The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with citations.

"Benjamin Knapp, of Haverstraw Precinct, Orange County" left a will dated 5 August 1772, proved 23 October 1772 (Pelletreau, NYC Abstracts of Wills, Vo. VIII, p. 70 [Liber 28: 323-or 424]). In it he mentions wife Susanah; children Benjamin, Samuel, Elizabeth, Susanah, Rachel, Mary, Hannah, Deborah, and Rebecca; and two children of son Daniel, deceased. Names wife and friend Jeremiah Williamson executors. Witnesses were Henry Palmer, Susanah Knapp, Daniel Pye, clothier.

According to the Knapp Genealogy, all of his children were born at Haverstraw and baptized 2 Sep 1749 at St. John's Church, Stamford, CT.

Knapp, Alfred Averill, Nicholas Knapp Genealogy, Winter Park, Florida: 1953, p. 22. This genealogy has confused Knapps and others, and since sources are not cited, there is no way of knowing where the information came from. In one place in the genealogy, Abraham Sneden's wife (their marriage date is given as 16 May 1765), Susannah Knapp is #E-51, bapt. 10 Sept. 1749 Stamford, CT, dau. of Benjamin Knapp, #D-24 who was the son of Benjamin Knapp and Elizabeth Butler. He was "b. 17 April 1704 Greenwich, CT, d. 16 (or 5 or 18) 1772; buried Clarkstown ("Charlestown" in same writeup) Burying Ground. He married June 3, 1731 (or Jan. 3, 1738) Mary -?-, or Susannah Miller, by Rev. John Tennant. Susannah's name may have been Millard or Milliar. Had 10 children. (Perhaps he m. 1st Mary, as Stamford Records say.)

In another section of the genealogy, Abraham Snedden's wife, Susannah Knapp (#^284), dau. of Benjamin Knapp (F-87), bapt. 3 Apr. 1767 (or 1765) Clarkstown, son of Daniel Knapp and Susannah Hunt. The name of his wife was not given. From other facts cited, it is apparent that the genealogy's compiler has confused these two Benjamin Knapps.

PAW Notes: Probably Rebecca Swartout was a descendant of Tomys Roelofse Swartwout who came from Amsterdam in 1652 and settled at Midwout on L.I.; in 1661 removed to Esopus (Kingston). (Bailey, Pre-Rev. Dutch Houses, p. 218) There were Swartouts in Dutchess County, in the Poughkeepsie and Fishkill vicinities. See *New York Genealogical & Biographical Record* July 1976, p. 161: Teunis Wiltzie m. 1751 Catharine Swarthout.

The Will of Benjamin Knapp, dated 5 Aug, proved 23 Oct 1772, of Haverstraw Precinct, Orange County, "being aged" mentions wife Susanna; and children Benjamin, Samuel, Daniel (deceased), Elizabeth, Susanna, Rachel, Mary, Hannah, Debrah and Rebecca. (Calendar of Wills by Fernow).—Howard I. Durie.

His estate was probated 1822 at Brooklyn, Kings, NY.

There was a Benjamin Knapp who died in Apr 1815 in Clarkstown. His wife, Mary, also died in Jan 1815 in Clarkstown according to the book "Supervisors of the Poor Account Book - Clarkstown" in the New City Library, #929.3747. He appeared on the census of 1 Jun 1790 at Rockland, NY; 1 male under 16, 2 males over 16, 2 females.<sup>1</sup>

Early Genealogies claim that Moses and Abigail had three additional sons and a daughter, e.g., Israel, Jonas & Moses, and Mary. Current research indicates that Moses & Abigail had daughters only as shown in this report, based on a 14 Feb 1712/13 Deed [Stamford, CT - Deeds, Vol "B":185], in which Moses bonds his sons-in-law, Thomas Pennoyer, Nathaniel Cross and Samuel Husted "to maintain their father & mother-in-law for their lifetime". John Crissey was not considered in this Deed as his wife, Abigail, had died prior to this time and he had remarried. There are no records that would indicate a male in this family and is further proven by the fact that, had there been (a) male offspring living in 1712/13, by law, he would have established a "heir of right" to the estate of Moses & Abigail. There are no records extant that would prove otherwise. Simply put, Moses, no doubt, would have bonded (a) son in lieu of his sons-in-law, were he to have had such (a) son. Samuel Husted, the remaining son-in-law, requested relief from the 1712/13 Deed in 1725/26, thus indicating that Moses and Abigail were both deceased at that time. That Moses lived to be 110 years old as stated in earlier writings on this family can be labeled nothing more than an "atrocious genealogical blunder" including the claim that he died at Peekskill, NY!!<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: (Fairfield Probate Records, Vol 1665-1675, page 55 & 56, Fairfield, Fairfield Co, Connecticut. In Stamford ye 15th 2mo Anno 1670 [15 Apr 1670]: The Last Will and Testament of Nicholas Knap of Stamford concerning the disposal of his worldly estate: (1) I give to my sonn Moses Knap my house and land in Stamford with all the meadow and upland belonging to me. Also I give to my said sonn Moses my cart and plowe or plowes--with all the furniture of Irons, yokes, and chaynes belonging and a small gun in the house and a sword. (2) I give unto my sonn Timothy Knap the monies remayning due to me upon the bil for the house of John Bats [John Bates] lives in. (3) I give to my sonn Caleb [Caleb] the loom and halfe the geers and the other halfe of the geers I give to my sonn Joshua Knap. (4) I give to my daughter Sarah Disbrowe the monies due to me from her husband about 37s - concerning the horsse. (5) I give to my daughter Hannah one mare. (6) I give to my daughter Lidea [Lydia] the mare that was Mr Bishop's with the increase she hath. (7) I give to my daughter Ruth twenty shillings. (8) I give to my two daughters-in-law [step daughters], viz: Sarah and Uneca Buxton, all their mother's clothes as a free gift, except one hat and one new pettecote, which my will is they should have onward of their portion. Also I will and bequeath unto Uneca Buxton the new Bible as a free gift. (9) My will is that portions due my daughters-in-law [step daughters], viz: Sarah and Uneca Buxton, out of the estate of their father Clement Buxton: I say that their part and portions be currently payd according to their portion of the inventorie. (10) Lastly my will is that my sonn Joshua Knap be sole executor of this my last will to receive all and pay all dues according to this my will as also debts to or for me. If in the case that mare be not found that I have given to Lidea [Lydia] that then shée to have another mare in lue of that. This being my last will and renouncing all other former wills made by me witness my hand. Witness: (signed) John Weed Nicholas y Knap Eleazur Slawson (his mark)

