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The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

This surname may have eventually become Keto/Ketor/Keetyn/Keet/Keator.³

Dorothy Koenig suggests that Susanna's first husband may have been Richard Hamer. Dorothy wrote: In volume I of the "Kingston Papers", pages 291-295, there is a detailed account of a fracas. In an extraordinary session the court sat from 29 April to 4 May 1666. In brief, Albert Heymans Roosa was the plaintiff, and he told how all he wanted to do was to go to the blacksmith's and have a broken coulter repaired [The dictionary tells me that a coulter is a sharp disk attached to the beam of a plow that makes the vertical cut in the soil.] When he was attempting to have his coulter repaired he was set upon for no reason by 5 soldiers one after the other. A misunderstanding escalated into a fight with men coming in to the aid of one side or the other. The five soldiers named were Francois Vreeman, Ridsert Hamer, Thomas Elger, Tomas Quinel, and Robbert

Pekock. Because of Susanna's continued association with Thomas Quinel and Robert Peacock (his wife was Elizabeth), I suspect that Susanna was first married to Richard Hamer. By 1666 Richard Hamer was back in New York City. Page 102 of Berthold Fernow's "Records of New Amsterdam", volume 6, tells us that Richard was the plaintiff against Sara Kierstede because he had ordered a "razer" from her and had not yet received it. On page 377 of the same volume we find that the Constable of New York City made a complaint to the court against "Corporal Hamor" for threatening and abusing the said constable in the executing of his office, Corporal "Hamor" is further identified as porter of this city and under the honorable Garrison. Kingston marriage record #124 tells us that in 1696 Antoni Voising born in France married Elisabeth Sybeddem, the widow of Robert Pecock. Both were residing in Marbletown. Because of the company she kept, I propose that Susanna (_____) Hamer, widow of Richard Hamer and recorded in her second marriage intention with her deceased husband's given name as "patronymic", was the person who married Melchior/Melchert Claeszen.

Dr. Kerfbyl, a graduate of Leyden University, was in NY by 23 Apr 1681, when he witnessed a baptism. He performed the high-profile autopsy of NY Governor Henry Slaughter, who died suspiciously in July 1691.¹

In his will, he wrote: 1st day of February, 1688. We, Johanes Kerfbyl, of the city of New York, medicine doctor, with Catrina Rugh, alias Kerfbyl, lawfully joined in matrimony, being both of perfect health and memory, and being desirous to settle things in order, do make this our last will and testament. The said Johanes Kerfbyl declares that the marriage contract made before the Public Notary, John Hendricksen Van Lawven, at Amsterdam in Holland, bearing date October 28, 1664, shall be of full force and virtue. And she is to enjoy the said estate as mentioned in the contract of jointure, as agreed by her cousin and guardian, John Hendricksen Lawven, and signed by myself. And all the remainder of my estate I leave to her. And if Johanes Kerfbyl is the survivor he is to inherit all the estate. Signed by both in the presence of Wm. Bogardus and Samuel Bayard. Proved before Lord Cornbury, November 4, 1704, and Letters of administration granted to the widow, Catharine Kerfbyl.

In his will, he wrote: September 28, 1728. I, John Kerfbyl, of New York, merchant, being at this time very sick. I leave to my loving son John, £25, when he is 21 years of age, or sooner if my executors see cause, so to do, and I do herewith cut him off and exclude him from any other or further claim or Pretension, as being my eldest son and Heir at Law. I leave to my daughter Catharine, in lieu of an outset, £30. My executors are to sell any part of my estate, real or personal. Reijnier Mynertse Heyserryck and Maritje (Jacobse) Vlierboom, his wife, joined the Tappan Ref Ch 23 Oct 1695.¹

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage banns they were: Reynier Meyvartszen, j.m. Van N. Yorck, en Marritje Vlierboom, j.d. Van Achter Kol, beyde woonende op Tappan.

Their names appear as Reynier Mynertse (Heyserryck) and Maritje (Jacobse) Vlierboom, his wife, in the membership of the Tappan Ref Church under the incorrect date of Oct 23, 1695. His name is found Heyserryck on the Tappan Church records, but he appears to have adopted Keyserick or Kyserike as well.

He served in Leisler's militiamen; and was made a Freeman in NY, on Dec 18, 1695. After removing to Tappan, he served as Assessor, Collector, Supervisor and Commissioner of Highways; as well as in the Orange County militia. On Oct 14, 1724 he acquired a total of 247 acres from the Tappan Patentees, the main lot of 92 acres being between the King's Road and the Sparkill. He d. probably soon after making his Will, dated Oct 21, 1737, proved June 27, 1738 at NY, which he signed 'Mynnyer Keysereyck'. Having no children, it devised the whole estate to his wife.

Rynier Hyserryck & Marretie Vlierboom witnessed the baptism 12 Apr 1715 Tappan Ref Ch of Marritie Vervelen, dau. of Gideon Vervalen & (2) Susannah De Graef.

She married (2) **Wilhelmus Crom** the same month her deceased husband's will was recorded. On April 26, 1744, she and her second husband sold the southeast quarter of lot 6 in the Kakiat Patent to Augustine Van Donck, which had been acquired by Renier 'Kisarike' from Mattys Acker (Eckerson), in 1731."

