

-- KIP, KIPP --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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**Kip/Kipp**

Hendrick Kip, ancestor of the Kip family of New York and New Jersey, came to New Amsterdam before 1643, bringing with him his wife, prob. named Tryntje, and 5 children who had been born in Amsterdam, Holland. Hendrick was a tailor; possibly of noble lineage, his arms were painted on stained glass windows of the first Dutch Church, also carved in stone of the Kip's Bay house. The family was originally from Bretagne, France.

He was one of "the Nine Men" in 1647, 1649, and 1650; assistant to the director or gov.; a member of the Council; a schepen in 1656; a great burgher in 1657.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Mary Kip, of the City of New York, widow of Abraham Kip, late of New York City, cooper, deceased, and one of the daughters of Huybert Vandenbergh, late of the said city, cartman, deceased; being at present indisposed in body. I order that my personal estate shall be sold and converted into cash, and the money put out at interest by my executors as they think fit at the risque of my daughter Mary; Also that my real estate shall be hired out for such rents as can be got for the same, and the profits of all my estate or so much as is necessary shall be applied for the maintenance of my daughter, Mary Kip, for her life. After the decease of my said daughter Mary all the rest of my estate to my three other children, to wit: Sarah, wife of Garret Harsen, Abraham Kip and Garret Kip. I appoint my son-in-law, Garret Harsen, of New York City, baker, and my son, Abraham Kip, of the said City, Painter, and my friend, Mr. Nathaniel McKinley, of the said City, executors. Dated July 19, 1765. Witnesses, Peter Hyer, Gilbt Burger, John McKesson (of New York City, Esquire). Proved, January 5, 1785. Administration granted to Garret Harsin the same day.

In his will, he wote: ...I, Abraham Kip, of Rhinebeck Precinct, in Duchess County, yeoman, being weak in body. I leave to my son Jacob my Great Bible and my gun. All the rest of my estate, real and personal, I leave to my son, Jacob Kip, and my daughter, Anilia Kip, to be divided when my son Jacob is of age. If they die, then the estate to go to my brothers and sisters [not named]. My executors are to rent out my house and farm and lands, "and also the Ferry across Hudsons river," to a good husbandman that will keep the same in good order, "and also that always a good Ferry boat and proper attendance be kept agreeable to the Patent granted for said ferry." All household stuff, horses, cattle, etc., are to be sold at public vendue and the money put at interest, "to sure persons, or for building a storehouse." "And as my servant and negro slaves have behaved faithful and obedient, it is my will that my servant, during the time limited by his indenture, and my negroes, Peggy and Robin, shall be hired to some honest persons, as they shall like best, and if possible that 'Peggy and Robin' may be both at one house, and my old wench 'Bett' shall have liberty to choose any good family that will take and keep her for victuals and clothes." My wench "Diana" I would have to live in the family where my children live. "Lastly, I beg the favor of my dear mother in law and my brother in law, Johanes Pruyn, to take my children into their house and under their special care, and not to let them want for victuals and clothes, and they are to be paid what is customary." I make my loving brothers in law, Johannes Pruyn and Gerritt Van Wagenan, and my cousin, Jacob Johan Kip, executors. Dated November 13, 1755. Witnesses, Jury Haas, William Scott, Christian Schults. Proved before Laurence Van Kleek, Judge of Common Pleas, and Peter Ten Broeck and William Humphry, Justices, February 16, 1756.

In an 'Answer to the Representation of New Netherland' by Cornelis van Tienhoven, 1650, ....[in his list of] some descriptions of the persons who have signed the remonstrance, he included... Hendrick Kip is a tailor, and has never suffered any injury in New Netherland to our knowledge.<sup>3</sup>

Series of Baptism -- Marriage and Burial Registers in Amsterdam [Netherlands] No. 629-fo. 43, V" dated April 20, 1624: "Appeared as before (before the commissaries of marriage matters) Heyndrick Heyndrixsz of Nieuwenhuys (born there), tailor, 24 years of age, assisted with his brother-in-law, Bloemert Sandert, living 9 years in Servetsteech (alley) and Tryntje Lubberts of Swoll, 25 years of age, orphan, living from her youth in Angelierstraat (street), assisted with her cousin Annetie Heyndrix."<sup>2</sup>

Hendrick Kip, ancestor of the Kip family of New York and New Jersey, came to New Amsterdam before 1643, bringing with him his wife, prob. named Tryntje, and 5 children who had been born in Amsterdam, Holland. Hendrick was a tailor; possibly of noble lineage, his arms were painted on stained glass windows of the first Dutch Church, also carved in stone of the Kip's Bay house. The family was originally from Bretagne, France.

