The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Bounded N by land of said Abraham Foshee; E by land of Harmanus Van Zile; S land formerly Zabriskie's and Garret Hopper; W by public Road. Signed by Abraham Foshee, Elizabeth Foshee (her mark). Witnessed by Garret A. Ackerman, Jacob Bamper.⁴

His property in Franklin Township is mentioned in January 1811 Bergen Co. Road Return (D:239) applying for vacation of "The Shunpike" in the Allendale area.

George Lawrence, age 80, a resident of Franklin Township, Bergen County, testified on 10 Feb 1835, in the Bergen County Court of Common Pleas at the application for a Revolutionary War Pension for Peter Allen, that he remembered Lt. John Blauvelt, Ensign John Myers, and Orderly Sgt. John Acker.³

John Lawrence was the brother of William Lawrence of Flushing, NY and Thomas Lawrence of Massachusetts, New Haven CT, and Newtown, Queens Co., NY.

John and William Lawrence were the first to emigrate. John, then a youth of seventeen, with his brother William, aged twelve, and his sister Maria (Mary), a child of nine years, embarked in the ship *Planter*, April 1635, and landed in Massachusetts.

The Lawrence children were in company with John Tuttell, a mercer, Joan Tuttell and four Tuttell children. John T. Tuttell was doubtless, stepfather to these three Lawrences. These passengers, with others, had a certificate from the minister at St. Alban's, Hertfordshire, and it is a fair supposition that they came from that parish or vicinity.¹

John and William Lawrence subsequently came to this province, where John was one of the six persons to whom the patent of Hempstead was granted by Gov. Kieft in 1644.

In 1645 John and his brother William, with several others, obtained the patent of Flushing, where John Lawrence established his residence, but soon after removed to New Amsterdam, where he held important public positions under both the Dutch and English. He was appointed alderman of New York under the English government in 1665, was afterwards mayor, and for a number of years was a member of the council. In 1692 he was appointed a judge of the supreme court, an office he held until his death in 1699.

His will states that he was then more than eighty years old. He had six children, all of whom, except Thomas, married, but none left issue that reached maturity save Mary. In his will, he wrote: 7th day of January, 1698, I, John Laurence, Sr., citizen of New York, in America, being in perfect health but well stricken in years, being above 80 years of age, and calling to remembrance the mortality of this transitory life." "I direct my body to be buried in such place where it shall please my heirs and executors to appoint, with the decency that they shall think meet according to my Quality and the estate I leave." The houses wherein I dwell in New York are to be at the disposal of me and my wife during our lives. Together with the rents of the house and land in Smith's Vly. All goods and property to be at his wife's disposal, except such goods as have been given to our daughter Martha, widow of Thomas Snowfell, who hath lived with me since her husband went from her, being now above seventeen years. And as concerns my estate in land as a patentee in Hempstead and Flushing and the only survivor in both, in Queens County, to be divided, with all the privileges whatsoever, granted by Patent to me, as appears under the hand and seal of Colonel Richard Nicholls, then Governor; bearing date June 15, 1665. Which lands I order to be divided to each of my children, John, Thomas, Martha, widow of Thomas Snowfell, and Susannah, wife of Gabriel Minville. After the death of my wife all the estate in New York is also to be divided among the children. Leaves legacies to "my daughter Willingham's children," and to "the daughter of my son Joseph," to be at the discretion of my executors. "And so, I pray God to bless them as my children and make them his children by faith and love in Christ." Makes his wife executor, and his son in law, Gabriel Minville, and his son Thomas, and daughter Martha to assist her. (Names of witnesses not given.) Richard, Earl of Bel-lomont, Governor, etc. To all, etc. Know ye, that at New York, the 15 day of May, 1699, the last will of John Laurence was proved and Letters of administration granted to his widow, Susannah Laurence.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Lawrence, of Newtown, in Queens County, being in a tolerably good state of health. I direct all debts paid. "I leave to my wife Patience all the use and income of all my Plantation on which I now live, with all the utensils for carrying on the Farming business." I also leave her my horses and 8 cows, and two negro boys and a girl, during her life or widowhood. If she remarries, she is to deliver up the farm to my children, and is only to have the use of a negro wench and £16 per annum, to be paid by my children, and the use of the household goods. I leave to my youngest son Daniel a negro boy, and he is to pay to his brother Samuel £20. I leave to my eldest son Joseph £5, over and above his equal share, it being in consideration of his birthright. I appoint all my children, viz., Samuel, Joseph, Richard, William, Thomas, Jonathan, and Daniel, and William Sackett, husband of my daughter Anna, executors. It is my desire that my farm shall be in the possession of any one of my sons who shall be the highest bidder, and all my children to share equally in my estate, except my daughter Anna, who shall have £60 less. In her will, she wrote: ...I, Patience Laurence, of Newtown, in Queens County, widow, "being somewhat indisposed in body." I direct all debts to be paid. My executors may sell all my estate to the highest bidder, and divide the money among my children, Joseph, Richard, William, Thomas, Samuel, Jonathan, and Daniel Laurence, and Anna Sackett. I leave to my daughter, Anna Sackett, all my wearing apparell. I leave to my cousins, John Laurence, son of William Laurence, and John Sackett, son of William Sackett, Nathaniel Laurence, son of Thomas, Richard Laurence, son of Joseph, John Laurence, son of Daniel, Jonathan Laurence, son of Jonathan, Joseph Sackett, son of William, John Pinfold, son of Richard, and Joseph Riker, son of Samuel, œ5 each. All the rest of my estate I leave to my children, Joseph, Richard, William, Thomas, Samuel, Jonathan, and Daniel, and Ann Sackett. I make my sons, Joseph, Thomas, and Daniel, executors. Dated May -- 1772. Witnesses, John Kearns, William Leveritch, Samuel Moore, 3d. Proved, November 18, 1772.

