The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In 1682, he was master of the sloop *Katherine*, which had been his father's in 1678. Ensign in 1684, later Capt. In 1686, he was appointed to take care of the well in front of his father's house. I leave to Catharine, wife of Joris Brinckerhoff, of Newtown, in Queens County, my negro girl "Betty." I leave to my four nephews, William, Harmen, Cornelius, and Peter Lieverse, all sons of my late brother, Lowvynus Lieverse, all my wearing apparell, and all my firearms, swords, and pistols. I leave to my nephew, Harmon Lieverse, my negro boy "John." I leave to Maria De Forest, wife of John De Forest, of Albany, "brasier," after the death of my wife, "my Large Dutch New Testament, with silver clasps, silver chains, and other silver furniture." I leave to my nephew, William Lieverse, my Large Dutch house Bible. I leave to Elbert Harring, Jr., son of my wife's nephew, Elbert Harring, of New York, baker, my two bolting cloths and bolting chest. I leave to my wife Catharine all my real estate during her widowhood. My executors are to make an inventory, and sell all the rest of my personal estate (except my negro woman Diana, and so much of my household goods and kitchen stuff as my wife shall think fit to keep) at public vendue, and put the money at interest. "My negro woman Diana shall be so far indulged, in consideration of her good services, as to choose the person she desires to live with, provided such person shall give a reasonable price for her." Whereas my nephew, Harman Andriese, of Bedford, in Kings County, is indebted to me in a bond of £50, the same is to be remitted, he paying the interest to my wife during her life. I also leave him 1/2 of all my real estate, and he is to pay to the three daughters (not named) of my late brother, Teunis Lieverse, £20 each. The other half of my real estate I leave to my wife's nephew, Elbert Harring, "baker," and he is to pay to Margaret, wife of John Quackinbush, of New York, carpenter, and to Cornelia, wife of Peter Anderson, cartman, and to Elbert Anderson, son of said Peter Anderson, £20 each. All the rest of my personal estate I leave to my niece, Maritie Lieverse, daughter of my late brother Lowvynus, and to Marytie, wife of Peter Vanderbergh, of Albany, and to my nephews, Harman and Petrus Vandewater, and my wife's niece, Catharine Knickerbocker, wife of Laurens Knickerbocker, of Magdalen Island, and to Margaret, wife of John Quackinbush, and to Cornelia, wife of Peter Anderson, and Catharine, wife of Adolph Myer, of Harlem. In 1640, Jacob, Stynje, and their baby daughter Styntie arrived in Fort Orange, New Netherlands (now Albany, New York) on the ship *Princess* owned by the Dutch West India Company. Jacob was the brother of Urbanes Luurszen.¹

According to the marriage intentions (banns), he was from Wageningen, and she was from Enkhuisen.

Jacob and his brother Urbanus (with wife Jannetie Claes Boanes) came to America to work for Rensselaer, possibly as mechanics. However, some records include details of shipping by the Dutch West India Company in which Jacob Luerszen is specifically mentioned as an officer. New York Historical Manuscripts contains a September 6, 1641 declaration of officers of the ship *The Angel Gabriel* who urged the captain to head for New Netherlands because of the disabled condition of their ship, signed by Jacob Luerszen as Chief Boatswain.¹

Another account dated January 1, 1648, tells of a complaint filed against Roulaf Cornelius who inflicted five wounds on Corporal Jacob Luerszen as the Corporal was trying to separate Cornelius and Casper Steinmetsel during a quarrel.¹

On 32 Aug 1647 a power of attorney was issued from Jacob Luurszen, Fort Amsterdam. On 28 Nov 1651 Jacob Luurszen took oath as a colonist of Rensselaerwyck. On 18 June 1652 at the Court of Fort Orange & Beverwyck, Jacob Luurszen petitioned for property in Beverwyck.