Hendrick Hendrickszen Kip was a tailor, his name appearing sometimes in the record simply as Hendrick the tailor, and again as Hendrick Snyder (tailor) Kip. On the 28th of April 1643 he obtained a patent for a lot east of the fort, in the present Bridge Street near Whitehall, where he erected his dwelling house and shop.

He was one of "the Nine Men" in 1647, 1649, and 1650; assistant to the director or gov.; a member of the Council; a schepen in 1656; a great burgher in 1657.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: In the name of the Lord, Amen. Know all those who shall see this present public instrument that (in the year) 1654 after the birth of our Lord and Saviou Jesus Christ, on the 2nd of February, before me, Willem Bogardus, notary public, residing in New York, admitted by the Right Honorable Thomas Dongan, Governor General on the part of his Royal Highness James, Duke of York and Albany, etc., of New York and the dependencies thereof in America, in the presence of the witnesseth hereinafter named, came and appeared in his own person, the worthy Mr. Hendrick Kip, residing at the house of his son, Mr. Jacob Kip, at Kipsberry, being in full possession of his mind and faculties, who considering the frailty and mortality of man, the certainty of death and the uncertain hour thereof, and wishing to forestall the said uncertain hour thereof by testamentary disposition, has therefore made his last will and testament and disposed in the manner hereinafter written. Commanding first of all his immortal soul to the merciful hands of God Almighty, and his dead body to the earth and a Christian burial, and in the second place revoking, canceling and making null and void all previous testaments and other instruments of last will hereto fore made or executed (by him) in any way, and now disposing anew, the testator declares that for good reasons and purposes him thereunto moving, he leaves and bequeathes in advance, as a pre-legacy and before any division is made, to his son Jacob Kip all his clothes, woollens and linen, without exception, which shall have served and belonged to his body; also all his paintings, large and small, none of them reserved; also all the printed books, a large and small extension table, all the chairs and chair cushions; also a mug rack with all the mugs, large and small, a lantern, a mirror, a pewter beaker, a pewter chamber pot, two pairs of spectacles, a pewter tankard, and a small silver mug. Likewise to his daughter Tryntie Kips, married to Abraham Jans, the clothes press, a small cupboard, the bed now used by the testator, two pillows, a bolster, two old white blankets and green curtains. Also to Catherine Kips, daughter of his son Jacob, a silver spoon, which the testator uses daily. Furthermore, to his three children all the remaining furniture and household effects, to wit, to each a like and equal share. And as to the other and remaining assets and credits, of whatever nature they be or wherever the same may be situated, none excepted the testator appoints and institutes as his sole and universal heirs his three children, namely, Baertie, Jacob and Tryntie, together with the children of his deceased son Isaac, representing one share, and the children of his deceased son Hendrick, also representing one share, in order that all the aforesaid property may be divided and partitioned into five equal and corresponding shares, both by the daughters and [sons immediately after the death of the testator, without the eldest son or [daughter?]]s having the right or claim or to enjoy any prerogative or privilege ?? in the matter; with the understanding that the child or children [that] are of legal age or married are to receive their portion, but that the portion of the minor child or children is to remain under the control of their already appointed or chosen guardians, to be employed [and supplied to their utmost benefit, and the portion or inheritance [that?] his daughter Baertie is to inherit from him shall be received [and?] disposed of by her, or her child or children, and by no one else, [the s]aid testator wishing and ordaining that the portions which the children of his son Isaac, deceased, and his son Hendrick Kip, deceased [are to?] inherit

