The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In the 1706 census, Abraham gave his age as 45.¹

In his will, he wrote:...March 25, 1734. I, Abraham Lakermans, of the County of Richmond, Gent., being very sick. After the payment of debts and funeral charges, I give and devise my farm or plantation whereon I now live at Old Town, in said County, to my three daughters, Hester, wife of Nicholas Lazelier, Catharine, wife of John Morgan, and Elizabeth, wife of John Vandeventer, all of Richmond County. I also leave to each of them £100. My executors are to sell, "at a publick vendue," my two dwelling houses in New York, one fronting Wall street, and now in tenure of James Searle; and the other on Dock street, now in tenure of Sharmin Goldsmith, with the lots; And also my grist mill and lot on the Great Kill, in the County of Richmond; and also my woodland in said County between the Fresh Kill lots, and the land formerly of William Barker. My personal estate is also to be sold at a public vendue. If any of my slaves prove stubborn, or obstinate, or disobedient, they are to be sold by my executors. And whereas I am bound that my wife Anje shall have £100, and a negro girl "Beth," the said girl is to be delivered to her. Out of the remainder of my estate, my son Jacob, and my daughter Mary, wife or widow, of Nicholas Matisen, shall be provided for with reasonable dwelling, meat, drink, washing, lodging, and apparell, during their lives. After

their decease, all my estate is to be divided among my children in such proportions as my executors may think proper. I appoint my trusty and well-beloved friends, Gosen Adrians, of Richmond County, and Rem Vanderbeek, of New York, Gent., and Jaques Cortelyou, Sr., of New Utrecht, in Kings County, and my 3 sons-in-law, Nicholas Lazelier, John Morgan and John Vandeventer Gent., of Richmond County, my executors. (The names of part of the children are not given.) Witnesses, Jacob Bergen, Nicholas Stillwell, Samuel Thurston. Proved, April 23, 1734.

In his will, he wrote: ...March 12, 1759. I, Abraham Lockermans, of Staten Island, yeoman, being sick. I leave to my son Abraham a sorrel horse and a gun. I leave to my son Walter the 14 acres of land I purchased from the executors of Peter Perlieu, Also the 16 acres purchased of John Grandine, the easternmost part of it joining the said 14 acres. All the rest of the land, which is about 19 acres, and 4 acres bought of Jonathan Lewis, and the home lot in Fresh Kills, and my salt meadow in Fresh Kills, and my lot of meadow in Great Kills, the same are to be sold with my personal property, at the discretion of my executors, for the bringing up of my children, and then to be divided among all my children, except my sons Abraham and Walter. My wife Sarah is to be in full possession "and to be Mistress during her widowhood." I make Benjamin Seaman, Esq., and Henry La Tourette, and my wife, executors. Witnesses, James Poillon, Barent Slaght, John Jones. Proved in Richmond County, before Benjamin Seaman, Surrogate, April 14, 1760.

In the marriage record they were: "Pieter Lakeman, j.m. Van Staten Eylt., en Jannetje Stavast, Wede. Van Evert Wesselszen, D'Erste wonende op t Staten Eylt, entwede alhier."

In her will, she wrote: In the name of God, Amen. "I, Jannetie Lakerman, of New York, widow of Peter Lakerman, bolter, and heretofore the widow of Evert Wessells, cooper." Whereas I have paid to the children of Evert Wessells their full portion with a good overplus of their father's estate, according to an agreement made by him, I leave to my son in law, Jacob Bratt, baker, and Nicholas Eyres, brewer, the husband of my grand daughter, Grietie, daughter of my daughter, Gertie Splinter, deceased, all my estate, real and personal. In trust to sell the same within 12 months, and the proceeds are to be divided into three parts, 1/3 to my five grand children, the children of my son Wessell Everts, deceased, viz., Evert, Lucas, Nicholas, Johannes and Catharine; 1/3 to my grand daughter Grietie Eyres; and 1/3 to my grand children Susannah, Janettie, Evert, Barent,

and Nicholas Bratt, the children of my daughter Affie, deceased, by my son in law Jacob Bratt. If my grand son, Evert Wessells, makes any pretence as heir at law, and seems not well satisfied with the division he shall be cut off from his share. I make Jacob Bratt and Nicholas Eyres executors. Dated June 20, 1726. Witnesses, William Walling, David Le Tellier, Henry Wileman. Proved, September 29, 1726. [NOTE.--The house of Peter Lakerman, where the testatrix lived, is now Nos. 51-53 Stone street, New York. Her grand son in law, Nicholas Eyres, lived on the east side of Broad street, between Stone street and Mill street (now South William street). It was at his house that the first Baptist meetings were held in this city.--W. S. P.]
