The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Barney Laback, 43, wheelwright, and Eliza, 38, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Manchester Township, Passaic County, NJ. Listed living with them were: John, 17; Alfred, 12; Elizabeth A., 9; Emma, 2. Also living with them were: James Meyers, 18, wheelwright; William Van Cleef, 16, wheelwright; Hannah Van Cleef, 53; and Mariah Van Cleef, 17.

Barney Laubaugh, 63, wheelwright, and Eliza A., 57, Keeping House, were listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in the 1st Ward, City of Paterson, Passaic County, NJ. Living in the same dwelling, but separate family, were: William Burch, 26, stone mason (b. MA), and Emma, 21, with [Mordallis?] Burch (male), 2; and Lillie Burch, 1/12 (b. April).

Barney Laback, 72, and Eliza Laback, 66, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living at 34 Arch Street in Paterson, Passaic County, NJ. He was a wheelwright. Living with them were their two sons, John Henry and Alfred, and two grandchildren, Carrie Birch, 10, and Edward Birch, 9. Also living with them was Eliza Van Ripper, 55, a widow, boarder, a tailoress. All were b. NJ.

Henrich Labach emigrated with his parents with the group of Palatines in 1709/1710. The prob. parents are cited on the Hunter List of 1 July 1710 with 2 pers. over 10 years of age, who would seem to have been this Henrich Labach and his probable brother, John Labach.

Elizabeth Lescher (Lescherin, Lizard, Lessjerin, etc.) came with her widowed mother and brothers and sisters with the German Palatine emigration in 1709/10. She was apprenticed (as Elizabeth Lizard, age 13) to James Leigh of New York 24 Oct 1710. Her mother, Magdalena Santbergen, widow of Jacob Leffjerin, m. (2) 28 Feb 1714 NYC Ref Ch, **Jacob Bosch**.

In the NYC Ref Ch marriage record, they were: Hendrik Labach, j.m., met Elizabeth Lesjer, j.d., beide uit H. Duidslt en woonende alhier.

"Hendrik Labbah" was admitted, with letter, into the Hackensack Dutch Reformed Church in 1727. His wife, "Elizabeth Lezsher" was admitted to the church in 1729. "Hendrik Labag and Elisabeth Lesjer, syn h.v." were admitted to the NYC Ref Ch from Hackensack 22 Aug 1748.

NJ Marriage License: Henry LeBagh of Hackinsack, cooper, and Henry Butler of Staten Island, farmer... [bound to]... Jonathan Belcher, Governor... 500 pounds... 11 May 1751. ... Henry LeBagh... obtained license of marriage for himself and for Sarah Johnson of Hackinsack af'd, spinster... [w] Thos Bartow.

Henry Labagh, Cooper, was made a Freeman of New York City 1 Oct 1765.

According to a List of Prisoners Taken at Hackensack, one was "Henry Labach a Cooper employed in the Enemys Service on Board ye Sloop at Hackensack."²

Hendrick may be the "Henry Lawboch" listed (after John Rose and before Henry Carlogh) in the 1779 Frankin Township Rateables as a householder. Henry Labach is listed (after Joseph Clark and before Jonathan Vangelder) in the 1780 Franklin Township Rateables, with 30 acres improved land, 70 acres unimproved land, 1 horned cattle, 4 hogs.

In 1781 Henry Laback was one of the Roadmasters of Franklin Township.

