The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

The name Le Sueur was well established in 1600 at Challe-Mesnil in Terre de Caux, Normandy, France of which Dieppe wa the capital. For the previous century, the Le Sueurs were cloth makers of Rowen, France." Le Sueur' means "to work" or "to toil." Alt. spellings are Le Seur; De Lachaire; La Cheer; Le Jere; Lessieur; Lesier. The Le Sueurs were French Hueguenots and were more accepted by the Dutch colonists in America than the English. — March 1996 post on America Online from screen name Dr McP@aol.com

"Francois le Sueur, who left the town [Harlem] early in 1663, was the ancestor of the families of Leseur and Lozier, now mostly seated in New York City and Bergen County, N.J. Francois first lived in Flatbush after coming to Manhattan, and in 1659 married Jannetie, daughter of Hillebrand Pietersen, of Amsterdam; in which year Jannetie's brother, Pieter Hillebrands, was captured by Indians at Esopus, but this did not deter her from removing there with her husband. Before going from Harlem he sold some of his effects, and his wife bought "a little bed," etc. at Sneden's sale. Le Sueur's sister, Jeanne, went with them to Esopus and there married Cornelis Viervant, with whom she returned to Harlem. Le Sueur was living in 1670, but on November 30, 1671, his widow bound out her son, Hillebrand, eight years old. He was engaged by the deacons, in 1673, to ring the bell at five guilders a year. Afterward this widow married Antoine Tilba, and by him had children also.— Riker, James, History of Harlem, p. 196f

Some interesting facts of the Loziers are as follows:

Probably the most interesting of all was Henry Abram Lozier, the manufacturer of the Lozier car and the Cleveland bicycle. He descends from a brother of Cornelius John Lozier. Abraham Lozier of Waldwick and Paramus, N.J-

William S. Lozier, founder of the large firm at Rochester, N.Y., Lozier Engineers, who do a great deal of municipal engineering, descended from Petrus Lozier, the third son of Nicholas. In his lineage is an Abraham Lozier, sergeant in the Continental Army.

Abraham Witten Lozier and his wife Dr. Clemence S. Lozier founded the New York Medical College and Hospital for Women. Their son, Dr. Abraham, Jr. also carried on the family profession. The senior Abraham was born and raised at the Lozier House on Goffle Road was a carpenter in N.Y.C.

The great Lozier Ranch at Cora, Wyoming which has been in the same family since the early days of the old west was founded by Levi Lozier after leaving New Jersey in the mid 1800s. His father, Peter A. Lozier of Edgewater, N.J- had the largest Lozier family known of to date, 22 children in all. Peter A. Lozier descends from the second son of Nicholas, Hildebrand Lozier. The writer also descends from this Peter A. Lozier.

My information has been gathered from many different sources with a strong emphasis on family records from all parts of the country. It has been my desire to correspond with every living Lozier in order to get additional information and to update, correct, and corroborate other sources of data. By necessity much judgement has had to go into compiling all the various facts, but I believe my work to be the most complete and accurate pool of Lozier history available. On 5 August 1803 (recorded 9 June 1804, Bergen Co. S:288) Thomas Harris, carpenter, of the City of New York, for \$1 release and quit claim rights in estate at Liberty Pole in Tenafly being part of Estate belonging formerly to John Lozier, purchased for use of his children by my late wife Ann Harris; quit all claims unto Dr. Abraham Lozier, unto Hellabrant Lozier, unto Christine Chapman, wife of Doctor George Warren Chapman, all of the City of New York, the two former being sons, the later a daughter of said Ann Harris, deceased. Banta; mentioned middle of Road that leads from the Liberty Pole to Tenec; bounded E by land of John I. Banta; S and W by Brook; N by aforesaid Road; (2) 11 and 10 Rods woodland beginning NE corner of Aury Westervelt; bounded N by land of Dower Westervelt; E by George W. Chapman; S by Benjamin Westervelt; W by Aury Westervelt. Signed by George Warren Chapman, Christina Chapman, Hellabrant Lozier. Witnessed by Luther N. Vrelon, John Lozier.¹

On 1 May 1804 (recorded 9 June 1804, Bergen Co. The sandstone Dutch Colonial house on the corner of Goffle Road and Paterson Avenue in Midland Park, NJ was believed to have been built by Cornelius Lozier about 1775 (or perhaps before 1750). South of the house was the grist mill known as Lozier's Mill; later, when the property passed to Garret Lydecker, the area was called Lydecker's Mill. In 1826 Abraham Van Riper, then owner, built the stone mill presently standing north of the house.⁵