I leave to the eldest son that I may have by my wife Catharine, "in case I shall have any, and more than one," the dwelling house and message where I now live, near Coenties market, in the Dock Ward. All the rest of my estate to my children if I shall have any. But if I have no children, then I leave to my wife Catharine as much money as I had with her at our marriage; a particular account of which is entered in my Book, and all the estate that was left to her by her father, Philip Livingston, Esq. Also £1,000 and the interest on £3,000 while she remains my widow. Also the household furniture and a negro man and boy and the use of my dwelling house, she paying the Quit rent and taxes. I leave to my brothers all my apparell. I leave to John Lawrence, son of Lena De Forest, £2,000 when of age. I leave to Deborah, Elizabeth, Hannah, and Mary, the daughters of my uncle, Nathaniel Lawrence, and to my niece, Anna Lawrence, daughter of Joseph Lawrence, each £100. To John, son of my brother, Nathaniel Lawrence, £30. To Mr. Philip Van Brugh Livingston £50, to buy him a suit of mourning. And all the dwelling house and lots, and all that I have given to my wife during her widowhood, I leave to my brothers and sister. My executors may sell real estate except the house where I now live. I make my wife and Philip Van Brugh Livingston and my brothers, executors. "Written on four sheets of paper." Dated August 11, 1761. Witnesses, James Brinkhoff, Anthony Ten Eyck, John Hamersly. Codicil.--Whereas, my brother Nathaniel has died, and whereas I have for certain reasons seen fit to revoke the legacy of £100, left to my niece Anna, daughter of my brother Joseph. And whereas, I have purchased a house and lot fronting Duke street and runs to Mill street, in the Dock Ward, my executors are to sell the same. And I leavethe proceeds and the £100 left to my niece to my brothers and sister. Dated February 21, 1763. Witnesses, Deborah Lawrence, John Long, John Alsop. Codicil.--Whereas, I have purchased a lot in Dock Ward, fronting on Bayard street, and the street commonly called Jews Alley, on which I have built a coach house and stables. I leave to my wife the use of them during widowhood, and then to my brothers and sister. I leave to my wife my chariot and horses. August 3, 1764. Witnesses, John Vanderspiegel, Thomas Merritt, Whitehead Hicks. Proved, September 25, 1764. [NOTE.--John Lawrence was Alderman of the Dock Ward, in New York. He died August 5, 1764. His house and lot is now No. 67 1/2-69 Pearl street. His coach house lot was probably No. 35 or 37 Stone street. On the south side of the rear of his house and lot he purchased a narrow lane, 6 1/2 feet wide, running to Stone street. This lane is now No. 34 Stone