Jacob, like other Dutch settlers, was granted a lot in Beverwyck near Fort Orange on October 25, 1653. Records show that

he built a house and had a garden there until his death on April 29, 1655. He was survived by his wife Stynje, daughters Styn-tie, Jacobyntie, and Agneit, and only son Luer.

On 7 Feb 1657 at the Court of Fort Orange & Beverwyck, administrators were appointed for the estate of the children of Jacob Luurszen, deceased.

He was chosen constable in fall of 1713. He succeeded to the allotment drawn in 1712 by Marcus Tiebaut, his step-father, from the common lands; but not to the half-erf and three morgen on which it was drawn. His house lot was on the north side of the Church Lane, and has since formed the easterly lot of the Brady plot. In 1740, Lewis sold his lot in 1st Division to Adolph Myer, and in 1748 the rest of his property in Harlem to Dr. Josiah Paterson. It included two house lots (erven) besides that he occupied, one of which he bought of Simon Johnson in 1747, out of Pipon's estate.¹

Marcus Tibout married, 29 May 1698, Aefie, widow of Jonas Lewis, and daughter of Cornelis Jansen [Kortright], and in 1713, was "in possession" of a house and lot on the north side of the Church Lane, next but one west of the kerk erf, which no doubt came from John Van Oblinus, and went to John Lewis, from whom it passed, in 1748, to Dr. Josiah Paterson. Marcus bought from Caspar Mabie, 26 March 1700, a dwelling, with its lot, which had formed Nos.5,6, of Daniel Tourneur's out-gardens. Here Marcus lived after John Lewis married in 1713, but dying in 1714, without children, so far as appears; his widow sold it the next year to John Oblinus, the trusty friend of Marcus, and also his kinsman, if we are right as to the latter's parentage.²

He removed to Huntington, L. I., where he married. He is first mentioned in Huntington 11 January 1682, when he, of Westerly, R. I., arranges to pay for a farm through Thomas Skidmore, Jr., and on 11 January 1683, Skidmore conveys it to him and he is again called of Westerly, R. I. It was located in Fresh Pond Neck and the property purchased also included Skidmore's house, and it is fair to assume that this was about the time of his marriage. In 1685 and 1688 he added to his acreage. He was evidently a carpenter, for on 28 July 1682 he agreed to build a house for John Corey of Huntington.

In his will, he wrote: 9 August, 1708. I, Jonathan Lewis, of Hunttington, in the county of Suffolk, being sick and weak. I leave to my eldest son, Jonathan Lewis, a £400 right and a half of land lying in the Purchases within the Patent of the Town of Hunttington, which Purchases are bounded on the east to the easternmost extent of Hunttington Patent, and on the west to Hunttington's old Purchase; and on the north to the Country road, and on the south to the head of the South swamp; Thirty three acres, being a part thereof, is laid out at the north end of my home lot, where my house now stands, and 25 acres of land laid out southward from my house nigh my new field, which belongs to the aforesaid hundreds; And 1/4 of all my right of meadow lying and being on a Neck at the South, called Sumpwans [neck], together with all my right of upland on said neck to the end of the swamp, To him, the said Jonathan, his heirs and assigns forever. I leave to my son John a £400 right of land in the bounds of the purchases above mentioned; Sixteen acres, being a part thereof, lying eastward from my house which I bought of John Ketcham; Also 51 acres of land lying in the Plains near Whitmans Hollow, Together with a quarter part of meadow ground which I have at the South, of what is remaining besides what is above given to my son Jonathan. I leave to my son Daniel, a £400 right of land lying within the bounds of the aforesaid Purchases, And the same quantity of meadow at the South as I have given to my son John, with the privilege to him to have 60 acres of land to be laid out within said Purchase, "my meaning is, that my son Daniel shall have the 60 acres from my whole right, be 20 Hundreds and a half, notwithstanding what is given to Jonathan and John. I leave to my son Richard a £400 right of land lying in the bounds of said Purchase, and thirty-three acres of land whereon my house with all the buildings, orchards, etc., being a part thereof; Also 25 acres in my new field and joining to it southward from my house; Also the same quantity of meadow at South as I have given to John and Daniel. "I give unto the child my wife is now bigg with, if it be a son, a 400 right of land in said Purchase, and the same quantity of meadow at South as I have given to John;" But if it be a daughter, then the said land is to go to my sons John, Daniel, and Richard. I leave to my wife, Deliverance, a pair of working oxen, and a pair of my best horses, 4 good cows, and 69 sheep, now in the hands of Jonathan Scudder and Joseph Platt and Joshua Arthur, and the use of part of my lands and meadows. I leave my movables and the rest of my cattle to my daughters Sybil, Elizabeth, Jemima, Hannah, and Sarah (all under age). I leave to my 4 sons a lot of land lying in the Town adjoining to the lot of Mr. Jones. I appoint Epenetus Platt, Nathaniel Weeks, and John Whitman executors. Witnesses, Phillip Weeks, Thomas Weeks, Jeremiah Platt. Proved before Governor Richard Ingoldsby, August 11, 1704.