On 28 Feb 1771, John Van Boskerk, Sheriff of Bergen County, conveyed to Cornelius Lozier of Paramus, for £62, 60 acres in Preckness...bounded by Abraham Spear and Benjamin Spear...purchased from Abraham Spear by Barent Spear, deceased, in hands of Amos Spear.³

Cornelius Lozier owned a mill, as mentioned in a road return dated 28 Dec 1771 (B:63) for the road that came to be called Wyckoff Road in Franklin Township, "beginning at rock by a road that leadeth from Lozier mill being fifty links distance from the corner of Cornelius Lozier's house."⁴

Cornelius John Lozier farmed a part of the original "Lozier Farm" at Hackensack, N.J. during his early years. He was a miller by trade and his politics put him square in the middle of the road. He liked the rebels who were of a minority, and he respected the "law and order" of the tory government, but mainly he wanted to sell his grain to whoever had the money.²

The Lozier family was badly split over the revolutionary political situation. Many of his cousins were ardent patriots, and some of them were loyalists, but Cornelius was able to keep on the good side of both parties which was no simple trick.²

On 12 May 1772, Cornelius & Jane Lozier, of Franklin Precinct, Bergen Co., NJ [sold] to John Bardan, of New Barbadoes Preceinct, Bergen Co., NJ, [for] £550, 137 acres, purchased by John Van Voorhees and William Van Voorhees, deceased, from John Hamilton, Andrew Johnston and John Burnet, 2 April 1745 ... willed, 1 Jan 1757, by the said John van Voorhees together with the wives of the said Garret Ackerman, Peter Post, John Laroe, and David Ackerman, to his son Albe van Voorhees. Signed Cornelius Lozier and Jannetie (x) Lozier. Wit: Cornelius Cooper, William Sarrell and Peter Zabriskie.³

Cornelius knew a Mr. Banta who farmed the ground on Goffle Road in Midland Park where the present Lozier House stands. Banta was having trouble with the Torys trespassing over his farm and taking some of the crops. He told Cornelius that he wished he could get in closer to Hackensack where the Torys were more careful about their actions. They agreed to trade farms, and a part of the deal was that Banta was to serve two hitches in the Continental Army for David and John Lozier, the teenage sons of Cornelius. The farms were traded and Banta served military time for the boys. Son John Lozier inherited the farm upon the death of his father, Cornelius. The farm consisted of 104 acres at that time, but upon the death of John in 1822, the farm must have been sold off, as the sons of John raised their families in the Sparta and Franklin Lakes areas of New Jersey.²

A brother of Cornelius', John Lozier of Hackensack, was what might be called a notorious patriot of the rebel cause. He was a member of the Bergen County Rangers carrying on some rather aggressive guerilla warfare for the Continental Army. The British had a price on his head and in the Tory controlled papers of New York City, he was called a murderer, a thief and such. The loyalists sent a detachment into the Hackensack area to apprehend the 'villian'. He was caught and imprisoned at New York City. General George Washington intervened personally and traded British prisoners he held for the return of John Lozier.²

On 23 April 1788 Cornelius & Jane Lozier, miller, of Franklin Township, conveyed to Hendrick Fredericksen, Jr., of same place, for £70, 60 acres bounded by Abraham Spear and Benjamin Spear...sold to said Lozier by John van Boskerk, late sheriff of Bergen County, for wit directed against Amos Spear, administrator of Barent Spear, deceased, 28 Feb 1771. Witnessed by Cornelius Haring, Albert van Voorhees.³

On 31 March 1812 (recorded 31 March 1812, Bergen Co. G2:189) Margaret Harris, John C. Stagg, and James L. Ackerman, executors of the Last Will and Testament of John Harris, late of Bergen County, deceased, conveyed at public sale, to Cornelius Lozier of the same place, for \$1812.50 5 lots at the Ponds. (1) 18-3/4 acres at W side of the Christian Pool, corner school lot; road that goes to Nicholas Romine. (2) 50 acres beginning land of Simon Van Winkle. (3) 20 acres beginning N side of the mountain. (4) 19-60/100 acres. (5) 20-40/100 acres. Signed by Marget Harris, John C. Stagg, James L. Ackerman. Witnessed by Garret A. Lydacker, John Bartolf.⁷

Francois Le Sueur came to Manhattan with his sister, Jeanne, about 1657. He lived first in Flatbush, then in Harlem in 1661. His father was a cloth maker in Terre de Caux, Normandy. Francois had a brother, Eustace, who was a painter (artist) in France where he was in 1648 a member of the French Academy.

