The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Arien Jansen Konink, j.m. te Wel & Lyske Damen j.d. van Herpt were married 15 Mar. 1650 at Well in Gelderland. The village of Well, seven kilometers southwest of Zaltbommel in the area known as the Bommerlewaard, province of Gelderland.

Adriaen Jansen Konink (from Well) arrived in New Netherland with his wife and four children (ages 8, 6, 4, and 1/2 yr) in 1663 on *de Bonte Koe (The Spotted Cow)*. Later records identify his wife as Lysbeth Damen (from Herpt, in North Brabant).

He settled in Manhattan, and his descendants usually wrote their name Koning (although the name was later translated by some to King). He was an innkeeper.

Lysbeth Damen m. (2) 11 Aug 1691 **Huybert Arentse**. In the marriage license record, they were: "Huybert Arentse of NYC, Clerke, Elizabeth Konning, Wido."

They were members of Domine Henricus Selyn's Congregation in 1686. Heyman Koning, en syn huysvr. Marritje Andries living on Nieuwe Straet, (New Street.) [HSYB 1916:26]

Maritie [Andries], widow of Hamon Koningh, and her nephew, John Poel, were executors of her mother's will. Her mother was Niese Huijtes (aka Wits Wijtes, and other names), widow of (1) Andries Andriessen and (2) Jan Vigne (as his second wife).¹

Elizabeth Koning, poss. sister of Heyman/Hermanus Koning?, m. Alexander Lamb.

According to Ethel Kolenut of Midland Park, NJ (AOL post Feb 1996), Adrian Janszen Koningh had a son Heyman who married Marritie Andries. Three, possibly four of their children moved to Second River, (Belleville) NJ. This is the only branch of the family that used the name King. The Koning family from the Tappan area did not use the name King.

Jacob de Ceunijnck made confession (together with his sisters Tanneken, Paulijntje and Maetje) in the church of Groede 30 June 1657. The register had added to his name "na Nieuw Nederland" (thus: to New Netherland). In 1665 he is called an "arbeider" (worker), and in 1675 he (being a carpenter) bought a house in Groede. In 1683 when Anthony Crespel, living in Yssoop (Esopus) in t Nieuw Nederland, visited his brother Jan Crespel in Groede, there was passed a notary act 7 Apr 1683 before notary P.A. Sijx in Groede, authorising Anthony to get money over debts from Jacob de Coninck, former carpenter in der Groede, now living "tot Nieuw Jorck" in t Nieuw Nederland.²

Jacob was married first to Josijntje Blanckaerts. The marriage took place probably in Nieuwvliet (also near Groede), but the marriage registers were destroyed [in WWII]. This was probably shortly before October 1661 because Josijne Blanckaerts wife of Jacob de Ceunijnck then became member of the church of Groede.²

Agneta van de Revijere (as she is named in the marriage register of Groede) was born in Vere (marriage register). On 29 Sept. 1662 she did confession in the church in Groede (as Agnes van de Rijvijere), and later moved from there to Vlissingen (Flushing). She probably returned and married in Groede (fian. 24 Jan. 1665, marr. 15 febr. 1665) to Gillis Leijnsen, a tailor, born around 1640 in Oelem, son of Joos Leijnsen and Josijnken de Vrient. Gillis made confession in Groede 29 June 1663.²

Jacob de Ceunijnck bought a house in Groede in 1675, at which time he was called a carpenter.³

He emigrated in 1676 or 1677.³

On 21 Aug 1677 Jacob de Coninck en [blank] zijn huijsvr. were listed a members of the NYC Ref Ch.

They both came from Groede, Netherlands; a record there says that Jacob was living in New York in 1683.¹

27 febr. 1679, Pieter de Coninck en Alla Caler zijn huisvr. Probably this Alla Caler (typing error for Anna?) is the same person as the Anna Koleths [original French form probably Colet or Collet], who was wife of Pieter de Koninck and who were both mentioned in Groede 1672. It is not clear yet if this Pieter is the father of Jacob and Anna his stepmother, or a half-brother, but they were (very) probably related. Jacob's father Pieter had by his second wife Tanneke Guillaemse de Puijdt only one son and 4 daughters, who inherited from their mothers side, so Pieter can't be a full brother.¹

Originally they must have lived in Wijtschate (south of Iper in Flanders) as all daughters were said to be born from there, and Jacob probably too.¹

