The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Inventory mentions a very large number of articles of domestic use, and 6 acres of wheat, 5 acres corn, 4 acres Oats, 2 acres Rye, 7 acres Peas.

In his will, dated 9 Feb 1760, probated 25 Oct 1760, he wrote: ...February 9, 1760. I, Charles Morgan, of East Chester, being in good health. It is my mind and will that all debts be paid by my executors. I leave to my son James a certain piece of land on the east side of the White Plains road, bounded south by said road, at the end of a stone wall; thence by a fence easterly to a ditch, and then by the ditch to Edmund Ward's meadow, and then by the land of Edmund and Stephen Ward to the White Plains road, and by the same to the first mentioned bounds south of the house. Also a piece on the west side of the White Plains road, bounded north by Stephen Ward, west by John Pugsley, south by John Townsend, east by the White Plains road. And he is to pay to his brother Charles £25 when he is of age. I leave to my son Charles all the land below the cross fence, which fence runs all along by the Barrack, and so along the said fence to a certain ditch, until it meets the meadow of Edmund Ward, and from thence running with the land and meadow of Edmund Ward to a road, and by said road to the White Plains road, and by the said road to the fence above mentioned. Also another piece of meadow, lying on the west side of the White Plains road, bounded north by John Townsend, west by John Townsend, south by the meadow of Valentine Archer, and east by the White Plains road. Also a piece of salt meadow lying near Silex (Selleck's?) Landing, bounded north by the upland of Nathan Palmer, west by the meadow of Caleb Morgan, south by Stephen Ward's meadow, and east by the meadow of Solomon Fowler. I leave to my loving wife Susanna one of the best beds and furniture, and a riding horse and saddle, and the use of my estate so far as bringing up my children will extend. I leave to my daughters, Abigail, Mary, Nancey, Phebe, and Susanna, each a feather bed with furniture. "And I do further provide for a child my wife is now pregnant with, if a son, he shall have £125, but if a daughter, to be equal with the rest of my daughters." I leave all the rest of movable estate to my wife and daughters. If my wife still lives a widow until my son James is of age, she is to have the best room in the dwelling house, and the use of 1/3 the land that is given to him. Also a negro man and girl. I make my trusty friend, Gilead Hunt, and Samuel Sneden executors. Witnesses, Joshua Ferris, Michael Smith, Noah Bishop. Proved, October 25, 1760.

I David Morgan late of the Town Clinton, county of Dutchess and State of New York. Being weak in body but sound in mind believing that my time in this world is almost spent. I do make and publish this my Last Will and testament in the manner and form following. That is to say I do order that all my household and personal property shall be sold to the best advantage excepting that I do give and bequeath the choice of two beds with all the bedding and all my silver spoons to my beloved wife Cecilia Morgan. I do order that all my debts shall be collected from the money thus as well as from the monies arising from the sale of my personal property shall be appropriated to the payment of all my honest debts and my funeral charges. I do further order and demand All my real property sold at such a time as may be judged proper best to promote the interest of my family should the monies arising from my personal property not discharge my debts and funeral charges then I so direct that money should be taken up and my real estate shall be given to secure the payment of the same if this security should be deemed necessary. I do give and bequeath to my Father-in-law Peter Lewis my watch as a testimony of my esteem to him together with all my wearing apparel.. I do direct that as soon as all my property shall be sold , it shall be put out to use and secured by Mortgage on landed property to remain or so to be continued until my Daughter Catherine may marry. I do further more direct that all the interest arising from my Estate shall be for the use and benefit of my wife Cecilia and my daughter Catherine and the (can't read Polnathin) of said child. But should my wife marry then she shall have one third of the interest arising from the money at use for as long she may live but the interest remaining that is to say the two thirds shall be for the use support and benefit of my child Catherine. Should my child Catherine die before her mother Cecilia and without issue then all the interest of the money at use shall be for the benefit of the said Cecilia or should Cecilia die before Catherine my daughter then said Catherine shall Heir the whole income arising from the afforsaid property. But should Catherine die without issue, likewise after the death of said Cecilia the property (can't read) to my Father-in-law Peter Lewis in whom I have the utmost confidence and my Brother Joseph Morgan as my executors(?) other with my wife Cecilia executrix to this my last will and Testament hereby making all former wills void. In witness whereof I hereunto sign my hand and seal on this the fourth day of June in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixteen. He lived in Gwynedd (Towamensin Twp.), Philadelphia Co. (now Montgomery Co.), PA. In Wales, his family had been Catholic, but when he immigrated to PA, he joined the Society of Friends of Haverford, Radnor and Merion Monthly Meeting. Edward MORGAN was in Philadelphia by 1684 when he was granted (by William Penn) a lot in the city.¹

The first settler in Gwynedd or its vicinity named Morgan, was Edward. He seems to have been here as early as 1704, as the road upward through Gwynedd, made in that year, was to go as far as his place. He was a tailor by trade, a Welshman by birth, no doubt, and was probably advanced in years when he came. He had lived previously near Philadelphia. In February, 1708, he bought 300 acres of land in what is now Towamencin, of Griffith Jones, merchant, Philadelphia. The tract lay along William John's land, and was therefore on the township line. In 1714 he bought 500 acres more, nearby, of George Claypool of Philadelphia, who, like Griffith Jones, was a speculative holder of Towamencin lands. By 1713 he had apparently moved to Montgomery; in the deed from Claypool he is described as 'yeoman, of Montgomery.