street and has a 3-story building on it, which is probably the narrowest building of that height in the city. "Bayard street" was a name sometimes given to Stone street or Duke street, which was for long years its real name. "Jews Alley" was Mill street, now South William street. A week after his death, Theodorus Van Wyck, his next door neighbor, was chosen Alderman in his room. The house and lot continued in the Lawrence family till recent years.--W. S. P.]

Jonathan's father deeded him 50 acres in West Farms, where he lived until 1749 when he removed to Orangetown, Orange Co., NY (the section that would later become Rockland Co.).

On 16 March 1749 he purchased a 504-acre tract of land along the west bank of the Hudson River in Rockland Township and the transaction was recorded in the first deed included in the Lockhart Patent. On this property he erected a mansion, known locally as the "big house," where he continued to live until his death 31 March 1775. In recent years it housed the town library in what is today the town of Palisades, NY.²

Jonathan Lawrence's will, dated 4 Mar 1773, describes him as Jonathan Lawrence, Jr. of Orangetown, grandson of Jonathan Lawrence of the same place. Jonathan Lawrence acquired wealth in mercantile pursuits in New York and about the age of 34 retired from business and bought the residence at Hellgate which had belonged to his great-grandfather, Major Thomas Lawrence (later comprising the farms of Squire John and Major Richard Lawrence).

An ardent patriot, in 1775 and 1776 he was appointed a member of the provincial convention which met at New York, and was afterwards elected to the convention which formed the first constitution of New York. In 1777 he was appointed a senator for the southern district of the state. After the war he returned to New York, where he entered into business again, to repair his damaged fortunes.

In his will dated 21 Feb 1810, proved 19 Aug 1820, Jonathan Lawrence, of New York City, merchant, mentioned wife Ruth, daughters Margaret, Judith Ireland, sons Jonathan, Samuel, Richard M., Abraham Riker, Joseph, John L., William Thomas. Mentioned 14 Houses and lots between Arundel, Delancey and Suffolk Streets, personal property. Executors the seven sons. Witnesses Abraham Brinkerhoff jun., Danl. Rapelye and Charles Rogers. Recorded ut supra, Vol. IV., p. 113.¹

Richard Lawrence was living on Staten Island, NY in 1767 when he witnessed the will of his brother, Jonathan.

He was a prominent Loyalist living in Richmond, New York. He did not travel to Canada after the Peace was signed, for some reason he stayed in New York. Supposedly one of the reasons was to collect money owing to him. However, he was arrested and imprisoned in the "New Prison" in New York City for some time and eventually put on trial for confiscating goods for the British Navy. He was actually employed by Admiral Howe as a Master Ships Carpenter and received the honorary rank of Colonel with a full Colonels pay. He was found guilty and in order to obtain his release he was forced to give up all

his possessions. He hid his 2nd wife and small children somewhere in Westchester County and travelled to Britain to seek compensation from the British Government for his losses. His intention was to return for his family and then come to New Brunswick where his older children were. He never made it -- the long imprisonment resulted in him contracting consumption and he died in Britain. In his statement to the British Government he said he was the son of John Lawrence and that he had been born in New Jersey.¹

Severyn Laurenszen, from Roskilde, in Denmark, was in New Amsterdam as early as 1656. He was a soldier (Lance Corporal in April 1658), tavern keeper (in partnership with Jan Jansen Romeyn/Langestraat), farmer, and a public official (in 1672 the Court of New Amsterdam elected Severyn as overseer of fences and highways). On 12 April 1658, when a Lance Corporal, he was sentenced for theft. On 28 May 1658 he was pardoned and permitted to live on Long Island. He returned to New Amsterdam and became a tavern keeper with Jan Jansen Romeyn [Langestraat], On 11 May 1662 both he and Jansen were prosecuted for selling liquor during divine service; on 3 July 1664 he was sentenced in Court for "permitting persons to play nine pins on his premises on Sunday." In 1662 "Severyn Lourens, of Roodschildt in Denmark" and his wife made their joint will. "Her children were Reiner, Mary, and Hendrick Arents (Van Engelen)."¹

Severyn Laurens, along with Pieter Janszen Van Langestraat, and Tryntie Van Engelen, witnessed the baptism 10 Aug 1661 NYC Ref Ch, of Adriaen, son of Jan Janszen V. Langestraat & Marritje Adriaens.

