whereupon he gave him for answer, that it was not true and that perhaps a dog had been in the mill and eaten them; saying he must not lay them to his charge, for perhaps he was as honest as he. After which the abovenamed de Witt came behind, where he sat on this mill stone and struck him, so that the blood followed; and that this was seen by no other person than by Jan Teunisen.¹

Jan Teunisen, pltf. v/s Jan de Witt, miller, deft. Pltf. says, that he had contracted to make a vault in the bay, for which he had been paid and was hard pressed to finish it--that deft. would not allow him his journeyman, though he offered him a man in his place. Deft says, he could not agree to that as he did not want another in the mill. And whereas parties cannot agree herein with each other, it was therefore proposed, if it were not better, that Jan de Witt should keep the mill alone a month more or less, on condition of paying his partner a certain sum for his share for the time he keeps it to himself, which they both agree to; And whereas they cannot agree with each other on what the abovenamed de Witt should give for the time he alone had the mill, Burgomasters and Schepens decree, that each shall choose a man to reconcile them therein, to which they have no objection and Jan de Witt on his side therefore chose as referee Burgomaster Paulus Leendersen van der Grift, and Jan Teunisen Schepen Jacob Backer, who have accepted it.¹

Jan Teunisen returning, the declaration of Elias Jansen hereinbefore written, was read to him and he is asked if it were true? Answers, Yes and that he should not like to get such a blow and he made his nose bleed with the blow.¹

Footnote: Jan de Witt and Jan Teunisen from Leerdam were partners and owned the windmill, which was situated in the present City Hall Park "on the line of the Great Highway," now Broadway. They dissolved partnership, De Witt retiring the following May. --O'C.¹

The appearer acknowledges in the presence of the undersigned witnesses that he was fully paid and satisfied in regard to the aforesaid account before the execution hereof, wherefore, whenever the honorable directors shall have paid and satisfied the aforesaid sum to Fredrick Jansz above named, he releases them from all further demands by himself, his heirs, or successors. In witness whereof this is signed by the appearer and the witnesses hereto invited. Done the 10th of March 1645, in Fort Amsterdam in New Netherland. This is the X mark of Willem Smith, made by himself. This is the P mark of Robbert Onferre [Robert Humphrey], made by himself. Willem de Key, witness. The ship *Princes Amelia*, traveling from New Netherlands to the Netherlands sank off the coast of Wales 27 Sep 1647. Among those who drowned were Frederick Jansz from Flensburgh and his wife, Metgen Barents.¹

27 January 1653 (not. H. Schaef, 1303/12v) Jan Hendrixs, age 60, chestmaker and his wife Aeltje Hansen, age 40, and Marytgen Simonsdr, age 58, widow of Gilbert Jansz from Swol declare at the request of Tietgen Pietersdr who has been the housewife of Willem Barendsz from Freebergh (Fredericksberg in Denmark?) now housewife of Gerrit Jansz bargemaster, that they knew well the persons of Frederik Jansz from Flensburgh and his wife Metje Barents and know they have both, the one after the other, voyaged to New Netherland. In 1647 both perished with the sinking of the Prinses. Note: Willem Barentsz, from Heusten, shoemaker, age 25, married in Amsterdam on 2 July 1622 Tietje Pieters, age 20 (DTB 427/185).