In the marriage record, he is "Francoys Le jere Van Scalmeny by Diepen in Vranckryck" and she is "Van Amsterdam."

Francois and Jannetje moved from Harlem to Esopus early in 1663. He was a soldier in the Esopus Indian War. As his health failed, he returned to New Haarlem with family abt. 1670 and died the next year.

After the death of Francois, Jannetje Hildebrand m. (2) **Antoine Tibba** (Telba; Tilba).

It is interesting to note that with few exceptions, most Loziers in the U.S. today are descendants of Francois Le Sueur, a civil engineer who came from Normandy, France in 1657. His youngest son, Nicholas took to the spelling of Lozier as the best his Dutch relatives could teach him in order to handle a French name in the new English language. Another Le Sueur son took the name of Lasher, being the John Lasher of N.Y.C. - who was a strong supporter of the revolutionary government.¹

He was the manufacturer of the Lozier car and the Cleveland bicycle. He is descended from a brother of Cornelius John Lozier.

About 1880, Harry A. Lozier Sr., was operating one of the largest bicycle and sewing machine manufacturing combines in America. In the period between 1880 and 1900 which has been called the "golden age of the Bicycle," the boom period for the two-wheelers, the Lozier enterprise was making one of the highest quality bicycles on the market, the Cleveland, at a time when most makes left a lot to be desired, qualitywise. Lozier had the foresight to sell out his bicycle manufacturing plants just before the bicycle boom ended -- for \$4,000,000 in cash. In 1897 money that was a good sized fortune. In fact Lozier Sr. did not quit the business in selling his plants but became involved in other enterprises and when he died, in May of 1903, newspaper accounts said he had left an estate of \$10,000,000.¹

In NYC Marine Court, 23 Jun 1828, Helebrant Lozier, a resident of NYC, testified that he enlisted at Hackensack, Bergen Co., NJ as a Pvt. Dragoon, Lee's Legion. He d. 2 Jun 1836, m. 15 Dec 1785 RDC Tappan, to Elizabeth Campbell, of Schaarlenburgh, Bergen Co., NJ. In NYC Marine Court, 8 Jul 1839, Jacob and James Lozier, sons of Helebrant, deceased, and Elizabeth Lozier, of Harrington, Bergen Co., NJ, who is of unsound mind for last six years. The name of Hannes Lozier, the father in this family group, is consistently spelled "Legier" in the transcription of the NYC Luth Ch Baptisms (in NYG&B Rec).

Their son, John Lozier of Hackensack, was what might be called a notorious patriot of the rebel cause. He was a member of the Bergen County Rangers carrying on some rather aggressive guerilla warfare for the Continental Army- The British had a price on his head and in the Tory controlled papers of New York City, he was called a murderer, a thief and such. The loyalists sent a detachment into the Hackensack area to apprehend the 'villian'. He was caught and imprisoned at New York City. General George Washington intervened personally and traded British prisoners he held for the return of John Lozier.¹

He was a Col. in the Revolution. John Lasher was a prisoner, May 11, 1778, in the old Provost Jail, New York City, as a member of Major Goutches' Rangers; he was soon exchanged.

Colonel John Lasher lived on the Battery, New York City, and appears to have been a man of some wealth, as at the fire Sept. 12, 1776, four houses belonging to him were burned. He built two houses in 1780 opposite the mansion built for the President's residence, as shown in a picture in "Early New York Houses." In 1806, his son John B. sold the corner house for \$9,400.00; the other for \$8,300.00. After the Revolutionary War he was a merchant in the wholesale grocery business. He was appointed first Surveyor of the Port of New York when the custom house was established, Nov. 18, 1784.

He made his will Feb. 13, 1806. He describes himself as a gentleman and devises to his son John B., to daughters Mary A., Catharine, Helen and to children of Mary A. and Catharine. His son John B. is made sole executor. He died, Feb. 29, 1806.

