The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

He lived for a number of years in Westchester County, NY and in 1729 returned to Newtown, in Kings County, NY where he took possession of the farm left to him by his uncle, Jacobus Cranckheyte.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their banns, they were: Abraham Rycke, young man "van de Armen Bouwereye" and Anna Catharina Mayers, young maiden "van N. Haerlem, de Eerste op de Armen Bouwereye, en twede tot N. Haerlem."

In his will dated 18 Aug 1742, probated 17 March 1745/46, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Abraham Lent, of Newtown, in Queens County, yeoman, being sick. I leave to my wife Anna Catharina, £20 yearly. I leave to my grand son, Abraham Lent, son of my son Ryck Lent, deceased, £3. To my sons, Adolph, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Johanes Lent, each £25. I leave all the rest of my estate to my sons above named, and to my daughters, Mary, wife of John Rapalye, Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Brinkerhoff, Wyntie, wife of Jeroninus Rapalye, and Annake, wife of John Brinkerhoff, and to my grandchildren, the children of my son Ryck Lent, deceased, viz., Abraham, Johanes, Catharine, and Margareta, and my granddaughter Catherine Haring. I will and order that all my estate, real and personal, in Westchester County, be sold by my executors. My Plantation where I now dwell is to be sold among my children, to the one that shall give the most for it. The rest of the children are to give a deed to the purchaser, except the Burying place, which is to remain entire as it now lies for the use of the relations and friends, with free egress and regress to the same. I make my sons Adolph, Abraham, and Isaac, executors. Dated August 18, 1742. Witnesses, Peter Lyster, Elbert Lyster, Cornelius Berrian. Proved, March 17, 1745/6.<sup>1</sup>

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Catrina Lent, of Newtown, in Queens County, widow, being in health. All debts or dues that I owe in Law or Conscience to be paid. I leave all the rest of my estate to my children and grandchildren in the following manner: I leave to my sons, Adolph, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Jacobus, each 1/11. To my daughters, Marite, wife of John Rapalye; Elizabeth, now wife of Jacob Brinkerhoff; Wyntie, wife of Jeronimus Rapalye; Anake, wife of John Brinkerhoff, each 1/11. To my granddaughter, Catharine Herring, wife of Joris Brinkerhoff, 1/11. To my grandchildren, the children of my son, Ryck Lent, each 1/11. I make my son Adolph and my son-in-law, John Rapalye, executors. Dated April 16, 1750. Witnesses, Andrew Rychen, Thomas Haggard, Cornelius Remsen, Jr. Proved, August 24, 1763. At that time John Rapalye was dead and Adolph Lent resigned and Letters of Administration were granted to "Matthew Dubois, of Dutchess County, son-in-law of said Catharine Lent."

Smith and wife Mary acknowledge before said E. C. Goodrich their transfer of Sept. 10, 1790.<sup>2</sup>

He made several purchases and became the owner of the whole of Ryck's Patent in upper Westchester Co. (a tract granted to his father, Ryck Abrahamse Lent). Before his death he divided this land between his children. Hercules Lent owned land in Westchester County and also owned the south part of the Stony Point Patent. Ryck's Patent, or Lent's Patent, is south of Peekskill. Places mentioned in Hercules Lent include: The "John Rant's meadow" is on Poplopens Kill, in Rockland County. Anthony's Nose is a well-known mountain on the east side of Hudson River. The meadow mentioned is the southwest corner of Putnam County. Stony Point, a well-known promontory, is famous from Gen. Anthony Wayne's great victory in the Revolution. The "Northwest Line" is a noted landmark, and runs from the south side of Stony Point to the Delaware River. It was the south boundary of an immense tract patented to Capt. John Evans, but afterward annulled.<sup>1</sup>

