The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In a quit claim deed (Ulster Co. Deeds) dated 6 Nov 1710: To all Christian people to whome this present writing shall or may come Gerrit Aartsen of the Corporation Kingstown in the County of Ulster---Jacob Aartsen of Wagendaal in said County of Ulster, Grietie Elmendorp of Kingstown aforesaid, widdow, and Arent Fynhout son and hiere of Neeltie Aartsen deceased send greeting. Whereas Aart Jacobsen Late of Kingstown aforesaid deceased--Did by his Last Will and Testament give & bequeath his whole estate unto his five children the above named Gerrit Aartsen, Jacob Aartsen, Grietie Elmendorp, Neeltie Aartsen Mother of said Arent Fynhout, And to Elizabeth Maston wife of Cornelis Maston of Kingstown aforesaid. And whereas they have devided their said fathers farme or Bowery Scituate Lying & being in the bounds & limits of the Corporation of Kingstown aforesaid on the north side of the Esopus Creek of kill on the great piece And the Lott No four by said division is fallen unto said Elizabeth Maston Now know yee that the said Gerrit Aartsen, Jacob Aartsen, Grietie Elmendorp, and Arent Fynhout for Divers good Cause & Vallid Considerations them there unto moving but more and especially for the avoyding and putting aside all strife and difference that hereafter might arise about said farme or bowery Have given granted Released Rattified and Confirmed And by these presents do for themselves and their heires freely Clearly & Absolutely give and Release Rattifie and Confirme unto the said Elizabeth Maston her heires & assigns for ever All that aforementioned Lott of Land No four being bounded Northeasterly by the Lott No three belonging now unto Barent Van Benthuizen Assigne of said Arent Fynhout, Southeasterly by the Land of said Grietie Elmendorp Called Creupelbush, Southwesterly by Lott No five belonging unto said Jacob Aartsen and Northwesterly by the great hill So as the same was Layd out & Stones Sett. To have and to hold the said Lott of Land being No four together with and all Singular the benefits advantages Commoditys profits priviledges hereditaments and appurtenances there unto belonging or in any wise appurtaining unto her the said Elizabeth Maston her heires and assigns for ever. ...sixth day of November Anno Dom 1710.

In his will, dated 30 Jan 1711-12, probated 6 March 1711-12 (written in Dutch). Cornelis Maston of Kingston, mentioned eldest son Johannis, his wife Elizabeth and his five children, by name, Johannis Maston; Aart Maston; the worthy wife of Gysbert Van den Bergh (named Diewertje (Deborah)); Antie Maston; and Geertie, wife of Arien Vliet. Witnesses, Abraham Lamettes, Willem Schepmoes, Aart Van Wagenen, and Wm. Nottingham, who all appeared before the Court consisting of Henry Beekman, Jacob Rutsen, and Dirck Schepmoes, 6 March 1711-12, proving the will.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Cornelius Marston, of Flushing, in Queens County, yeoman, being sick. All debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Jeremiah Brown, my best bed and furniture. I leave to my said daughter Elizabeth, and to my daughter Margaret, now the wife of Thomas Farrington, of Westchester County, and to my daughter Martha, wife of John Wilkins, of Flushing, all my iron pots and all my pewter, and to my daughters Elizabeth and Martha each a horse, and to each of my 3 daughters a cow. To my son John, my wagon, plough, and farming utensils. All the rest of my movable estate to be sold by my executors at public vendue, and all my lands, meadows, and tenements at Flushing, Jamaica, or elsewhere. From the proceeds all debts to be paid, and the expenses of my executors, and the rest to my son John and my 3 daughters. I make my friends and cousins, Bernardus Ryder and Leonard Marston, both of Flushing, executors. Dated August 10, 1754. Witnesses, Hannah Field, Jr., William Field, Benjamin Hinchman. Proved, September 27, 1754. William Field being "a known Quaker."

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Francis Marston, of Flushing, yeoman, being sick, I leave to my wife Mary the choice of rooms in my house, and furniture and household goods; but if she marries she shall have £10 and depart from my farm. I leave to my son John, the house, land, and farm where he lives, which I bought of Francis Bloodgood, in Flushing. My executors are to sell all my other lands. I leave to my daughter Gretie, wife of Peter Smith, £60; to my daughter Conertie [Kniertje], £60. I leave to my son, Lawrence Marston, all the rest of my estate, real and personal. I make my wife and sons executors. Dated March 23, 1748. Witnesses, Simeon Smith, Cornelius Vandewater, Joseph Smith. Proved, August 17, 1748.

