

Christoffel Johanis [Langestraat]
d. before 22 Dec 1755

Christoffel Johanis (Langestraat) of Gowanus, on 7 Sep. 1695, conveyed to Woughter Van Pelt of New Utrecht 40 acres of land and meadows at Gowanus lying between the land of Simon Aesen (De Hart) and those of Maria widow of Thomas Van Dyck, deceased, fronting on the bay, and bounded on the rear by the common woods, as formerly in possession of Johannis Cristoffel Schaers, deceased, as per pg. 74 of Vol. II of Con.

In his will - dated 15 May 1745; probated 22 Dec. 1755; on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, Albany - he devises his Brooklyn and New Jersey property to the children of Wouter Tunis Van Pelt.

In his will, dated 20 April 1755 Shrewsbury, Monmouth Co., NJ, Gisbert Longstreet mentioned wife Rachel. Children--Garret, Gisbert (both under age), Moyca, Nelley, Jane and Rachel. Real and personal estate. Executors--James Irons, Sr., Garret Scanck and John Longstreet, Sr. Witnesses--Koert Schenck, Garret Schanck and Nelley Schanck. Codicil of August 31, 1757, provides that a part of the bequest, given to dec'd daughter Jane, alias Onicha, be given to grandson, Guisberd Lake, mentions children of dec'd daughter Moica and a daughter Elizabeth. Witnesses--Moses Richards, Thomas Ellison and John Lake, Proved Nov. 8, 1753. (Lib. G, p. 4.) 1758, Nov. 13. Inventory, £1265.15.10, incl. bills, bonds, book debts and cash, £704.18.4; 320 bush. of Indian corn, £32; 3 Dutch books, 10s.; others 12s.; half a book called "the Confesions," £1; two looking glasses, 16s.; 2 negroes, £100; made by Thomas Ellison, Ebenezer Cook and David Johnston, with James Irons, Jr., as clerk.

He was the brother of Pieter Janszen Rommen [Van Langstraat].

In their marriage record, they were: Jan Janszen Van Langestraet, en Marritjen Arents Van Zutphen.

They were members of the New York Dutch church in 1686, and lived on Princes (now Beaver) street, east of Broad street. Their descendants seem to have adopted the name of Rommen, Rommo, Rome and Roome, or variants thereof.

According to Dorothy Koenig, her "educated guess" involving Jan Janszen's name is that "Romme" was the given name of Jan Janszen Rommen Van Laangstraat's grandfather. According to A. Huizinga's "Encyclopedie van voornamen", Romme is a shortened form of the given name "Rommert", itself taken from the Latin name of one Saint Romaricus. (The well-known New Netherlander Rem Janszen Vanderbeeck's more formal name was "Remmert", the form that appears in his wedding intentions.) One of the alternative ways in Dutch of forming a possessive is to add the letter -n; so Jan Rommen would be a way of saying "Jan, the son of Romme/Rommert."¹

June 16, 1657, Pieter Jansz Romeyn, widower of Dirckie Jansz Van Meffelen, intends to marry Maritie Juryaens, y.d. of Copenhagen. Romeyn has minor son about 6 years old, Jan Pietersz, issue of his marriage with Dirckie Jansz. Jan Ruthersz, Grandfather of child & Jan De Jongh appointed guardians. (Ref: Dutch Records in the City Clerks Office, NY)²

In the (2) marriage record, they were: Pieter Janszen Van de Langestraet, Wedr, Van Dirckje Jans, en Marritje Jeuriaens, Van Copenhagen in Deenmarcken.

Pieter Jansen Langestraet was a tavern keeper, in partnership with Severyn Laurenszen.¹

In his will (signed Stoffel Langstraat), dated 1739, December 1. Longstreet, Theophilus, of Shrewsbury Township, Monmouth Co., yeoman, will of: Wife, Mercy. Eldest son Richard, plantation he lives on, on Manasquan River, old gun, and £50. Second son Gilbert, plantation where he lives on same river. Third son, Aury, land at Raritan, where he lives. Fourth son, Theophilus, land in said town on Long Branch and Raccoon Island. Daughters -- Yonica, Catherine, Mary, Sarah, Moica and Anne. Executors -- four sons. Eldest daughter Yonica, to have old loom. Witnesses -- John Little, Thomas Wainwright, Jon. Seares, and Jacob Dennis. Signed "Stoffel Langstraat." Proved March 1, 1741. Lib. C, p 491. (Calendar of New Jersey Wills, Vol II, p 304. 1730-1750 #1001M)

In her will, dated 8 April 1752 Shrewsbury Township, Monmouth Co., NJ, Moicae Longstreet, widow, mentioned children--Stoffel. Gisbert, Jeane, Cattren, Marcy, Sary, Masy and Anne. Personal estate. Executors--son Gisbert, John Little and William Hendrickson. Witnesses--Jeames Jorns (Trons), Gershom Bills, John Lake. Proved March 13, 1758. (Lib. F, p. 105.) 1753, Mar. 20. Inventory, £147.13, incl. half of a Bible, 15s.; a sermon book, 5s.; bonds and debts, £110.15.2; made by Thomas Ellison and William Osbourn.

- **Dirck Longstreet** (Richard), d. about 1760; m. about 1720, **Alice Osborn**, dau. of Samuel Osborn & Catherine Poillon. In his will, "Richard of Shrewsbury" who wrote will #2659M, dated 12-23-1759, proved 4-18-1761. Richard, in his will, refers to his wife "my well-adored Alice". [She was the dau. of Samuel Osborn (1680-1754) of Shrewsbury, whose will #2307M, dated 3-21-1754, names his fourth child as "Alice Longstreet".] Richard also refers to a plantation at Manasquan which his father "bought of John West and by his will gave to me" Richard named as his children: eldest son then living, Samuel; two younger sons, Awrey and Richard; three older daughters, viz. Catherine, Moica and Mary; daughters Alice and Ann; two grand-daughters by eldest son Stophel deceased, viz. Catherine and Alice. (Calendar of New Jersey Wills, Vol. IV; 1761-1770 #2659-2664M Lib.
