The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

John Osborn served in the Revolutionary War from 1776-1783, being a sergeant in the regiment of Colonel Ann Hawks Hay, Captain Blauvelt's company, from Haverstraw Precinct of Orange County, of which the present Rockland County was then a part. He was engaged in the various alarms and skirmishes along the Hudson river while New York was in possession of the British; was twice under the personal command of General Washington and took part in the battle of Stony Point. Years afterward a pension was accorded to him which he declined on the ground that he had been paid once for his services.³

Kakiat Patent: "The first settlers in this portion...were the original company of men who, in 1711, purchased the north moiety of this patent. They were all from Queens county, LI....that William and Nathaniel Osborn were in Queens county in 1710, before which they were living in East Hampton, Long Island, where they were known as the sons of Thomas Osborn, one of the first settlers of that place in 1657."⁵

After Michael Hawsen, one of two patentees of the Kakiat grant [in what is today Rockland County, NY] died about 1712, the executors of his estate sold his half of the patent to a group of men, including William Osborn and Nathaniel Osborn.³

Nathaniel Osborn was included in "A True List of all the Militia in Orange County, N.Y., October 25, 1715."²

Richard Osborne sailed from London, England on February 17, 1634 on the ship *Hopewell*. In July 1635, he drew for a home-lot in Hingham, MA.²

He received a Colonial grant of 80 acres, May 1671, for service in Pequot War.

He came to Hingham, Mass., 1635; rem. to Windsor with first settlers, and served in Pequot War 1637. He came to New Haven, 1639, and moved to Fairfield by 1652. He settled in Westchester, N. Y., by 1682, and d. there abt. 1685.

At New Haven, he signed the Fundamental Agreement, June 1639, and took the oath of allegiance, 1644; had three in his family, 1641; sold his property there in Apr. and May 1652. The General Court of Connecticut granted Capt. Richard Osborn on June 4, 1639, 80 acres in Fairfield, for his good services in the "Pequot War" in 1637.

On 26 May 1674 he gave land in Fairfield to his dau. Priscilla wife of Cornelius Seeley; and it was recorded, 25 Nov. 1678, that Thomas Bedient had land by gift from his father-in-law [stepfather?], Capt. Richard Osborn.

On 27 Oct. 1682, being of Westchester, he gave his Fairfield lands to his son John, who was to pay £1 apiece to the eldest dau.'s five children, £2 apiece to dau. Priscilla's two sons and £1 apiece to her two daus., £1 apiece to dau. Sarah's seven children, £1 apiece to dau. Mary's three children, and to dau. Elizabeth, £50. [Fairfield Deeds.]

His first wife, mother of his children, is not known. On 12 June 1677, he appears in Westchester records as husband of Mary, widow of Roger Townsend. She had previously been widow of Mordecai Bedient.

From Teller's History of Ridgefield: "There has been one instance of a man who deceased in town 102 years old, he was born at East Chester in the State of New York, and came into this town in the 44th year, by name Richard Osborn. He was a very religious man, slender in body, had been a justice of the peace and deacon in the prime of life, was temperate in his habits and diet, but animated in his passions". He was listed as a proprietor for the purchase of land from the Indians in 1715 at age 38, but may not have moved to the town immediately. He was also listed on the purchases of 1721 and 1727. He was the Justice signing the documents in 1721, 1727, and 1729 (no proprietors listed). For all of these except Justice in 1721, his name is Osburn. At the time of the 1721 purchase, he was 45 years of age.

Some genealogists maintain that Osman/Osmond and Osborn were two distinct and different surnames, which because of their similar sounding pronunciation, have been comingled and confused in early records.

Thomas Osman was a brickmaker.

In the spring of 1638/1639, a group of Europeans, mostly English, in a vessel captained by Matthew Sunderland, first having stopped in North Carolina in search of turpentine, came to settle on the neck of land opposite the northwest corner of Manhansett (Shelter) Island. Among them were: William Salmon, William Purrier, Thomas Osman (Osborn), Thomas Reeve, James Reeve, Thomas Benedict, John Corey, Thomas Terrill, Edward Tredwell and Henry Whitney. Most of them remained permanently in what became the town of Southold.

Thomas Osman recorded his first deed for land to build a brickworks in 1656. He received his land from William Salmon. He does disappear from the Southold area early and goes to Hashamomack. Thomas spelled Osmond received his dividend of land in Oysterponds 20 Nov 1661. He is in the Estimate 16 Sep 1675 (DHNY)

At the time of the 2nd marriage, he was described as "lately having come from Newcastle on the Delaware to Gravesend."

William Osborne's will: In the name of God, Amen, February the 10, 1682. I, William Osburne, of Gravesend, in the West Riding of Yorkshire, being in good memory. I leave to my wife Alice all the land and houses, which formerly did belong to her husband, Samuel Holmes, with all the stock thereon except three horses, one of which came from Setalcot. I also give her my gray horse and mares, now running in Hugh Garetsons neck, and which did belong to her former husband Samuel Holmes. Also household goods and farming utensils, during her widowhood. Also 10 ewes and 6 lambs, with their increase, now in possession of Wait Smith of Jamaica, and were delivered to him in 1680. I leave to my eldest son, William Osburne, a tract of land lying within the Precincts of Newtown, and now in the possession of John Smith, and Hannah his wife, of said town, and will be due to me or my heirs at the decease of said John Smith and his wife Hannah. I leave to my daughter Elizabeth, two houses and home accommodations lying in the town of Flushing, and now in the possession of Thomas Williams, and due to me or my heirs at his decease. But one of the houses and lots being in controversy between the said Williams and myself, and a Suit in Law depending thereon; if the said house and lot be not recovered, then my daughter Elizabeth is to have the house and lot I bought of Thomas Davis, and £20 more. I leave to my daughter Margaret, £60, and to my son Samuel, £80. If any of my children marry without the consent of my executors and overseers, they shall have power to detain their portions. Witnesses, Corsten Jansen, Samuel Spicer, Peter Smith. Proved at Court of Sessions, August 29, 1683, in Gravesend, by the witnesses, and Peter Smith, Clerk of the Court, who also testify that William Osburne gave verbally to his wife Alice "all the whale craft in the Town." The will appoints Gersham Moore, Samuel Moore, and Daniel Whitehead, executors, and John Coe, Samuel Spicer and John Tredwell as overseers.¹

After Michael Hawsen, one of two patentees of the Kakiat grant [in what is today Rockland County, NY] died about 1712, the executors of his estate sold his half of the patent to a group of men, including [brothers] William Osborn and Nathaniel Osborn.¹

Kakiat Patent: "The first settlers in this portion...were the original company of men who, in 1711, purchased the north moiety of this patent. They were all from Queens county, LI....that William and Nathaniel Osborn were in Queens county in 1710, before which they were living in East Hampton, Long Island, where they were known as the sons of Thomas Osborn, one of the first settlers of that place in 1657."²

William Osborn, on 15 July 1720, was one among others to sign stating that a tract be granted to Joseph Wood of Hempstead, Queens Co., L.I. to open a blacksmith shop in Kakiat.³
