The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

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LaRoe, LaRue, le Roux, etc.

The original spelling of the name appears to have been LeRoux. The family in Bergen County seems to have used the LaRoe and LaRue spellings of the name.

The immigrant, Jacques LeRue, came to America from Mannheim in the "Palz" (Palatinate), accompanied by sister Susanna and a probable relative [uncle?] named Abraham; and joined the Dutch Church at New York on March 1, 1677. He came to New Jersey with the Demarests and joined the Church at Bergen on October 7, 1678. In April and May of that year, he and Lawrence Ackerman obtained warrents for land at Tappan; also 300 acres on the Hudson River. He married in January 1681 at Bergen, Wybrecht Hendricks from that place. Three of his sons, Hendrick, Samuel, and ?Peter? settled on the Ramapo Tract in what is today northwestern Bergen County.

According to tradition, Abraham LeRoux/LaRoe was the cousin of Pierre LeRoux/Laroe, whose wife and children arrived in 1678 on *De Trouw*, along with Abraham (Pierre had died on the voyage, which originated in Holland).²

Magdaleine Gille was bp. 3 Dec 1662 NYC Ref Ch, as Marie Magdalena d'Usile, dau. of David d'Usile & Maria Kasier (wit: PhilipCorciruu, Peter Bolou, MarritieThymens, Jacomina Parasie).

At Kingston, Ulster Co., NY, 1 Sep 1689, Abraham Larew took the oath of allegiance to the Governor of New York.⁷

On 5 April 1694 Abraham Larew was elected Constable of Staten Island. On 1 April 1706 Abraham LaRue was elected Constable of the North Division of Staten Island.⁷

The will of Abraham LaRoe was dated 21 Sep 1702 Staten Island, but the estate was administered in NJ. In it he named wife Alshe; and mentioned, but did not name, their children. He bequeathed 8 cows to the children of Josua Creson "to be divided amongst them as they come of age." (Unrecorded wills, Burlington County, NJ, Liber 1:61-64) Administration of the estate was granted to "Olive" (presumably an Anglicization of Aeltje/Alshe on 14 June 1712 (West Jersey Wills, Liber 1:358, abstracted in *Calendar of New Jersey Wills* 1:282-83, New Jersey Archives, First Series, Vol. 23, 1901.)¹ In his will, dated 21 Sep 1702 Staten Island, Abraham Larue, yeoman; mentioned wife Alche, sole heiress. Children mentioned, but not by name. Movable and immovable estate. Witnesses--William Tillyer, Jean Casier, Louis du Bois, Samuel Grasset.⁴

Inventory of the personal estate of Abraham Larew/Larue, £380.1.7 1/2, incl. bills and bonds £138.2.3; made by John Parke and Andrew Smith; sworn to by the widow Olive La Rew, 8 Jan 1711/12. 14 Jun 1712 Administration on the estate granted to his widow, Olive La Rue, the will not having been properly proved, because some of the witnesses are dead and others cannot be reached.⁴

Like his father, he was a goldsmith. Bartholomew LaRoe was made a Freeman of New York City 6 June 1687.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage they were: Bartholomeus Le Roux, j.m. Van London, en Geertruyd Van Rollegom, j.d. Van N. Yorck, beyde Wonende alhier.

In his will, he wrote: 10 July 1713. I, Bartholemew Le Roux, of New York, silver smith, being sick in body. I make my wife Gertruyd, and my eldest son Charles Le Roux, executors. An inventory of my estate is to be made as soon as convenient after my decease, and my wife is to have the use of all my estate to assist her in bringing up my children. After her decease the estate to be divided among my children. Witnesses, Robert Darkins, Cornelius Lodge, John Conrad Codwise. Codicil confirms the above will, and mentions son, John Le Roux (other children not named). Proved, August 28, 1713. [NOTE.--Bartholemew Le Roux lived at what is now No. 27 Broadway. The Stevens House covers the site and that of adjoining lots.--W. S. P.]

