The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

On 26 June 1804 (recorded 24 August 1805, Bergen Co. He lived in Upper Saddle River, Bergen Co., NJ, and moved abt. 1897 to Saddle River, opening a grocery store there on Allendale Avenue.

John G. DeBaun owned a general store in Saddle River, on the corner of East Allendale Road and West Saddle River Road, Bergen Co., NJ, today (1995) the site of the Saddle River Market. The building had been occupied as early as 1861 by a J. D. Nagle. The grocery business that had been John D. Berdan's had moved to this site in 1880 when A. Z. Winter had purchased the stock from it. In the early 1890s the business was purchased by John G. DeBaun and run at the building, still owned by John D. Berdan. The building burned in 1900 on Easter morning and was rebuilt; it burned again in 1910 and was rebuilt in 1911 by Albert Mowerson (who had worked for DeBaun, but left him in 1906 to begin a travelling meat market business; and later built a butcher shop in his front yard at 59 East Allendale Road). Mowerson moved his market building from his home and located it to the rear of the property of his new business. Mowerson's store was later owned by his son-in-law, Abram Forshay, who sold it in the 1940s.

Albert Mowerson, 25, and his wife, Jane, 22, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living with his parents.

At the time of the 1885 New Jersey State Census, they were living in Hohokus Township (probably in what became Upper Saddle River) with their two sons, Robert and John; living with them was Fredrick Felsche.

Albert Mowerson, 44, Provision Dealer, and Sarah J. Mowerson, 43, his wife, were listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living in the Borough of Saddle River, Bergen County, NJ, in a house they rented, listed living in the same dwelling with Phoebe Dewsnap, 70, widow. Listed with them were children: John A. Mowerson, 19, single, Expressman; Robert Mowerson, 17, single, Pattern Maker; and Elsie Mowerson, 11.

Albert Mowerson, 55, and Sarah J., his wife, 53, were listed in the 1910 Federal Census, living on Allendale Avenue in the Borough of Saddle River, Bergen County, NJ in a house they owned. Listed with them was daughter Elsie, 21, single, [teacher?].

In 1902 Archer J. Mowerson took over the coal and feed business in Wyckoff, Bergen Co., NJ that his father had founded late in the 19th century. The Mowerson general store established in 1877 was sold in 1909 to Herman Klomberg, who later sold it to Robert Mowerson..

At the time of the 1920 Federal Census (taken January 1920), they were living in Franklin Township (Wyckoff Village), on Railroad Avenue: Archer J. Mowerson, 39, properties, coal & feed; Annah L. Mowerson, 42, wife; Cathrine L. Mowerson, 13, daughter; Mildred P. Mowerson, 11, daughter; Edward A. Mowerson, 9, son; and Ina J. Mowerson, 4-2/12 (or 1-2/12), daughter.

He left 20 acres to his son Peter Mourison with the stipulation that Peter pay his sister Catherine \$25 when she needed it. He left his farm in Franklin Township and the remainder of his his real and personal estate to his grandson, James P. Mowerson, with the stipulation that he "give unto my beloved wife during her life a good and comfortable maintenance in livelihood, and \$25 in cash." He also mentioned in his will a daughter Catherine, and her son John Alyea. In a codicil of the same date, he directed that his wife should have "the room at the east end of my House and the bedroom at the end of the hall to her use during life, and also the use of the Cellar and Chamber."

On 6 May 1795, Cary and Hester Ludlow, gentleman, of New York City to Abraham Rattan, yeoman, of Franklin Township, for £200.4, 68.75 acres...line of Lucas cooper, James Mourison and John DeBaun. Signed by Cary Ludlow, Hester Ludlow. Witnessed by George Ludlow, Garret A. Ackerman.¹

On 10 April 1798, Joseph and Elizabeth Sharp conveyed to James Mourison, of Franklin Township, for £168, 5/14 of 231.3 acres. Signed Joseph Sharp, Elizabeth Sharp. Witnessed by Matthias Little, Hannah Solomon.¹

William Mowerson, 22, Farmer, and Lavinia Mowerson, 20, his wife, were listed with their son Freddy, 2/12 in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Also living with them was Edward Debaun, 13, servant.

By 1886 William H. Mowerson was residing with his father-in-law at 432 West 35th Street, New York City. The NYC Directory listed his occupation as clerk. In 1888 he was listed as a butcher living at 334 West 30th Street, NYC.

He probably moved to Tenafly after 1889 when his father-in-law gave each of his children parcels of land on Norman Place. For many years he was a commission merchant at the old Washington Market in NYC. He had 14 stalls on 14th Street, West Washington Market, where he sold calves livers, lamb, rabbits, chickens, etc. By 1910 his son Fred was in business with him under the name of W. H. Mowerson & Son. Also in business with him were sons Harry (a driver residing at 2200 8th Avenue) and William H., Jr. (manager, residing 363 West 15th Street).

He started a coal and lumber business in Tenafly as William H. Mowerson & Sons.
