The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In their marriage record, they were: Henry Monye, j.m. Van Bordeaux, en Marianne Grasset, j.d. Van Rochel, beyde woone allier. Met Att. Van de Fransche Kercke.

They settled on Staten Island before 1700. Henry Money was constable on Staten Island 1713-1728. The 1712 will of Augustus Grasset mentions son-in-law Henry Money. Henry and Mary may have later moved to Elizabeth (then Elizabethtown), NJ. They were later settlers at Westfield, NJ, where the baptisms of his grandchildren by son, Henry De Money, Jr., were entered in the church records.

Robert Hunter, Esq., Captain-General and Governor. Whereas Augustus Grasset, of New York, died intestate, Letters of Administration are granted to Louis De Bonis, who married his daughter Hester, Joseph Oldfield, of Jamaica, Long Island, who married his daughter Martha, and Henry Money of Richmond County, who married his daughter Mary. April 19, 1712.

"Henry De Monye" was one of the first settlers at Piscataway, NJ. Henry de Money was mentioned in early records of Woodbridge, NJ about 1721.

In his will, he wrote: 1755, Jan. 29, I Henry De Money, of the Boro' of Elizabeth, Essex Co., tailor; mentioned children-- Henery Demoney, Augustus Demoney, Ann Wood, Easter Freeman, (wife of Benjamin). Marey Frasey, and Susanah Demoney. Real and personal estate. Executor son (son-in-law) Joseph Frasey of said Bor'. Witnesses--Moses Frazee, Samuel Willis, John Stits, proved Feb. 5, 1755. 1755, Feb. 6. Inventory, £186.8.8 1/2 by Joseph Frazee and Benjamin Littell.

Jan Mainje obtained a patent for 20 morgens in Brooklyn 11 Sep 1642: Kings County Deeds, Book I, p. 246: Willem Kieft, Director Generall, to Jan Mainje grants piece of land great 20 morgan stretching about South east 190 rodds inward the woods towards to Sassians Maisland long in the limits of said maisland 50 rodd, then again to water side, 220 rodd about N.W. so Nly and along the stranth or waterside 70 rodd, which land is lying upon L.I. bet. Andrus Hudden & Claus Janse Ruyter. Dated 11 Sep 1642. Willem Kieft, Conelis Vantienhove, Sect. 29 Jan 1652, the above said patent mentioned by Pieter Linde (having married the relict of Jan Manje) transported to Barent Janse as appeared upon the record in the date above written signed C. V. Ruyven, Secr.¹

Jan Manje was wounded at Stamford (in the Manhattan Indian War) and later died around 11 March 1644. He was married to Marta Chombar/Combaer of Nieukerck at the time of his death. Nieukerck is Neuve-Eglise, West Flanders, Belgium, a few miles N.E. of Bailleul.

On 11 March 1664, Councillor Montague made a declaration respecting the testamentary disposition of his property as made by Jan Manje, lying wounded at Stamford, of which wounds he died, as per p. 26 of Cal. of Dutch Man. On 31 March 1664, Cicero Albutus (Pieter Caesar Albutus) receipts for his wife's (dau. of Jan Manje) share of her father's estate.

Pierre/Peter Monnet, Sr. came from London, and was at Staten Island by 1681. He returned to London where he was a member of the French Church in Threadneedle St.

In his will (London; translated from the French): I Peter Monnet living in the Liberty of the Tower of London in the County of Middlesex, Master Weaver, [old and blind] leaves all land, houses, moveables, moneys, merchandise or otherwise in either France or England, to wife Catherine Monnet and makes her sole executrix. Dated 30 July 1709, London. Signed Peter Monnet. Witnesses: A. Le Febure; John Chaboussant. Probated 11 May 1715 London by Catherine Monnet relict of said deceased and the executrix named in the will.

The Census of Staten Island, 1706 shows: "MEN: Peter Codret (error for MONET), Henery Money; WOMEN: Mary Money, Mary Money; BOYS: John Mon (Mone), Albert (Abraham) Money, Peter Money, John Money; GIRLS: Anne Money.

In his will, he wrote: I, Peter Manett, of Staten Island, yeoman. I leave to my wife, Mary, all houses, lands, and goods during her life, and after her decease to my eldest son Abraham, and he shall pay to his three brothers, Peter, John, and Isaac, £ 50 when of age. If my son Abraham die without issue, then my house and lands where I now dwell, and the tract of land in the woods, which is mentioned (though yet undivided) in a Patent, jointly with my neighbor, Anthony Tice, are to go to my second son Peter, he paying to the rest £ 75. I make Captain James Poillon, and Mr John Latowrette, executors. Dated June 19, 1707. Witnesses, J. Billop, Anthony Tyce, Tyce Willimse. Proved, April 8, 1712." (p. 121.) (N.Y. Hist. Coll. Vol. II.)

When Pierre Monnet, Jr. made his will in 1707, probated, 1712, he sealed his signature, written by him, as "Manett," in wax, and he affixed his seal, clearly showing the "Lion Rampant," and as if to preclude doubt forever, intersticed a form of

scroll, between his prename and patronymic, as exists similarly today, in the earlier signature of his ancestor, the first Pierre Monnet, 1573, and later, in original recs. at La Bibliotheque Nationale, Paris. This scroll always apparently took the form of a letter "M," sometimes following the surname signature, offering a most striking and high degree of proof of pedigree and French lineage.
