

-- LYONS, LINES, LEIN --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Lyon/Lyons

Here are grouped what are probably at least two or three separate families, with names sounding or written the same or similarly, including Lein (the German family) and Lyon/Lyons. They are grouped and arranged as though all surnames were spelled alike.

There is a Lyon family (of French ancestry, then through England-Scotland) descended from Richard Lyon, who was at Fairfield, CT 1649, and Henry Lyon, a descendant of Richard. Henry Lyon, of Milford, CT was a founder of Newark, NJ (which was first called Milford), and was at Elizabeth, NJ by 1673. An account of this family is in Crayon, Joseph Percy, Rockaway Records of Morris County, New Jersey, 1902, pp174-182.

Another immigrant of the name is Thomas Lyon, who settled in Rye, NY.

Liew is Dutch for Lion. (see also: Van Liew)

The will of Abraham Lynn of Saddle River in Bergen Co., N.J. was dated 30 Jan 1767, probated 1 June 1771 (N.J. Wills).

On 25 July 1773, Mary Lien, John Lien (executor of estate of Abraham Lien, deceased) and Daniel Lien (executor of estate of Conrad Lien, deceased) all of Wamayack, Bergen County, conveyed to Anthony Beam, of the same place, property surveyed for Joseph Kerbride...mistake in purchase of 639 acres by Richard Aashfield, deceased, of New York City. On 14 November 1802 (recorded 28 March 1804, Bergen Co. S:26) Theunis Ryerson of Bergen County, conveyed to John Beam of Pompton Township, for \$100.20, a 50-4/100 acre, strict measure, plot of land in the Township of Pompton, where a small brook that leads from Beams High Mountain and empties into a Brook called Deep Brook, also being the 4th of a Lot belonging to Peter Slott recorded Book S14, p. 168 at Perth Amboy. Signed by Theunis Ryerson. Witnessed by Abraham Line, Junr., Polly Ryerson.¹

On 8 January 1805 (recorded 1 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:303) Theunis Ryerson of Bergen County, conveyed to Conrad D. Lines and Abraham Lines Junior, both of the Township of Pompton, for [\$ amount left blank], two lots: (1) 10-15/100 acres strict measure in the Township of Pompton, beginning SE end of Wanaque Mountains; corner 50-acre tract returned to Silas Condit 5 July 1801. The following transaction may refer to this Abraham C. Lines: On 13 April 1790 Anthony and Hettie Bartrim, blacksmith, of Saddle River Township, conveyed to **Abraham C. Lines**, carpenter, of Franklin Township, for £28, 9 acres in Franklin Township. Signed by Anthony Bartrim, Hettie Bartrim (her mark). Witnessed by Jacobus Lines (his mark) and John Collins.¹

In his will, dated 23 Dec 1811, probated 18 April 1812, Abraham C. Lines, of Pompton Twsp., Bergen Co., mention wife Sarah; daus. Elizabeth (wife of Jacob Van Houten), Mary, and Sarah. Executors were Charles Board, Esq., and Henry Van Waggoner. Witnesses were John A. Post, Martin G. Ryerson, and Theunis Ryerson. An inventory of the estate (valued at \$1,000.97) was made 16 Apr 1812 by Nathaniel Board.

His name is given in a list, 1694, of subscribers to the support of the Rev. John Harriman of the First Presbyterian Church of Elizabeth. In the re-survey and allotment of the township, which from the first was the leading one in New Jersey, Benjamin Lyon was chosen assistant "to lay out, divide and equally assize all the lands and meadows within the whole bound and purchase of Elizabethtown, to every one interested therein, by right of purchase under the Hon. Richard Nicolls, their several respective parts, and of the whole." "They entered upon their work December 26, 1699, and completed it March 5, 1700. The ground surveyed comprised 17,000 acres. Benjamin Lyon was chosen 1708-9 by the Borough of Elizabeth as a member of the Assembly, was appointed 1711-12 a Justice of the Peace; served 1717 on County Committee of Highways. "These appointments, embracing a period of about ten years, serve to show who were of the second generation chosen to office, and were looked upon as men of activity and influence by their townsmen. In almost every instance they were the sons or grandsons of the old planters whose names were still represented in the town."

Benjamin Lyon married Bethiah Condit, sister of John Condit, whose will, dated March 15, 1709-10, names "brothers Benjamin Lyon and Matthew Williams" as overseers.

In his will, dated 18 Feb 1719/20, Newark, Essex Co., Eastern Division of NJ, Benjamin Lyon, yeoman; mentioned wife Bethyah. Children--Benjamin, Anna Canfield, Joanna Prudden. Home farm, meadows at the Fishing Place, salt meadow on George's Creek, meadow, bounded by land of Thomas Sayr dec'd, salt meadow, part of Newark meadows, bo't of Jonathan Tichenor. Personal estate. Executors--the wife and son; brother Joseph Lyon requested to see will executed. Witnesses--Jonas Wood, Thomas Tomson, Jo'n Cooper. Proved April 7, 1720.

Henry Lyon, of Glen Lyon, Perthshire, Scotland, with brothers, Thomas and Richard, all of whom were in Cromwell's army, came to America in 1648. Henry settled at Milford, Conn.; m. May 1652, Elizabeth Bateman. He joined the First Church at Milford 24 Feb 1649.

On 4 May 1652 he was granted a homestead and home lot at Fairfield, CT. On May 28th, 1654, he was dismissed from Milford Church to Fairfield Church.

They later removed to Newark, NJ, as one of its founders in 1666, where he served as Newark's first Treasurer. He was

also Newark's first innkeeper; in January 1668 it was recorded that "The Town hath chosen Henry Lyon to Keep an Ordinary for the entertainment of Travellers and Strangers."

