

-- KERMER, CARMAN --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Abraham Kermer, probably a German, came from Hamburg to New Amsterdam in or before 1656. Metje Davids was from Arnhem, Gelderland, Holland. The surname is written by descendants today as Carmer.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Henry Carmer, of the City of New York, Joiner, being aged and infirm. I devise to my son, Nicholas Carmer, my water lot now unimproved and last granted to me by the corporation of this city, in the East Ward of this City. To my wife Elizabeth, 30 yearly during her life. All the rest of my estate, real or personal, I dispose of in the following manner, to wit: two equal undivided third parts thereof, to my son Nicholas, the other third part to the children of my daughter, Mary Williamson, viz.: Elizabeth, John and Henry, equally divided, and if any die during their minoritys the share of such to the survivors. I appoint my son Nicholas sole executor and I empower him to sell my estate and out of the net proceeds to retain the dividend of my said grandchildren during their minoritys or till they marry, and he to be guardian to them until the above Contingency. Dated February 12, 1785. Witnesses, Robert Mercer, Robert Roberts, hatter; Matthew Cowper, merchant, all of New York City. Proved, March 1, 1785.

Peter Carman owned the old Mount Prospect Hotel on Franklin Turnpike, in the Ramsey area of Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ, which now is the site of the Ferncroft Apartments. Peter operated a Tavern in Hohokus Township for many years, and travelled back and forth over the Paterson Hamburg Turnpike, owning the Hotels and Taverns from Hohokus to Sussex, NJ. He was "compelled to leave Hohokus" (got kicked out) by the Brotherhood of Hohokus, who were upset that he was operating a Tavern too close to a Church, and for "failure to obtain a Tavern license." This was in the early 1870's, but Peter returned and purchased the Mount Prospect Hotel (Ramseys), and did a very lively, and somewhat famous business for miles around. His famous "Balls" and "parties" were to be noted on a constant basis in the Bergen County newspapers. Also to be noted, were the drunken brawls that followed some of those events. He also held "Court" at his hotel, as numerous Court cases were to be heard there. He was known as "Judge Carman," although he was never appointed to any Jurist position. Peter Carman's Hotel was where they heard Court cases in Hohokus/Ramsey. After he got kicked out of Hohokus, which was probably around 1879, he then left for Butler and Bloomingdale. The newspapers are littered with the troublesome Whitfield Carman (the papers referred to him as "DeWitt Carman", and spoke about all kinds of fights and dares while in Hohokus/Ramsey area. Once, a vagabond was travelling through Ramsey, and had no where to stay, so Peter Carman put him up in the Hotel. The next morning, Whitfield woke up to find his suit of clothes gone, along with money, a picture of "his gal" (Jennie Crouter) and a gold watch missing, and in its place, the clothes that the tramp was wearing.¹

Abram Carman, 82, farmer, and Frances, 75, keeping house, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in the Township of Pompton, Passaic County, NJ. Listed living in the same dwelling, but listed as a separate family were: Peter Carman, 35, laborer, and Martha, 34, keeping house; Mary, 14; Whitfield, 11; Rachel A.. 8; and Sarah E., 4.

According to a Township of Hohokus tax bill of 1876 (to Mr. Stephen Lawrence), taxes in the Ramsey area could be paid at Peter Carman's Hotel; the Commissioners of Appeals were also scheduled to meet there.²