To my brother, William Johnson, £3, and one suit of my wearing apparell, my brother to have his first choice of my wearing apparell. To my loving cousins, Jacobus Petersen and John Geatman, all the rest of my wearing apparell. To my cousin, Cornelius Fonaston [Van Oosten, child of Cornelia's brother, Jacob Corneliszen], £25, and a silver spoon and my walking cane. To my cousin, Frederick Fonaston [Van Oosten, child of Cornelia's brother, Jacob Corneliszen], £28. To my cousin Margaret [(daughter of his first wife's brother Jacob Corneliszen), wife of Michael Dunning of Goshen, £25, and a silver spoon. To my cousin, Lynah Warterbee [this was Josyntie the daughter of his first wife's brother, Jacob Corneliszen], wife of William Warterbee, £25, and a silver spoon. I also give to my 2 said cousins, 3 pewter plates, that did belong to me, in the life time of my former wife. I leave to my friend, Mary Badle, daughter of Thomas Badle and Mary Badle, deceased [Harmen and his wife Cornelis were god-parents to one of their other children, Harmen Begel on 30 March 1714], £20, and a silver spoon and my best cupboard. To my friend, Cornelia Langdon, wife of William Langdon, and daughter of Thomas Badle and Mary his wife, now deceased, £20. To my friend whose maiden name was Abigail Forbes, daughter of William Forbes, of whom I am God father, £2 10s. To my friend whose maiden name was Mary Albertus, daughter of Arthur Albertus, of whom I am God father, £2 10s. To Mary Foster, daughter of John Foster of Flushing [John Foster was the second husband of Harmen's first Wife's brother Jacob Corneliszen and Mary was their daughter baptized in 1708], £25. I give to any person for whom I stood as God father, and are related to me by blood, or to my former wife, or my present wife, the sum of £5; That is, whose names are entered in the Church book kept by the Dutch Church in Kings County, or Queens County. I leave to my cousin Cornelia, wife of Frederick Fonaston, one silver spoon. I leave to my wife, Liber Johnson, my best bed, and my best horse and saddle and bridle, and my case of drawers and my silver Tankard and £500, or the use of my homestead with houses, barns, and orchards, and also my lot of meadow lying in the farther east neck in the Town of Jamaica, during her life, and £300. If she demands her right of Dower she shall not have the sum I have given to her. My executors may sell all the rest of my personal estate, and from the proceeds they are to pay 1/2 to the children of Leffert Peterson, of Flatbush, deceased, and the children of Peter Hoogwert of Staten Island, deceased; The other 1/2 to the children of my sister-in-law Margaret Geatman. If my wife should relinquish all claim then my executors are to sell all lands, meadows, and rights of commonage to the best advantage, and out of the money they are to pay 1/2 to the children of Leffert Peterson and 1/2 to the children of Peter Hoogwert. I make my friends, Henry Hendrick, yeoman, Henry Harrison, cordwainer, both of Flatbush, and my loving cousin, Peter Lefferts, of Flatbush, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Montanye, Richard Everett. Codicil, April 28, 1746. Whereas I have left £40 to my sister, Margaret Geatman, deceased, I order that the said £40 be divided among the children of Leffert Peterson, and the children of Peter Hoogwert, and the children of Jacob Peterson, my brother in law, and the children of my sister, Margaret Geatman. Witnesses, John Eldert, Jacob Boerum, Richard Smith. Proved, October 4, 1746.

In her will, she wrote: ...January 7, 1747/8. I, Liber Johnson, of Hempstead, in Queens County, Gentlewoman, being in good health. "I commit my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christianlike and decent manner," and all debts and charges to

be paid. I leave to my cousin [nephew], Michael De Mott, son of my brother, Martine De Mott, £5. To my cousin [niece], Ann De Mott, daughter of my said brother, £5. To my brother, Anthony De Mott, £12. To my cousins (nieces), Altie Van Nostrand and Elsie Van Nostrand, grand daughters of my brother, Anthony De Mott, £50 between them. To my cousin (nieces), Allactie Remsen, wife of Rem Remsen, £40. To my cousins (nieces), Mary, John, and Anthony Remsen, children of my cousin (nieces), Rem Remsen, and Allactie his wife, £60. To my cousins (grand nephews), John and Anthony De Mott, grand sons of my brother, Anthony De Mott, each £5. To my cousin, Elizabeth Oakce [Oakes?], daughter of Abraham Oakce and Ann his wife, deceased, £50 and my gold buttons. Herschel Vespasian Johnson was a Senator from Georgia; born near Farmer's Bridge, Burke County, Ga., September 18, 1812; attended private schools and Monaghan Academy near Warrenton; graduated from the University of Georgia at Athens in 1834; studied law; admitted to the bar in 1834 and commenced practice; moved to a plantation, "Sandy Grove," in Jefferson County in 1839 and practiced law in Louisville; unsuccessful Democratic candidate in 1843 for election to fill a vacancy in the Twenty-eighth Congress; presidential elector on the Democratic ticket 1844; moved to Milledgeville, Ga., in 1844 and continued the practice of law; unsuccessful candidate for nomination as Governor in 1847; appointed as a Democrat to the United States Senate to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Walter T. Colquitt and served from February 4, 1848, to March 3, 1849; was not a candidate for election to fill this vacancy; chairman, Committee on the District of Columbia (Thirtieth Congress); judge of the superior court of the Ocmulgee circuit 1849-1853; presidential elector on the Democratic ticket 1852; Governor of Georgia 1853-1857; returned to his plantation near Louisville, Jefferson County, in 1857; unsuccessful candidate for Vice President of the United States on the Douglas Democratic ticket in 1860; delegate to the State secession convention at Milledgeville in 1861; a Senator from Georgia in the Second Confederate Congress 1862-1865; president of the State constitutional convention in 1865; presented credentials in 1866 as a Senator-elect to the United States Senate but was not permitted to qualify; resumed the practice of law in Louisville; appointed judge of the middle circuit of Georgia in 1873 and served until his death on his plantation near Louisville, Ga., August 16, 1880; interment in the Old Louisville Cemetery. |Bibliography: American National Biography; Dictionary of American Biography; Flippin, Percy. Jan's parents, Barent Janszen Van Driessen and his wife Aeltje were murdered in an Indian attack on Staten Island in Sep 1655. Their young son, Jan Barentsen, survived the massacre. His name appears in a list of survivors reported at Zuphen on the 14/4 November 1657 by the wife of Captain Adriaen Post and by the farmer Jan Aerentsen van Heerde: Noch een Jonge van Berent Driessen van Oostenengh woont op t'lange Eylant by een Bouman [translation]: Also a boy of Berent Driessen

