The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

In the Bergen Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were both of English Neighborhood.  
Abraham S. Moore & Mary Van Gelder, his wife, joined by certificate, the Greenwich Ref Ch, NYC, 12 Oct 1820. They were dismissed 4 July 1827.

The large parcel of land which was owned by Abraham Moore in 1840 had been acquired by him from his father, Samuel, in 1826 and consisted of 103 acres. After Abraham Moore died, his widow, Mary, conveyed the property in 1843 to John Kelly. Apparently Samuel A. Moore and John D. Bogert held a mortgage on this large parcel of land. In 1849, the parcel was

sold at a Sheriff's sale to William Wood. Wood Park is named after William Wood, and his home housed the Leonia Public Library for many years prior to its demolition in the mid part of this century.<sup>1</sup>

In his will he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Benjamin Moore, of the City of New York, sailmaker, do on the 25th day of June 1771, make this my last will and testament. I leave to my eldest son, Benjamin, £5. The remainder of my estate to my loving wife Cornelia and my children, Benjamin, John, James, Henry, Catherine, Elisabeth and Mary equally divided and paid to my children as they severally arrive to the age of twenty-one, or on the day of their marriages, In case my wife dies before she should marry again to any future husband, or any of my children depart this life unmarried and before twenty-one, the share of such to the survivors. Nevertheless my wife shall hold and use my real estate and personal estate and receive the rents and profits toward the support of herself and such of my children as shall remain under twenty-one or unmarried, educating and bringing them up while she remains my widow but no longer. If my wife die or marry before my youngest child is twenty-one, I order my executors to rent out all my real estate, the rent with the income from my personal estate to go towards bringing up my children. If my personal estate fall short of paying my debts and the said legacy of £5 to my son Benjamin I empower my executors to sell such real estate as necessary for the same. I appoint my wife Cornelia, and my sons, Benjamin, John and James Moore, executors. Witnesses, Abel Hardenbrook, Cornwall Sands, of Cornwall, Orange County, trader; Sarah Sands. Proved, New York, September 13, 1784. Administration granted to Henry Moore, of the City of New York, Physician, a son, and to William Smith of Fredericksburgh Precinct, Dutchess County, Esquire, a son-in-law of Benjamin Moore, late of the said city, sailmaker, deceased, whereas John Moore, the only surviving executor is absent from this state, New York, October 8, 1784.<sup>1</sup>

This item probably refers to this Henry (Harry) Moore—Charity Ackerman Diary: "19 Jun 1838: A colored man named Harry Moore lost his house by fire at Saddle River."

Harry Moore, free colored person, is listed in the 1840 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near the Saddle River area. Listed in his family group are one female under 10, 3 males 10-24, one male 35-55, and one female 35-55.

Henry More, 57, basketmaker, and Sarah, 56, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ, with real estate valued at \$1000. Listed living with them were: Nicholas, 21, laborer; and Fanny, 19. They were all listed as "black."

Harry More, 68, mulatto, farmer; and Sarah More, 68, wife are listed in the 1860 Federal census, perhaps living in the Waldwick-Ho-Ho-Kus area. In the house listed immediately before his were living the family of Nicholas More, 31, probably his son.

Harry Moore and Sarah Moore, "colored," were listed in the 1865 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ, probably in or near what became Saddle River Borough. Listed after them were: John Moore (aged 5-16); Edward Moore (aged 5-16); Samuel Moore; Margaret Moore; Henry Moore; Sarah C. Moore; Lavis Moore (aged 5-16); Fanny Moore (aged 5-16); John Moore (aged 5-16); Allena Moore (aged 5-16); John Moore; Margaret Moore; and Henry J. Moore (aged 5-16).

