

-- **KINGSLAND** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

On 26 September 1786 (recorded 8 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:419) Abraham Kingsland of New Barbadoes Neck, conveyed to Nephew Gilbert Van Emburgh of Bergen County, Black smith, for love, good will, and affection, all my Real Estate and personal estate on New Barbadoes Neck, beginning at the River by the land of John Outwater, being half the land formerly belonging to my father, Isaac Kingsland, deceased, who by his Last Will and Testament bequeathed to me. Signed by Abraham Kingsland (his mark). Witnessed by William Dow, John Dow, Junior.¹

On 15 February 1790 (recorded 8 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:413) Abraham Kingsland of New Barbadoes Neck, yeoman, conveyed to Gilbert Van Emburgh, Black smith, of same place, for £5, 8-41/100 acres meadow at New Barbadoes Neck, beginning at corner Thomas J. Van Riper's meadow; mentioned Buck's Creek; corner of Henry Outwater's meadows; Hackensack River. Bounded S by meadows of said Thomas Van Riper; W by Bucks Creek; N by said Henry Outwater's meadow; E by said Hackensack River. Signed by Abraham Kingsland (his mark). Witnessed by Abraham Speer, Abraham Van Emburgh.¹

On 31 March 1791 (recorded 8 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:417) Abraham Kingsland, Executor of the Estate of Isaac Kingsland Junior, deceased, of New Barbadoes Neck, conveyed to Gilbert Van Emburgh of the same place, for £8, 2 acres meadowland in New Barbadoes Neck, beginning SE corner Halmegh Sipp's meadow. Signed by Abraham Kingsland. Witnessed by Wm. McLom?, Abraham Van Emburgh.¹

In his will, he wrote: I Charles Kingsland, New York, house carpenter. I empower my executors to sell and dispose of all my lands, lying in the State of New Jersey; also to sell all the lumber I may have at the time of my decease; out of monies arising from such sales, all my debts and funeral charges be paid by my executors and the residue put out at interest on good security, and the interest thereof shall be applied to the support and education of my children until my youngest child shall become of age; I do then bequeath to my son, Isaac, £50 out of the said monies and the remainder shall be equally divided among my children, Isaac, John, Elizabeth, Charles and Joseph, share and share alike; to my wife Ann, while she remains my widow, the rents, issues use and profits of all the residue of my estate as well for her own benefit as for the support and maintenance of my children during their minority; after the decease or remarriage of my wife, I give all the residue of my estate to my said children, share and share alike; in case any of my children should die before a division is made of my estate, leaving lawful issue such issue shall take the place of the parent so dying and be entitled to his share. I appoint my brother, Joseph Kingsland, William Brown, sexton of St. Paul's Church, New York, executors. Dated May 4, 1798. Witnesses, James Scott, David J. Secor, John Wandell. Proved, July 28, 1798.

Kingsland commonly called Gustavus's Lane; mentions land of Cornelius C. Jorolemon. Bounded SW by Daniel Kingsland's land; NW by James C. Jorolemon; NE by Cornelius C. Jorolemon; SW by Public Road. Signed by James C. Joralemon, Rachel Joralemon (her mark). Witnessed by Rufus Harrison, Teunis Brown.¹

According to Winfield, Isaac Kingsland settled on the east bank of the Passaic River. He was a nephew of Major Nathaniel Kingsland of the Parish of Christ Church on the Island of Barbadoes, by whose will he received a large tract of land on New Barbadoes Neck.

Isaac Kingsland was appointed first sheriff of Essex County on 25 March 1683.

X:58) Joseph Kingsland and Mary, his wife, of the County of Essex, conveyed to John Jordan of the Township of Newark, in the County of Essex, for \$1500., about 27 acres in the Township of New Barbadoes, corner Tunis Brown's Homestead in line of Joseph Harrison; mentioned land of Abram Brass and William Kingsland; Charles Kingsland, deceased. Signed by Joseph Kingsland, Mary Kingsland. Witnessed by Joseph T. Powers, John Dodd.¹

On 13 June 1804 (recorded 3 February 1806, Bergen Co. X:58) Joseph Kingsland and Mary, his wife, of the County of Essex, conveyed to John Jordan of the Township of Newark, in the County of Essex, for \$1500., about 27 acres in the Township of New Barbadoes, corner Tunis Brown's Homestead in line of Joseph Harrison; mentioned land of Abram Brass and

William Kingsland; Charles Kingsland, deceased. Signed by Joseph Kingsland, Mary Kingsland. Witnessed by Joseph T. Powers, John Dodd.²

The will of William, dated 6 Apr 1809 Newark township, Essex County, named wife, Margaret, a comfortable maintenance out of place I now live on; also 6 chairs, 2 beds and linens should she choose to live elsewhere; son, John to pay her maintenance. Son, John place whereon I now live (13 acres), also a lot of salt meadow on east side of Morses Creek (3 acres), also another lot when of age, also weaver's loom and blacksmith tools and he is to pay 100 pounds, also to provide for Rachel and William until they come of age and also keep and provide for my father one year out of two. Son, William, tract of land at Newton on main road from Bloomfield to Belleville (10 acres), also a bed and bedding and blankets when of age, also 100 pounds. Daughters, Mary, Elizabeth, Margaret, and Rachel, each 20 pounds. Proved 9 June 1809.¹

Will of Margaret dated 3 Mar 1814 Bloomfield, Essex County, widow of William. Son, John lot of salt meadow on east side of Morris Creek. Son, William ten acres at Newton adjoining public road; should he not return from Pittsburgh then 2/3 of land to his son, William and other 1/3 to my four daughters, Elizabeth Stager, Mary Speer, Margaret Vreeland, and Rachel Rutan. Margaret, daughter of Richard Stager 6 silver tea spoons. Margaret, daughter of John I. Vreeland my bible. Margaret, daughter of my son, John Kingsland, six china cups and saucers. To Caty wife of my son, John \$4. All other estate to four daughters. Executor, son John and friend Samuel H. Rutan. Signed by mark. Proved 20 Aug 1814.¹