In his will dated 10 April 1765, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. "Know all men by these presents, that I, Hercules Lent, of Ryck's Patent, in the County of Westchester, being blind, and weak in body, this 10 of April, 1765." All just debts are to be paid by my executors with all convenient speed. "I have given to my eldest son, Jacob Lent, in consideration of his birth right, the sum of £25." I leave to my son Jacob all that farm he now lives on, and lies in the southeast part of a tract of land formerly granted to my father, Ryck Abrahamse, and it is commonly known by the name of Ryck's Patent, and by the Indian name of Sackhoes, the said farm being 350 acres, with all the appurtenances, and he is to pay £50. I leave to my son Hendrick all that farm where he now lives, and lies in the southwest part of the said Ryck's Patent; Also one half of a certain meadow lying in Orange County, in the Highlands, on the west side of Hudson's River, and is known by the name of John Rant's meadow; Also one half of all my right to a certain meadow lying in Dutchess County, on the east side of Hudson's River, and on the north side of a certain hill called Anthony's Nose; And he is to pay £100. I leave to my son Abraham all the farm where he now lives, being 350 acres, adjoining Hudson's River, and on the north side of the land left to my son Hendrick, being part of said Ryck's Patent; Also one half of the said John Rant's meadow; Also one half of my right to the said meadow on the north side of Anthony's Nose, and he is to pay £50. I leave to my four grandchildren, the children of my daughter Christena, viz., Abraham Lamb, James Lamb, Lea Lamb, and Rachel Lamb, £100, to be paid by my son Hendrick. I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Lent, £100, to be paid by my sons, Abraham and John. I leave to my daughter Rachel, wife of James Lamb, all that part of my lands and meadows lying in Orange County, by Hudson's River, known by the name of Stony Point; Also as much more of my land on the north part of my tract of land as will make the two parcels contain 382 acres, to her for life, and then to her children. I leave to my daughter Catharena, wife of Hendrick De Ronde, 382 acres of land and meadow in Orange County, bounded on the south by the Northwest Line and Stony Point, east by Hudson's River, north by land left to my daughter Rachel, as the same is laid out, to her for life, and then to her children. All the rest of my personal estate I leave to my six children, Jacob, Hendrick, Abraham, Rachel, Catharena, and Elizabeth, and one share to the representatives of my daughter Christena. I make my sons executors. Witnesses, Philip Ver Planck, James Ver Planck, Jacobus Kronkheit, Abraham Kronkhytt. Proved in New York, November 13, 1766.<sup>1</sup>

Ryck Abramsen Lent (he and his brother Hendrick, both sons of Abraham Rycken, assumed the surname Lent) along with several others, in 1685 purchased land in upper Westchester County, N.Y. from the Indians. This tract took the name Ryck's Patent. Ryck was a miller.

His will was dated 30 Mar 1720; probated 28 Mar 1723. In it, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Ryck Abrahamsen Lent, of the Manor of Cortlandt, in the County of Westchester, miller, being of sound mind. Whereas I am entitled to a certain Island, lying in the Sound, called Judick's island, and to a certain parcel of land lying opposite to it on the Island of Nassau; which is wrongfully detained from me, I bequeath the said Island and piece of land to my eldest son, Abraham Lent, provided he recover the same at his own charge. I also leave to my son Abraham my fowling piece, being the old gun I formerly employed for my own use, and which I give to my said son, in full of his pretensions, and claim to my estate as heir at law. I leave to my son Harek Lent, all my lands, meadows, and tenements, lying and being in the Manor of Cortlandt, and all my meadow land lying at Jan Cantens Hook, in Orange County, upon the condition that he pay the following legacies, viz., to my son Abraham, £60; To the children of my son Ryck, deceased, £60; To the children of my daughter Elizabeth Hyatt, deceased, £25; To my daughter Catherine, wife of Abraham Jones, £25; To my daughter Margaret, wife of Thomas Benson, £5 annually for life, and to be paid to her, and not to her husband. And my son Harek is to give security to the Governor of this Province, for the payment of these legacies. As for the rest of my estate, my executors are to divide it into six parts and divide the same among my children, and the children of my deceased children. I make my sons, Abraham and Harek, executors. Dated March 31, 1720. Witnesses, John Nicholl, Adolph Phillipse, Henry Wileman. Proved March 28, 1723.