On 17 Oct 1648 both Pieter and Tanneke did confession in the church of Sint Anna ter Muiden (near Sluis), but on 27 June 1649 they became members of the church of Groede. Pieter was a farmer there in 1652. Both he and his wife must have died before 1663. On 16 apr 1663 in a notary act before not. Isaac van Damme, Groede, there appeared Pieter Sohier, farmer, and his wife Cathelijken Coninx, for himself and as guardian for the (minor of age) orphan children of Pieter de Coninck by his wife Tanneken de Puijt, together with Jacob de Coninck fs Pieter and Claes de Later, having been married to Paulijntje de Coninck, item Tanneken de Coninck, "bejaarde dochter" (which means major(?) (not minor) unmarried daughter), together and replacing Pieter Melsen and his wife Maijken de Coninck, all together children and heirs of Pieter de Coninck and Tanneken de Puijt filia Guilliamme, all living under the Groede; they authorise N.N. to transfer a portion of land in Passendale, that has come from the side of Tanneken de Puijt.¹

Pieter de Ceuninck became member of the church of Groede Jan. 1666 with attest from the church of Guines (near Calais); afterwards he went to Retranchement (near Sluis); he is probably the same as the Pieter de Keunijnghe who became member of the church of Groede July 1672, together with his wife Anna Koleths, with attest from Sint Anna ter Muiden (also near Sluis); later he moved to Sluis.⁴

Pieter de Koninck, en Anna Calet, syn Huysvr. were accepted into membership of the NYC Ref Ch 27 Feb 1679.

Pieter de Coninck II (Peter King II) & his wife Anna Calet, were immigrants to New Castle County, Delaware by 1680/81.²

27 febr. 1679, Pieter de Koninck en Alla Caler zijn huisvr. Probably this Alla Caler (typing error for Anna?) is the same person as the Anna Koleths [original French form probably Colet or Collet], who was wife of Pieter de Koninck and who were both mentioned in Groede 1672. It is not clear yet if this Pieter is the father of Jacob and Anna his stepmother, or a half-brother, but they were (very) probably related. Jacob's father Pieter had by his second wife Tanneke Guilliaems de Puijdt only one son and 4 daughters, who inherited from their mothers side, so Pieter can't be a full brother.¹

In 1684 Peter Sluyter, John Moll (an early presiding justice of the court at New Castle) and others purchased 3,750 acres from [Augustine] Herman, manorial proprietor of the 20,000-acre Bohemia Manor (whose son Ephraim was a Labadist), as a site for a Labadist colony: "The Labadist community was limited to one hundred persons, with Peter Sluyter as its head and his wife installed as abbess. Sluyter grew rich, dealt in slaves and tobacco and lived well, while the members of the colony suffered many privations. Sluyter died in 1722 and the Labadist colony scattered and none were left five years after his death. In 1698, Sluyter divided up a portion of the land, of which he had become sole proprietor, and conveyed three necks to Herman Van Barkelo, Nicholas de la Montaigne, Peter D. Koning, Derick Kolchman, John Moll, Jr., Hendrick Sluyter and Samuel Bayard."³

Steven Jansen, carpenter, with his wife and child came to the colony of Rensselaerswyck from Manhattan in 1649.

In 1654 Jacob Hendrickse Maat, aka Van Looserecht, reported Maria for serving brandy to the "savages". This was a serious crime in New Netherland, and while Maria denied it at the time, she later confessed and was fined (a hefty amount), and banished for over a year.

It seems possible that sometime about 1655, Mary/Maria Goosens had an extramarital alliance with Jacob Hendrickse (Jacob Hendrickse Maat, aka Van Looserecht, inkeeper as of 1654) and bore him a son, out of wedlock (while still married to Steven Jansen Coninck), named **Hendrick Jacobs**, who is mentioned as her son in her will dated 10 June 1687. This event may have been the cause of the subsequent estrangement and divorce of Steven Jansen Coninck & Mary Goosens.

On 7 July 1655, The court of Fort Orange and the village of Beverwyck, having seen and examined the request made to them by the court of the colony of Renesslaerwyck, return as answer thereto, that they are sufficient of themselves as they have always shown, and with a like desire for the maintenance of justice are inspired, and moreover shall not stand idle. On the contrary, their duty shows that the person of Jacob Hendrickse Maat, in case he shall be found in their jurisdiction, must be apprehended and taken under the keeping of justice, placed and confined in a secure place, until such a time as the state and condition of the patient Steven Janse [Coninck], shall have taken an favorable or unfavorable turn, in order that he may be dealt with as justice and right may demand.