By Dec 1674, he and his family had removed to Elizabeth Town, NJ, where he became active in political and commercial affairs: November 8th, 1675, he was a member of the General Assembly. February 4th, 1681, he was made one of the Judges of Small Causes. February 28th, 1681, he became a member of the Governor's Council. August 1st, 1681, he was appointed Justice of the Peace, which during the Colonial period was equivalent to that of Judge of the Supreme Court. December, 1682, he was appointed Commissioner to lay out and appoint all necessary highways, bridges, passages, landings and ferries for the County of Essex. November 26th, 1684, he was a Representative in the Council of the Governor. May 1st, 1686, his commission to the Judgeship.

He accumulated large land holdings at Elizabeth Town, one section of which, located midway between Newark and Elizabeth, was later known as Lyon's Farms.

He probably returned to Newark at or soon after his second marriage.

In his will, dated 9 Feb 1702, he wrote: Whereas I, Henry Lyon, Senior of Newark, in ye provence of East New Jersey being weak in body yet of good understanding and memory--Do make this my Last Will & Testament (hereby making all other wills and testaments at any time by me made voyd and null) in manner and form following: "first, I bequeath my Soul into ye hands of Almighty God....Also I commit my body to the Earth Decently to be buried.... And for my Worldly Estate bothe Real & personal I dispose of as followeth-- Imprimis: I will & bequeath to my Loving Wife Mary Lyon Eighty pounds & I give unto my two Daughters Dorcas & Mary Lyon to each of them Eighty pounds & also my will is yt my house & other buildings & Land & Meadow in Newark shall be kept for ye bringing up of my Daughters Dorcas & Mary Lyon untill they be eighteen years of age & Also my will is yt my wife Mary Lyon & my Daughters Dorcas & Mary Lyon shall pay unto my four sons (viz.) Samll Lyon, Joseph Lyon, Benjamin Lyon and Ebenezer Lyon twenty pounds out of my living in Newark when my Daughters Dorcas & Mary Lyon shall be eighteen years of age, & if my wife Mary Lyon do leave this house then my two Daughters afore'sd shall repay unto my wife what she payd of ye sd twenty pounds unto my four sons afore'sd. 2ndly, My will is & I do will & bequeath unto my two Daughters Dorcas & Mary Lyon to them their heirs & assigns for Ever my house Land & Meadow in Newark after my wife's decease. 3rdly My will is yt if any one of my Daughters Dorcas or Mary Lyon shall dy before they come of age to enjoy ye aforesd Legacy of Eighty pounds & other things belonging to them my will is yt ye surviving Daughter shall enjoy it. 4thly I will & bequeath to my Grandchild John Ward twenty shillings, unto my Daughter Elizabeth Lyon relect of my son Thomas, to her & her children twenty shillings. Elizabeth Harrison, widow of Henry Lyon, became the third wife of John Morris, who was one of the signers of the New Haven Plantation Covenant, and he was one of the Milford Colony that planted Newark. On June 18th, 1668, he and his wife

were appointed guardians of Hopestill Lyne, a minor. I leave to my son John, £10, as heir at law; Also the house which he now lives in with orchard and lot of land running across to Byram river, by the lot that was Samuel Lyons, a direct course, so that it be 1/2 the land that I have on Byram Neck adjoining to the river, which said land lies in Greenwich, Connecticut; Also a negro man. And he is to pay to my 3 daughters, viz., Elizabeth, wife of Thomas Star Tredwell, Ruth, wife of Abraham Bush, and Sarah, wife of Elnathan Mead, £5 each. I leave to my son James, Mary's Hill, so called, in Byram Neck, and Samuel Bank's lot "with which the other 1/2 of the neck of the lands to be made up," And he is to pay to his brother, Rodger Lyons, £100. I leave to my son Rodger, with what I have already given

him, my lands on Calves Island, and all my salt meadow, and all my right of undivided lands in Rye, and a negro man. I leave to my son Gilbert the farm where I now live with the house and buildings and 4 acres of land, subject to my wife's right; Also the timber lot on the other side of Byram river, along the road as you go to Horse Neck. And he is to pay to his brothers John, Rodger, and James, and to his sisters, £300. I leave to my son in law, Abraham Bush, the Saw Pit lot. All the rest of my movable estate I leave to my three sons. And as touching my lands at Cacoatt (Kakiat) on the west side of Hudson river, and all my rights of land in the Patent of Peter Fauconier & Co., they are to be sold by my executors, and the money paid to my three daughters. My negroes are to be considered part of my movable estate, and my old negro Betty to be maintained. I leave to my grand daughter Mary, daughter of my son John, £30 when of age. Witnesses, J. Wetmore, Cornelius Flanus, Ebenezer Edwards. Proved before Samuel Purdy, Esq., August 16, 1749. [NOTE.--The lands at Kakiat are in Clarkstown, Rockland County.]

Moses Lyon was a revolutionary soldier and served as a private in Capt. Abraham Lyon's Company, second Regiment, Essex County, New Jersey Militia, during the revolutionary war. His sons, James Henry and Nathaniel, aided the cause of

American Independence, the first two as officers, and the third as private in the second Regiment, Essex County Militia and Continental Line. His son Moses was a drummer boy in the same regiment.

In the distribution of home lots at Newark in 1666, Samuel Lyon received No. 39. He signed the "fundamental agreement" with the Milford Colonists June 24, 1667, although at that time he was a mere lad. Feb. 25, 1683-4 the town of Newark allowed Samuel Lyon to sell two acres of land to Zopher Beach.