In his will, he wrote: I, Jonathan Lewis, of Staten Island, Richmond County, being sick and weak. I will that my Executors shall dispose of all my goods, chattels, lands, mills, and tenements as they in their discretion think fit within two years after my decease except such articles as shall hereinafter be bequeathed, and I give them full power to sell all my lands, mills, and

tenements within the County of Richmond to any persons and their heirs forever by all such lawful ways as to my Executors or their Council learned in the law shall seem fit. To my dearly beloved wife Mary, my best horse and riding chair, two of my best cows of her own choosing, with sufficient of my household furniture to furnish her room together with the sum of £100 to be first taken out of my estate, and that in lieu of her dowry or power of thirds upon my estate. Also she to have the use of my negro wench and the yearly interest of £50 for life or while my widow. I will that my Executors use £10 for the further education of my son Joseph. After my debts, funeral charges and the above legacies are paid, the remainder of my estate shall be divided among my children in manner following: To my son Jonathan, one eighth of my estate, to my son David one eighth, to my son James one eighth, to my son Israel one eighth, to my son Joseph one eighth, to my daughter, Sarah Degroot, one sixteenth part; to my daughter, Catharine Hutchinson, one sixteenth; to my daughter, Mary Lewis, one sixteenth; to my daughter, Frances Lewis, one sixteenth; to my daughter, Elizabeth Lewis, one sixteenth; to my daughter, Phebe Lewis, one sixteenth; none of the said legacies to be paid to any of my children till they are twenty-one years old, but if my Executors have money on hand and shall think proper to make a dividend thereof amongst those of my children that are of the above mentioned age, those of them that are under that age shall have the interest of their dividend yearly for their support till they arrive of full age to receive such dividend or their full legacy. If any of my children die under age their part to be divided among my surviving children. I recommend my Executors at the sale of my houses and lands to reserve such part as they think convenient for the reception and continuing of my family together during the life or widowhood of my beloved wife Mary, and after her decease or discontinuance of widowhood such house or land reserved shall be sold as also my Negro wench and the money divided as aforesaid. I appoint my wife Executrix, my trusty friend and brother-in-law, David Latourette, my sons Jonathan and David, all of Staten Island, Executors. Dated October 28, 1785. Witnesses, John Latourette, Abraham Vail (weaver) and Edward Hall (schoolmaster). Proved, Richmond County, January 5, 1786.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Joseph Lewis, of Huntington, in Suffolk County, this 10th day of September, 1781. My executors within one year after my decease to sell such of my moveables as they shall think will be the most benefit for the children, and pay all my just and lawful debts out of my moveable estate. I leave to my oldest son Azel, and my third son Concklin, all my part of the mills, dams, houses, and lands, etc., at Cow Harbor, and my house and lands at Cuby, which I bought of Alexander Lewis. Likewise I give to my sons, Azel and Joseph, one pair of oxen, which I bought of William Hubbert in lieu of one span of horses they now claim. I give to my second son, Joseph, and my fourth son, Richard, all my houses, out houses, lands, rights, and privileges to the same belonging in the "Townd spot" of Huntington, and likewise my tract of land that lays adjoining the south part of Zebulon Platt's homestead, containing about forty-five acres, more or less. I give to Richard Lewis the yearling colt. I give to my four daughters, namely: Abigail, Elizabeth, Amelia, and Naomi Lewis, all my moveable estate, except what I already disposed of. If any of them should die under age, my will is that it should be equally divided among the survivors, and if any of my four sons should die under age their part shall be equally divided among the surviving sons, except £200 of the deceased part, and that shall be equally divided among the surviving daughters; if any of my sons so die then his partner shall have the refusal of his part, and that my executors shall make the valuation. I give to my son Concklin my silver watch. I make my friend, John Squire, and my brother, Scudder Lewis, executors. Witnesses, Nathaniel Harrisen, Epenetus Conklin, yeoman, Phebe Bayles. Proved, October 19, 1781.