from him shall be paid and satisfied to them or their [guardi?]ans by his son Jacob Kip out of the moneys of the house purchase[d by] him, and that the portion of his daughter Baertie shall be paid [by Abra?]ham Jans out of the moneys of the house sold to him. Furthermore, it is the testator's will and express desire, inasmuch as he sold [hou]se and lot to his son Jacob for the sum of six thousand guilders (equal to \$2400), that now this is to be and that he shall have to [possibly?] add to] it no more than the sum of five thousand guilders, and no more, [??] this for good reasons him thereunto moving. Further it is the testator's express will and desire that his son Jacob Kip is to have absolute charge of all arrangements to have the testator decently buried, the expense of which must be defrayed first [??] of the moneys and ready cash which the testator has in the [custodianship] of Abraham Jans, and whatever is lacking must be paid out of the purchase money of the houses or out of the rent thereof, without any [??] of it falling on the shoulders of his son Jacob Kip, or any [??]ant being presented to him therefor on account of any promise or [pet-; cond-]ition made in connection with it. Further, the testator appoints and institutes as executor of this, his testament, his aforesaid son [Jacob] Kip, with such absolute power and authority as all testamentary [??]tors have according to law and reason. All that is hereinbefore [giv?]en having been clearly read to the testator he declares the same [to be] his final and last will, which he wishes and desires after his [death] to have full force and effect, notwithstanding some formalities [??]red by law may not have been observed herein, considering the [??] however, as inserted in the most effective and usual manner. [????]ness whereof this is signed and sealed at Kipsberry aforesaid, day, month and year as above written. Hendrick Kip. (L.S.)

R:266) Cornelius Kip of the County of Bergen, conveyed to Henry Kip of same, for \$150, [no acreage given], one equal half of lot of land in the Township of Saddle River, which Cornelius Kip holds in partnership with said Henry Kip by virtue of deed from Nicholas Kip bearing date 25 Nov 1793. Isaac Hendrickszen Kip was admitted to the rights of a great burgher with his father April 11, 1657. On June 21, 1656, he and his brother Jacob obtained each a patent for a lot of land in the sheep pasture at New Amsterdam.<sup>1</sup>

He was a Yacht Captain, engaged in the river trade between New Amsterdam and the settlement at Esopus (Kingston) and Fort Orange (Albany). In 1665 he was living in De Brouwer Street, now Stone Street. In Dec. 1675 he was living at New Harlem, and then belonged to the First Corporalship of the night watch in that place.<sup>1</sup>

He is said to have come from Holland to what is today New York in 1645. He was a brewer, trader and General Store Keeper. Served on the Board of Schepens (Secretary), under Stuyvesant. He owned land, Waal-boght neighborhood, petitioned to form a village there, 1660. He, or his father, obtained 150 acres on the East River, known as Kip's Bay. Built farmhouse, 1655, re-built, 1696, it was George Washington's HQ for a brief period. It was at 35th St, demolished, 1851, when 35th St was opened. City house, built, 1657, present Exchange Place. He owned a number of other city lots and houses. Moved to Kip's Bay before 1686.

In 1647, Jacob Kip (son of Hendrick Hendrickson), gave his uncle, Harmon Droogh, a power of attorney to receive money due to him from the West India company at Amsterdam.

In 1647 he was clerk in the provincial Sec'y's office at New Amsterdam, and as early as Dec. 1649, was acting clerk in Director Stuyvesant's Council. On Jan. 27, 1653, he was appointed first Secretary of the Court of Burgomasters and Schepens of New Amsterdam. Upon his resignation of that office June 12, 1657, he engaged in Brewing, combining with his business that of a general trader or storekeeper. He was a member of the board of Schepens in 1659, 1662, 1663, 1665, 1673, and president of the board in 1674.<sup>3</sup>