Thomas Lawrence was said to be a brother of William Lawrence of Flushing, NY and John Lawrence of Massachusetts and New York. Other sources claim that he was actually the son of John Lawrence, the immigrant, of Newtown, Queens Co.,

NY.

Thomas Lawrence came to Massachusetts after 1635 and settled in New Haven, CT before 1651. He was a patentee of Middleburgh (Newtown), Queens Co., NY in 1655. He bought a house and lot at Newtown in 1656. (These dates, 1655 and 1656, are suggested to be a misreading of actual dates of 1685 and 1686). He purchased cultivated farmlands along East River at Hellgate Cove to Bowery Bay, having bought the whole of Hellgate Neck.

He was appointed a captain of militia 21 April 1665 and was commissioned a major of Queens County Militia 30 Dec 1689. The name of his first wife is not recorded.

In the (2) m. record, they are: "Thomas Laurence, Wedr. en Mary Ferguson, j.d., d' Eerste wonende by t' Hellegat, en twede alhier."

In his will, he wrote: ...Thomas Lawrence, of Newtown, in Queens County, upon Long Island, being weak in body but in senses and memory. I bequeath my soul into the hands of the Almighty God who gave it. I give my body to the earth from whence it came, to be buried in decent and comely manner. I leave to my son, Thomas Lawrence, that lot of ground which I bought of Hendrick Johnson, with all the houses and buildings thereto belonging, with the great neck of land and meadow, and the Island bounded with a creek; I leave to my wife, Mary Lawrence, one third of all my movable estate, both within doors and without, and I leave all the homespun cloth and yarns and lambswool at my wife's disposing; I leave to my son, Jonathan Lawrence, that lot of land which was Samuel Joas, and the house which he now lives in; he paying to Elizabeth Saunders eight pounds when she is eighteen years of age. I leave to my sons William and Jonathan, that piece of salt meadow, which I bought of Robert Beacham, equally between them. I leave to my son, Daniel Lawrence, all my fresh meadow lying in Trains meadow. I leave to my five sons all the rest of my lands, meadows, and privileges equally, they paying all my debts. I leave to my grand child, Elizabeth Saunders, two mares and two cows, three silver spoons, and her mother's wearing clothes. I leave the rest of my estate to the children of my four sons, Thomas, William, John, and Jonathan. My wife Mary is to have the privilege of my dwelling house during widowhood. I make my sons, Thomas and William, executors. [Not dated.] Witnesses, Content Titus, Jonathan Hazzard, Jeremiah Burroughs. [No date; no date of probation.]

On 16 November 1728, James and Ann Martin, cordwinder, of Essex County, conveyed to Samuel Moore, yeoman, of Bergen County, for £160, one fourth part of tract of Thomas Nowell...within patent of Maj. John Berry. Signed by James Martin, Ann Martin. Witnessed by Thomas Lawrence, Richard Edsall, William Provoost.¹

A notice of her death appeared in *The Boston Weekly News Letter*, June 19-25, 1737 (quoted in XI, NJ Archives, Vol. I, p. 502): "New Jersey, June 4 [1737] -- On Thursday last the wife of Capt. I leave to my sons, Thomas and Nathaniel, all my lands and appurtenances, "and my negro 'Jacob' shall go along with the lands." I make my brother (in law), Gerardus Willse, and Joseph Embury, executors. Witnesses, Cornelius Hunt, Samuel Embree, Adrian Lafarge. Proved, October 19, 1752.

several cruises in her from New York during the old French war.