Colonel John Moore, who came to New York from Philadelphia, was one of the most prominent merchants in the city. The water lot bought of the Corporation is the west side of Moore street, and his mansion was on the corner of Pearl street. The street was named in his honor. Where Moore street is was originally a bridge that led to the wharf or dock, which was about where Water street now is. On the northeast corner of the bridge was the "Weigh House." His lot on Moore street was subdivided into small lots, and, with the houses, were left to his other sons. The house and lot left to his daughter Rebecca is now No. 23 Whitehall street. It was originally the home of Rev. Everardus Bogardus and his famous wife Aneke Jans. A tablet marks the spot. The house and lot left to his daughter Susanah, and which he bought of Simon Pasco, is next north of this. The lot bought of Robert Bennet, which he left to his son Charles and daughter Susanah, is Nos. 62-64 Cherry street, with the water lot on the opposite side of the street. The "garden spot" left to his daughter Anne, is the south side of Liberty street. The old "Sugar House" of Revolutionary fame, stood on this lot. It has been stated that Colonel John Moore was the first person buried in Trinity Church Yard, but this is doubtful.--W. S. P.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Moore, of New York, merchant, being of sound mind, I leave to my well beloved wife Frances, all my plate, linnen, and household furniture and the use of all my estate during her life, for the maintainance of herself and children, except that part of my estate in Philadelphia, which I leave to my son John, as also my estate in the Highlands. I leave to my son John all my house and ground in Philadelphia, next to the parsonage house, with the garden and alley, devised to me by my father after my mother's death. And he is to pay £850 charged to me by my father's will. Also all the lot of ground I bought of the Corporation of New York, with the buildings in which I now live, after the decease of my wife, and he is to pay to my son, Lambert Moore, £300, and to my son Daniel £300, and to my son William £400, and I charge the said lot with these sums. I leave to my daughter, Rebecca Moore, all that lot of ground which I bought of Delanoy and the dwelling house which I built thereon, and is now in the tenure of Mr. Isaac De Peyster. I leave to my son Thomas the lot of ground I bought of Thomas Roberts, with the buildings, now in tenure of Mr. James Napier. And he is to pay to my son Richard £100, and to my son Charles £200, and to my daughter, Anne Moore, £100, and I charge the lot with the same. I leave to my son Richard, after the death of my wife, part of the water lot I bought of the Corporation of New York, with the house I built upon it, in which Mr. De Hart the sailmaker now lives, with a yard of six feet in breadth, distinguished as Lot No. 1. I leave to my son Lambert, after the death of my wife, two other lots, part of said water lot, each 25 feet in width, and called Lots 2 and 3. I leave to my son Daniel two other lots of the said water lot, 25 feet wide each, and called Lots 4 and 5. I leave to my son William the rest of the said water lot that I bought of the Corporation of New York, being 28 or 30 feet in width, as the ground may hold out, being No. 6. I leave to my son Charles 1/2 the lot I bought of Robert Bennet, that is to say one bank lot, or upland lot, next to (James) Desbrosses, and the water lot opposite. I leave to my daughter, Susanah Moore, the other 1/2 of said lot; I also leave to my daughter Susanah the house and lot I bought of Simon Pasco, and lately in tenure of Mr. Woodford. But if she or her heirs or assigns shall erect a new building on said lot they shall not obscure the light of the windows of the house that I have given to my daughter Rebecca. I leave to my daughter, Anne Moore, the garden spot between the new Dutch church and the house of Captain Jacob Waldron, being about 100 feet square. I leave to my son Stephen the land in the Highlands that I bought of Charles Congreve; Also 3 negroes; Also the land adjoining to the above and lately patented by me, being about 2,800 acres. And whereas I have given to my daughter Frances, wife of Samuel Bayard, a full proportion of my estate, yet as she is my eldest daughter, I direct my executors to pay her £50, and £50 to her first-born son, Samuel Bayard, when he is of age. My executors are to sell all the rest of my estate to pay debts. "And for as much as many losses and misfortunes for some years passed have happened unto me and others, and my personal property may not be sufficient to pay debts, my executors may sell my house and lot in Philadelphia, near Wickeco, commonly called the Plantation or Pasture, which by my father's will comes to me after my mother's decease." I make my son John and my wife executors. Dated September 4, 1748. Witnesses, Joseph Robinson, Isaac De Peyster, Mauritz De Hart. Codicil. Since making my will it has pleased God to take unto himself my eldest son John. I will that part of my estate in Philadelphia left to him shall be to my wife Frances for life and then to his brothers and sisters. And whereas I have been informed by letter from my son's partner in Jamaica, West Indies, that in his last sickness he declared he would make his will and give the chiefest part of what he had to his three maiden sisters, Rebecca, Susanah, and Anne, who he said were not so well able to provide for themselves, I therefore give to them all his personal estate to which I am entitled. Dated February 23, 1748/9. Witnesses, Robert Watts, Joseph Robinson, William Hamersley. Proved, November 9, 1749.

