The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Adam Müller came (prob.) from Ober-Mockstadt, Germany, to New York in 1709/1710 with the group of German Palatine immigrants. He was on the Ramapo Tract by 1713/14 when his name is found on the Ramapo Tract Account Book.

The group of Palatine families first lived near Newburgh, NY where they worked on a government naval stores project. When the project failed, the Palatines were left on their own. Johan Dietrich Wanamaker, one of the Palatine group, made arrangements with Peter Fauconnier to move to the Ramapo area (the Island section of Mahwah). On 3 April 1713 they rented a boat to bring them and their possessions down the river, arriving 8 April 1713. Family heads among the group included Johann Dietrich Wanamaker, Peter Wanamaker, Nicholas and Conrad Meissinger, Christian Straight, Adam Miller, Michael Storr, Heinrich Schmidt, and Conrad Linus.

Miller, Alexander

Alexander Miller m. -?-

About 1718, Alexander Miller came from Belfast Ireland and settled first in Saco, Maine. A few years after he purchased a large tract of land near what is now Portland, Maine, where he settled and continued the remainder of his life. About the year 1740 he loaded a vessel with boards and sailed in her for Boston to dispose of the cargo. The vessel was last seen near Wood Island; it was supposed that all on board were lost. After this the family removed to Londonderry, New Hampshire.

He was one of the first company that came to Truro in the fall of the year 1759, and came again with their families in the Spring of the year 1760.¹

In the year 1763 there were sixty families in Truro, and in 1765 there were about seventy. This year they obtained a grant from Government of the whole of the Township of Truro in one grant. It contains about eighty thousand acres of land. There is no reserve in this grant of mines or minerals. It is granted to about seventy persons, in "Rights." Some having but half a Right, some one Right, some a Right and a half, and others two Rights. This Grant is signed by Governor Wilmot, dated October 31st, 1765. Alexander Miller was one of these grantees.¹

His aged mother, who been long a widow, and in a poor state of health, would not consent to stay in New England with any of her sons, but came to Nova Scotia with her youngest son, Alexander, as her attachment was strong towards him. She died about eight or ten days after they arrived in Truro, and was the first person who was interred in the Truro Cemetery, the exact spot being now unknown. It is said that when they erected the Church, eight years after, it was found necessary to place it over the grave.¹

Alexander Miller's house lot was on the west side of the Parade. He built his first house on the same place where the Court House now stands, and lived in it fifteen years. He built his next house on his front wood lot, near the place that Mr. John L. Doggett now resides. At this time it was considered quite a distance in the woods. At this place he spent the remainder of his days, and died April 9th, 1791, aged 66 years. His widow died March 28th 1807. It was he and his brother-in-law, Captain John Morrison, (grandfather of Thomas F. Morrison, M.P.P.) who built the first mill which was started in Truro after it was settled by the British. This Mill was built at the same place the Mills now stand near the house of Mr. John McClure. The French had some kind of a Mill at the same place; there was a millstone found in the bottom of the brook.¹

The writer has now in his possession a copy of an interesting letter written by Alexander Miller to his brother James, who resided then in Belfast, Province of Maine, dated at Truro, June 24th, 1786. He states in this letter how well he had prospered in worldly things since he settled in Truro. That he was now owner of 1650 acres of good land, 31 head of cattle, 3 horses, and 14 sheep; and that his son Isaac had 500 acres of land, and Samuel had 250 acres; and that his son Samuel had helped to kill eleven moose the winter before. His son James had not returned home having been absent more than eight years. He had a letter from him, dated at Cork, Ireland, May 9th, 1785. He informed him by this letter that he was married to a woman in Cork, and that he was bound for Holland as a first mate of a brig. Alexander Miller sympathized with his brother James on account of the sufferings of him and family during the time of the American Revolution. He states to him the critical situations that he was placed in at one time in Truro between the two parties. For entertaining some of his American friends, he and his two sons had to take to the woods and remain there until the soldiers went off. He also states that the winter before the snow was three feet deep along the side of the Bay, and back about ten miles it was five feet deep, and that it went off that Spring with the heat of the sun. The grain that had been sowed about six weeks before the date of the letter was but then coming through the ground. He and his wife join in thanking God for His many mercies. This letter contains a great deal more about family affairs that might be interesting to connections, but which we do not copy.¹

Alexander Miller seems to have been listed twice in the 1850 Federal Census, Knox Co., IL, in Hendersonville -- once enumerated with the Samuel Dean family: Samuel Dean age 32 Shoemaker b. Ohio. This Alexander was 20, Shoemaker and b. NY. The 2nd enumeration shows Alexander Miller was living with another Dean family: Daniel Deen age 45, Shoemaker b. NY. This Alexander was 21, Shoemaker b. Ohio. But they are probably one and the same Alexander Miller.