"The Lewis family, of Dutchess County [NY] are descended from Thomas Lodowycksen (Anglicised into Lewis), who was an early inhabitant of New York. The first of the name in Poughkeepsie was Colonel Leonard Lewis, Sheriff of the County, etc. Magdalena [Lewis, widow of John Tomkins; she m. 19 July 1767 as his second wife, Casparus (Kasparus) Westervelt) may have been his daughter. Walter Tallman Westervelt, *Genealogy of the Westervelt Family*, 1905, p. 22, footnote

Leonard Lewis served in the expedition against the French in 1692. By Jun 17, 1696, he had a farm on Staten Island, patent granted Jun 17, 1697. In 1696 he was Alderman from East Ward, NYC, re-elected 1697, 1698, 1699. Freeman, Aug 9, 1698. Colonial Assembly, NY County - 1699-1701. Capt of Foot, NY Militia, 1700. Judge, Court of Common Pleas. In 1703, he is listed of NYC with 1 male, 2 females, 7 children, 1 negro, 1 negress, 1 negro child. 20 years, Col of Militia. Colonial Assembly from Dutchess County, 1713-1726. Judge of Court of Common Pleas, Dutchess County, 1716. First County Treasurer, 1717.¹

His house in NYC is listed on the City Tax List 1695-1699 at £ 100 2d. (East Ward). He was a partner with his bro-in-law Johannes Hardenbergh and a syndicate of others, in about 2 million acres of land between the Hudson and Delaware Rivers, known as the Great Hardenbergh Patent, which covered most of the Catskill range. His heirs received 1/8 of the lands after his death. He received 5 of the "Great Lots", which were cut into 77 smaller lots.

In 1710, he purchased land at Poughkeepsie from Myndert Harmense Van Den Bogaardt (a tract N of city and another at Minnesinck, 12,000 acres,nearby). It ran along the riverfront, north of the Van Kleeck farm to a small watercourse and extended east, widening at the rear to the Val Kil in the vicinity of Salt Point Road. He and George Clarke bought 3,000 acres in Dutchess County in 1712, called Matapan. He lived at Poughkeepsie from ca. 1710-1730. His stone house (1710-1717) may have been at the mouth of the Val Kil (Fallkill). He built a mill there, about 1710, SE of the house at the mouth of the Val Kill, on its north side, beside the waterfall, (near the present North Water St) and others later built a dock and storehouse and eventually factories. The road to the mill is now Mill St. (Area called Upper Landing.) The house still stands, although greatly modified, on N. Water St, Poughkeepsie, owned by the Central Hudson Gas and Electric Corporation. His children sold the mill to Anthony Yelverton, who sold it to Col Martin Hoffman, of Red Hook. It eventually became the property of various Livingstons, and later (1800) the brothers, Martin, Isaac and Robert Hoffman. [The dau of Martin Hoffman, Jr., married a Roosevelt. Val Kil is the name of the house of Eleanor Roosevelt.]

