The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Gilbert Livingston was a lawyer. As rerepresentative for the Manor of Livingston he served in the Provincial Assembly from 1728 to 1737. He held the office of Clerk of Ulster County from 1722-1746.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Gilbert Livingston, of Kingston, in Ulster County, being sick and weak. Whereas there is to be raised out of the land given by my father-in-law Colonel Henry Beekman, to my beloved spouse Cornelia Livingston, deceased, the sum of £3,000, for my 10 younger children, Henry, Gilbert, Philip, James, Samuel, Cornelius, Alida, wife of Captain Jacob Rutson, Joana, Catharine, and Margaret, The said sum shall be equally divided among them. And whereas there is to be raised the sum of £1,000 for me and my heirs and assigns, I give the same and all my lands and estate to my eldest son, Robert Livingston, and my other 10 children. My executors have full power to sell all lands to pay debts. I make my sons Robert and Henry, and my son-in-law, Captain Jacob Rutsen, and my beloved nephew, Robert Livingston, son of my brother, Robert Livingston, executors. December 12, 1745. Witnesses, Thomas Beekman, Jacobus De Lameter, Job Viele.

In his will, he wrote: I, James Livingston, of New York, taking into consideration the uncertainty of life and the prudence of making a disposition of my worldly estate while I enjoy my usual share of understanding. My body to be interred in such a manner, and such expense as my executors may think proper. Whereas, I have formerly given to my son Robert £900, towards his advancement, and have since advanced to him £472 10s., I discharge him from all demands, and I also discharge him from all rent for the house he now lives in from the first day of May, in the year 1750, to the first day of May, 1764. I also leave him my large Silver Punch Bowl, and a saddle, and one small Silver Salt; and the further sum of £125 10s., to be paid in six months. I leave to each of my daughters, Elizabeth and Mary, £1,500, to be paid in six months. And as I have already given an

advancement of £1,000, in cash, and £500 in an outset, to each of my daughters, Jannet and Margaret, at their marriage, I direct that these sums left to my son Robert and my daughters, Elizabeth and Mary, shall be paid before any division. I leave to each of my daughters, Elizabeth and Mary, the further sum of £100, in consideration of the trouble they have had in taking care of my family since the death of my wife. I leave to my grandson, James Livingston, son of my son Robert, all that my part of a certain parcel of ground and water lot, in Montgomerie Ward, in New York, which was purchased by Robert Benson, deceased, and myself in common, as by deeds may appear. All the rest of my estate, real and personal, I leave to my son Robert, and my daughters, Elizabeth, Jannet, Margaret, and Mary, and if either dies, her share is to go to the rest. I make my children executors. Dated September 3, 1763. Witnesses, Gualtherus DuBois, Pierre De Peyster, Whitehead Hicks. Proved, August 31, 1764. [NOTE.--James Livingston was son of Robert Livingston, who was son of James Livingston, brother of the first Lord of the Manor of Livingston. He was born December 21, 1701, died September 7, 1763. He married, May 18, 1725, Maria, daughter of Jacobus Kierstede and Elizabeth Lourens. His son, Robert Livingston, married Susanah Smith, daughter of Judge William Smith, and sister of William Smith the Historian and Chief Justice of New York and Canada. The daughter, Janet Livingston, married the said William Smith, Historian and Judge. Mary Livingston was the second wife of Major Thomas Moncrieffe. They were married October 9, 1764. Margaret Livingston married Peter R. Livingston, of the "Manor family." Eliabeth Livingston died unmarried. The house and lot, the rent of which was given to his son Robert, is now No. 23 William Street. This had a large garden in the rear. James Livingston owned a wide lot on the east side of William Street, extending nearly to Sloat Lane, now Beaver Street. The north part of this, with the houses, belonged to his wife, who was the only child of Jacobus Kierstede. It was sold by Thomas Moncrieffe to Alexander Robertson in 1783. The south part, also with two houses, was purchased by James Livingston from one White Timmer. He seems to have given them to his daughter Janet, wife of William Smith. The house and lot, owned in partnership with Robert Benson, is now No. 28 Cherry Street, and No. 27 on the south side of the street, and the same lines extended to Front Street. It was sold by James K. Livingston (the grandson mentioned in the will) to John Beekman, in 1794. The son, Robert Livingston, had many children, among them Judge Maturin Livingston, who married Margaret, the only child of Governor Morgan Lewis. Jacobus Kierstede was son of Dr. Hans Kierstede, who was the son of Dr. Hans Kiersted, who married Sara Roelofsen, daughter of the famous Annake Jans. Elizabeth, wife of Jacobus Kiersted, died January 26, 1760, aged 81. Her daughter, Maria Livingston, died November, 1762.--W. S. P.]

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Robert James Livingston, of New York, merchant, being of sound mind. I leave to my son Robert my largest silver Punch bowl, "with the salt cellar and ladle, that are with it from a Relation in Scotland." I leave to my son William my smaller silver bowl and my watch. I leave to my sons, William, Robert, and Peter, my three guns. "I leave my Pike, Partizan, Pistols, and sword, and cutlass to my sons, Peter and Maturin." "I leave to my son William my own Picture." To my son James "the Pictures of my grandfather and grandmother." My executors may sell any part of my real estate, and they may join in partition of all tracts of land undivided. All the proceeds and the rest of my estate I leave to my wife

Susannah, so long as she remains my widow, for the maintainance of herself and my children, with full power to devise the same by will. If she marries, the estate is to be divided, and my wife is to have one share. From the share of my son James is to be deducted £100, which I advanced for him. "From the share of my daughter Maturine is to be deducted the like sum, which I have advanced to her in marriage." The shares of the children who are not of age are to be in the hands of my executors. My executors are to make an inventory of all my estate. I make my wife and Grove Bend and my sister, Elizabeth Livingston, and my brother-in-law, John Smith, executors. Dated, January 23, 1771. Witnesses, William Livingston, Robert Ray, merchant, Henry C. Bogert. Proved, April 4, 1771.
