The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

His mother and father came to eastern Long Island early in 1640, and lived at South- or Northampton, Long Island, until the family removed to Elizabethtown, N. J., in 1665. David was twenty-six years old at the latter date, and is in that year named as one of the original Associates of Elizabethtown. He had taken oath of allegiance to the English government of New York on Feb. 19, 1665, probably while on Long Island.

David Ogden applied for a survey of 120 acres, Apr. 27, 1676, and about that time removed to Newark, N. J.

Judge David Ogden, of Newark, graduated at Yale in 1728 and became one of the judges of the supreme court of the State of New Jersey. When the Revolutionary War broke out he espoused the side of the king and became a distinguished loyalist. One son, Isaac, sided with his father, and his interest in the old Boonton property was accordingly confiscated and sold to his brother by the commissioners. Sons Abraham and Samuel were active and ardent patriots. The former was a distinguished lawyer, and said to have had no equal before a jury. He was appointed surrogate for Morris in 1768. After the war he returned to Newark, was United States district attorney in Washington's administration, was a member of the Legislature in 1790, and died suddenly in 1798, upward of sixty years of age. Samuel Ogden married a sister of Governor Morris, and lived at Old Boonton, where he was largely engaged in the iron business. He commanded a company of militia in the war. In 1805 he is described in a deed as being of Newark. He was the father of David B. Ogden, eminent at the bar, both in New Jersey and New York.

After the independence of the Republic was acknowledged by the British government, David Ogden went to England and became agent for the loyalists in the prosecution of their claims for compensation for losses they had sustained by their adherence to the King. He returned from England in 1790, and resided on Long Island until his death.

John Ogden and his brother Richard, then both of Stamford, CT, built, in 1642 (finished in 1645), the stone church in New Amsterdam.

John Ogden was one of the the original purchasers of Elizabethtown [NJ] grant, 1665, a patentee by substitution for the interests of both Daniel Denton, and his brother, Nathaniel Denton, bought in that year, in association with Captain John Baker. He was probably one of, if not the most influential, founders of Elizabethtown, coming originally from Stamford, Connecticut, where in 1641 he had m. Jane, sister of Robert Bond. He, with Rev. Richard Denton, father of Daniel and Nathaniel Denton, et al, founded Hempstead, L. I., in 1664, being a patentee. In 1647/9 he planted a colony at Northampton, L. I. He was made a freeman of Southampton, L. I., Mar. 31, 1650. He was a magistrate appointed by the General Court, and a Deputy to the same, from Southampton, May, 1659, and in the Upper House, May, 1661, and later. His name appeared frequently in the records of L. I. and Connecticut, and he was everywhere recognized as one of the able, representative and influential men of his day.

In his will, he wrote: ...I John Ogden Senior Inhabitant of Elizabeth towne in ye province of new East Jersey for Divers good causes and waity Considerations moveing me hereunto but more Espetially for that Jaan Ogden is my Deare and beloved wife and soe hath been for above fowerty yeares Have Given Graunted Alienated and made over unto my above Deare wife Jaan Ogden all my Estate both moveables and immoveables that is to say houses lands cattles goods and what ever else may be my proper Right & Due & what soever Lands not yet Layed out which is my Right & Due I say I Doe by these rts fully and firmly Give Graunt Alienate and make over all & every part & parcell of ye above mentioned estate unto my aforesaid wife all Just Depts being payed Satisfied & answered: by ye advice & Councell & assistance of such overseers as I have thought fitt to Constitute namely Benjamin Parkis Jonathan Ogden & Joseph Ogden for a full & firm Ratification & Confirmation of ye promises I have Herevnto set my hand and Seall this one and twenty day of December one thousand six hundred Eighty and one and in the three and thirty yeare of his Majesties Raigne JOHN OGDEN [SEAL] "Sighned Sealed & Delivered in presence of us "Isaac Whitehead The marke W of Jaan Whitehead"