Maat, alias Van Looserecht, Jacob Hendrickse, an innkeeper, in 1654, became farmer of the excise for 1300 gl; in 1665 (?)

was accused of gambling, and of roughly handling one Steven Janse Coninck. p. 145)³

"The court of the colony of Rensselaerswyck, understanding that from the fight between Steven Janse (Coninck) and Jacob Hendrickse Maet, there exists just reasons and motives, in the matter of their bounden duty, to be vigilant and watchful in the administration of justice, the offense being such, that Steven Janse was struck in the left side with a knife in the hand of Jacob Janse (Hendrickse) aforesaid in such a manner that he was redeemed from periculum vitae, and that Maet was committed in the jurisdiction of the aforesaid colony. this 2d of July, 1655" (p. 232)³

"The court of Fort Orange and the village of Beverwyck, having seen and examined the request made to them by the court of the colony of Renesslaerwyck, return as answer thereto, that they are sufficient of themselves as they have always shown, and with a like desire for the maintenance of justice are inspired, and moreover shall not stand idle. On the contrary, their duty shows that the person of Jacob Hendrickse Maet, in case he shall be found in their jurisdiction, must be apprehended and taken under the keeping of justice, placed and confined in a secure place, until such a time as the state and condition of the patient Steven Janse (Coninck), shall have taken an favorable or unfavorable turn, in order that he may be dealt with as justice and right may demand. 7th July, A.D. 1655. (p. 233)³

A court document is found in Mortgages 1658-1660 of the Early Records of Albany series -- where Goosen Gerritsen [Van Schaick], Adiraen Jansen Appel and Philip Hendricksen appear as sureties for the fine of Steven Jansen (Coninck) at Fort Orange and Beverwyck in 1659. There is no further detail as to what this fine is for.¹

Steven Janse Coninck & Maria Goosens apparently divorced: "Articles of Separation between Steven Jans Coninck and Maria Goossens". "This day, the 29th of December 1663, appeared before me, Dirck van Schelluyne, notary public, and before the hereinafter named witnesses, Steven Jans Coninck and Maria Goosens, married people, making known that on account of divers disputes and differences (God help them) they, the appearers, now for more than eight years have kept apart and been separated from bed and board with the knowledge and consent of the honorable court of Fort Orange; and as there is no likelihood that the appearers (as they declare) will again unite to live together in quietness, peace, and godliness, therefore, in order to prevent further strife and mischief, they deliberately and after mature consideration do hereby fully and absolutely absolve each other henceforth and forever from their nuptial bonds and marriage relation, without ever holding any further intercourse with each other in any manner whatever, but on the contrary mutually grant each other freedom to marry, live and keep house...Respecting the children which they have begotten together, Maria Goosens shall at her own charge maintain, nourish and educate the same, he, Steven Jansz, renouncing his paternal obligations; and therefore Maria Goossens shall remain in full possession of the estate, all debts and credits for her own profit and loss. And as respects the debts which have been incurred by one or the other during their separation from each other, each shall assume and pay his own.... Witnesses were Arent van Curler, Commissioner and councilor, and Gerard Swart, sheriff. Both Maria and Steven signed by a mark.²

Maria/Mary Goosens m. (2) by NY license 12 Sep 1669, **James Matthys** (Matthews). See Maria's will under the entry for James Matthys/Matthews.

Jeams, Maria Gosens, witnessed the baptism 6 Nov 1672 NYC Ref Ch, of Marritie, dau. of Gysbert Gerritsen & Reyntie Stephens.

In August 1673 "Steeven Koonink's wife" was reimbursed 6 florins for having given "6 pounds of butter at 1 guilder a pound given to Hans "de backer's" [the baker's] wife". In a footnote, Venema says, "Steven Jansz Koninck's first wife was Mary Goosens. They were divorced in 1663. His second wife was Geertje Cornelis van Fulpen, widow of Cornelis van der Hoeven. She died in 1684."⁴

Steven Jansen Coninck received land in Kinderhook, NY in 1683.
