The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Lambert Clomp [aka Lambert Huybertsen Moll?] is on a list of owners about 1674 in Smith's Valley. [HSYB for 1896, p. 167].

Abraham Moll and wife Jacomyntie van Dartelbeeck are shown on Selyn's 1686 list of members as living in Smith's Valley.

The version of the 1703 Census in New York City Neighborhoods by Nan A. Rothschild, p. 197, shows an Abraham Moll living in the East Ward in Smith's Valley with occupation shipwright. O'Callaghan's version of the 1703 census in Lists of Inhabitants, p. 25, shows Abraham Moll in the East Ward with 1 man, 1 woman, and 1 female child.

In his will dated 6 Sep 1723, probated 27 Sep 1732, Abraham Mull, of New York "being very aged but of sound mind"

mentioned wife Jackamintie; children of dau. Catalyntie, deceased -- Abraham Hyer, Walter Hyer, and William Hyer, Jr.; grandson Abraham Stephense, son of dau. Ryertie Meleke [Meleke corrected to Stephens]; dau. Adriana, wife of Francis Harrison; Hendrick Van Bommel, son of dau. Susanah. He named Wynant Van Zandt, blockmaker, and Nicholas Mathieson, blacksmith, as executors. Wit: Johannes Brant, William Hyer, John Bresteed. The executors having relinquished their charge, Letters of Administration were granted to Ryertie Stephense, widow of Michael Stephense, in trust for herself and her children Abraham and Elizabeth Stephense; and to Walter, Abraham and William Hyer, Jr., children of Catalyntie and William Hyer; and to Francis Harrison and his wife, Adriana; and to Susanah wife of Hendrick Van Bomel.¹

There is a "Jan Jansz Mol" shown as passenger on *De Bonte Koe* (The Spotted Cow), April 15, 1660. (Year Book of the Holland Society, 1902).¹

In the marriage record (NYC Ref Ch) they were: "Jan Janszen Moll, j.m. Van Amsterd., en Engeltje Pieters, j.d. Van B. Yorke, beyde woonende tot N. Yorke."

On 27 Feb 1679, Jan Janszen Mol and Engeltje Pieters are listed on the Church Members list of the NY RDC. (NYGBR vol 9, p. 164). In 1686 Jan and Engeltje are listed on Domine Selyns' List of Members of the DRC in NY. They are shown as living on the west side of the Heeren Gracht (now Broad Street) about 8 houses up from her mother, Aecht Jans. (Year Book

of the Holland Society 1916).¹

He is said to have arrived in New Amsterdam in 1626.¹ If so, he must have returned to the Netherlands and then returned to New Amsterdam. He was a ship builder.

A document said to have been from the municipal archive at Amersfoort, in the Netherlands, translates: "For, on Jan 8th, 1631, a certain Lambert Huybertsz Moll, shipcarpenter and farmer on Long Island (Eylandt) is mentioned and recognized as a son of this married couple. [Hubert Lambertsz Moll and Geertgen Cornelisdr. (van Schaick) from Amersfoort]"²

Lambert Moll and his wife, Tryn Pieters, are listed as "old members" (prob. before 1660) of the NYC Reformed Dutch Church.

He may have been married two times: (1) Margarethe -?; (2) Tryntje Pieters.

On 29 July 1641 Lambert Huybertsen Mol bought a plantation on Long Island from Cornelis Jacobsen alias Stille. [NYHMD: Reg. of Prov. Sec I:340] Then on 7 Sept 1641 Lambert Huybertsen Mol was granted a patent to a parcel of land formerly occupied by Cornelis Jacobsz Stillen. [NYHMD: Land Papers, p. 13]

On or about 27 Feb 1643, Lambert Huybertsen Mol was one of 5 men (including Hans Hansen) who signed a petition by inhabitants "residing on Long Island." [CDNY I: 416-17]

In 1649 (as Lambert Huybertsz Klomp) he got a deed from Van Tienhoven to a lot in Smith's Valley (ie. north of the wall along the east river). Reg. of Prov. Sec. III, p. 128. He got a deed to the plot at Q8 Castello plan in 1656. Icon. II:325,408. Lambert shows up on various Lists for New Amsterdam at least thru 1674.

4 August 1649. "Deed from Cornelis van Tienhoven to Lambert Huybertsen Klomp on a lot in the Smith's valley, on Manhattan Island." [47c] p.128 .. "conveys to Lambert Huybertsz Klomp a lot of his land situated in the Smits valey, on the island of Manhatans," ... "in width on the south side, at the strand, four rods and eight and one-half feet; in width in the rear, on the north side, four rods and eight and one-half feet; in length on the east side, sixteen rods and six and one-half feet; in length on the west side, sixteen rods and four feet, " [NYHM:Dutch Vol.3:128] He seems to have engaged in ship building there. The family seems to have continued there in this business at least till 1703.
