The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Joost Van Oblinus (now O'Brien), his son Joost and family, from Walloon Flanders found refuge at Mannheim, on the Rhine, within the German Palatinate. Peter Van Oblinus, son of Joost, Jr. and his wife Marie Sammis, was born in 1662.

In the marriage records Aletta's name is given as Letty Cortelyou of New Utrecht. Albert O'Brien was a graduate of Queens (Rutgers) College. In 1791 he was appointed first teacher in the classical department of Erasmus Hall Academy, a pri-

vate school in Brooklyn, at a salary of ninety pounds. Albert O'Brien's will, dated Aug. 8, 1806 and probated Jan 2, 1807, left to his wife, Letty O'Brien all his personal estate. To his three surviving children, Maria, Henry, and Isaac Courtelyou O'Brien, he gave his lands in Brooklyn, subject to use by his wife "Letty" during her widowhood. Aletta and Albert, with the two daughters, Ann are buried in Flatbush Cemetery, Brooklyn.¹

Andrew Oblenis was a mason. He lived in Ramsey in 1877 according to Martin Hennion's will, which gives Ramsey as residence of grandchildren. He may actually have lived in Allendale, however. He is probably the Jack O'Brien mentioned in the Bergen Index of 12 Dec 1877 as having put up an addition to his dwelling, the former old time toll-gate house on the Turnpike in Allendale. He was then keeping a small variety store there.

Andrew J. Oblenis, 31, farmer, and Caroline, 26, his wife, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township (prob. northern Mahwah), Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them were: Sarah M., 9; Angeline, 5; and John, 1.

Andrew and Caroline Oblenis were listed in the 1865 New Jersey State Census, living in Hohokus Township: Andrew J. Oblenis, Caroline Oblenis, Sarah M. Oblenis, Angeline Oblenis, John Oblenis, George Oblenis, and McElroy Oblenis.

He and his family, with second wife Ellen and her son Frank (listed as Andrew J. Oblenis's step son), are listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ (in what became Allendale Borough) between Corines Quackenbush and Charles A. Binder (or Bender). "Andrew O'Brien" is listed in the 1880 Federal Census as a mason. Listed with him were his unmarried children: George, 18; John, 21; Maxwell, 15; and Harry, 12; his second wife, Ellen, 40; and his stepson, Frank Storms, 18. [Where was dau. Jennie Storms?]

His second wife, Ellen Hosey, divorcee of Jeremiah Storms, had children by her first marriage: Frank Storms, b. about 1862, and Jennie Storms, b. Dec 1866, m. Peter Westervelt Van Dien, widower of Stella Mabie.

Bernard Oblenis was a veteran of the War of 1812, in which he was a post officer in the NYC militia. He was clerk of police from 1805 to 1819. He was a lawyer, farmer, surrogate, supervisor, and judge. They lived in Clarkstown, NY.

Gertrude Sanders was b. in Putnam Co., NY, Her parents died when she was young and she lived with her brother, Isaac Sanders, in NYC until her marriage.

The will of Bernard Oblenis of Clarkstown, Rockland Co., NY was dated 11 July 1825; probated 13 March 1830 (rec. NYC). In it, Bernard Oblenis, of Clarkstown, farmer, mentioned wife Gertrude, sons John & William, James Demerest, William Hutton, Executors: wife Gertrude, Executrix and two sons. Witnesses: James Demerest, William Hutton, John Demerest. Signed B. Oblenis.

At the time of the 1860 Federal Census, Gertrude was living (along with her son John) with the family of her grandson, (Dr.) Bernard Oblenis, in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ.

Dr. Bernard Oblenis built a home at 220 East Saddle River Road, Saddle River, Bergen Co., NJ about 1848.

He had a medical practice in the Paramus Valley in New Jersey, which he abandoned because of health. He then moved to Saddle River, NJ where in 1856, in a grist mill previously built and run by John Van Buskirk, he began, with John Demarest, a business for the manufacture of woolen yarn under the name of Oblenis and Demarest. In 1860 Oblenis bought Demarest's share and continued the operation for almost 20 years. In 1880, J. Augustus Bogert became a partner and they manufactured cardigan jackets until 1889 when they closed. H. W. Thurston succeeded Oblenis and made hosiery until the mill burned in 1897.

Oblenis was a Hohokus committeeman for 6 years. He was the first Mayor of the Borough of Saddle River, Bergen Co., NJ, serving five years in that capacity.

Elizabeth Haring's brother was Jacob Cox Haring, who was b. about 1840; d. 16 July 1915 age 75, Ticonderoga, NY. Jacob Cox Haring was at one time postmaster at Spring Valley [NY?], and between 1870 and 1890 a prominent breeder of trotting horses. Among those he raised and raced were Deucallion, record 2:22, and Scotland Maid, record 2:28.³

Bernard Oblenis, 33, Doctor, b. NY and Elizabeth Oblenis, 28, b. NY, his wife, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed with them were their daughters, Maria, 7, b. NY; and Elizabeth, 4, b. NJ. Also living with them at the time of the 1860 census were John Oblenis, 60, farmer, b. NY [his father]; Gertrude Oblenis, 86, b. NY [his grandmother], May Thompson, 30, Servant; and Charles King, 65, farmer.

In the 1870 census, Oblenis, Dr. Bernard, 43, is listed as a Mill Operator. Living with his family is John Oblenis, 70.

Bernard Oblenis, 53, manufacturer, and his wife, Elizabeth, 48, were listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ. Living with them were Elizabeth Oblenis, 23, single, daughter; Augustus Bogert, 34, widower, manufacturer, son-in-law; and Bernard O. Bogert, 3, grandson.

At the time of the 1885 New Jersey State Census, living with Bernard and Elizabeth Oblenis were Elizabeth Oblenis and Bernard Bogert (aged 5-20).

Andrew Esler, 43, Florist and seedsman, and Elizabeth O. Esler, his wife, b. June 1856, were listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living in Saddle River Borough, Bergen County, NJ, in a house they owned. In June 1900 she was the mother of no children. Listed living with them in June 1900 were her parents: Bernard Oblenis, 73, Physician (Retired), and his wife, Elizabeth H. Oblenis, 68, mother of 2 children, 1 then living.

Garett Oblenis of Clarkstown, in his will dated Jun. 30, 1837, probated Aug. 26, 1839. mentioned Wife, Vroutye; Garett Oblenis House, son of my nephew, Henry House; Nephew, Henry House; Margaret Tallman - wife of John J. Smith. Mentions deeds: John, James and Jos. Blauvelt to Garett Oblenis in two deeds dated Dec. 29, 1804 and Aug. 24, 1805. Executors: Nephew, Henry House and Dowah I. Tallman.