from Oostenengh lives on Long-Island with a farmer.

The farmer of Gravesend, Long Island, into whose care Barent and Aeltie Driessen's young son, Jan Barentsen, entered soon after the murders on Staten Island was Lourens (sometimes written "Lauris") Jansen. He was not one of those driven from Staten Island across the harbor to Long Island. He was a prominent Dutch citizen of Gravesend who, five weeks after the affairs on Staten Island, signed, with Anthony Jansen van Salee, the letter to Peter Stuyvesant on behalf of the inhabitants of Gravesend appealing for protection against the Indians, which letter reveals that Jan Barentsen escaped one calamity, only to be menaced by another.

In November, 1655, Lourens Jansen and Jan Eversen Bout appointed a joint guardian of both the boy, Jan Barentsen, and the boy's inheritance, by the Surrogate Court under the Dutch (Minutes of the Orphan Masters of New Amsterdam, 1655-1663).

On March 2, 1674, Jan Barentsen purchased, for 820 guilders, of Thomas Morgen and Nicholas Stilwell of Gravesend, land, house, barn, garden, and orchard, property No. 11, in Gravesend. [Gravesend Deeds, Leases, V, 9.] At this time he was unmarried and residing at Flatlands near by, as his name in this deed is written, in the English form, "John Barnes of Amesforde," but he signed the deed "Jan brnsen." Five weeks later, on April 9, 1674, as "John Barnes of Gravesend" (as written by the conveyancer), he bought more land at Gravesend, and he signed this deed in semi-English style, "Jan barnes."

On May 19, 1681, as "John Barnes of Gravesend" he sold to John Carsonsson share No. 30 on Gisbert's Island, and signed the deed "Jan barnsen." On May 15, 1684, he, as "John barentsen," and "Martten Pettersen" (Wyckoff)--John's son, William Jansen (Johnson), and Martten's daughter, Jannetje Wyckoff, respectively, later married--as freeholders of Gravesend signed the authorization for three others to settle the dispute between the towns of Gravesend and Flatlands. [Gravesend Town Meeting Records, III, 60.]

In the record of their banns, they were: Jan Barentsz van Driest, young man from Zutphen in Gelderland, residing at Gravesend, with Jannetje Willems Van Borkeloo, young lady born in N. York, residing at Amersfort; and married the 18th May at Amersfort, with certificate from Gravesend.

Jan Barents, of Kings County, died intestate, Letters of administration were granted to his eldest son, Barent Johnson. February 28, 1706/7

(signed) Barne Jansen. John J.L. Lake (his mark), Jochem Gulick.