SECONDLY I Give & bequeath to my oldest son Cornelius Lozeere & to his Heirs forever the fifty Acres of land be the same more or less by me bought & by him enjoyed in the County of Sussex. THIRDLY I Give & bequeath to my son John Lozeere Jur and to his heirs forever All my Homstead Farm in the Township of Franklin County of Bergen . FOURTHLY I Give & Bequeath to my oldest Daughter Polly wife of Henry H. Masker Two Hundred and Fifty Dollers in the following manner my son John must pay to my Daughter Polly one Year after my Decease twenty five Dollers and six months thereafter twenty five Dollers & so on In succession untill the aforesaid sum of two Hundred & fifty dollers is paid. FIFTHLY I Give and bequeath to my yungest Daughter Jane wife of Michael Stor by my son John in manner following Two Hundred & fifty Dollers one Year after my desease to pay one hundred Dollers & one Hundred Dollers two Years after My Deseas & fifty Dollers one Year after. SIXTHLY I devise that my son John pay to my son Cornelius the sum of Three Hundred & twelve dollers & fifty Cents in the following manner one Hundred and twelve Dollers & fifty Cents one Year after my Deseas & one hundred yearly untill the whole is paid. SEVENTHLY I Give & bequeath to my son John All my

personal property not heretofore disposed of in my will & in case of my Disease before my wife Pegge my son John must Maintain her Desent during her life & in case she wishes to go to any of her other Children or even to any stranger my son John to pay A reasonable price for her board & in case of disagreeing on the price each to Chuse A man indifferent between the parties to settle on a price between the parties aforesaid. LASTLY: I appoint my trusty friends James L. Ackerman & Peter Watson Executors of this my last testament and will. Wits. were John Bard, John Ellison, Egbert Vanderoef. The will was probated upon oath of John Bard, of Dutchess County, Physician.¹

Nicholas Lozier moved from New York to Bergen County after his first marriage.

He purchased from the East Jersey Proprietors 29 Sep 1697, 80 acres probably in what is now Teaneck, NJ. 1697 Sept. 29. Patent to Nicholas Lazeere of Bergen Co., for 80 acres there, N. E. Lawrence Lawrence, S. W. Johannes Christiancie's son.²

In the m. record (2) they are "Claes Losier, w. of Trintie Slot, and Antie Dirckse Banta, y.d., b. Ackinsack, both l. here."

Nicholas's father, Francois, died when Nicholas was about three. He was raised by his Dutch Mother and her relatives in Harlem and Kingston, NY. After marrying, he moved back to Hackensack, NJ from New Haarlem, to farm. He purchased a

farm from agents of King George of England. Part of this farm remained in the Lozier family until 1937 without interruption in the chain of title. The homestead is shown on the Erskine maps used by Geo. Washington as "Lurzires house."

In his will, dated 12 April 1745 Hackensack, Bergen C., NJ, Nicholas Lozier, shoemaker; mentioned wife, Antie, sole executrix during widowhood. Brother-in-law, Jacob Derkse Banta, and son-in-law, David Demarest, both of Hackensack, to be tutors and administrators of the minorene children, as also assistants of the wife, and, if she dies or remarries, to act as executors. In case of second marriage, wife, Antie, to hold the whole estate secured, until the youngest child will be sixteen, that the children may be educated, etc. Then the oldest son, Anthony, to have the land where he hath formerly lived, at Steenraapje (?), that is from Hackensack River running back westerly according to the deed thereof unto the first run beyond the hill. Son, Johannis, to have remaining part of said land. Son, Petrus, the land where he formerly lived, called the New Hook, on Hackensack river, between Peter Alje Hendrick and Samuel Laroe. Son, Lucas, the south half part of the tract between the land of Goleyn Ackerman and Peter Alje (according to deed). Son, Derrick, the other half of the tract. Sons, Jacobus and Benjamin, the land on the plain east of Hackensack River, with the slip, containing 63 acres (according to deed thereof). Sons, Jacob and Abraham, the home farm, with a piece of land I bought of Benjamin VanBoskirk, and the meadow bought of Wm. Day. Son, Hillebrant, "all his smith tools." Further, I have given to the children begotten by first wife, Fraintje, viz., Anthony, Jannetje, Petrus, Johannis, Mary, Hillebrant, Antje, Lucas, Jacobus and Benjamin, each £5 allowance of their mother's estate. "Oldest son, Anthony, to have my cane and 'sit place' in the church at Schralenburg." Unto children Fraintje, Hester, Rachel, Derrick, Jacob, Abraham, Lea, and Margrietje, whatsoever they may require out of my estate. Witnesses--Johannis Vanhooven, Silvester Earle, Robert Livesey. Proved 8 April, 1761. Antie Lozier qualified as executor. (Lib. G, p. 419) 1745, Apr. 12. Fragment of renunciation. "Whereas Nicholas Lozier by his last will, dated 12 April, 1745, appointed Antie Lozier, Jacob Derkse Banta, and David Demarest executors, and whereas the said Jacob Derkse Banta and David De (missing) refused to take upon them the burthen."