He settled on a farm on the shore of Flushing Bay, previously owned by his father-in-law. He was appointed a judge in 1784.

William's father, Robert Laurens [Thomas Lawrence], lived at Ashton Hall, Lancastershire, England. Four of his children came to NYC: John Lawrence, Capt. William Lawrence, Maria Lawrence, and Major Thomas Lawrence. William Lawrence was the brother of John Lawrence of Massachusetts, Flushing, NY, and New Amsterdam, and Thomas Lawrence of Massachusetts, New Haven CT, and Newtown, Queens Co., NY.

John and William Lawrence were the first to emigrate. John, then a youth of seventeen, with his brother William, aged twelve, and his sister Maria (Mary), a child of nine years, embarked in the ship *Planter*, April 1635, and landed in Massachusetts.

The Lawrence children were in company with John Tuttell, a mercer, Joan Tuttell and four Tuttell children. John T. Tuttell was doubtless, stepfather to these three Lawrences. These passengers, with others, had a certificate from the minister at St. Alban's, Hertfordshire, and it is a fair supposition that they came from that parish or vicinity.¹

John and William Lawrence subsequently came to NY.

In 1645 William and his brother John, with several others, obtained the patent of Flushing, NY. William left Flushing and lived for a season in Middelburg (Newtown), Queens Co., NY, of which he was a purchaser in 1656. He returned after several years to Flushing, where he bought Lawrence's or Tew's Neck, where he lived the remainder of his life.

He served in the magistracy under the Dutch and held civil and military offices on Long Island under the English.

Whereas Captain Wm. Laurence, late of Tews neck in Flushing, one of the Justices of the Peace of the North Riding, died intestate, leaving a considerable estate, and divers children. And Elizabeth his wife, and his eldest son William by a former marriage, having made application for Letters of Administration, and having brought in an inventory, they were appointed March 25, 1680.

Inventory of estate of Wm. Lawrence, Flushing. The neck of land called Tews neck, with housing, orchards and meadows, £1,250. Two 50 acre lots at Whitestone, £60. 50 acre lot, No. 13, £20. The 50 acre lot in Newtons neck £15. 10 4 acre lots lying at the Town, with all housing, orchards, etc., £60. 640 acres lying adjoining to Sunk meadows, eastward, and also running west to the Fresh Pond, and north to the Sound, and south to the path that goes to John Goldin's house, £150. 1/2 share of salt meadow at Towns end, and 2 shares of fresh meadow, one at Grays, and the other in the middle meadow, £10, 1 share of salt meadow at Terrys Point, £30, 6 shares of meadow at Westchester. 3 shares of meadow in the New Found Passage, £3. 3 shares of meadow in Hunt's cove, £16. 1 share of salt meadow at Head of the bay, £16, one negro, John, £50, negro Andrew, £40. 10 negroes in all. One English boy called by the name of Bishop, for a year and some months service, £5. 32 oxen, £160. 46 cows. 17 Horses. The inventory is very lengthy, showing great wealth and high social station. Total, 4,032. Taken by Richard Cornell, John Bowne, John Lawrence, Abm. Whearly. Elizabeth Lawrence and Wm. Lawrence, administrators, made oath to the same in presence of Governor and Council, November 18, 1680.

After his death, his second wife and widow, Elizabeth Smith, married (2) Sir **Philip Carteret**, governor of New Jersey; and m. (3) Col. **Richard Towneley** of New Jersey.

