The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

They were listed in the 1930 Federal Census, Pennsylvania, Lackawanna Co., Dunmore, District 144, p. 46, enumerated 14 April 1930, 1642 Webster Ave., Dwelling 554, Family 610 -- Oldis, Archie F., Head, Renting home, age 42, married at age 223, b. NJ, his father b. NJ, his mother b. IA, Sales Manager, Baking Co.; [Oldis], Florence J., Wife, age 39, married at age 19, b. NJ, her parents b. England; [Oldis], Robert, Son, age 18, Single, b. NJ, his parents b. NJ.

In 1942, when he registered for the WW II draft, he lived in Yardley, Bucks Co., PA and was employed by Rider College, Trenton, Mercer Co., NJ.³ He was a college vocational director at Rider College.

On 5 March 1727/28 Benjamin Oldis, aged c. 18 years (son of Benjamin Oldis, late of NYC, feltmaker) pray that Garret Onckelbagge, of NYC, distiller, and Aaron Bogaert (of NYC, turner) be admitted his guardians.²

This family was living in or near Allendale by 1762 (and may have been at this location as early as 1742), probably near the property of John Fell and today's "Celery Farm" acreage.

A Bergen Country Road Return dated 20 Sep 1756 stopping a road that runs from Ramapogh to Hackensack through Marten Easterly's Land, and laying out a new road was recorded at the request of Marten Easterly. Landmarks cited for the new road were the line between Marten Easterly and John Ackerman (two rods from each land); land of Benjamin Oldis; stopping the road that runs from Campga atop the hill through Marte Easterly's Land; and have layed a four rod road from Peter Tibous at the waggon road; mud bridge; to said Ramapogh Road.¹

It is prob. this Benjamin Oldis who is listed in the 1778 Franklin Township Rateables (just after James Provost and just before Garrit Oldis) with 150 acres, 2 horses, 8 horned cattle, 4 hogs. He is listed in the Jan-Feb 1779 Franklin Township Rateables with 150 acres and 14 horses and cattle. "Benjamin Oldest" is listed in the 1780 Franklin Twp. Rateables with 50 acres improved land, 50 acres unimproved land, 2 horses, 6 horned cattle, and 3 hogs.

On 16 March 1804 (recorded 25 April 1804, Bergen Co. S:91) William M. Bell of the County of Bergen and Rachel, his wife, conveyed to James Laroe of the same place, for \$3,855, two certain messuages in the Precinct of Franklin. (1) 98-3/10 acres more or less lying on Goghakes Brook; mentions Benjamin Oldles lot; Hopper's line. (2) 151-74.100 acres more or less, beginning corner of highway in line of Henry Hopper's land; mentions corner of Peter Tebou's land; corner John Buskirk's land at W side of Brook; corner of Kingsland Patent; corner John Hopper's land; corner Prevoost's tract of land, excepting all such lots as were sold by James Marcus Prevost in his lifetime to Benjamin Odel and Lewis Miltenbury, and all lots sold by said William M. Bell to Peter Alyea, John Van Blarcom and others, Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church; Abraham H. Hopper; John A. Hopper; Cornelius Smith and John Van Blarcom. Signed by W. M. Bell, Rachel Bell. Witnessed by G. I. H. Bell, Abrm. Westervelt.³

Garret Oldis [or perhaps his father Benjamin?] may have run a "popular house of entertainment" about the time of the Revolution in what became Midland Township. The original dwelling was burned by the British and afterwards rebuilt.¹

He is likely the Garrit Oldis, single man, listed in the 1778 Franklin Township Rateables (just after Benjamin Oldis and just before Abraham Hopper). He is not listed in the Jan-Feb 1779 Franklin Township Rateables.

On 28 April 1787 John and Jane Van Giesen of New Barbadoes Present, conveyed to Garret Oldis, of the same place, for £185.4, 12 acres...corner to Harmon Lutkins, Albert Van Voorhees and Peter Lutkins. Signed John Van Giesen. Witnessed by Jacob Zabriskie, John Van Sice.³

On 26 May 1796 (recorded 14 March 1806, Bergen Co. X:207) Nicausey Romine and Derickia, his wife, of New Barbadoes precinct, conveyed to Garret Olden of the same place, for £45, 10 shillings, 7 acres strict measure in New Barbadoes Precinct on the E side of Sprout, part of a lot formerly the property of Nicholas Romine, deceased, the father of the present grantor, beginning at lot of Isaac Vanderbeek; mentioned land of Daniel Romine. Bounded NW by Daniel Romine; NE by Isaac Vanderbeek's woodland; SE by said Nicausey Romine; SW by John Romine. Signed by Nicholas Romine, Derickie Romine. Witnessed by Cornelius Banta, John Banta.⁴

He is probably the Garret Oldis, who with Francis Oldis and Benjamin G. Oldis (poss. Garret's sons by those names), in March 1813 bought the Red Mills at Arcola, and surrounding property of 38 acres, from Isaac Sloat and Leah Zabriskie, his wife. The property was described as "all that certain messuage, Gristmill, Saw Mill, tract or parcel of land and land covered with water lying and being...at a place known by the name of New Hamburg." In February 1816 Garret and Francis Oldis conveyed the mill lot at New Hamburg to John Ryers of Sloterdam for \$8,750.²

Elizabeth Van Horne, wife of Garret Oldis, joined the Hackensack Ref Ch 11 Oct 1819.

Martha Ann Zabriskie wrote in her diary, 26 Feb 1830, "Died Garret Oldis from Hamburg."