I dispose of all the lands and estate which descended to me as heir at law to my mother, in the following manner, viz., The lands lying in Orange and Ulster Counties to be sold by my executors. From the money, £180 are to be paid to my wife to enable her to bring up my children, and the rest to my wife and all my brothers and sisters, except my brothers Richard, Thomas, and Barent, to whom I have already given 3/11. And the rest of my lands I leave to my wife and my brothers and sisters, except Richard, Thomas, and Barent, who have each received 1/8. I leave to my three children all the rest of my estate not disposed of, and my wife is to have my personal estate to bring up my children. I make my wife Rachel and my father in law, Abraham Swartwout, executors. Dated June 14, 1757. [Children not named.] Witnesses, John Hickey, Bartholemew Cranell, attorney at law. Proved in New York, August 9, 1759.

Thomas Lodowycksen was born in Belfast, but migrated to Holland. Thomas probably fled to Holland with his two sisters, and after their deaths came to New Netherlands, "in March of Cromwells Wars." Thomas Lodewicksen, carpenter, came to New Netherlands in 1656 on *the Blue Dove*, with his fare paid by the West India Company on the condition of his remaining for three years. Upon his arrival, it seems that Thomas Lewis went directly to Beverwyck (Albany) to serve out his term of service. He was apparently in a carpentry partnership with Reynier Wisselpenningh. He later became a mariner (in 1664 he was captain of a barque sailing to Delaware Bay).¹

In 1658, he had to sue for payment for constructing a bapistry in the church. He also fitted out yachts. They came to New Amsterdam ca. 1663. He transported troops to Esopus for the second Esopus Indian War (after the burning of Wiltwyck (Kingston, Jun 7, 1663), aboard his bark, and Peter Stuyvesant made his bark his headquarters.(Stuyvesant mentioned him a number of times in his letters as Thomas the Irishman.) In 1664, he was sued by an employee he fired because the employee was to teach another to saw wood, but did not know how to do it himself. Thomas became Capt of a cargo vessel plying the Hudson, from New Amsterdam to Fort Orange. In 1664, he sailed a boat on the South River (Delaware) and made many trading voyages. In 1678, he was master of the sloop, "Katherine."

In 1664, he lived on Broad St, in 1665 on "The Prince Graft". On Jul 2, 1668, he bought the house and still house of Burgher Jorissen at the corner of William and Stone Sts, near Wall St (No. 57 on Danckaert's (the Labadist View)(No 18, Block Q on the Castello Plan). His heirs sold it in 1713. It was later the home and place of business of the printer, William Bradford, where he printed the first copy of the "New York Gazette", NY's first newspaper. On Oct 7, 1669, Peter Stuyvesant sold Lot # 3 of the Calk Hook Farm (1/4 of farm) to Thomas Lewis. On Nov 10 and 12, 1725, his heirs sold the property to Anthony Rutgers. On the tax list of 1674, Thomas Lewis is listed with a worth of fl 6,000, making him the 17th richest man in NYC.

On Aug 18, 1670, Margaret, wife of Frederick Philipse, bought land at Yonkers which was formerly in possession of Andriaan Vander Donck, the Jonge Heer (from which Yonkers got its name), for £300, on behalf of her husband and Thomas Lewis, mariner, from Elias Doughty, the brother of widow VanderDonck. It included 300 acres and one half the River Nepperham with milling priviliges. Doughty sold various parcels of land, including one to John Archer, which was erected into the Manor of Fordham. On Sep 29,(or Nov 29), 1672, Thomas Lewis, with Thomas Delaval and Frederick Philipse, purchased the residue of Doughty's lands, 7708 acres, each owning one third. A patent was obtained by Philipse, Geesje Lewis and John Delaval on Feb 19, 1684/5. John Delaval (son of Thomas), sold his rights to Philipse, on Aug 27, 1685 and on Jun 12, 1686, Geesje Lewis (wife of Thomas) and her surviving children, sold their rights to Philipse, in order to get money to raise the children. Philipse had acquired additional land and had the property erected into the Manor of Philipsburgh on Jun 12, 1693, by Gov Fletcher. The mills he built at Yonkers gave the river its name, "Saw Mill River." The patent for the original purchase was not issued until Feb 19, 1684/5. The Geshee Lewis House etc. is listed on the City Tax Lists 1695-1699 at £130 2 Sh 2 d, and the Thomas Lewis Estate at £ 50 1 Sh (East Ward).