(Reverse side of Will) "John Curtise of new-wark & Jonathan Ogden & Benjamin Ogden both of Eliz:town Came before me underwritten Commissionated for takeing ye probate of all last wills & Testaments wthin ye sd province of East new Jersey & did solemnly depose upon ye holy Evangelists of almighty God that they were perfectly well acquainted wth the hand writting of John ogden decsd Commonly then Called old John ogden & Isaac Whitehead decsd & then did & still do know

their hand writing very well & yt they do truely & verily beleive in their Consciencs yt ye within written Instrument is ye hand writting of sd Isaac Whitehead & his name subscribed thereto as a wittness is his true hand writing and yt ye name of ye testator John ogden subscribed thereunto is ye real & true hand writing of ye sd John ogden & ye sd Jonathan ogden further saith yt this Instrument was delivered to him very shortly after ye sd old John Ogdens death & yt he hath safely kept it ever since yt time till now Jurat: Decimo nono die martij anno Dom :1702do: Coram me Thomas Gordon."

This John Ogden had conveyed a message and tenement situated in Bramshaw, England, to his sister Mary, on Mar. 7, 1638, about which time he emigrated to the New Haven Colony, thus coming to America about two years before John Ogden, the Pilgrim. He probably became one of the first settlers of Stamford, Conn. He was closely associated in the New World with his father-in-law, John Budd, whose daughter Judith became his second wife, Apr. 19, 1638, and doubtless soon after his immigration. He is probably the John Ogden who was connected with the building of a mill-dam, as recorded in the Stamford records. In Sept., 1641, the mill was sold to Thurston Raynor, "he to take her as she now stands for £74, 10s. at common charge according to a bargain made between John Ogden and Mitchell for building a dam."¹

This John Ogden is known to modern writers as "John Ogden of Rye," because he became associated with his father-in-law, John Budd, in mill property at the new settlement at Rye, and took up residence there. Rye is near the western end of Long Island Sound, on the mainland, and was settled in 1660; it was first under the jurisdiction of Connecticut, but in 1683 was transferred to New York, being now in Westchester Co. This John Ogden was a prominent man among the settlers, and a man of great strength of character. He is probably the John Ogden who joined with other New England men in sending a petition to the King, 1665-1667. At General Court held at Hartford, Oct. 8, 1674, John Ogden was named as a deputy Governor for the Colony of Rye. The following year, Apr. 20, 1675, John Winthrop was made Governor, and John Ogden assistant Governor of the Colony of Connecticut. In 1679 the town of Rye granted John Ogden 48 or 50 acres by the waterside at Fishing Rock, for the purpose of building a house and wharf. In May, 1682, John Ogden appeared before the court in Hartford, and was granted 20 acres of land for a pasture. He also brought forward some matters of dispute about the boundary lines between New York and Connecticut, and was the bearer of a letter from the General Court at Hartford to the Governor of New York, relating to it.¹

Robert Ogden was a member of the King's Council for N. J. In 1751 he was elected to the Legislature, and was rechosen at each succeeding election. In 1763 he was chosen Speaker of the House. In 1765 he was one of the Delegates to the Continental Congress at New York. "This first Continental Congress, emanating from the people, met as contemplated, and continued in session until Oct. 25th. "A Declaration of Rights and Grievances," in 14 particulars, was drawn up, with an Address to the King, and a Petition to each House of Parliament. . . . The proceedings were approved and signed by all the members except Timothy Ruggles, the presiding officer, and Mr. Ogden of New Jersey. These two gentlemen maintained that the proceedings were to be submitted to the several provincial Assemblies, and, if sanctioned, forwarded by them, as their own acts. They were doubtless quite sincere and conscientious in maintaining this position; Mr. Ogden certainly was. . . "Mr. Ogden was burned in effigy by the people of New Jersey." It was a blunder, to say the least, on the part of Mr. Ogden, who was so annoyed by it as to request the Governor to convene the Assembly, when, Nov. 27, 1765, he resigned his position and his membership.

In the m. record they are "Swaen Hockdon, y.m., b. and l. Newark, and Maritie Ackermans, y.d., b. and l. Ackinsack."

Their children Sarah, Mary, and John all died within days of each other, of an epidemic (thought to have been diphtheria) which was peculiarly fatal to children and swept southward from Kingston, NH through NJ in the spring of 1735.
