## -- KORTRIGHT --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

**Kortright** (also Kortregt; Kortryk, Cortright, Courtright)

Cornelis Jansen [ancestor of the Kortright family of Harlem]....[was]....born in 1645, at Beest, in Gelderland, he came out with his father, Jan Bastiaensen, in 1663...., and on November 8, 1665, married Metje, daughter of Bastiaen Elyessen, and widow of Claes Teunisz van Appeldorn; a lady who, after Jansen's early death, in 1689, proved her ability both to manage his business and enhance his estate, the use of which, under his will, dated February 25, of said year (but not proved till March 18, 1706), she was to enjoy till her death or remarriage. Having been a trooper, he gave his eldest son, Johannes "the best horse, and the best saddle, and the best boots, and the best pistols, and holsters, and carbine and cutlass." He also left him, over and above his share of the estate, "the lot of land at Jochem Pieters, to wit, the lot by the great gate." This was No. 3 of the old lots (afterwards Sickels'), and the gate must have stood at the upper corner of the Church Farm, where the road going north to Myer's narrowed from 4-1/2 to 3 rods, as finally fixed by a vote of the town in 1744.

Sebastian Van Kortryk left Kortryk in what is today Belgium and settled at Leerdam in South Holland. He had two sons:

- 1. Jan Bastiaense, b. about 1618
- 2. Michiel Bastiaense, b. about 1620

These two sons, with their wives (whose names we do not know) and their children, came to New Amsterdam arriving 16 April 1663 on *De Bonte Koe* (The Spotted Cow).

Jan Bastiaense, who had moved to Beest, Holland, had four children, all born in Holland:

1. Cornelis (Cornelis Jansen), b. about 1645; m. Metje, dau. of Bastiaen Eleyessen. Their descendants were the Harlem

branch of the Kortright family.

- 2. Hendrik (Hendrik VanBeest>Hendrik Jansen>Hendrick Jansen Van Kortright), b. about 1648; m. Catharina Hansen, dau. of Hans Webber. He eventually settled in Ulster Co., NY.
- 3. Lawrens (lawrens Jansen), b. about 1651; m. (1) Mary Roosa and (2) Wyntje Ariens. His descendants used the patronymic of his name, Louwrens>Louwe>Low.
- 4. Beletje, b. 1659; m. in Esopus 1670 Jacob Janse Decker.

Michiel Bastiaense (Giel Bastiaensen), lived at Schoernwaerd, about two miles from Beest. He had five children, the first four b. at Schoernwaerd, and the last born at Haarlem in New Amsterdam:

- 1. Reyer, b. about 1653, m. Jacomina Thibout. Their descendants used as surnames "Reyer" and "Michaels/Mekeel."
- 2. Metzje/Metje, b. about 1655, m. Hendrick Kiersen
- 3. Annetje, b. 1658, m. John Odell
- 4. Bastiaen, b. 1662, m. Jelante LaMontagne. Their descendants (through son Johannes, who m. Aeltje Vermilye) were the Fordham branch of the Kortright family.

"The first of the Courtright clan, of whom any knowledge has come down to us through the shrouding mists of almost four centuries, was named Sebastian. He was born about the year 1586, at Kortrijk, a city in West Flanders Province, Belgium, on the River Lys, 15 miles Northeast of Lille, France. Formerly when Flanders was under French influence Kortrijk was spelled Court-rai and pronounced cor-tray. The Dutch version Kortrijk (pronounced Kor-tri) is the direct origin of the family name "Courtright.".....Proceeding to Amsterdam, they all embarked April 16, 1663 in the ship Bonte-Koo (Brindle or Spotted Cow), Jan Bergen, Master, in which ship there also sailed several French refugees from Manheim, in the Palatinate. Men, women, children, there wer ninety-odd passengers, the French comprising a third. Each adult was charged 39 florins, children under ten, half price, and it cost Jan Bastiansen (Kortright) for himself, wife, and family, 204 florins 10 stivers. (This article concentrates on Jan Bastiansen.) The Bastiansen brothers, upon their arrival, first went to Stuyvesant's Bowery, though they soon after came to Harlem. Michael and his family, who settled first at Harlem and then at Fordham, were the ancestors of a flourishing and wealthy branch of the Courtright family in New York city whose history is covered thoroughly by Mr. Abbot. (John H. Abbot).....As the descendants of Michiel are not a part of this genealogy, we will leave him here. It may be of interest to mention, though, that his children and grandchildren, following the Dutch custom of taking the father's first name for their last name, originated the Mekeel (Michiel) and Reyer families in the New York area..... Michiel, the other son of Sebastian, married and lived at Schornewared about two miles from Beest. (This is after the father, Sebastian, left the wartorn land of his birth and settled at Leerdam in the province of South Holland, about 1615.) He (Michiel) and his wife were blessed with five children, the first four born at Schornewared, the last at Haarlem (New Amsterdam).

On 8 November 1665 in New York City DRC Cornelis Janszen had his intention to get married recorded. It reads "Cornelis Janszen, Van Brest [probably a mis-transcription for "Beest, Gelderland" and Metje Bastiaenszen Werckhoven, widow of Claes Theuniszen."

He was admitted 2 June 1670 to keep an ordinary (tavern/inn) in Harlem, NY. He was a constable in 1672, elected Captain of the Night Watch in 1673, overseer in 1674 and 1681, and commissioner of the town court 2 Feb 1686 and 1 Nov 1687.