At the time of their marriage, Roeloff Janssoon was a seaman, aged 21 years, having no parents (to grant parental permission), assisted by Jan Gerritsz., his nephew, residing three and a half years at the St. Tunis gate. Anna Jans was recorded as born in Vleckere, Norway (Flekkeroy, on the island of the same name, Vest Agder, Norway) aged 18 years, assisted by Trijn Roeloffs, her mother.¹

Roelof Jansen was among the first immigrants to New Amsterdam and in 1630 was commissioned to farm land in the new colony of Rensselaerswyck for \$72 a year. Roelof and Anneke, together with their two children, a party of colonists and probably Anneke's mother and sister, set sail on 21 March 1630 from The Texel for New Amsterdam aboard the ship *Eendracht*, arriving on 24 May 1630.¹

In 1636 Roelof was granted thirty-one morgens (62 acres) of land (later confirmed to the widow of Domine Bogardus in her own name, as Anneke Jans, on 4 July 1654), described as a line drawn near the north side of today's Warren Street on the south; and Canal Street, or perhaps Desbrosses Street, on the north; on the west by the Hudson River; and on the east by a series of irregular lines west of Broadway. This presently includes parts of the modern neighborhoods of Greenwich Village, Soho, and Tribeca in New York City.¹

Roelof Jansen died shortly after his arrival in New Amsterdam, and in March 1638 Anneke Jans, then a widow, married Domine (Reverend) **Everardus Bogardus**.¹

Anneke Jans had a sister named Marritje who m. 1) Tyman Jansen, 2) Dirk Corneliszen Van Wensveen, 3) Govert Loockermans.¹ On an unknown date, but probably dated between 10 and 14 Aug 1647 if documents are in chronological order (as they seem to be), "This day, date underwritten, before me, Cornelis van Tienhoven, secretary of New Netherland, appeared Dirck Cornelissen from Wensveen, as husband and guardian of Marritjen Jans, daughter of Tryn Jonas from Masterland, in her lifetime midwife here in New Netherland, and in said capacity as heir of the above named Tryn Jonas he, the ap-pearer, declared that he appoints and empowers, as he does hereby, Everardus Bogardus, minister..." to collect salary due to Tryn Jonas from the West India Company.²

In her will, she wrote: In the name of the Lord, Amen. Know all men by these presents, That this day, the 29th of January, 1663, in the after noon, about four o'clock, appeared before me, Derrick Van Schelluyne, notary public, in the presence of the witnesses hereafter mentioned, Anneke Janse, widow of Roeloff Janse, of Master Land, and now lastly widow of the Reverend Everhardus Bogardus, residing in the village of Beverwyck, and well known to us, notary and witnesses; the said Anneke Janse lying on her bed in a state of sickness, but perfectly sensible and in the full possession of her mental powers, and capable to testate, to which sound state of mind we can fully testify. The said Anneke Janse considering the shortness of life and certainty of death and the uncertainty of the hour or time, she, the said Anneke Janse, declared after due consideration, without any persuasion, compulsion, or retraction, this present document to be her last will and testament, in manner following: First of all recommending her immortal soul to the Almighty God, her Creator and Redeemer, and consigning her body to Christian burial, and herewith revoking and annulling all prior testamentary dispositions of any kind whatsoever, and now proceeding anew, she declared to nominate and institute as her sole and universal heirs her children, Sarah Roeloffson, wife of Hans Kierstede; Catrina Roeloffsen, wife of Johan Van Brugh; also Jannettje and Rachel Hartgers, the children of her