In his will, he wrote: I, William Lawrence, of Flushing in Queen's County, on the Island of Nassau, being conscious of the mortality of life in this world. I leave to my wife Deborah Lawrence, one-half of my household stuff, during her widowhood, and the other half to my daughter Elizabeth, also two negroes. I leave to my son, Joshua Lawrence, a bond of £57. 10s. I leave to my son, Caleb Lawrence, all the farm I now live on, in Tews Neck, with all the housing and orchards, and a negro boy and two horses. I leave to my son Stephen, 500 acres of land I bought of the Underhills, at a place called Spring Hill, in East and West Jersey, and one negro boy and two horses. I leave to my sons, Obadiah, Daniel, Joshua, and Adam, and my son-in-law, Joseph Rodman, all my right of land in Smithtown Patent, which father Smith gave me in his will, and all my right in Smithtown. I make my sons, Daniel and Obadiah, and my son-in-law, Joseph Rodman, executors. I give all the rest of my estate, and two lots of land in New York, which I bought of Carster Learsen, as by bill of sale from him, lying in William street, above the Smiths Vly, to all my children. Dated July 28, 1719. Witnesses, Joseph Thorn, Sr., Benjamin Thorn, Jacob Thorn. Proved before John Jackson, Judge of Common Pleas, March 16, 1719/20.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Deborah Lawrence, of Flushing, in Queens County, widow of William Lawrence, Gent., this 2 day of May, 1737, being in good health. I leave to my grandson, William Lawrence, son of my son Richard Lawrence, £5. I leave to my three sons, Samuel, Adam, and Stephen. £5 each. I leave to my daughter Sarah Rodman, a silver porringer, and tumbler, and 2 spoons. To my daughter, Elizabeth Willett, my wearing clothes, and household goods, and £5. I leave all the rest to my sons Samuel, Adam, and Stephen, and my daughter, Elizabeth Willett. But if my son Joshua should come back within 10 years, he shall have his part. William was appointed one of the council of the province under Gov. Leisler. At the fall of Leisler, William Lawrence, with the rest of the members of Leisler's council, was seized and committed on a charge of high treason. He was indicted and tried for "ryot" only, in 1691. John Lawrence, his uncle, who had never countenanced Leisler's elevation, was appointed on the commission with Sir Thomas Robinson, Col. William Smith, and others, to try those political offenders. William is supposed to have owed his escape from conviction to the influence of his uncle, John Lawrence, a member of the Court.

In 1693 William was Speaker of the House of Deputies of East Jersey, and from 1694 to 1698 a Deputy. In 1699 he became a member of Gov. Basse's Council. In the early part of the next century he was a member of the Council of Lord Cornbury.

William Lawrence settled in Bergen County, N.J. on a plantation given to him by his father-in-law. In 1683 he was appointed Coroner of Bergen County and in 1688 was elected Deputy for the "Out Plantations of Bergen." In 1693 he was Speaker of the House of Deputies of East Jersey, and from 1694 to 1698 a Deputy. In 1699 he became a member of Gov. Basse's Council. In the early part of the next century he was a member of the Council of Lord Cornbury.

I will and bequeath after the decease of my said wife, Hannah Lawrence or at her second marriage unto my three sons to wit, Silas Lawrence, Jacob Lawrence and Isaac Lawrence, and to their heirs and assigns all and singular my said real estate both house lands meadows and hereditaments in Flushing aforesaid together with what moveable estate I have left to be divided between them, share and share equally after these following legacies first to be deducted with all my lawfull debts. Item. I will and order and hereby empower my said three sons to wit, Silas Lawrence, Jacob Lawrence and Isaac Lawrence, or the survivor of them to sell and convey all and singular my said real estate in Flushing aforesaid, both houses lands meadows and all the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, together with all what moveable estate is left in a convenient time after the decease of my said wife, Hannah Lawrence, or at her second marriage, and the money arising from the sale of my real and personal estate so sold, I will and dispose of it thus: first out of said sum that shall arise from the sale of my said real and personal estate by my said three sons, I give and bequeath unto my son Silas Lawrence the sum of twenty five pounds current lawfull money of New York. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter** Jane, the wife of Samuel Norris**, the some of twenty five pounds. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah, the wife of Moses Ingram, the sum of twenty pounds. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Hannah Lawrence, the sum of fifty pounds. Item. Lastly I nominate and appoint my well beloved wife Hannah Lawrence to be my sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament heretofore by me made and done holding this and only this which is written upon three sides of a sheet of paper to be firm and effectually. In Testimony thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and fixt my seal this seventeenth day of July Anno Domini, one thousand seven hundred and fifty three. William Lawrence (his mark) Signed sealed and published by the Testator as his Last Will and Testament in the presence of us, John Embree, Daniel Latham, William Phillips.¹
