The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Conrad Maisinger was on Capt. Leonard Allen's ship in Holland in 1709 (Rotterdam Lists); emigrated and came to the Ramapo Tract [Bergen Co., NJ] between 1710 and 1714 with the group of German Palatine immigrants. The group of Palatine families first lived near Newburgh, NY where they worked on a government naval stores project. When the project failed, the Palatines were left on their own. Johan Dietrich Wanamaker, one of the Palatine group, made arrangements with Peter Fauconnier to move to the Ramapo area (the Island section of Mahwah). On 3 April 1713 they rented a boat to bring them and their possessions down the river, arriving 8 April 1713. Family heads among the group included Johann Dietrich

Wanamaker, Peter Wanamaker, Nicholas and Conrad Meisinger, Christian Straight, Adam Miller, Michael Storr, Heinrich Schmidt, and Conrad Linus.

A Cond. Maisinger of Annsberg was a soldier in 1711 (Palatine Volunteers to Canada). Cond Maisinger was listed in 1711 as living in the Palatine settlement of Annsberg.

The name of Conrard Meisinger appears often in the Ramapo Tract Account Book. Conrard Meusinger and Anna Margretha with 5 children were listed next to Nicolaus Meusinger ca. 1716/17 at Hackensack (Simmendinger Register).

Sebastian Maysinger made his initial appearance on the Hunter Lists 1 July 1710 with 1 pers. over 10 yrs. and 1 pers. under 10 yrs. of age; his entry for 4 Aug 1710 read 3 pers. over 10 yrs. Niclaus Maysinger then took over as head of the family 4 Oct 1710 when he was isted with 1 pers. over 10 yrs. of age. Niclaus Maysinger, son of Sebastian, was noted 24 June 1711 with 2 pers. over 10 yrs. of age. Nicolas Meissinger was recorded in records of the Ramapo Tract. Nicolas Meusinger and Anna Maria with 2 ch. were at Hackensack circa 1716/17 (Simmindinger Register); they were enrolled next to Conrad Meusinger and his family on this census.<sup>3</sup>

Another claim [to the Proprietors, re: the Ramapo Tract] came from Mr. Barbarie, grandson of a partner of Fauconnier. A release was worked out in August 1744, excepting the 600 acres known as the "Barbarie 600," which had been conveyed to Nicholas Maysinger and Dietrick Wanamaker at the "Island: in Mahwah."<sup>2</sup>

A Bergen County Road Return dated 3 July 1759 was recorded at the request of Coenraat Frederiks, regarding a road "in the precinct of Saddle River in the county of Bergen at a place called Mawier." The road to be continued "leads from Saml Bushes to Ramapough and Laroës Mills"; they altered the road that leads from Laroës Mills to the Road that leads from Ramapough to Hackensack that was laid out in the year 1758. The surveyors laid out "another Road from Saml. Bushes to the Burying place as the old Road formerly runs;" the surveyors altered "another Road that Leads to/from George Dearman's to the Burying place to Lay out another [four rod] Road beginning at the west Corner of George Dearman's House between the Line of sd. Dearman & Nicolaes Mysinger and so to the Road that Leads from the Iron Works to Hackensack."<sup>1</sup>

Cornelius Haring, commissioner, of Bergen County, NJ to Benjamin Statwell [Shotwell?], of Middlesex County, L726, 93 acres . . . corner to Nicholas Meysinger and Peter Wannamaker . . . seized of Derick A. In a deed dated 20 May 1794 (recorded 7 Dec 1814, Bergen Co.) Nicholas Maysinger and Susannah his wife, of the township of Franklin, Bergen Co., conveyed for 10 shillings, to his brother John Maysinger, "all that lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the township aforesaid, it being part of that Tract of land (?previously?) known by the name of John Barberies six hundred acres tract, purchased many years ago by Derrick Wanmaker and Nicholas Maysinger Sr. both deceased, lying in the Neighborhood called the Island."

On 22 February 1796 (recorded 4 Dec 1803, Bergen Co. R:163) Nicholas Maysinger of the Township of Franklin, yeoman, and Susannah, his wife, conveyed to Henry Wannamaker of same place, for £46, 17 shillings, 6 pence, 8 acres more or less in Ramapough tract, being part of John Barberie's 600 acre tract in Franklin Township. Bounded S by Benjamin Westervelt; W by Nicholas Maysinger; N by said Maysinger; E by John Stephens land, now in possession of Elizabeth Bowman. Signed by Nicholas Maysinger (his mark), Susannah Maysinger (her mark). Witnessed by Richard Wanmaker, John Horn (his mark).<sup>2</sup>

In a deed dated 23 March 1803 (Bergen County R:26), Nicholas Maysinger and Susannah, his wife conveyed to Richard Wanamaker (all living at Ramapough in the Township of Franklin, Bergen County, NJ, for \$226.25 a 22-10/100 acre parcel of land situate at Ramapough being part of lot no. 183 in the Ramapough pattennt, beginning at the southwest corner of Barbere 600.<sup>2</sup>

On 2 March 1810 (recorded 26 May 1812, Bergen Co. G2:425) Christian D. Wanmaker and Michael Maysinger, executors of Last Will & Testament of Nicholas Maysinger, dec'd, and Susannah Maysinger, widow of said deceased, all of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to David Carlogh of the same place, for \$162.25, 10 acres in the Township of Franklin, beginning corner of Richard P. Wanmaker; land of said Maysinger, dec'd; land of Major Abraham Forshee. Signed by Christian D. Wanmaker, Michael Maysinger, Susanna Maysinger (her mark). Witnessed by David Christie, David D. Christie.<sup>2</sup>

On 1 November 1811 (recorded 16 September 1812, Bergen Co. H2:111) Susannah Maysinger, widow of Nicholas Maysinger, Coun rought Maysinger and his wife Margaret, heirs for themselves and Christian D. Wanmaker and Michael Maysinger, all of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to William Conklin of the same place, for £103, 13 shillings, 4 pence, 14-81/100 acres in the Township of Franklin, beginning John W. Hopper; John Peterson and David Carlough. Signed by Susannah Maysinger (her mark), Coun Rought Maysinger (his mark), Margaret Maysinger (her mark), Christian Wanmaker, Michael Maysinger. Witnessed by James Davison, Benjamin W. Conklin.<sup>2</sup>

Nicholas Muysinger of Franklin Twsp. left a will dated 8 October 1804, proved 11 May 1805 mentioning his wife Susanna. Son Conrad. My seven children, but not by name. Support of children under 14 years of age. Executors: Michael Muysinger and Christian D Wanamaker. [NJA 10:327]