Alexander W. is found in the 1870 Illinois census, Knox county, Walnut Grove township. He is age 41, born in Ohio and a farmer.

They were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, Illinois, Knox Co., Walnut Grove, p. 403C -- A. W. Miller, 50, b. NY, farmer, parents b. NY; Rebecca Miller, wife, 45, b. NY, Keeps House, parents b. NY; Hannah Miller, dau. 7, b. IL, at home, parents b. NY.

Alex W. Miller is found in the 1900 Illinois census, Knox county, Walnut Grove township. He is a farmer born September 1830 who has been married for 49 years.

A.W. Miller, general farmer and shoemaker, residing on section 13, in Walnut Grove Township, was born on Long Island, 12 September 1830. His father, Vincent Miller, is now living in Guthrie County, Iowa, and has attained to his 80th year. He was united in marriage with Alma Smith, who was also a native of Long Island and died there while her son, our subject was yet a small boy. His early education had scarcely time to develop his mind, when he set out for himself in the battle of life. After arriving in the West, where his father came in 1836, he proceeded to Henderson, his father settling in Cambridge, Henry County. Mr. Miller was apprenticed to and learned the boot and shoe trade, his employer being Henry Dean, of Henderson. He worked for Mr. Dean for many years, and while yet at his trade, 16 January 1851, was married to Miss Rebecca Edwards, a native of Wayne County, New York State, who was born 8 February 1835. She was only six years old when her parents came to Illinois and when they settled in Henderson. Her people were among the oldest settlers and by their honesty and industry won for themselves the admiration and esteem of the community. Mrs. M. is the oldest of a family of 13 children, eight of whom are yet living - three sons and five daughters. This good lady is the mother of four children, of whom one is deceased: Marcus E. is married to Jennie Pettitt and now resides in Topeka, Kansas, where he represents a large wholesale grocery house; they have one child, Theresa; Fannie is the wife of Augustus Miller [typo; should be Richards] and lives in St. Paul, Nebraska; he is a large and successful land-owner; Hannah M. resides at home and Martin is deceased. After his marriage, in 1856, Mr. Miller arrived in Walnut Grove Township and lived in Altona for some years, where he followed his trade and sold boots and shoes. In the spring of 1867 he first purchased 80 acres of land, on which he now lives and which has been improved to a large extent. This gentleman has held many minor offices of his township, in each one of which he has acquitted himself credibly. He is a solid Republican in politics.¹

I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Miller, £70, also a feather bed and furniture. I leave to my two eldest sons, Andrew and James, all the farm or plantation whereon I live, lying in the Patent of Wawayanda, in Goshen, containing 400 acres, and they are to pay the legacies. It is my will that all my sons, James, John, William, David, and Alexander, do live together, with my son Andrew, on my farm till my youngest son Alexander is of age. And then the farm is to be appraised by my brother-in-law, James Jackson, of New Windsor, and my brother-in-law, Alexander Jackson, and William Jackson, son of Michel Jackson, both of Goshen, with all the improvements. And out of the whole, my son John is to have 1/6, and my sons William and David and Alexander, each 1/6. My daughter Elizabeth is to live with the family while single, "to take care of the affairs of the house." When my son Alexander is of age the whole farm is to be divided. My executors are to

sell my lot of land at New Windsor. I make my brother-in-law, James Jackson, and my son Andrew, and my wife, executors. Witnesses, Michel Jackson, William Armstrong, William Jackson. Proved, September 10, 1767.¹