Exhibited for a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, rights, credits of John Oort, deceased, by William Kidd and sarah his wife, this 26th day of October 1692. signed William Kidd and the marke of Sarah Kidd.

Witnesses, Mansfield Tucker, James Johnson. Proved, September 12, 1744. The oldest son Christopher was then dead.

"A short distance east of Richard Smith's plot of ground upon the East River, the land between the road and the river shore was intersected by the gully or ravine, known as "Burger's Path". A small parcel of ground intervened, however, containing about fifty English feet front upon the road, or Hoogh Straet, and extending some eighty feet or thereabouts to the crumbling bank above the beach. Upon this ground...Abraham Martenszen Clock and Tryntje, his huysvrouw, had built for themselves a small house. This stood apparently near the bank of the river, and about at the southwestern corner of the site of the modern building now [1902] known as the Old Cotton Exchange. Abraham Clock received his ground-brief for this parcel of land in the year 1655, it being described as a "lot on the east side of the lot of Richard Smith, and on the west side of the road which Burger Joris uses to go to the river side." The premises seem to have contained a well of some repute, the site of which is clearly marked in the conveyances of this property, and which may, indeed, still exists under the Old Cotton Exchange which at the present day covers Abraham Clock's modest holding, -- house-site, garden and all. This well was at the right of the entrance to the modern building, upon Hanover Square, and about eighteen feet back from the street line.¹

Of Abraham Clock, but little is known; he was living here as late as 1664, but died within a few years after that date. One of the trials of his humble life at this spot was that his plot of ground was subject to the encroachments of the waves at high tides. Later, in 1672, when his widow, Tryntje, had been ordered to fill out the street, or Waal, in front of her premises, and also the hollow way upon the east [the result of constant erosion?], she declared herself unable to have the work done; and the magistrates of the city decided to render her special aid, "as she had so much to do."¹

And my executors are to use £25 for his support, and he is to have one good new suit of apparell from head to foot, and three new shirts, and a new hat and cap, and all the wearing apparell that he has. I make my wife and Johanes Vanderheuil, and Henricus Boelen, ex-ecutors. Witnesses, James Parsell, Peter Felton. (One name illegible.) Proved, March 4, 1728.¹

In her will, dated 25 Oct 1744, probated 27 June 1753, Elizabeth Clock, of Newtown, widow of Martin Clock, late of New York, shopkeeper, being indisposed in body. All debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my nephew, Abraham Vanderhuyl, of New York, £2. To Elizabeth Voorhees, daughter of Daniel Voorhees, of Oyster Bay, £15. My negro man "Frank" is to be free. Of all the rest of my estate I leave 1/2 to the children of Sarah Rapalye, late wife of Daniel Rapalye, of Brookland, and the children of Catharine Boelen, wife of Jacob Boelen, of New York, deceased. And the other 1/2 to the children, Trinitie Clock, wife of Elbert Clock, of New York, Mary De Milt, of Stamford, Connecticut, Janittie Wyncoop, of New York, and to the children of Johanes Vanderbergh, of New York. My executors are to sell my house and lot in New

York. I make Hendrick Boelen and Cornelius Wyncoop executors. Dated October 25, 1744. Witnesses, Samuel Fish, Elbert Luystre, Andrew Rychen. Proved, June 27, 1753.¹

The house of Elizabeth Clock was at the corner of Dock street (now Pearl street) and Burger's path (now Old Slip), in New York.¹

In the record of the (2) marriage, he was described as a house-carpenter, a widower, and from "Alckmaer in Nort Hollant." He was no doubt born either in Germany or in North Holland of German parentage.

Jan Barentsen Kunst was frequently in court, but never as a defendant. From 1653 to 1656 he brought a number of suits to collect debts due him personally or with his partner, Carsten Clausen.

Jan apparently made a voyage to Holland and returned in the Gilded Beaver in May, 1658, bringing a workman with him. In 1663, he sold his half-interest in a house and lot extending from Stone to South William Streets in New Amsterdam.

He was a witness in 1659 in a lawsuit regarding pay for building a bridge at Esopus, and must have about that time settled there, as in 1663 he was listed as owner of a lot next to the churchyard in what is now Kingston.

In 1670, Jan Barentsen Kunst was listed as owner of over twenty-four acres of land at Kingston and as then living at Hurley, a new settlement near by.

He, his family, and a number of farmers, herdsmen, and laborers, along with friend and countryman Jonas Bronck, sailed on the ship *Fire of Troy*, arriving in New Netherland about July 1639. He received a land grant from Kieft for about 400 acres at what became Harlem, NY. This section was called Jochem Pietersen's Flat.

Jochem Pietersen Kuyter was murdered in his own house on Staten Island by Indians about March 1654.

Leentje Martens m. (2) (banns 18 Dec 1654 NYC Ref Ch), **Willem Janszen Van Heerd** (from Gelderland).

By 15 Nov. 1655 Leentje Martens was dead, as her estate was being settled by Willem Jansen who is recorded as "the widower of Lyntje Martens deceased." The settlement and inventory went on for several years.