"On the 1st of March 1660, Aert Anthonissen Middagh, Teunis Gysbert Bogart, Jean Le Clear, Gerrit Hendrick Backer, Philip Barchstoel, Christina Cappaens, Jacob Kip and Jofis Rapalje, all residents of the Waal-boght neighborhood, petitioned the Director for permission to form a village on the margin of the river between the lands of said Bogart and Kip so that as they expressed it 'we may be in sight of the Mannhattans, or Fort Amsterdam.' The place selected was probably the level point of land which jutted into the river about the foot of South Fourth Street in the present Eastern District of Brooklyn, and which

was known in the ancient times as the "Keike' or 'Lookout".<sup>3</sup>

While there is no evidence that Jacob Kip ever resided on this place, "it was probably owing to his desire to improve the value of his real estate, by the securing the establishment of a village thereon, that this petition was made," and through his influence with the authorities, that it was granted.<sup>3</sup>

At an early date, was it Jacob or his father? obtained a patent for a farm of 150 acres, on the East River, on what is still known as Kip's Bay. It is said that Jacob Kip in 1665, erected on his farm a house which was rebuilt in 1696, and was, for a time during the Revolution, Washington's headquarters. It stood upon the line of east 35th St. and was demolished in 1851. His house in the city was built in 1657, and was situated in the present Exchange Place. He owned a number of city houses and lots, and in 1665 resided in the present Broad St. near Exchange Place as late as 1674. In 1686 he was living "Beyond the Fresh Water," the Kip's Bay farm doubtless being the place alluded to.<sup>3</sup>

In his will, he wrote: 19 day of September, 1702, I, Jacobus Kip, of Newtown." I give the new house in the Dock, now being built and bounded west by the house and lot of Benjamin Block, east by the house of Wm. Bill, north by the street, and south by the Dock, and also the water mill with all the lands and appurtenances, to my heirs, Johannes Kip, Abraham Kip, Jesse Kip, Rachel Kierstede, Mary Hogeland, Catharine Richeman, Benjamin Kip and Samuel Kip. The rest of my estate I leave one half to my heirs named above, and one half to my wife and her heirs, viz., to heirs of Jacobus ver Planck and the heirs of Maria Teller. I leave to Jacobus Kip and Jacobus Kip, Jr., £50 ; To Johannes Kierstede, £50. I make Johannes Kip and Jacobus Kip executors. Witnesses, Richard Burt, Samuel Ketcham, John Firman. Proved in Jamaica, Queens County, October 31, 1702, before John Bridges, and executors confirmed.

Application for Pension was made from Montgomery County for James Kip and was approved 7 Jun 1832. When he entered the service in 1777, he was a resident of NY City. He served as an artificer at Peekskill and Fishkill. Part of his service was under "Chevers" and "Radock". It was not allowed as the kind of service rendered by him was not provided for. In 1854, John L. Kip of Hannibal; Orange Co, NY renewed the claim for the service of his father, James. James Kip stated that because of the fear of his life at the time of the British possession of NY, he fled from his well-furnished home on Broadway, the next block south of the Metropolitan Hotel and when the British evacuated, his house, which had been occupied by them, was destitute of furnishings. He was also instrumental in intercepting a plan of the British to capture Col. Steuben at Fishkill, for which service General Washington gave him a lieutenant's commission.<sup>1</sup>

According to a letter in his pension file, the British were about 12 miles from Fishkill over the hills and General Washington had an army at Newburgh. The British General sent a Sergeant and 12 men to Fishkill for the purpose of taking prisoner General (Col.?) Steuben. These men arrived on horseback one or two at a time within a two day period. They said that they were deserters and "put themselves up" at a public house kept by a widow. General Steuben and James Kip occupied separate rooms in the house of Miss Swart or Swartwout, whose family also occupied a portion of the house. The family section was separated from the rest by a small common or open yard. In the rear of the house was an orchard in which the aids of Gen. Steuben had set up a tent. The General's guard was in the barn and a lone sentinel guarded the door to his room. James Kip was the first to realize that something was afoot. He found that they had plenty of money and lived high, were well armed, and well-mounted and did not resemble people who had just deserted. He finally discovered their plan to get one of their number into the General's company, when one of them went of the Steward and asked to see the general. The Steward did not suspect anything but told the "deserter" that his services were not wanted. When James heard this conversation and put it together with other things he had heard he understood the plan. He went with Mr./Mrs. S. and went to the General's room to divulge what he had learned. The General then sent for the British group and while he was talking to them, his guard surrounded them. He threatened them with hanging, pointing to a nearby tree to add weight to his threat. Finally he had his guard sell their horses and equipment and giving them each a small amount of cash, told them to be on their way, separately and warned them that if any of them were caught together after 1 hours time, they would be hung on that tree after all. Not more than days later, General Washington came by and after hearing the case, he approved all that the General had done with