In his will, dated 16 June 1753, proved 13 June 1760, he wrote: In the name of God Amen, I, Hendrick Laroe of Ramapogh in the County of Bergen and Eastern Division of the province of New Jersey, yeoman, being sick and weak in body but of a perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following, first I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to be buried at the discretion of my Ex-ecutors hereafter named and astouching the disposition of all such temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me. I give and dispose thereof as followeth. First I will that all my just debts and funeral charges shall be honorably paid

and discharged. Item. I give unto my eldest son Jacobus Laroe three pounds lawful money in right of his primogeniture or birth right. Item. I give unto my said son Jacobus Laroe one fourth part of that tract of land lying at Ramapogh in the County of Bergen where I now dwell on, which was to contain about five hundred and forty eight acres. The said Jacobus Laroe is to have it at that place where he now dwells thereof bearing even date with these presents, To hold the same unto the said Jacobus Laroe, his heirs and assigns forever, subject nevertheless to the raising of portions of the rest of my children as hereafter shall be directed. Item. I give unto my son Lambartus Laroe one fourth part out of my said tract of land, it being the South West part of said tract adjoining next to Samuel Laroe's according to the said map or cart of division thereof. To hold the same unto the said Lambartus Laroe, his heirs and assigns forever subject nevertheless to the raising of portions for the rest of my children as shall hereafter be directed. Item. I give unto my son Arie Laroe one fourth part of the aforesaid tract of land next adjoining to my son Jacobus Laroe at the North East side thereof according to the aforesaid map or cart of division made thereof, To hold the same unto the said Arie Laroe, his heirs and assigns forever, subject nevertheless to the raising of portions for the rest of my children. Item. I give unto my son John Laroe the remainder full fourth part out of the said tract of land lying between my said sons Jacobus and Lambartus their lotts where I now dwell on, also according to the aforesaid map or cart of the division thereof. To hold the same unto the said John Laroe, his heirs and assigns forever subject nevertheless to the raising of portions for the rest of my children as hereafter shall be directed. Item. I give unto my four sons, Jacobus Laroe, Lambartus Laroe, Arie Laroe and John Laroe, each of them an equal part or share of all my rights or title of in and to a certain cedar swamp lying upon the mountain near Staring commonly called and known by the name of Hagluegenonk cedar swamp. To hold the same unto the said Jacobus Laroe, Lambartus Laroe, Arie Laroe, and John Laroe, their heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give unto my loving wife Mary the full power and command to possess and enjoy all my estate both real and personal during she continue or remains my widow but in case she should happen to come to a new wedlock that then and in that case she shall have a good feather bed with furnature thereunto belonging, both woollen and linen, and in case her husband should happen to die that then she shall be reasonably maintained out of my estate by my four sons or the survivors of them. Item. I will and order that my four sons, namely Jacobus, Lambartus, Arie, and John Laroe, shall raise and pay the sum of one hundred and sixty pounds to my five daughters, namely Rachel, Jannetie, Margrit, Mary, and Catrin, four years after the decease of my wife or the death of each of them the sum of thirty two pounds to be equally raised and paid by my four sons, each of them the sum of forty pounds current money of the province of New Jersey. Item. I give unto my five daughters, namely Rachel, Jannetie, Marigret, Mary and Catrin after the decease of my said wife all the household goods to be equally divided amongst them and the remainder part of all my personal estate I will and order that all my just debts be paid out of the same by my Executors hereinafter named and the remainder part to be equally divided amongst all my children sons and daughters chare and chare alike. Item. I do nominate and appoint my loving wife Mary and my two sons Jacobus Laroe and Lambartus Laroe to be Executors of this my last will and testament, intreating them to cause the same to be punctually performed fulfilled and kept. Item. And lastly I do hereby revoke and make void all former and other wills by me heretofore made, declaring this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this sixteenth day of June in the twenty sixth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second over Great Brittain and King Anno Dom. one thousand and seven hundred fifty and three (June 16, 1753). Hendrick Laroe (his mark). Signed sealed published and declared by the said Hendrick Laroe to be his last will and testament in the presence of John Myers, Samuel Laroe by Mark, George Ryerse. Will proved June thirteenth 1760 before Uzal Ogden. Probate granted by Gov. Hardy and dated Nov. 7, 1761.²

On 5 August 1800, James and Cathalina Laroe, of Pompton Township, conveyed to Richard Francisco Jr. of Morris Co., for £1800, 73 acres...line of Robert Gold...and 11.1 acres adjoining. Signed by James Laroe, Cathalina Laroe. Witnessed by John Lozier, John Francisco.¹