Very early settled at New Haven, as he relinquished his right, signing by his mark, to any of the land purchased by the New Haven colonists from the Indians 11 Dec. 1638. Took oath of fidelity, New Haven, July 1644; had been in Delaware Bay before 1644, and was a poor man. His wife and children were mentioned 1647. He removed to Fairfield, and was one of four "poor men" to whom the will of Dr. Pell. 1669, gave their debts to him.

Married (1) (???), executed for witchcraft 1653.

Married (2) Elizabeth Dickerson, dau. of Thomas. The will of [her stepfather] Daniel Finch. 1667, gave a legacy to the wife of Roger Knapp. The will of her dau. The pitiful story of the trial and execution of "Goody Knapp" of Fairfield, as disclosed by testimony in the famous Staples slander suit, may be found in New Haven Colony Records. As Roger was the only Knapp appearing in Fairfield records at that period, we hesitate not to make him husband of "Knapp's wife" as she was also called.

Will 21 Mar. 1672/3, proved 20 Sept. 1675; wife Elizabeth; sons Jonathan, Josiah; dau. Lydia; sons Roger, John, Nathaniel; daus. Elizabeth, Mary.

Will of Elizabeth Wake, 7 July 1691, exhibited 9 Nov. 1691, not approved; son Nathaniel Knap; will of son Roger, lately dec'd; two daus. Mary and Sarah Knap; dau. Phebe; son-in-law Charles Lane and my dau. Elizabeth; brother Thomas Dickerson, and Jonathan Morehouse, Exec'rs. Inv. of widow Wake of Fairfield, and her son Roger, 23 Sept. 1691. Court ordered distribution, 1/3 to three grandchildren (children of Charles Lane her son-in-law), 1/3 to dau. Mary and 1/3 to dau. Phebe.

Samuel Knapp lived at Warwick, Orange Co., NY.

Samuel lived in the western part of the Town of Warwick, N.Y. Deeds locate his property in the so-called "Drowned Lands" west of the Wallkill River and the vicinity of Pochuck Mountain. His earliest deed was dated 1772.<sup>1</sup>

One piece of land was purchased from A. MacGregor (date unknown), and another bought in 1795 from William and Mary Thompson was described as 140 acres in the first division on "Pochunk" Mountain. It was part of the Waywayanda Patent, and the original patentee was Daniel Honan. On 5 Apr. 1806, Samuel sold 15 acres in this same area to Jesse Gustin, his son-in-law, and, in 1826, 98.25 acres to his son, John D. Knapp.<sup>1</sup>



Among Samuel's neighbors were William Holly and Caleb Taylor whose names appear in the 1775 Warwick Assessment Roll (Holly, Taylor), 1790 census (Holly, Taylor) and 1800 census (Taylor).[12,13] Note: Caleb Taylor's father Elias was actually in the assessment roll and 1790 census.<sup>1</sup>

Samuel's will, dated 21 May 1815, was probated in 1834. He died 15 Jan. 1834 aged 96, according to his wife's deposition.[15] He was presumably the Samuel Knapp listed in the 1775 assessment roll for Warwick Town (District No. 8 which included the area of Mount Eve, Amity, Pine Island and down to the New Jersey line) and the 1790 and 1800 census for Warwick.<sup>1</sup>

There is some conflict as to whether Bethia married Timothy Knapp, Sr or Joseph Taylor, or both. William Knapp was a Corporal in Capt. David McCampany's Co., Col. Hathorn's Regt., NY State Militia from Orange Co., NY June 10, 1778/79<sup>1</sup>.

He lived on a farm between Chester and Warwick, NY<sup>1</sup>. His last residence was located between Chester and Warwick, Orange Co, NY, said to be near Sugar Loaf, and he is buried on the Baird Farm, Knapp Plot, between Chester and Sugar Loaf, NY.<sup>2</sup>

His will was dated 19 April 1817, and was probated 21 June 1817. Executors were May and Jabez Knapp and James Smith. Witnesses were Mary Rae, David Rae, and Jesse Wood, Jr. He gave to wife 30 acres on road from Chester to Warwick, part of "farm where I now live." To son Caleb, \$5; to dau. Clemence Vail, \$125; to William R., \$250; to Elizabeth Fulton, \$25; to Joseph, \$100; to Charles, \$100; to Samuel, \$125 "and all my shoemaker's tools when 21 yrs. of age." To Jabez "all the remainder of my estate except \$125 to Nathaniel R."<sup>1</sup>