Edward Morgan no doubt had several children. His sons probably received and held the Towamencin lands. In the list of 1734, for that township there appear: Joseph Morgan, 200 acres; Daniel Morgan, 200; John Morgan, 100. In 1727, Morgan Morgan of Towamencin, died leaving a will, in which he mentions his wife Dorothy, his brothers Joseph, John and William, his two sons Edward and Jesse (both minors) and his niece Elizabeth, John's daughter."

Item – I give to my Son Elijah Seventeen Hundred and Fifty Dollars – Item – I give to my daughter Sarah One Thousand Dollars and one bed and bedding. Item – I give to my Son Joseph Seventeen Hundred and Fifty Dollars. Item – I give to my Son David Seventeen Hundred and Fifty Dollars. Item – I give to my Son Caleb Seventeen Hundred and Fifty Dollars – to be paid to him on his arriving at Twenty One years of age and not before. But I will and direct these Legesit to be but to interest on good security and the Interest to be paid him yearly should he want it for schooling, clothing or sickness but in case he should come to actual want and be unable to maintain himself then and in that case he shall have a rite to so much of Interest and Principal as will render him comfortable. Item – I give to Amelia Hunt One Hundred dollars. Item – I desire my Executors hereafter to be named to sell and dispose of all my Estate Real and Personal as soon after my death as they may think proper or convenient. Item – I desire that One Hundred and Fifty Dollars should be paid to my beloved Wife Levina for her support until her interest should become due. Item – after the Intire Settlement of my Estate should there be a surplus (?) it is my will the (?) balance? Should be equally divided among my Heirs. Item – After the death of said Wife I require that a division be made of the Twenty Five Hundred Dollars equally among my Children. Item – I will and direct that whatever money may fall to my Daughter Rebecah directly or indirectly should be dispursed of in the manner first directed in my bequest to her. Now I do hereby appoint and constitute my beloved Wife Levina, my Son Joseph and Peter Lewis Joint Execution of this my last will and testament ratifying this and no other to be my last will and testament. I hereby wish it to be understood that all abbyatored (loans?) I may have against my Children at the time of my death shall be considered as part of their Legacy. Elijah Morgan (initals L L) Signature sealed and declared to be the Last Will and Testament, By Elijah Morgan in the presence of James Covell, John Drake, Daniel Williams.¹

Sir James Morgan, 4th Baronet of Llanternam, m. (1st) widow Ann Hopton Jones, of Canon-Frome; m. (2nd) Lady Alice Hopton, of Canon-Frome, cousin of first wife.²

Sir James was a non juror as late as 1675, with an estate of £158, 19s. 2d. per annum.²

All the Baronets of Llanternam were non-jurors and adhered to the old religion, with all their resources. They were continually suffering sequestration by Parliament, of their estates, but managed to retain them by frequent compoundings, the largest being for œ1,007, paid by the second Sir Edward in 1666, when Parliament sequestered Pencoyd/Pencoe Castle, but permitted retention of Llanternam Abbey. from which the title was derived. All the Baronets sheltered priests; and, when Llanternam Abbey passed to the Blewetts, (Lady Frances (dau. of Edward, James's brother) being declared eventual heiress of Sir James, there being no contest from the American emigrants), and was restored by them, many "priest holes" where

priests had been concealed from the soldiers, were discovered.²

Proved, July 28, 1764.

John Morgan was an applicant for land on the [?] side of Fresh Kill in 1680. His cattlemark was recorded in 1695; before 1699 he became the second husband of Frances, daughter of Pierre Billiou and widow of Nicholas Larzalere. In the census of 1706 he was 54 years old and his family included four women, and three boys: Nicholas Larzalere, Joseph and Charles Morgan. Thomas Morgan is mentioned in connection with a land grant on Karle's Neck in 1677 and 1681. He was a justice and lieutenant under Leisler in 1689, was a petitioner in 1691 for pardon for his support of Leisler, member of Assembly 1692, and a lieutenant again in 1700.¹