He was appointed Alderman by Gov Andros in 1675 and served a number of terms (1676, 1679, 1680, 1681), serving at various times with William Dervall, Stephen Van Cortlandt, Johannes de Peyster, Francis Rombout and William Beekman. He was appointed chairman of the committee to survey vacant land and served on the committee to determine the expenses for building a new church. He was a Lt Col in the Rgt of Col Christopher Lyne, on Jan 6, 1679. After his death, his wife became a baker, and she was ordered to bake bread for sale on Mondays. In 1686, she was l at Lang St - with her property, the North side of Pearl St and Hanover Square to Wall St, with her dau Catherine. A well was sunk in front of her house in 1687. She sold her property to Abraham Van Horne, bolter in 1703. Her son, Thomas lived next door.

Geesje Barents was prob the niece of Annetje Barents van Rotmers who m. Albert Andriessen Bradt, the Norman, and dau of Barent Barents and g-dau of Barent and Geesje Barents (who emigrated in 1640 on the Waterhound, with her second husband, Pieter Jacobsen van Rynsburch), and sis of Rachel Barents.

In 1664 he was capt. of a barque sailing to Delaware Bay.

He became owner on 29 Nov 1672 with Thomas Deleval and Frederick Philipse, the tract of land known as Upper Yonkers. Thomas Lewis's heirs sold this tract to Frederick Phillipse 12 June 1686.

His name almost always appears in records as "Thomas Lodowycksen" and his childrens' names as "Lievens"; it was not until the third generation that the name begins to appear as "Lewis," although there are evidences that the family had so called themselves from the first.

At a meeting of the Common Council held December 8th, 1683. The City and Corporation of New York was divided into six wards one of which was the East Ward, described: To Begin att ye house of **Thomas Lewis** and ffrom thence Northward to ye house of Laurence Sluys then along ye Wall to ye Corner house of Miriam Levy and so to Thomas Lewis againe, with all ye houses in ye Smith floye and without ye Gate on ye South side of ye ffresh Watter. According to W.S. Pelletreau, The house of Thomas Lewis was the North West corner of Hanover Square and William Street. (Old Burgers Path)

On 13 September, 1684, before me, William Bogardus, Publick Notary, of New York, appeared in their own persons Mr. Thomas Lewis known to me. He declared to have given to his wife, Geesie Lewis, all his goods and estate, movable and immovable, during her lifetime, and after her death, to be divided among his children, named Lodowick, Barent, Leonard, Catharine, and Thomas, gotten by said wife, but the eldest son is to have no prerogatives. If his wife marries, she is to divide 1/2 among the children and have the use of the rest. Witnesses, Martin Clark, Evert Dyckinck, "citizen of this city." [Note.-- The house and lot of Thomas Lewis was the north, or east, corner of Pearl street and William street.--W. S. P.] Thomas Donagan, Lieutenant-General and Governor. To all, etc. Know ye that at a Court of Records in New York, on September 14 last, the will of Thomas Lewis was proved, and his wife Gussie Lewis was confirmed at executor, April 1, 1686.

