The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the marriage record, they were: Arent Jeuriaenszen Van Oldenzeel, in de Twent, en Belitje Lodowyx, Van Amsterdam.

June 22, 1665.--Lodowyck Pos(ty his wife and daughter, wife of Arent Juriansen Lautsman [Lantsman], entering, said Lautsman's wife requests to be divorced from her husband, as she cannot keep house with him. Decreed to postpone the matter until next Court day, when said Lautsman is to be heard, and Lodowyck Pos is allowed to retain his daughter during that time.

June 24, 1665.--Lodowyck Pos and his daughter Beletje, wife of Arent Lautsman, appear; said Beletje producing a remonstrance communicating she be not obliged to go back to her husband; whereupon it is apostilled: Copy hereof is on request ordered to be given to party to answer in writing next Court day and to appear himself in person, and Arent requests copy of whatever papers his wife may file. Decision: Petitioner's request is granted.

July 4, 1665.--Lodowyck Pos vs. Arent Lautsman. Pltf. complaining as father of Beletje Lodowyx, maketh known the unchristian and insufferable treatment and behaviour of deft, towards said Beletje, deft's lawful wife, exhibiting divers attestations, etc., and demanding that deft, shall be condemned in such penalty as the Magistrates may deem proper, and further that his said daughter Beletje Jacobsen be not constrained to return again to her husband against her will. Deft. answering denies, that he has improperly treated his wife, but says, they had some differences, whereof said Lodowek Pos and his wife were the principal causes, exhibiting a declaration to that effect, requesting that his wife be obliged again to return to him and he promising to live henceforth with her as man and wife ought to do. Pltf. replying says, that he has now been three times before the Court concerning improper treatment of his daughter by the deft., who each time promised amendment, but never kept his promise; therefore he persists in his suit. The Deputy Mayor and Aldermen having heard the debates of parties on both sides--postpone the decision of the Court to next Court day and meanwhile their Worships shall authorize some honorable and fitting person to reconcile, if possible, the parties to love and friendship--if not, to report.

July 11, 1665.--Arent Lautsman communicates by petition in substance, that he and his wife were, pursuant to order of July 4, with Rev. Ministers De Johannes Megapolensis and De Samuel Driesius, but that his wife's parents would not come to any agreement nor listen or submit to the advice of the Ministers. He requests therefore, that the Court would please to order his wife to return to him, as he no longer could live without a wife, again promising to live with her as an honest man ought to do. Whereupon Arent's wife appearing, assisted by her father, and the request having been read to her, she was asked, if for this time she would not go with her husband on the promise of amendment given by him; she answers: No. as he had already repeatedly promised the same, but never kept it. The Mayor and Aldermen, -- --, declare, they had contributed all in their power, as well through the clergymen as otherwise, to reconcile the parties in love and friendship, but all in vain, and whereas by divers declarations it is sufficiently apparent, that the parents, Lodowyck Pos and his wife, are the chief and principal cause of the trouble, which has arisen between the parties, they therefore order the said Lodowyck Pos not to detain the above named Beletje, wife of Arent Lautsman, in his house beyond 14 days, within which time parties shall have to be reconciled to each other or in default thereof they must again make joint application to the Court; and further said Arent Lautsman is hereby notified, that if again any complaints should be made of his improper behaviour, then he shall be delivered over to the Governor General for punishment, whether by separation from bed and board, imprisonment or otherwise, as his Honour shall deem proper as an example to other evil householders.

July 25, 1665.--The petition of Arent Lautsman was read and considered, making complaint, that his wife still evinces her unwillingness, contrary to the last judgment of the 11th inst., to come home to him; also that his father-in-law, Lod. Pos, is entertaining her contrary to said judgment, and requesting the Court to order and constrain the said Pos not to entertain his

wife any longer and order her to return home to the petitioner; the Mayor and Aldermen direct, that the matter be placed in the hands of the jury. The aforesaid judgment of the 11th together with the other papers having been considered by the jury, they decide that Beletje Lodowycks, wife of said Lautsman, shall return to her husband and that Lodowyck Pos shall no longer harbour her without the consent of her husband, or allow others to harbour her, and he is to pay costs in this case. The Court approves the jury's verdict.

They are thought to have lived at Rutherford, Bergen Co., NJ.

Annetje was probably a sister of Metje Brouwer who m. Christophel Van Rype in 1746; when Christophel Van Rype and Metje Brouwer had their son Gerrit bp. 4 Sep 1764, Christophel Juriaense and Annetje Brouwer were witnesses, which would indicate friendly relations existed between the family branches in spite of traditions that a quarrel between the two caused the name change.

On 30 May 1804 (recorded 11 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:396) Jacob Van Ostrand and Charity, his wife, of the Township of New Barbadoes, conveyed to Isaac Van Winkle, of the same place, for \$653.40, two lots in the Township of New Barbadoes: (1) 5-78/100 cleared land, beginning E side of Road leading from the boiling spring road to Passaic River on S side of land of John Van Winkle. (2) 8 acres strict measure of woodland, beginning SW side of Christopher Yereanse's land; mentioned Peter Kipp's woodland. Signed by Jacob Van Norstrand, Charity Van Norstrand. Witnessed by Richard Outwater, Christopher Van Norstrand.¹

Guert Corten, of Bergen, who died between 5 Feb and 1 June 1671 devised several acres of land at Bergen to Thomas Juriaensen [grandson of Guert Corten's brother, Harmen], then but three years old.

In 1720, Joshua Bosh, blacksmith, of Saddle River, conveyed to Thomas Juriaensen, farmer, of Aquakana, Essex County, for £84, 84 acres on Saddle River, east side of Passaic River...sold to said Bosh 1716 by John Corteen. Signed Joshua Bosh (his mark). Witnessed by Hermanus Grant (his mark), John Smith (his mark).¹
