

-- MATTHYS, MATHEWS --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Anthony Matysen, a free African, had made a contract with ferry master Egbert Van Borsum to rear "his negro's child," which involved Matysen's wife nursing the baby. The deal had been consummated by Van Borsum's wife, who had "bar-gained with [Matysen's] wife for the child for one year at least, and has not refused her payment of what she promised her in the presence of other negroes." Matysen went before the city court in March 1655, claimed that he had not been paid by Van Borsum, and "request[ed], therefore, that the child be declared free, when [sic] he promises to rear the same at his own expense." The court ruled against Anthony Matysen.<sup>1</sup>

He was in New Amsterdam by 12 Aug 1658, when he brought suit against Cornelius Janzen, a woodsawyer. He lived at Harlem where he was a carpenter and timber-hewer. In 1668 he moved to Hellgate Neck, Newtown. He may later have moved to Hackensack, where his family had moved.

It seems likely that Maria may have had a son out of wedlock while she was still married to Steven Jansen Coninck: **Hendrick Jacobs**, son of Jacob Hendricks [Van Looserecht; Maat; Maet]. This event probably led to the subsequent estrangement and divorce of Steven Jansen Coninck & Maria Goosens.

At a meeting of the Common Council held December 8th, 1683. The City and Corporation of New York was divided into six wards one of which was the South Ward, described: To begin att ye Corner house of **James Mathews** by ye Watter Side and so North ward along the heere Graft to ye house of Simon Jonson Romain and ffrom thence West ward up ye Beaver graft to ye Corner House of Barent Coursen and ffrom thence south ward by ye fforte to ye watter syde including ye Pearle street & so to ye house of James Mathews againe. W. S. Pelletreau wrote: The house of James Mathews, 'Inn Keeper', was the North West corner of what is now Pearl and Broad St.

James Matthews of New York kept an inn near the Bowery.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: the 5 and 20th day of January, 1685. I, James Matthews, of the city of New York, Inn keeper, being weake." I leve to my son in law Isaac Stevensant £30. To my son in law Peter Stevensant, 1 shilling in full settlement of all claims whatsoever. To my grandson, James Seaborough, £15, to be paid when occasion shall be to put him out an apprentice or when he is 21. To my granddaughters Hester Erwyn and Maria Gerittsen, whom I have brought up with me from their childhood, each £20, when of age or married. But they are not to marry without the consent of my wife Mary their grandmother. Rest of estate real and personal to wife Mary and makes her executor. Witnesses, Hendrick Williams, Otto Geristse, Nathaniel Marston, George Farwell. Entered in the Records, April 14, 1686. Record held in New York, on Tuesday, March 16, 1685, the last will of James Matthews, late of this city, was proved. His wife Mary was confirmed as executrix, September 20, 1686.

In her will, she wrote: I Mary Matthews widow being sick of body." As for the lot of ground lying at the upper end of the street commonly called the Sheep Wey, and one great black walnut cupboord standing in my dwelling house I leave them to my grand child Hester Ervin. And concerning one half of the lot of ground lying on the east side of the city of New York, I leave it to my grand child Margaretie Gisbertse, and the other half to my grand son James Seabrook. I leave to my son Peter Stevenson 6 shillings only, the rest of the property is to be divided into seven shares, one to Lucas, Elizabeth and Mary, the children of my son John Stuyvesant [should be Stevensen?], deceased, one share to Johanes and Jacob the children of my son Gallus Stuyvesant [Stevens], deceased, one share to my daughter, Christian Dorkins, wife of Robert Dorkins, one share to Rynstie Guysberts my daughter, wife of Guisbert Guysbertse, one share to my son Isaac Stuyvesant [Stevens], one share to my daughter Janitie Roberts, wife of Thomas Roberts, and one share to my son Hendrick Jacobs. Makes Robert Dorkins, Thomas Roberts and Hendrick Jacobs executors. Dated June 10, 1687. Witnesses, John Wessels, Nathaniel Marston, Hendrick Jacobs. The last will of James Matthews, late of this city [New York], was proved. His wife Mary was confirmed as executrix, September 20, 1686.

New York, September 14, 1687, Jeroninus Jansen came before me and made oath that he saw Mary Matthews seale and deliver the above instrument, as her act and deed, and that she was of perfect senses, etc. N. Bayard.

In her will, she wrote: I, Bridget Matthews, of New York, widow. I give to my grandson, Peter Matthews, my late husband's silver watch, and his writing desk, which now stands in my parlor. I leave to my only son, Vincent Matthews, £5 over and above what I shall hereinafter leave to him. Whereas my late husband did give to my son Vincent at his marriage, a considerable sum of money, as part of his portion; now to equalize the said sum unto each of my other two children, which was my husband's intention, I do give to my eldest daughter Catherine, a negro girl, and to my daughter Flora, my negro girl named Dinah, and my negro boy called Galloway. I leave to my two daughters all my wearing apparel and jewels and household stuff, except the plate. All the rest of my estate I leave to my son Vincent and my two daughters Catherine and Flora. And whereas my daughters have some small pieces of plate, and other small wares, which have hitherto been given them, they are to enjoy the same without any contradiction. I make my three children executors. Dated January 8, 1721. Witnesses, Joseph Wright, William Sharpas, John Chambers. Proved, January 27, 1721/2.