Anthony Miller possessed about 600 acres along the Bronx River, approximately 1/2 mile in width and 2 miles long, stretching from the rural cemetery to the vicinity of the Kensico dam. The Miller House, still standing, was most likely the second house on the same site, and probably was built by son Anthony.¹

Anthony began as a Tory, signing various petitions in defense of the colony's government, but soon was persuaded to change sides, and lent his name to numerous complaints, suits, and protests.¹

Anthony owned a 'fulling' mill on the Great Meadow Brook, near the Bronx River. This mill was mentioned in a 'Patent', or land grant, issued in the name of King George the Second in 1721. This patent established White Plains as a township, and was intended to resolve various long-standing land disputes. According to a pamphlet distributed at the Miller House which served as George Washington's headquarters, a fulling mill 'cleansed, beat, and pressed, by means of pestles and stampers, hand-woven cloth until it became compact and close'.

Ezra Miller and Amanda Miller were cousins. He was a soldier, surveyor, and inventor.

Ezra Miller lived in his boyhood in Rhinebeck, NY and Flushing, NY. He was a topographical, mechanical and hydraulic engineer. In 1833 he enlisted in the New York State Militia and was made a Colonel in 1842. He married his cousin, Amanda Jane Miller, in May 1841. In 1841 he was made commander of Fort Hamilton, L.I., where he continued for 6 years. In 1848 he went to Wisconsin to make surveys of public lands (the Dakotas). While there, he lived near Janesville, Wis., served as justice of the peace in Magnolia, and in 1852 was elected to the state senate. He became interested in railroad safety and in 1863 he patented his first invention: a railroad car that would not "telescope." (Early railroad accidents were compounded by the "telescoping" of colliding cars.) Some of his other railroad inventions included the coupler, buffer, and platform.

He returned to Brooklyn in 1865, and in 1870 he moved to Mahwah, NJ purchasing on 1 Oct 1872 50 acres from John and Rhoda Mack, who had acquired part of the land from Peter Bush. He later bought more land from Peter Maysinger, Cornelius Lydecker, Jacob Crouter, Richard Wanamaker, Isabella Fave, and additional property from the Macks, increasing his total acreage to 356 acres, which later became the neighborhood known as Cragmere. Miller's estate was known as Oweno. His huge, 30-room mansion outranked any private residence in the county.

Miller was elected to the New Jersey senate in 1883 at the age of 71.

Esral Miller, 66, Farmer, and Amanda J. Miller, 64, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township (in what later became Mahwah), Bergen County, NJ. NYC), "Garrit Miller, of Smith's Clove, Precinct of Cornwall, Orange County, N.Y." mentioned eldest son Joshua, a piece of land on which he now lives, containing ten acres, to hold the same until my youngest child shall attain the age of twenty-one, when the said land and all the residue, both real and personal, be equally divided among my children, Joshua, Mary, Elizabeth, Garrit, Nathan, Sarah, Samuel, Anne Hampton, and Jeremiah; if wife (not named) shall marry before my youngest child arrives at lawful age, to my wife, three milk cows, one mare, saddle and bridle, one bed and bedding, and one spinning wheel in lieu of any claim she may have on my estate; my children to be maintained and my wife to have an equal share of the profits of my estate until my youngest child arrives at lawful age; Also my wife receive an equal share of my personal estate, provided she remain my widow. Made wife and Nathaniel Seely, executors. Witnesses were John Fell, Benjamin Goldsmith, Abraham Skinner. On 25 Sep 1786 at New York, administration was granted to Patience Fowler, formerly Patience Miller, and Nathaniel Seely, the executors.

William H. G. Miller was a farmer and carpenter. They lived in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ.

According to Donna Ristenbatt, an interesting story is told in the pension papers of Wm. H. G. Miller by his brother-in-law, Henry R. Wanmaker. It seems that William Henry Garret was baptized while his father was away. (This suggests the possibility that his father was a mariner.) When his father returned home, he forbid him to ever be called William Henry, but said he would go by the name Garret from then on. So, when he got married he was married under the name Garret Miller. When he entered the Civil War Service (he was in two nine month regiments - first the 22nd, and then the 39th N.J.), he entered the service under the name William Henry Garret because he said he always liked the name. His widow had to try for three years before she was granted the pension because she had to prove they were both one and the same person.¹