Upon his death, the farm was broken up by will to the 10 sons. Some of the sons sold their shares back to those who stayed on the land to farm it. The ones who stayed on the land did quite well, sending their children to good schools and eventually off to be doctors, lawyers and successful business men. The Loziers who sold out, mostly went to N.Y.C. and apparently were soon out of their money. Their descendants were most often the laborers, drivers, and workmen in the hub-bub of the large city. It is interesting to note that the family records of those who stayed out of N.Y.C. are much more complete than those who lived in the city.¹

Because Nicholas refused to swear allegiance to the newly established American government, several of his grist mills were confiscated and he was forced to flee. He fled to Belleville, Canada via the Mohawk valley with all his possessions to escape service in the Continental Army and as a result his home was confiscated by the Federal government. This Nicholas was a proud Loyalist and he changed the spelling of his name to Lazier and today, many of his descendants carry this Lazier name in Canada.⁴

Nicholas and Charity came with their family and slaves to settle near Sophiasburg, Ontario about 1792. Upon his arrival in Prince Edward Co., Ontario, he erected another grist mill, this one situated beside a small creek on his property. Evidence of Lozier's prosperity lies in the fact that he was able to bequest a farm to each of his sons. Nicholas Lozier was a Justice of the Peace. Their son(s) acquired farms in Prince Edward County, and operated mills in Hastings County.³

Peter Lozier was a Private in the NJ Continental Line. He filed for a Revolutionary War Pension No. S42886. At NYC Marine Court, Apr 1818, Peter Lozier, age 57, Pvt. Dragoon Lee's Legion, enlisted at Hackensack, Bergen Co., NJ. Others mentioned in pension: Helebrant Lozier (no relationship stated).

On 3 October 1787 Peter and Fenety [Trintie?] Leishear, of Ramapo, conveyed to Area Westervelt of Teanafly, for £139, 9 acres; mentioned line of said Area Westervelt, John Westervelt and Dower Westervelt. Signed Peter Lozier (his mark), Arene Lozier (her mark). Witnessed by John Benson Jr. and John Hopper.¹

On 1 October 1787, Hellabrant Leishear of Teanafly, and Peter Leishear of Ramapo (grandsons of Hellabrant Leishear, deceased, of Teanafly) conveyed to said Peter Leishear, 9 acres and 8 acres; mentioned line of Dower Westervelt and John Westervelt; line of Area Westervelt, Benjamin Westervelt and Anne Harris. Signed by Hellabrant Lozier, Peter Lozier (his mark). Witnessed by John Benson Jr., Aury Westervelt.¹

He is possibly the Peter Lozier mentioned in the following transactions: On 1 May 1792 (Recorded 27 Feb 1805, Bergen Co. U:34) Cryn Bartolf of Ramapough, Franklin Township, and Susan, his wife, yeoman, conveyed to Peter Lozier of the same place, yeoman, for £220, 22 acres, farm at Ramapough, in the Township of Franklin, where said Crynis Bartolf now lives on, beginning middle of road leading though said neighborhood at SW corner Andrew Hopper's land. Bounded SE by middle of road; SW by land of John Hopper; W by land of John Hopper and Andrew Hopper; N by Andrew Hopper. Signed by Cryness Bartholf, Susan Bartolf. Witnessed by Mary Leroe, Henry Van Allen.²

On 7 December 1796 (recorded 27 Feb 1805, Bergen Co. U:38) Jonas Halsted of the Township of Franklin, blacksmith, conveyed to Peter Lozier of the same place, for £400, 56 acres strict measure [surveyed 1768] in the Ramapough Tract, beginning SE corner Corines Bartolf. Mentioned land of John P. Post. Signed by Jonas Halstead. Witnessed by James Christie, Jonathan Traphagen.²

On 5 March 1799 (recorded 22 Feb 1805, Bergen County U:24) Andrew Hopper of Franklin Township, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to Peter Lozier of the same place, yeoman, for £20, 1-45/100 acres strict measure in the Township of Franklin, at a place known by name of Ramapough. Signed by Andrew Hopper, Mary Hopper. Witnessed by Henry V. Allen, Henry Van Dalsem.²

On 17 April 1801 (recorded 22 Feb 1805, Bergen Co. U:27) Abraham Zabriskie of Ramapough in the Township of Franklin, yeoman, conveyed to Peter Lozier of same place, yeoman, for \$8, 20/100 acres more or less in Ramapough in Franklin Township, beginning middle of main road leading through Ramapough neighborhood on N of a blacksmith shop on premises of said Peter Lozier. Mentioned land of John Hopper, Esq. Signed by Abraham Zabriskie. Witnessed by John V. Allen, Henry V. Allen.²