* Geesje Barents was prob the niece of Annetje Barents van Rotmers who m. Albert Andriessen Bradt, the Norman, and dau of Barent Barents and g-dau of Barent and Geesje Barents (who emigrated in 1640 on the *Waterhound*, with her second husband, Pieter Jacobsen van Rynsburch), and sis of Rachel Barents.¹

The wife of Thomas Lewis was Geesje Barents, of Dutch extraction. It would seem probable that Geesje Barents was the granddaughter of Gijsje Berents (Geesje Barents), who emigrated in 1640 on the *Waterhondt* with her (second) husband Pieter Jacobsen van Rynsburch (Van Rensselaer Bowier Mss-822). It is evident from the power of attorney mentioned in the "Early Records of Albany, VOL. 3, Notarial Papers, 1660-1695" (p.226), that the first husband of Gijsje Barents had been a man named Barent, and that by him she had at least two children (1) Annetje Barents van Rotmerz, who married Albert Andriessen Bradt de Noorman, and was the mother of "Storm Van der Zee" (Rec. XXXV-45) and the Bratt family; and (2) by deduction, a son by the name of Barent Barents. For, in the power of attorney above mentioned the children of Annetie Barents mention their cousin Geesie Barents and Raechel Barents, who must have been the daughters of a man named Barent, and this Barent was probably a son of Gijsje Barents and her first husband. Rachel Barents disappears from the records, but her sister Geesje Barents would seem in all probability to be the Geesje Barents who married Thomas Lewis about 1661 in Albany. There is no proof of this, but it seems probable, because members of the Bratt family acted as sponsors at the baptism of some of the Lewis children.¹

Thomas Lewis sailed with Captain Tew, a Privateer, turned pirate. It was Captain Tew who first entered the Indian Ocean to prey on the trading ships of the Great Moghul of India. His brother-in-law, Barent Rynders sailed with him. Barent Rynders

later wrote to the Earl of Bellomont, seeking permission for the two of them to return to NY. Thomas Lewis wrote in his will that he was bound out on a voyage. Captain Tew met his death in the Indian Ocean. The story says that he was hit in the stomach by a cannon ball.¹

In his will, he wrote: I, Thomas Lewis, of New York, merchant, being in good health, but now bound out on a voyage, and knowing that the time is uncertain when it will please God to take me out of this vile and transitory world." And to the end that no variances might hereafter arise do make this my last will and testament. I give to my son, Thomas Lewis, £5, when he is 21, over and above all other legacies. The rest of my estate I leave to my wife, Frances Lewis, during widowhood, with full power to sell houses and lands with the advice and consent of my brothers, Leonard Lewis and Barent Rynders [I believe he means brother-in-law as Barent was married to Frances's sister Hester Leisler]. If my wife should marry, then she is to have and enjoy the household stuff and wearing apparell, jewels, rings, diamonds, etc., and one half of my estate in houses and lands. When she remarries, the estate is to be divided, and the share of my children is to be put into the hands of my brothers, Leonard Lewis and Barent Rynders, who I name as executors. Dated January 10, 1699/1700. Witnesses, William White, Abraham Abrahamse, John Basford. Proved before Lord Cornbury, June 14, 1704.

Both Cornelis Claes Swits and Tobias Teunissen/Toemszen were massacred by Indians 15 Sep 1655, their goods plundered or burned and their wives and children taken captive. By the end of Nov. the wives and children were returned.

Wednesday 9 April 1659. Paulus Van der Beeck and Joannes Monjeer De la Montagne appointed guardians of Jacobus the nearly 3 years old son of Tomas Verdon, who intends to remarry. His deceased wife was Barbara Imbroeck. Tomas Verdon intended to marry Janneken Boones, widow of Tobias Teunisz. Janneken Boones had four children: Herme Urbanus, 17 years old; Neeltje Urbanus, 15 years; Urbanus Urbanus, 10 years; and Teunis Tobiase, 8 years. Abraham Clock and Evert Duyckingh appointed guardians. Her last husband's name was Tobias Teunisz, by whom she had one child. [HSYB, Original Records of Burgomasters and Orphan Masters, 1900:117]