On 23 May 1801 (recorded 22 February 1806, Bergen Co. X:124) James Laroe of the Township of Pompton, and Cathalina, his wife, conveyed to Garret Post of the same place, for \$1, 70-3/4 acres excepting 6 acres, in the Township of Saddle River; mentioned Peter Van Houten's line; land formerly of Gabriel Ogden, now deceased. Signed by James Laroe, Cathalina Laroe. Witnessed by Martin Ryerson, John M. Ryerson.³

Perhaps it was *this* James Laroe, innkeeper, who bought on 16 Mar 1804 from Captain William M. Bell, and his wife, Rachel, "the Hermitage" (or outlying land) at what is today Ho-Ho-Kus, Bergen County, NJ.

On 8 March 1803 (recorded 25 April 1804, Bergen Co. S:95) Cornelius Smith of the Township of Franklin, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to James Laroe of the City of New York, for \$1,450, 8-39/100 acres strict measure, being certain message Grist Mill and Saw Mill and lot in the Township of Franklin, beginning NE corner of Vegetable Garden known by name of the hermitage farm; mentions bridge below the Mills; Road formerly used by the Methodist Congregation to and from their Church. On 16 March 1804 (recorded 25 April 1804, Bergen Co. S:91) William M. Bell of the County of Bergen and Rachel, his wife, conveyed to James Laroe of the same place, for \$3,855, two certain messages in the Precinct of Franklin. (1) 98-3/10 acres more or less lying on Goghakes Brook; mentions Benjamin Odles lot; Hopper's line. (2) 151-74.100 acres more or less, beginning corner of highway in line of Henry Hopper's land; mentions corner of Peter Tebou's land; corner John Buskirk's land at W side of Brook; corner of Kingsland Patent; corner John Hopper's land; corner Prevost's tract of land, excepting all such lots as were sold by James Marcus Prevost in his lifetime to Benjamin Odel and Lewis Miltenbury, and all lots sold by said William M. Bell to Peter Alyea, John Van Blarcom and others, Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church; Abraham H. Hopper; John A. Hopper; Cornelius Smith and John Van Blarcom. Signed by W. M. Bell, Rachel Bell. Witnessed by G. I. H. Bell, Abrm. Westervelt.³

On 1 May 1806 (recorded 10 June 1806, Bergen Co. Y:81) James Laroe and his wife, Cathalina, of Bergen, conveyed to Samuel Garret of the County of Bergen, 57 acres more or less, a message in the Township of Bergen; mentioned line of Robert Gould. Signed by James Laroe, Cathalina Laroe. Witnessed by John Powlis, Abrm. Westervelt.³

On 17 May 1813 (recorded Bergen Co., H2:471), James Laroe of New Prospect and Cathalina, his wife, conveyed to John Cooper of the Township of New Barbadoes, for \$4,000., a parcel in the Township of Hackensack.³

Jacques Le Roux first appears in the records of New Harlem, 13 August 1673 when he took the oath of allegiance as Jaco el Roey, a young man. He was also called Jeams, Jacobus, and Jacob.

Their first banns were recorded on 2 January 1681 for "Jacob Lerou, young man, from Mannheim in the Palz [i.e. in German "Pfaltz" (the Palatinate)] and Wybrecht Hendricks, young woman, from Bergen [NJ]." They received a certificate on 25 January 1681 to get married in New York.

At their marriage, he was listed as "Jacob Lerou, Y.M., from Mannheim in the Palz" and she "from Bergen."

Jacques LeRue came to America from Mannheim in the "Palz" (Palatinate), accompanied by sister Susanna and a probable uncle named Abraham; and joined the Dutch Church at New York on March 1, 1677. There is a tradition that his father died at sea on the voyage over, and the mother landed in New Amsterdam about 1670, with four children: Jacques, Susanna, Marie and Anne.

