The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the marriage record, they are "Andries Marschalk, j.m. Van Vlissingen in Zeel^l. en Elisabeth Van Gelder, j.d. Van New Yorck. beyde woende alhier."

Andries Marschalk, with Rebekka Jans, h.v. van Pieter Jacobse, witnessed the baptism 4 May 1698 NYC Ref Ch, of Casparus, son of Jacob Van Noorstrand & Annetje Croesvelt.

Anderiez Marschalock was listed in the Census of NYC taken about 1703 living in the North Ward. Living in his family group were 1 male 16-60; 2 females; 5 male children; and 1 female child.¹

In his will he wrote: I, Andries Marschalk, of New York, baker, being in good health. I leave to my son Johanes £5, in full bar to all claims of his being heir at law. I leave to my daughter Maria £70, "which is in lieu of the portion by me given to my other children for their advancement in their life time." "I leave to my wife all the household goods that she was possessed of at the time of our marriage, and which she brought along with her," And she is to have œ12 yearly. All the rest of my estate I leave to my children, Johanes, Peter, Abraham, Francois, Maria, and to the children of my son Andries, deceased, and to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of David Schuyler. I make my sons and my son-in-law, David Schuyler, and my daughter Maria, executors. Dated October 2, 1738. Witnesses, Peter Bos, A. Vitte, Simon Johnson. Proved, October 21, 1742.

Andrew Marschalk was a New York-born printer, best known for championing the case of Ab-dul Rahman Ibrahima Ibn Sori, popularly known as the "Prince of Slaves".

Andrew Marschalk was an Ensign in the Revolution under General Wayne.

Marschalk learned the printing trade while living in London in the 1780s. He brought a small mahogany press to the America in 1790. Marschalk sold this printing press when he joined the United States Army. During his period in the Army he fought Indians in the Northwest Territory, and after the fighting was over he became a lieutenant in the reserves.

In 1797 Marschalk regained possession of his press. With the printing press and thirty pounds of type he moved to the Mississippi Territory. His first ballad, deemed "The Gallery Slave," energized the small town of Natchez, Mississippi. Unfortunately, Marschalk's superior felt the printing business was beneath an Army soldier, so Marschalk was ordered to leave Natchez. It was not until 1802 when he was discharged from the army that he returned to Natchez. Marschalk then established "The Mississippi Gazette", which was published for six years. Marschalk eventually moved to the nearby town of Washington, Miss., where he published "The Washington Republican" and was postmaster of Washington.

For the remaining thirty-six years of his life, he lived in Natchez and Washington, publishing various works. In 1828 Andrew Marschalk found an interest in the case of Ab-dul Rahman Ibrahima Ibn Sori, known popularly as the "Prince of Slaves". He began gathering donations and successfully petitioned the Secretary of State, Henry Clay, to help return the Ab-dul Rahman to Africa. Marschalk then supported Ab-dul Rahman Ibrahima Ibn Sori's tour through the north as a free man raising funds to liberate his children.

Jarvis Marshall was first mentioned in New York City records in 1676 (MCC 1:28) unless he was the Gerard Marshatt mentioned in 1670 (RNA 6:245). He was Cryer and Marshall of the Court of Mayor and Alderman (1683), Dock Master (1686), Under Sheriff of New York City 1691 and Marshall of the court of Vice Admiralty in (1697), all as shown in MCC 1:109, 192; CEM 207, 257. He was also involved in land speculation in Orange County and Dutchess County (where he was one of the Nine Partners of the Patent of that name). He witnessed an unrecorded will dated 3 April 1714 (WNYHS 11:12, 17:368; original will #413). He evidently died or moved away from New York City prior to February 1721-1722 when his name does not appear on the assessment roll of New York City (original roll on microfilm at NYG&BS) No probate has been found for him or his wife in New York, New Jersey or England.¹

Jarvis Marshall, and John Smith, glazier, release to Peter Stoutenburgh, Peter Jacobse Marius, Dirck Van der Cliff and Jacobus Kipp, all claim against the estate of Elizabeth Peters and Dirck Wiggerse, deceased, "From the beginning of the World

until the day of the date hereof." April 2, 1686. Witnesses, John Robinson, William Coales.

The celebrated "Great or Lower Nine Partners Patent" in Dutchess County was granted May 27, 1697, to Col. Caleb Heathcote, Agustine Graham, James Emmot, Col. Henry Filkins, David Jamison, Hendrick Ten Eyck, John Aertson, William Creed and J. Jarvis Marshall. Nearly all of these men held some office, high or low, in the Colony. The last mentioned patentee for example: by the Civil List of the Province of New York it appears that Jarvis Marshall, was in 1693, "Doorkeeper and Messenger of ye Council," at a salary of 30 pounds a year.²

This grant was an extensive one, comprising all the land in the Towns of Clinton, Stanford, Pleasant Valley, Washington, Amenia and Northeast, with the exception of that which came in the last two named in the Oblong being annexed, and all land in the Town of Hyde Park south of the Crum Elbow Creek.²

In 1699, a survey was made, and the land divided between the nine proprietors. These Lots varied from thirty to thirty-two chains in width. Lot No. 9, fell to Jarvis Marshall; its west boundry was the Hudson River and it was all in the Town of Hyde Park. He also had "Great Lots" Nos. 1, 15, 24 and 35 in the interior. At an early date he sold one-half his interest in the Patent to Jacobus Van Rollegin, and in 1700 he sold the other half to John Croke, a New York Merchant.²