deceased daughter, Fytje Roeloffs, during her life the wife of Peter Hartgers, representing together their mother's place; also her son Jan Roeloffs, and finally, William, Cornelius, Jonas, and Peter Bogardus, and to them to bequeath all her real estate, chattels, money, gold and silver, coined and uncoined, jewels, clothes, linnen, woolen, household furniture, and all property what soever, without reserve or restriction of any kind, to be disposed of after her decease and divided by them in equal shares, to do with the same at their own will and pleasure without any hindrance whatsoever; provided never the less with this express condition and restriction that her four first born children shall divide between them out of their father's property the sum of one thousand guilders, to be paid to them out of the proceeds of a certain farm, situate on Manhattan Island, bounded on the North river, and that before any other dividend takes place; and as three of these children at the time of their marriage received certain donations, and as Jan Roeloffs is yet unmarried, he is to receive a bed and milch cow; and to Jonas and Peter Bogardus she gives a house and lot situated to the westward of the house of the testatrix in the village of Beverwyck, going in length until the end of a bleaching spot, and in breadth up to the room of her, the testatrix, house, besides a bed for both of them and a milch cow to each of them, the above to be an equivalent of what the married children have received. Finally, she, the testatrix, gives to Roeloff Kierstede, the child of her daughter Sara, a silver mug; to Annatje Van Brugh, the child of her daughter Catrina, also a silver mug; and to Jannetje and Rachel Hartgers, the children of her daughter Fytje, a silver mug each; and to the child of William Bogardus named Fytje also a silver mug; all the above donations to be provided for out of the first moneys received, and afterwards the remainder of the property to be divided and shared as aforesaid. The testatrix declares this document to be her only true last will and testament, and desiring that after her decease it may supersede all other testaments, codicils, donations, or any other instruments whatsoever; and in case any formalities may have been omitted, it is her will and desire the same benefits may occur as if they actually had been observed; and she requested me, notary public, to make one or more lawful instruments in the usual form of this, her, testatrix, last will and desire. Signed, sealed, and delivered at the house of the testatrix in the village of Beverwyck, in New Netherland, in the presence of Ruth Jacobse Van Schoonderweert and Evert Wendell, witnesses. This the X mark of Anneke Janse with her own hand. Rutger Jacobus, Evert Jacobus Wendell. D. V. Schelluyne, Notary Public, 1663.

If she dies under age, then I leave to the 5 children of my late cousin, Benjamin Herring, late of the Island of Curacao, deceased, £750. Of the rest I leave 1/2 to my wife. Of the other half I leave £1000 to my Godson, Simon Johnson Myer [son of Andries/Andrew Meyer & Susanna MacFedericks], and the rest to the children of my loving niece, Catharine Livingston, wife of Robert G. Livingston, and to the children of my sister, Mary Hude, of New Brunswick, widow. Contingent legacies are left to "my wife's nephew, Gerritt Van Horne, son of her nephew, Gerritt Van Horne," and to "the children of my wife's late nephew, Cornelius Beekman, deceased," and to "my wife's nephew, Gerritt De Witt," and to "my wife's nephew, Gerard Beekman, Jr., son of her nephew, Captain Gerard Beekman"; Also to the Minister and Elders of the Reformed Dutch Church. My excutors may sell all real estate. I make my wife sole executor, and after her death Peter G. Livingston and Gerard Beekman, Sr., and "my wife's cousin, Mr. David Van Horne," and "my niece's husband, Mr. William Neilson." Dated August 14, 1770. Witnesses, John R. Myer, Joseph Cox, Wynant Kettle-tas, merchant. Codicil, September 12, 1771. Removes David Van Horne from being executor, and in his place appoints "my dear grandchild's father, Mr. Charles McEvers." Witnesses, Cornelius P. Low, William Wiseman, merchant, Peter Kettle-tas, Jr. Proved, September 21, 1772.

Administration granted to Thomas Bibby, of New York City, Captain, who intermarried with Margaret Johnson McEvers, granddaughter and residuary legatee of Simon Johnson, late of the same place, Gentleman, deceased. Whereas Simon Johnson made his will August 14, 1770, and appointed Margaret Johnson, Robert G. Janse Van Luane or Lowaanen was a free black who emigrated to New Netherland in 1654, and soon purchased a sizeable parcel of land in New Utrecht. According to Bergen, Luane was a variation of Leone, and that Janse was from Sierra Leone [citing Kco 344-45]. (He was also known as Swaen Janse and Janse Swaen; his marriage record gives his name as Swaen Van Laonge.)¹

Initially, Swaen Janse did own land on Manhattan, "...He arrived in New Amsterdam in 1654, sometime before October as in that month he purchased a lot on Manhattan north of Rev. Drisius' property [citing Cal. Dutch Hist. MSS, 381]." This was on the "north side of Wall Street between Broad and William Streets."¹

Citing Fernow's "Records of New Amsterdam, from 1653 to 1674 (1897), vols I: 270, 272 and III: 62, 64, "By 1659 Swaen Janse had sold his lot on Manhattan to Hendrick Smitt."¹

In 1662 he was a slave and his master was Govert Loockermans. He was freed between 1664-1675.²

He then went to Kings County, Long Island and apparently spent his remaining years in the Yellow Hook area, dying "sometime before February 1691."¹

[Signed] WILLEM JENSEN [Seale] JANNETJE JOHNSON [Seale] her marke X . In the presence of us, Daniel Griggs, Thomas Griggs. June the 9th 1713. Then appeared before me, Nicholas Stillwell one of her Majestyes Justices of the Peace for Kings County [etc.] the within named William Johnson and Jannetje(*) his wife, acknowledged the within said Instrument to be their free and Voluntary Act and Deed. Nicholas Stillwell Judge.