Daniel Turner, Cornelius Jansen, Bastiansen and his brother, Samuel Jansen, Plaintiffs, against Colonel Lewis Morris. They complain that in July and August, 1679, "Contrary to Law and against the Publick Peace," the defendant did enter upon the meadows of the Plaintiffs upon Stone island, against New Harlem, and by force and arms did mow and cut down the grass and did carry away the hay, whereby they were much damnifyed.

In his will, he directed: 25 of February, 1689, appeared before me Jan Tibout, Clerk, admitted by the Mayors Court and residing in the town of New Harlem, and in the presence of the witnesses hereafter named. The worthy <u>Cornelis Jansen</u>, sick in body, lying on his bed, but in the full exercise and use of his understanding. He appoints after his decease, his lawful wife Meetye Bastianse, the guardian over all his estate until she shall marry, and then she shall be bound to give to her eldest son, Jan Cornelisen, preferable to the others, the lot of land at Jochem Pietersens, to wit, the lot by the great gate. Also the best horse, the best saddle, and the best boots, and the best pistols and holsters, and carbine, and then he shall share with the other brothers and sisters. And Daniel Devoor is to have a cow for his daughter, Meetie Daniels, when she is of age. And Jan Cornelis is to have a cutlass with his share of goods. This passed in the presence of Adolph Meyer, Constable, Johanes Cornelis,

overseer, and Jacob Turneur, in my presence. Jan Tibout, Clerk. Proved, March 18, 1705/6.

On 12 Feb 1669, he bought land near Stuyvesant's Bouwery, but did not hold it long, removing to Esopus.

Hendrick settled in Ulster County, NY, buying land at Mombackus, town of Rochester. He was among the list of early freeholders and inhabitants of the town and was assessed the sum of six shillings, ten pence, he being estimated at that time to be worth fifty-five pounds sterling in assessable wealth. On September 22, 1703 his name appears on the "Quit Rent" list. Hendrick Korteret and Catherina Korteret witnessed the baptism 1 July 1704 Kingston Ref Ch, of Hendrick, son of Jan Korteret and Maria Korteret.

Jan Bastiaensen sailed from the Netherlands on 16 April 1663 in the ship "De Bonte Koe" (The Spotted Cow). Jan is said to be from Leerdam (a town in the far western section of the province of South Holland). With him were his wife and four children ages 19, 15, 12, and 6 years old.<sup>1</sup>

Jan Bastiaensen Van Kortryck owned a bouwery on Staten Island in 1674 and is last mentioned in the records Jan. 8, 1677, when he is witness to a power of attorney, given by his old Schoonrewoerd friend, with whom he came over. Jan Louwe Bogert, to Hendrick Jansen Baker to collect money due Bogert on Brooklyn property sold to Thos. Lambert.

On Sept. 25, 1670, Jan Bastiaense, father, and Bastiaen Elyessen father-in-law of Cornelius Jansen, witnessed an agreement between Cornelius and Laurens Jansen his brother in re land transaction, Laurens then departing for Esopus and married

On 18 Nov 1841 Jack Earnest fell asleep "before the fire" at his home in Skunk Hollow, in what is now Alpine. He awoke as his clothing caught fire, and he ran outdoors, but before he could get his clothing off, he was mortally burned. He managed to put on a great coat and went to the house of a black neighbor, John Cortright, who lived a quarter of a mile distant. He survived until the following day, and died in the afternoon of Friday, November 19, 1841.

John bought property at what is now known as Skunk Hollow, Harrington Township, Bergen County, NJ before 1844; in or by 1850; and in or by 1854 (2 acres).1

John Courtride, 50, black, laborer, b. NJ, and Sarah Courtride, 36, black, b. NJ, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census. living in Harrington Township, Bergen County, NJ, probably in what is today Rockleigh or Alpine. Listed living with them was Mary E., 6, black, b. NJ.

In 1856 he was a trustee of the Skunk Hollow community church.<sup>1</sup>

Michiel Bastiaensen [Kortryk] was the son of Sebastiaen/Bastiaen Van Kortryk, and was the grandson of Sebastiaen Y Cortez.<sup>2</sup> Michiel/Chiel lived in the "Prince's Land near Schoonrewoerd, two miles north of Leerdam, Gelderland.

Michael Bastiaensen and his brother, Jan Bastiaensen, sons of Bastiaen [Van Kortryk, or Kortryk in Belgium] came to this country in 1663 from the County of Leerdam, or the Prince's Land\*, in South Holland. Michael Bastiaensen lived in Harlem. They immigrated, along with his brother Jan and his family, 16 April 1663, embarking from Rotterdam on *De Bonte Koe* [The Spotted Cow]. Giel Bastiaensen (Michiel, often called "Chiel" Kortright) immigrated with his wife and four children, aged 8, 9, 5, and 1 year of age. His brother, Jan Bastiaensen immigrated with a wife and four children, aged 19, 15, 12, and 6

Jan Bastiaensen [Michiel Bastiaenszen's brother] was the father of Cornelis Jansen (b. 1645), Hendrick Jansen (b. 1648; removed to Esopus), Laurens Jansen (ancestor of the Low family, b. 1651, m. 1673 Mary Roosa, dau. of Albert Roosa of Esopus), and Belitje Jansen (b. 1659, who m. in 1678 Jacob Jansen Decker of Esopus). Jan might have been the "Kortryck" who owned a bouwery on Staten Island in 1674.

Michiel Bastiaensen was charged an excise on "good bier" (strong beer, as opposed to "kleyn bier" — small beer) by the town of Harlem (NY) between 16 Jan and 22 July 1667.

In May 1670 Michiel Bastiensen [Kortrycht], residing at Fordham, was appointed curator of the estate of Kier Woltersen, dec'd.4