Labagh, Henry

Henry Lobach, from nine miles off toward Pyramus, a tory from Ramapough, captured and taken prisoner in Clinton's raid on English Neighborhood, 19 Dec. 1776.¹

Henry Labagh served in the 4th Battalion Of New Jersey Volunteers (Loyalist) under Capt. Peter Rutan's Company at Staten Island. He was listed in Muster Rolls for that company between 1777 and 1781 as follows: Staten Island, November 18, 1777, Private Henry Lawback, enlisted 7 Dec 1776, Taken prisoner 29 Dec 1776; Staten Island 6 Jan 1778, Private Henery Laubuck, taken prisoner 29 Dec 1776; Staten Island, March 1778, Private Henry Lawback, Prisoner with Ye Rebels; Staten Island, May 1778, Private Henry Lawbock, prisoner; Staten Island, July 1778, Private Henry Lawbock, Prisoner with ye Rebels; Staten Island (no month given, poss Aug or Sept) 1778, Private Henry Lawback, Prisoner with ye Rebels; Staten Island, (no month given, possibly Oct), 1778, Private Henry Lawback, Prisoner; (no date or place given poss Jan 1779), Private Henery Lawbock, Prisoner with the Rebels; Powles Hook, 7 July 1779, Private Henry Clauback, Prisoner with ye Rebels; (no place or date, but poss. He may be the Henry Lawback, aged 40-50, listed in the 1830 Federal Census, living in Acquackanonk Township, Essex Co., NJ, near [his son?] Henry Lawback. He was listed with his supposed wife, aged 40-50; one son 10-15; one son 15-20; and one dau., aged 15-20.

He may be the Henry Labock on the June 1802 Tax List for Saddle River, Bergen Co., NJ (p. 7).

This Henry Laback possibly was a witness for the following transaction:

On 16 December 1805 (recorded 29 December 1805, Bergen Co. Isaac P. Labagh was a graduate of Dickinson College (1823) and at the New Brunswick theological seminary, where he graduated in 1826. He was ordained 24 Dec 1826 in New York. He was successively pastor of Dutch Reformed churches at Rochester and Gravesend, NY until 1842, when he was suspended for his opinions concerning the second advent and the Christian Sabbath.¹

He was suspended by the Classis of the Church in 1842 and joined the Protestant Episcopal Church. (He was succeeded on

22 Jan 1843 by a cousin, Rev. Abraham Labagh, from the island of St. Thomas, West Indies.)

He was for some years missionary to the Jews in New York City, and organized and built St. Paul's church, Haddonfield, NJ, and also St. Paul's church, South Brooklyn. In 1860 he removed to Illinois, and established a female seminary, Euphemia Hall, and after its destruction by fire in 1863 he organized and built St. Peter's Church at Cairo. He next removed to Fairfield, IA, and was pastor of St. Peter's church there until his death.¹

Isaac P. Labagh published "A Sermon on the Personal Reign of Christ" in 1846. He was Rector of Calvary Church, Brooklyn, NY in 1859, when he published Twelve Lectures on the Great Events of Unfulfilled Prophecy. He published "Theoklesia, or the Organization, Perpetuity, Conflicts, and Triumphs of the One Holy, Catholic Apostolic Church" in 1868.¹

Both Peter and Livingston Labagh were named in their grandfather's will.

Peter Labagh was educated in Hackensack, NJ under Dr. Peter Wilson, and served in churches in New York, Pennsylvania

and Kentucky before going to the Harlingen Ref. Dutch Church in Somerset Co., NJ in 1809. He organized a Reformed Dutch Church near Harrodsburg, Kentucky in 1796 (church of Salt River, in Mercer Co., KY). He was pastor in Greenbush, Rensselaer Co., NY until 1809. and afterward of the united churches of Shannock and Harlingen till 1844. He was elected a trustee of Queens (now Rutgers) College in 1811, and had the degree of D.D. conferred on him by that institution in the same year. He contributed largely to securing the endowment of the theological seminary at New Brunswick, was active in the councils of his church, and a powerful preacher. A memoir of him was published by the Rev. John A. Todd, D.D. in 1860.⁵

He was a clergyman of the Reformed Dutch Church for over 50 years.

From Mercer County Kentucky Court Order Books, Book # 3 page 310: Rev. Peter Labaugh is granted licence too solomize rites of marriage and he entered into a bond of 500 lbs with James Staggs and John Smith his sureties.⁴