On 7 Nov 1673, Jacques Le Roux was appointed one of the soldiers to serve on the night watch at New Harlem.⁵

Jacques LaRoe came to New Jersey with the Demarests and joined the Church at Bergen on October 7, 1678. In April and May of that year, he and Lawrence Ackerman obtained warrents for land at Tappan; also 300 acres on the Hudson River. One of the patents, dated 5 June 1678 read, in part: "By Phillip Carteret, Esq. Governor of New Jersey and his Councill -- Sir George Carteret Knight & Baronet Vice Chamberlaine of His Majestys Household One of his Majtys Most Honourable Privy Counsell & Lord Proprietor of the Province above sd Have given & Granted & by these Presents do give & grant unto Jacques La Roue of Harlemes Weaver & Laurance Ackerman of the sd place & Calling a Tract of Land Lying and being on the W. side of Hudsons River containing Three Hundred Acres of upland Allowance given for Mountains and Rocks." Winston C. Perry, Jr., believes this land was along the Hudson from present-day Piermont to Grand-View-on-Hudson, almost to South Nyack. The grant was conditional and required that three families be settled on it within two years. There is no indication that LaRoue or Ackerman ever settled on their patent that is today in Rockland County, NY. Parts of the same land were later sold to Dow Harmonson (tallman) on 11 May 1681; and Teunis Rolelofsen (Van Houten) on 6 May 1684. A southern portion was known as Little Claes the Indian's Plantation.⁴

He married in January 1681 at Bergen, Wybrecht Hendricks from that place. On April 24, 1682, he and Anthony Hendrickson were given a patent for 120 acres near the Hackensack River, followed by a deed on December 20, 1685 for the same land. He purchased 220 acres from Gawen Lawrie on May 8, 1686, lying between the Hackensack River in Oradell and the Sprout Brook in Paramus, partly along the north side of what is now Ridgewood Avenue. He joined he Dutch Church at Hackensack on April 5, 1696 "with letters from the French Church." On April 24, 1702, he purchased from the Indians a large

tract of land now in Emerson and Harrington Park, in partnership with Jean Aliee, his brother-in-law. This was confirmed in 1727 by a deed from Peter Sonmans made to Jacques, Hendrick and Samuel "LaRoux," as well as Peter "Alier," and Nicholas "LeSieur."

1697 April 27. Patent to Albert Stephenson [Van Voorhees], Hackinsack R., for 75 acres in Essex Co. on said river betw. David Akarman, formerly Jacque Lerne [Laroe?], and John Berrie.⁶

He died probably in 1730, leaving a will dated November 14, 1728, proved September 2, 1730, in which Jeams Laroe of Bergen County, yeoman, named his wife Wybreggh, and children, Hendrick, Samuel, Abraham, Jannecke, Mary, Ann, and Margrit. He also named grandchildren -- children of daughters Suzanna and Angenitie; daughter of son Peter. He mentioned real and personal estate. Executors -- sons Hendrick, Samuel, and Abraham. Witnesses -- Richard Edzall, Abram Brouwer, Elezibeth (sic) Brower." The will was proved on 2 September 1730.

Some of these children had been baptized in the French Church. The name in Bergen County was later generally spelled Laroe/LaRoe or LeRue/LaRue.

On 12 Dec 1730, Hendrick Laroe, Samuel Laroe, yeoman, both of Rampogh, Beregn County, NJ, and Wybreggh Laroe, their mother and widow, of Hackensack, Bergen Co., NJ, [sold] to Abraham Laroe, yeoman, of Hackensack, Bergen Co., NJ, [for] £18, 60 acres ... James Laroe and John Alyee, both deceased, purchased of Indians ... formerly bounded by Gawen Lau-ries, but now by Peter Fauconnier ... sold in presence of Peter Sonmans to said James Laroe, Nicholas Lozier and Peter Alyee, son of said John Alyee ... said James Laroe in his will, 14 Nov 1728, gave to wife Wybreggh Laroe and sons, Hendrick Laroe, Samuel Laroe and Abraham Laroe. Wit: Jonathan Traphagen, William (x) Alex, Abraham (x) van Gelder, Jan (x) Banta, Wybreggh (x) van Bussum and John Christeen.¹

