The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Abraham Lynsen, merchant, became a resident freeman of New York 29 Oct 1734. Abraham Lynsen had a share in the 1755 Schuyler's patent in Herkimer County.³

In his will, he wrote: I, Abraham Lynsen, of New York, merchant, being weak. I leave to my wife Catharine the legacy given to her by her father, Anthony Rutgers, in his will. I leave to my wife during widowhood all the rents and profits of my estate for her support and maintainance and education of my children. Whereas I have given to my son Abraham and my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Thomas Smith, each £1,400, my executors are to pay to my son Cornelius and my daughters

Catharine and Hester each £1,400 when they are of age or married. All the rest of my estate, after the death of my wife, I leave to my son Abraham and my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Thomas Smith, and my son Cornelius, and my daughters Catharine and Hester. Executors may sell all real estate. I make my wife and children executors. October 23, 1759. Witnesses, Thomas Bartow, Jr., Richard King, Joseph Lynsen. Proved, January 5, 1760. [NOTE.--The residence of Abraham Lynsen is now No. -- Wall street. Thomas Smith, who married his daughter Elizabeth, was the brother of William Smith, the Historian. He was the owner of the famous "Treason House" at Haverstraw, where Benedict Arnold and Major John Andre held their conferences. It was then occupied by his brother, Joshua Hett Smith, the unfortunate dupe of Arnold and Andre.--W. S. P.]

5 July 1768 -- Catharine Lynssen, widow of Abraham Lynssen, late of the City of New York, deceased; Abraham Lynssen, merchant of New York City, and Magdalin, his wife; Thomas Smith, of New York City, Attorney-at-law, and Elizabeth, his wife; Cornelius Lynssen, of Newark, in the Province of East Jersey, and Jane, his wife; James Clarke of Milford, in the Colony of Connecticut, Physician, and Catharine, his wife; Cary Ludlow, Attorney-at-law, of the City of New York, and Hester, his wife, all of the 1st part, and George Ludlow, merchant of New York City, land on Queens Street, formerly the Strand, of which Abraham Lynssen died seized on October 23, 1759. (Note. --Deed was not recorded until 5 July 1809.) (New York County Deeds -- Liber 85, p. 52.)¹

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Catharina Lynsen, of the City of New York, widow of Abraham Lynsen, of the said City, merchant, deceased, being weak in body. It is my will that I be buried in the family vault in the New Dutch Church yard, without pride or ostentation. I leave to my two grandchildren Catharine Sands and David Lynsen each £100. To my grandson, Abraham Rutgers Lynsen, son of my son Cornelius, deceased, £350, to be paid him at such time as he shall be out of his apprenticeship or be twenty-one years old, to be advanced to him by my Executors from time to time as they think most for his benefit, and if he die sooner without lawful issue then the said sum shall sink into the bulk of my estate and be divided among my three daughters Elizabeth, Catharine and Hester. To my said grandson, Abraham Rutgers Lynsen, my silver watch, formerly the property of his father. To my three daughters, Elizabeth, Catharine and Hester, all the rest of my estate, equally divided, and nothing in this will shall be construed so as to prevent them from possessing their equal proportions of my estate as of their own private interest and estate, and the estate hereby devised to them shall not in any wise be subject to the payment of any of the debts of their respective husbands (not named) but shall be held by them in their own right. I make Isaac Roosevelt and Gabriel William Ludlow, of the City of New York, Merchants, Executors. Dated November 2, 1785. Witnesses, Abrm L. Smith, James S. Smith, James Bayne Clarke (of New Milford, Conn., Gentleman). Proved, November 28, 1785.

On 4 Nov 1735, at a meeting of the NYC Common Council, "Gideon Lynsen who was Elected and Returned to Serve in the Office of A Constable of the South Ward of this City was this day Sworn into the Said Office...and William Lewis was by this Court Admitted and Sworn his Deputy."¹

Agnes Van de Rijvijere joined the Groede church by confession 29 Sep 1662.²

When Agneta married she was a "jongedochter" (young daughter which means unmarried woman. Witness for her was Josijntje van Lare and there was written consent from her guardian, who thus did not live in Groede. So probably her father and maybe mother were dead by then. It is possible that the Walraven van de Riviere who is witness for her first two children is that guardian, but I have no information about him. The relationship with Josijntje van Lare, who was midwife in Groede, is unknown, but as she appears prominently, there might be one.¹

Joos Leijnsen was living in Oelem (Oedelem, about 10 kilometers south of Bruges), Flanders, from about 1638 through 1641. He was in Groede, Zeeuws Vlaanderen, Zeeland, by 1643.² He moved between 1663 and 1665 with his third wife to Zaamslag.

Joos is called a tailor, 35 years old, in a notary declaration dated 3 Aug 1654.

Joost probably came to New York with his mother Agnes de Riviere and stepfather Jacob de Coninck, arriving by 31 May 1677 when they joined the Dutch Church in New York.²

In their marriage record, they were: Joost Vincent, j.m. Van Cassant, en Elisabeth Daniels, j.d. Van N. Yorck, beyde wonende alhier.

Joost Lynszen, en syn huisvr. Lysbeth Daniels were members 2 March 1698 of the NYC Ref Dutch Ch.

Joost Lynsen, baker, became a resident freeman of New York between 26 Sep-9 Nov 1698. He appeared with property in tax assessments lists for the North Ward from 1695 through 1699. Joost Lynsen, baker, was naturalized 26 July 1715 in New York City.²