John More, 35, black, laborer, b. NJ, and Phebe More, 33, black, b. NJ, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them was Harry More, 5/12, black, b. NJ.

John More, 34, laborer, and Phebe, 32, wife, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them was Henry, 10. They were all listed as Mulatto.

He was probably among the Moores listed in the 1865 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near what became Saddle River Borough).

According to local newspaper accounts of the time, he provided the music at many social functions in the Allendale-Saddle River area during the 1870s and 1880s.

In Dec. 1890 a building he owned in Waldwick (used as a store for the sale of "segars, etc.") was destroyed by fire.

Alfred P. Smith, writing in *The Landscape* in January 1893, noted that "John H. Moore, the colored fiddler, whose wit and music have made merry many a holiday of succeeding generations for more than fifty years, is very low and apparently near his end. John must be about 75 years of age."

Y:99) Able Smith of the Township of Hackensack, sole executor of the Last Will and Testament of John Smith of the English Neighborhood, to Garret Myer of the same place, whereas John Smith directed the sale of his house and lot be purchased from Abraham Montane, dec'd, and land purchased of Albert C. Zabriskie; for \$2,750., two lots: (1) 3-1/2 acres of marsh in the precinct of Hackensack; line now or late of Jacob Demott; heirs of John Moore, dec'd. (2) 52-3/4 acres in the Township of Hackensack, beginning at land now or late of Samuel James Moore; Jacob Demott; line late of Roelif Westervelt, now dec'd. Signed by Able Smith. Witnessed by Lewis Moore, Eliza Moore.<sup>2</sup>

In his will, dated 21 May 1840, codicil 15 Dec 1840, Lewis Moore of Hackensack mentions wife and children but names only Edward Lewis and Michael Lewis, executors. Because the estate held property in New York, it was also probated in New York. The 13 Nov 1843 examination in the New York Surrogate Court names Isaac Dayton of the City of New York special guardian of George H. Moore, Charles Moore, Lewis Moore, William Moore, and Alexander Moore., minors [the latter three were sons of Lewis, who was deceased by this time]; Edward Moore residing in the City of New York, but at present absent in some of the Southern States; William Moore residing in the same city, but at present at sea or in foreign parts; and Elizabeth Blauvelt, Mary Moore, John Moore, Louisa Moore, Helen Moore, Benjamin Moore, and Jane Ann Moore residing in Hackensack; heirs and next of kin of Lewis Moore late of Hackensack deceased; Elizabeth Moore residing in Hackensack, the widow of Lewis Moore; and Michael Price Moore of the City of New York, who lately applied to have the will and codicil recorded. Michael Price Moore's management of his father's affairs and actions as executor reduced several court cases.<sup>1</sup>

Eliza made a new will in Feb 1859, but the Bergen Court refused to accept it. The New Jersey court determined that she had been coerced by several of her children into writing the will to disinherit her granddaughter, to whom she had given a child's share. In the end, the will that was probated, on 23 Dec 1862, was the one she made 8 Sep 1854, signed by X mark, specifying that her daughters remain for one year on the homestead conveyed to her by her father (it then descended to her heirs at law as if she had died intestate); her wearing apparel, furniture, and plate equally to her five daughters and granddaughter Eliza Zabriskie; \$100 each to daughters Mary, Louisa, and Jane Ann; property to be leased for two years and then sold, with proceeds equally to children Eliza, Mary, Louisa, Helena, Jane Ann, John, Benjamin, Edward, and Charles, daughter-in-law Mary Moore (widow of son Lewis; her share to go to her three children if she predeceased Eliza), and granddaughter Eliza Zabriskie. They, with son Michael, shared in the homestead lot: "It being my intention not to leave to my son Michael any part of my estate except the interest herein given to him in my homestead lot."<sup>1</sup>