daughters of the said Testator/ to wit / Helena the wife of Gerret Ackerman, Elizabeth the wife of Peter Post, Margaret the wife of the said Johannes Laroe and Rachel the wife of David Ackerman, and to their one every of their heirs and assigns for ever All that part of the Real Estate of the said Testator Commonly known and Called by the name of the Homestead Farm at Wykoff Containing One Hundred and Thirty Seven acres. Together with all and Singular the Hereditments and Appurtening. To Have and to Hold, unto him the said Abraham Van Gelder his heirs and assigns To the only Proper use benefit and behalf of him the said Abraham Van Gelder and to his heirs and assigns for ever. Van Voorhees of Franklin Township, for £10, quit claim their interest in property John Van Voorhees willed to his son Adam Van Voorhees 137 acres, and after the death of said Adam Van Voorhees, the land would pass to his four daughters, Helena, wife of Garret Ackerman, Elizabeth, wife of Peter Post, Margaret, wife of Johannes Laroe, and Rachel, wife of David G. Ackerman and said Rachel died, leaving children, the said John D. Ackerman and the said Rachel, wife of James McColly. Signed by John D. Ackerman, James McColly, Rachel McColly (her mark). A Bergen County Road Return dated 3 July 1759 was recorded at the request of Coenraat Frederiks, regarding a road "in the precinct of Saddle River in the county of Bergen at a place called Mawier." The road to be continued "leads from Saml Bushes to Ramapough and Laroes Mills"; they altered the road that leads from Laroes Mills to the Road that leads from Ramapough to Hackensack that was laid out in the year 1758. The surveyors laid out "another Road from Saml. Samuel and his wife, with letters from Tappan, were accepted into the Dutch Reformed Church of Hackensack 13 Apr 1723, upon confession of faith. In 1731 he was an Elder in the Dutch Reformed Church of Schraalenburgh. He later removed to Ramapo, New Jersey, where he held large amounts of land.

Samuel's will was dated 29 Apr 1760, pr. 9 Oct 1761. In his will, he wrote: In the name of God Amen. I, Samuel Laroe of Ramapough in the County of Bergen and Eastern Division of the province of New Jersey being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God, I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, first I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and as touching the disposition of all such temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me, I give and dispose thereof as followth. First I will that all my just debts and funeral charges shall be Honourably paid and fischarged. Item. I give unto my eldest son Jacobus Laroe ten acres of land in right of his primogeniture or birth right. Itwm. I give unto my said son Jacobus one third part of all that tract, lot of land or plantation where I now drell on containing three hundred nynthey six acres so that said son is to have one hundred and forty tue acres where we now dwell, to hold the same unto the said Jacobus Laroe, his heirs and assigns for ever. Item. I give unto my daughter Wayborough one thord part of all that tract, lott or plantation where she now dwells, containg three hundred ninthy acors, so that my said daughter Wayborough is to have one hundred and twenty seven eacors to hold the same unto the said Wayborough, her heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Mary one thurd part of all that tract, lott or plation where she now dwells, containing three ninthy six eacors so that my said daughter Mary is to have one hundred and twenty seven acres to hold the same unto said Mary, her heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give unto my son Jacobus and my daughter Mary each of them the half of the new mill. Item. I give unto my daughter Wayborough the old grist mill and the saw mill to my son Jacobus one ghalf and the other half to my daughter Wayborough to hold for their property forever. Item. My will and pleasure further is that my movebels goods shall be sold by my Executors hereafter named to pay my just debts adn the remainder part of my personal extate I will and order that it shall be equally divided among my said children, son and Daughters share and share

alike. Item. I do nominate and appoint my son Jacobus Laroe and my two sons in law, John Bertholf and Jacob Kogh to be executors of this my last will and testament, entreated them to cause the same to be punctually performed, fulfilled and kept. Item. And lastly revoke and make void all former and other wills made by me heretofore made, declaring this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of April in the turthy second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second over Great Brittain and King Anno Dom. one thousand seven hundred sisthy (1760). Signed and Sealed, published and declared by the said Samuel Laroe to be his last will and testament in the presence of Lambartus Laroe. Jacobus Laroe. John Myer. Samuel La Rue (his mark). Proved 9 Oct 1761.

On 15 August 1763, Jacobus Laroe and Johannes and Weybrough Bertholf, conveyed to Mary Cough, division of property...Samuel Laroe willed 29 April 1760 divided his real estate between the three parties of these presents...On 12 May 1762, George Ryerson made the division...to Mary Cough, tract in Saddle River Precincty containing 57 acres...also tract of 10 acres.