In his will, he wrote: July 14, 1770. I, John Morgan, of Richmond County, "being very low in body." I leave to my wife Deborah the use of the lot of land I bought of Nicholas Larzelere, Jr., "commonly called the Douglass Lot," until my son Charles is of age. "She making no waste of timber, nor cut any, only for the necessary use of the Plantation." Also the use of that portion of my farm I dwell on, with the houses, lands, and improvements adjoining to Nicholas Larzelere, and adjoining the land before mentioned, until my son Jesse is of age. She making no waste. I also give her, in consideration of her bringing up my children and giving them Schooling, until they are fit to be put to trades, the following articles: one bed and furniture, "one bed which the children lyeth on," 2 cows, 2 horses, farming utensils, waggon, horse and chair, tea kettle, and tea ware, linnen wheel, woolen wheel, and a negro boy, and all my library books. "My Large Bible I leave in the house for the use of my family, so long as my wife continues in it, and then to my son Charles." I also leave her all kitchen utensils. I leave to my daughter Ann a bed, 2 cows, a negro girl, and £20, when she is 18. I leave to my son Charles the lot I bought of Nicholas Larzelere, called Douglass Lot, after the death of my wife. With the meadow ground thereto belonging, "And 6 acres of meadow, which was Sweems," lying between Larzeleres land and the upland, except a parcel bounded as follows: West by Robert Harris, south by John Journy, east by a deep gully, "and extends down said gully to a white oak tree stump, broken off by the wind, pretty well up, and standing near the place where we cross the gully with the waggons," and then north a straight line to a white wood tree standing near the Harris fence, at the brow of the hill. And he is to pay to my son Joseph £100, when of age. I leave to my son Jesse the lot of land and meadow I now live on, with the house and barn; and lies between the land of Nicholas Larzelere and the land given to my son Charles. Also the piece of wood land reserved. And he is to pay to my son Joseph £100. I order that the wood lot of land where my son John now lives, with the salt meadow thereto belonging, be sold by my executors, and 1/3 of the money to be put at interest for my son John, "and the other 2/3 to my two sons, James and Peter Billiew, to be put at interest for them till they are of age." I leave to my grandson, John Cornell, £10. To my grandson, John Morgan, £10. All the rest of movable estate to my daughters, "first giving to my daughter Frances, wife of Auter Simeson, a negro girl Sarah, provided the said Auter Simeson pay a bond of £40 to John Watts, for which I am bound. I leave to my daughter Catharine, widow of Barent Christopher, a negro girl, now in her possession. I leave to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of David La Tourette, a negro girl. My wife is to have the use of a room in my house, and two cows and her fire wood and garden, and fruit, "and two barrels of cider a year." I leave to my son Charles a loom and tackling. I leave to my sons, James and Peter Billiew, each a gun and a sword. I make my son-in-law, David Latourette, and my friend and kinsman, Daniel Lafarge, and my friend, Joshua Wilet, executors. Witnesses, Colin Cole, blacksmith, Benjamin Seaman, Benjamin Drake. My wife is to have all the grain and cloth for the use of the family. Proved, August 28, 1770. [NOTE.--James and Peter Billiew were probably stepsons.--W. S. P.]

Second – I hereby authorize empower and direct my said executrixes to sell all of my real estate and make and deliver unto the purchasers there of a good and sufficient deed or deeds therefore. Third – I further authorize my said executrixes to sell so much of my personal estate as may be necessary to pay my just debts and funeral expenses which I hereby direct my said executrixes to pay. Fourth – After the payment of my said debts and funeral expenses I give, bequeath and devise unto my said three daughters Elizabeth Frear, Mary Cole, and Nancy Harrison all the rest and residue of my property of every name and kind to be equally divided between them share and share alike. I witness I have here unto set my hand and seal this first day of September in the year of Our Lord One Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty-five. Now there fore I do hereby give devise and bequeath each all every part of the property both real and personal which would have taken under my said will by my said Daughter Elizabeth Frear, if living, to the following married children of my said daughter Elizabeth Frear to wit; Mary Newcomb, Lavinia (Presson or Frisson), William D. Frear and Leonard C. Frear the same to be divided among the (?) four children equally, share and share alike. In witness where of I here to subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 18th day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty-three. Lewis Morgan was the last foreman of the White Paper Mill in Waldwick, Bergen Co., NJ. He and his family lived in half of the White Tenant House at 16 White's Lane in Waldwick; his brother George Morgan and his family lived in the other half of the house. Members of the Morgan family lived in the house until about 1982-83, when the house was determined to be uninhabitable.¹

At the time of the 1895 State Census, they lived in Orvil Township (Waldwick). At the time of the 1920 Federal Census (Jan 1920) they lived on Hewson Street, Waldwick in a house they rented. They lived on West Maple Street, Allendale about 1937, and in about May 1938 moved to 46 East Crescent Avenue. At the time of her death, she lived at 140 Allendale Avenue, Allendale, Bergen Co., NJ.
