

-- MABIE --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

"Some genealogists believe the Mabie and Van Orden (or Van Norden) families are descended from the same ancient French family of Mabilie in Anjou, which they left during Huguenot troubles. It is thought that one Sergeant Casper Mabilie emigrated to New Amsterdam in very early days by way of the Dutch village of Naarden. Some of his descendants thus came to be known as Van (from) Naarden, because of a custom that frequently created a permanent surname from the place of emigration."— Talman, Wilfred Blanch, *Tappan: 300 Years*, 1988, p. 69

Abraham Mabie was a blacksmith and a prominent Tory. He probably reconveyed the land he received from his father back to his father when he left the area for good. No proceedings were taken against his property by the New Jersey authorities. His career as a spy is noted in Adrian C. Leiby's The Revolutionary War in the Hackensack Valley, which also records that Mabie's wife was given a pass in December 1779 permitting her to go to New York with her two children.

In a newspaper account of their marriage (*Paterson Intelligencer*, 10 Oct 1827), he is Frederick B. Maybee of NY and she is of Paramus.

Frederick B. Maybee was listed in the 1830 census for Franklin Township (prob. Waldwick-Hohokus area) with: one male of 20 and under 30; one female of 10 and under 15; one female of 30 and under 40; one male free colored person of 10 and under 24.

Charity was mentioned in her father's will da. 13 Jan 1838 as "Charity, wife of Fredrick Mabie." She inherited 1/4 of her father's homestead farm.<sup>1</sup>

Charity's brother John was married to Frederick's sister, Mary Ann. In 1848, Fredric B. Mabie was appointed guardian of John A. Hopper, Hannah Hopper and Hester Hopper, the children of her dec'd. bro. John and also his dec'd sister.<sup>1</sup>

Living with them in Franklin Township at the time of the 1850 census were: Hester Hopper, 14; Frederick B. C. Mabie, 4; Samuel Pemoste, 38, laborer; Catharine Snyder, 17; Adam Snyder, 13; and Henry J. Snyder, 11.

I leave to my eldest son, Peter Mabee, all my lands and tenements on the north side of the Mohaug's river, between the lands of Laurence Van der Valogoe, and the land of Colonel Stephanus Groesbeck, with all the privileges, and £150, and he is to pay £150 to his sisters. I leave to my second son, Jacob, all my estate on the south side of the Mohaug's river, between the land of Jacobus Peek and Peter Vrooman, Sr., with the houses, barns, and barracks, and he is to pay to his sisters £250. And he is to pay 5 Scheppels of wheat towards the rent of his lands to his eldest brother Peter as an acknowledgement. I leave to my youngest son, Abraham, the house and lot where he now lives, in the town of Schenectady, between the lot of Benjamin Vanfleet and the minister's lot, And the pasture ground that lyes between the pasture ground of Herman Vedder, and the pasture ground of Captain Herman Vanskite; Also all the arrable land lying between the land of Martin Vanbenhousen and the land of Aaron Vedder, on the south side of the road, and the Swamp or Cripple bush thereto adjoining. And he is to pay to his sisters £250, and 5 Schepples of wheat yearly forever to his eldest brother Peter towards paying the rent of his farm. I leave to my daughter Margaret one half of all my lands where she now lives, called Kadaritha, during her

life. And the other half, which Nicholas Holl hath hired for 15 years, I leave to my sons Peter and Jacob, and the other half after the death of my daughter Margaret. All the rest of my estate I leave to all my children. (Seven daughters are mentioned but only Margaret is named.) I make Jacobus Van Dyke and Caleb Beck\*, executors. Witnesses, Jan Danite, Jacobus Peek. "Proved before Peter Van Brugh, the will of Jan Peterse Mabee, September 13, 1725."<sup>1</sup>

In 1857 he purchased 51 acres at Fairview, Bergen Co., NJ and built a brownstone mansion. His business was the manufacture of gold pen cases. He was also an inventor, inventing a screw pencil and a car replacer, a successful railroad invention.

On 3 Oct 1854 John Mabie, of English Neighborhood, Bergen Co., NJ patented an improved pen and pencil case.<sup>2</sup>

Myndert Mabie was a blacksmith. His brother, Abraham Mabie, also a blacksmith, was an active loyalist during the Revolutionary War, serving as a spy and messenger of great importance. Myndert Mabie was arrested with his father in 1779 and jailed at Poughkeepsie for a short time, but his further involvement as a loyalist, if any, is not recorded. He lived at what is now #285 Prospect Avenue, Park Ridge. He sold the property in 1813 and moved to Upper Preakness with his family.

In 1800, Isaac and Sally Maby, of Harrington Township, conveyed to Peter J. Maby, farmer, of the same place, for £150, 5 acres...corner to Minder Maby, Beter Bogart and Margaret Then [Thew?]....and 3 acres, adjoining...line of William Holdrum...and 11 acres, adjoining. Signed by Isaac Maby, Sally Maby (her mark). Witnessed by Isaac DeBaun.<sup>1</sup>

Pieter Casparszen [Mabie] was not a member of either the Van Orden or Van Norden families, as has been asserted.<sup>2</sup>  
 Pieter Casparzen was in New Amsterdam by 1647. He lived on the west side of Broad Street in New Amsterdam.

Daughter Tryntie is shown on Domine Selyns' 1686 list of church members where she appears to be living with her widowed mother, Aecht Jans, on the Heeren Gracht, west zyde, (Broad Street, west side), probably in the family home, which was on the SW corner of Broad Street and Marketfield.<sup>3</sup>

According to tax lists for NYC, Aechtje was in the South Ward which was the area between Whitehall and Broad streets and between Beaver street and the water. In the first assessment shown, made in Dec 1695 are: Eaght Janse, £3; Peroo [John Peroa], £20; Ditto for ye house, £30. The listing of Eaght Janse and John Peroa (with spelling variations) continues for several assessments ending with the 21 Aug 1697 assessment. In the 1 Feb 1697/8 assessment there is no mention of "Eaght Janse," only: John Peroa house &c, £25; Ditto his Estate, £20.<sup>3</sup>

His father devised to him, in his will probated 8 July 1772, "all my lands lying over the Kill in the Pattant to Honeing & Hawding..." and after some sales of land, this amounted to about 88 acres. Peter had lived on part of this land from about 1759.

Peter's sons Abraham and Casparus, were active Loyalists and the western end of his property in Lot #3 of the Kakiat Patent had caves and was a refuge for Loyalist gangs. After General Washington ordered them seized, Peter and his son Min-dert were taken into custody and jailed at Poughkeepsie for a short time, later being released.
