

-- LE ROY --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Daniel and Ingenatia made a joint will dated 15 July 1723 mentioning Anna Senserff, widow of Pieter van Braam, and two half brothers of Ingenatia (not named). On 28 August 1725 they made another will mentioning daughter Anna Maria whose guardians were to be Jacob and Walter Senserff, uncle and cousin of Ingenatia.

Daniel Le Roy was a wine merchant in Rotterdam. In 1745 he and his wife and dau. Marie Ann received a letter to transfer to the French Church in Amsterdam.

Jacob Le Roy made a will in Rotterdam dated 27 April 1752, in which he left everything to his sister Maria Anna Le Roy and to his parents, Daniel Le Roy and Ignatia van der Bergh. His parents, living in Amsterdam, gave him power of attorney on 30 Sep 1751. Later that year or in 1763 he settled in New York City. He joined the New York Reformed Dutch Church 18 Nov 1754 with certificate from the French Church in Amsterdam. He was naturalized in New York 3 May 1755 and became a free-man of New York City 6 May 1755. He was a merchant there, initially in partnership with his brother-in-law, Anthony Rutgers.

After his second marriage, he and his family favored the Anglican Church over the Dutch Reformed Church.

In the New York administration of the will of his brother-in-law, Jacob Henry Chabanel, he was described in 1785 as Jacob Le Roy, of Amsterdam, Holland, now residing in Dutchess County, New York. That he had moved out of New York City would suggest that he favored the Patriot side during the American Revolution.

He left a will dated 20 Dec 1792, probated 17 Jan 1793, mentioning wife Catherine and unnamed children, one of the ex-ecutors was to be son Jacob Le Roy.

Simeon LeRoy was the common ancestor of the families known in French Canada as Roy-Audy and in the United States as LeRoy and Laraway.¹

According to the Parish register, their marriage took place "the third day of the month of September, 1668, after betrothal and the publication of one bann of marriage, between Simeon LeRoy, a son of Richard LeRoy and Gilette Jacquet, his father and mother, of the parish of Notre Dame De fontenay le Comte, Bishopric Of Maitzais (Maillezais), of the second part; Monseigneur the bishop having granted them a dispensation of two banns, and there being discovered no legal impediment, I, the undersigned, Cure of this parish, have married them and have given them the nuptial benediction, according to the form prescribed by the Holy Church in the presence of the Known witnesses, Pierre Chamare, Michel Riffaut, Francois Charlet. (signed) H. De bernieres."¹

Claude "Blandina" was one of three orphaned sisters who were sent to Canada as a "Filles Du Roi"(king's daughters). The Filles Du Rois were impoverished or orphan women sent to Canada at royal expense to find husbands and populate the country. She is thought to have been recently arrived in "New France" (now Quebec) at the time of her marriage because the bishop dispensed with two of the usual three required banns for rer marriage to Simeon LeRoy.¹

He was a master carpenter. He always signed his name S: leRoy. He lived in Quebec and Montreal and removed to Albany, NY by 28 Nov 1682. By 1786 or 1687 he was living in Kingston, NY.¹