William Johnson's real estate was extensive. It occupied all the land between Heathcote Brook, south of the King's Highway that now divides Middlesex and Somerset counties, and the Ridge Road that runs between Kingston and Monmouth

Junction, and extended for several hundred yards along the northern side of that highway, with another tract upon the opposite side where that road is joined by what was the old road to Spotswood. The United States Geological Survey map shows the approximate location by its mark for the Johnson private cemetery. The residence stood nearly a hundred yards northwest of the cemetery. Though the original house was enlarged about 1850, it is still quite distinguishable, as a separate unit, amid the modern improvements. The nucleus of the old estate has been for many years held by the Stout family. William Johnson, when about seventy-five years old, made his will, but he proved to be another example of the great vitality of the Johnsons, for he lived until nearly April 20, 1782, when he was about ninety years old. This approximate date of his death is recorded in File No. 60671, of Middlesex County wills in the office of the secretary of state of New Jersey, in which file is the inventory of his personal effects. His last testament is recorded at page 65 of liber 24 of wills in the same office.

In his will, he wrote: ...The twentieth Day of December one thousand seven hundred & sixty Eight 1768 I William Johnson of the south ward of New Brunswick in the County of Middlesex & Province of New Jersey being in sound mind & memory & perfectly in my senses...And as for such worldly Goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give bequeath and dispose of in the following manner Imprimis I give to my son Marta fifty pounds money at Eight shilling per oz to be paid out of my real estate within five years after my decease to whom I freely give it to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son John fifty pounds money as aforesaid to be paid in manner as aforesaid within six years after my decease to whom I freely give it to him & his Heirs forever. Item I give to my son William fifty pounds money as aforesaid to be paid in manner as aforesaid within seven years after my decease. Item I give my son Peter my Plantation whereon I now live after payment of the above legacies after my just debts & funeral charges are paid to whom I freely give the same & to his heirs & assigns forever: And also I give to him my said son Peter out of my Personal or moveable Estate one Waggon one Harrow, two working horses with Geers Lines & Clevises belonging to the same--And the remainder of my personal or Moveable Estate I will that the whole thereof be carefully sold at publick Vendue and turned into Money as soon as conveniently may be after my decease which money I give to my Daughters & their Children to be divided in five Equal parts, One fifth part thereof I give to my Daughter Jean and to her Heirs forever, Item I give one equal fifth part thereof to my Daughter Hannah & to her Heirs forever. Item I give one equal fifth part thereof to my Daughter Catharine & to her heirs forever Item I give to the children of my Daughter Mary and to their heirs forever one equall fifth part thereof Item I give the remaining fifth part thereof to the children of my Daughter Leanah & to their Heirs forever. And Lastly I do make Constitute and appoint my beloved son Peter Johnson & my son in law Jockhum Guelick my Executors to Execute this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other former Will or Wills by me made & hereby Declaring this & no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the date above--the above & within written Will. William Johnson (his mark). Signed sealed Published declared & pronounced by the said William Johnson to be his last will & Testament in the presence of us the subscribers as witnesses Isaac Snedecker, Jacobus Snedecker, Jonathan Combs. Sworn at New Brunswick April 20, 1782 before Rodt Hude Surr. In his will, he wrote: ...January 19, 1746. I bequeath unto my negro woman named "Betty," my dwelling house and lands in Jamaica where I now live, during her life, provided she keeps it in good repair. Lidia Johnson, widow of William Johnson, wrote her will on 21 Apr 1780, and it was proved on 7 Aug 1780. She directed that her executors sell all of her estate and divide the proceeds among her children whom she names as Henry, Nathaniel, Ephraim, William, James, Abraham, Phebe, Abigail, and Ann.