the exception of the release of the plotters. After the war, General Steuben was in the city of New York, on the walk nearly opposite the building in which the British imprisoned many and said that if it had not been for James Kip, he would have been confined in that prison, a sugar house. According to his son John L., "My father lost considerable property in the City of NY by means of the British Army. He also lost a farm in Johnstown worth 5 or 6 thousand dollars soon after the War of 1812 by being security for others about the time of the manufacturing speculation and was left destitute in his old age." his children were born in Dutchess and Orange Co, NY. His factory was situated at what is now 59 Broadway. About 1797, he and his family moved to Johnstown.<sup>1</sup>

In 1686 Jesse's father (and presumably Jesse) was living at the Kip's Bay Farm (along the East River between present-day 26th and 42nd streets).

Jesse Kip owned a grist mill at Fish's Point in Newtown. On Oct. 16, 1711, Jesse Kip purchased of Thomas and John Stevenson a fulling-mill near his grist-mill.

In his will, he wrote: I, Jesse Kip, of Newtown, in Queens County, being in good health. I leave to my wife Mary all my estate, real and personal, of houses, mills and goods while she remains my widow. If my wife remarries she shall give a true inventory to my executors of all houses, lands and goods, which are to be divided as follows: To my eldest son Jacobus, £10. Of the rest, one half to go to my wife and her heirs and assigns. The other half to my children, Jacobus, Abraham, Jesse, Johannes, Wilhelminus, Benjamin and Elizabeth. If my wife dies my widow, then all the estate to my children. My executors

have power to sell lands if necessary. I make my wife Mary and my cousin, John Stevenson, of Westchester, and my nephew, Jacobus Kip, of New York, executors. In his will, he wrote: 25th day of May, 1765, I, the underwritten Roelof Kip, of Rhinebeck Precinct, Dutchess County, yeoman, being advanced in years but yet retaining my perfect knowledge and senses. As for my temporal estate of "lands, buildings, Negroes, debts, horses, cattle, gold and silver coined or not coined," etc. I order as follows, viz.: that all my debts be paid at the right time; that my dear and loving wife Sarah, so long as she remains my widow, remain in possession of my whole estate, real and personal. To my oldest son, Jacob, 20 shillings for his birthright and he shall have no further claim on that account. To my son, John Baptist, freely and absolutely, all my real estate whatsoever, and that he or his heirs pay to the remainder of my children £250, as follows: £125 one year after my or my wife's decease which last shall happen, and £125 two years after the same, which sums to be divided among my children and children's children as hereafter ordered. All my personal estate to my seven children, viz.: Jacob, John Baptist, Isaac, Ignas, Abraham, and my two deceased daughters, Grietje, late wife of Philip Van Ess, and Sarah, late wife of Baltus Van Cleek, equally divided; the seventh part thereof belonging to my daughter Grietje, deceased, to go to her son Gerrit, and her daughter Catatyntje; the seventh part belonging to my daughter Sarah, deceased, to go to her six children, viz.: Peter, Frans, Sarah, Chatarina, Grietje and Elizabeth. My Executors are my five sons, viz.: Jacob, John Baptist, Isaac, Ignas and Abram. Whatsoever children are indebted to me shall after my wife's decease be accounted as a share or part of their heirship of my personal estate. Witnesses, Jan Pir, George Trimper, Christian Schultz (of Rhinebeck, schoolmaster). Proved, Dutchess County, March 9, 1785. Confirmed, New York, October 25, 1785.