In the record of their banns, they were: Jan Maston, j.m., Uyt Engelandt, en Dievertje Jans, j.d. Uyt Noordt Hollt.

John Maston or Marston, was an Englishman who probably came to this country as a soldier in the Dutch service and settled in Flushing, L.I. (his name is mentioned in Gov. Kieft's patent 19 Oct 1645). His name appears on the Dutch Church records as Mast, Maste, Masten, Marston, and Marston. His son John, who settled in Flushing, L.I., appears to have adopted the name of Marston; while Cornelius (also his son), who settled at Kingston, NY, took the name of Masten.²

John Marston was one of the 18 men granted a charter for the town of Flushing on 10 Oct 1645. On 27 Dec 1657 "John Mastine" signed the Flushing Remonstrance.

Jan Maste, soldaet, along with Roelof Janszen, and Anneken Molyn, witnessed the baptism 8 Feb 1644 NYC Ref Ch, of Jan, son of Jan Pieterszen.

Jan Mast, along with Henry Pieche, Thomas Beccen, witnessed the baptisms 28 March 1644 NYC Ref Ch, of Jan, son of Hanna Beckens.

In his will, he wrote: John Marston, Flushing. "I will that my two sons, John and Cornelius, shall live with my well beloved friend John Hinchman and to be wholly at his disposall till they come of age, and he is to have the oversight of all my estate." Leaves all to his two sons when of age. Leaves to daughter Elizabeth a gold ring, and to daughter Katherine a silver thimble. "This is my full will and my sons' desire, as witness our hands this 14th February, 1670/71." Witnesses, Robert Terry, Joseph Thorne, John Marston, Sr., John Marston, Jr., Cornelius Marston. Whereas John Marston, of Flushing, in the North Riding of Yorkshire, upon Long Island, dyed in ye month of February last, and made a will wherein he leaves John Hinchman of the same place to be the guardian of his two sons. Which will according to ye usual custom of the Law ought to be proved at ye next Court of Sessions, and it soe falling out that noe Court is to be held until the month of June during which time the estate may be impaired." The said John Hinchman is confirmed as administrator, April 6, 1671.

In the marriage record they were: Jan Mastingh, young man at Flushing with Geertje Franssen Bloedgoed, young lady from Amsterdam in Holland, residing at Flushing.

In his will, he wrote: I, John Marston, of Flushing, in Queens County, being at this present indisposed of body. I leave to my sons, Francis and Cornelius, all my lands and meadows within the bounds of Flushing, with the housing and orchards. "My will is that if my eldest son Francis shall see cause, or incline to this place where I now live, he hath his liberty to take or refuse, as to him shall best seem meet," together with the 20 acre lot lying upon the east side of Thomas Hinchman's land. "My will is further, that the place where my said son Francis now lives, with the Housing and land thereto belonging, with the 10 acre lot of land lying upon the south side of the Hills, I leave these to my son Cornelius, But if he die without issue, then to my son, John Marston." And whereas the 20 acre lot purchased from Colonel Thomas Willett, the deed being made to my son Francis. If my son Francis shall accept this homestead, where I now live, then he shall be obliged to give a deed for the same to my son Cornelius. I leave to my sons Francis and Cornelius, all my meadow, salt and fresh, both in the town of Flushing and at the South, in Jamaica bounds. To my son Cornelius 3 horses, and a plow and wagon, And I leave them all my carpenter tools. All the rest of my estate, horses, cattle and household goods to my ~~granddaughters~~ [should read "daughters"], Isabel ~~Hoff~~ [corrected to Haff], and Elizabeth Gardner, and my grandson, John ~~Hoff~~ [corrected to Haff], the son of my daughter, Isabel ~~Hoff~~ [Haff], deceased. I make my sons, Francis and Cornelius, and my brother-in-law, William Bloodgood, executors. Dated September 23, 1712. Witnesses, Anthony Glean, James Haight, James Clement. Proved, April 14, 1721, before Henry Wileman, appointed by Governor Burnet.
