The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

[Fabritius] Foppe Jansen Outhout, Dutch, born about 1631, was quartermaster during Stuyvesant's expedition to recapture Fort Casimir. Upon return of the Dutch ships to Manhattan, he completed his duties there and returned to the Delaware as a permanent resident. By 1660, he operated a tavern in New Amstel and was a justice of the court in 1664 when he signed the oath of allegiance to the English. In 1671 he was still a justice in New Castle and continued in this capacity until 1680 although he had moved his principal residence to Penn's Neck, where he had purchased land from the indians in 1665. His wife was Sarah Neering, who had previously married and had sons **John and Hendrick Williams Neering**. Foppe Outhout and Sarah Neering had at least two daughters. One became the second wife of Adam Pietersen, and the other (Sarah) married Olof Olleson Thorsson. Foppe Outhout died in Penn's Neck, New Jersey, by 1693; his widow died in New Castle in 1703.¹

In his will, dated 22 Jan 1685/6, Fopp Jansen Outhoot, inhabitant of the Eastern Shore of Delaware River; mentioned wife Sarah Neeringhs, sole heiress and executrix of real and personal estate. Children mentioned, but not by name. Witnesses--

William Shute, Robert White, Michael Barron. Recorded March 2, 1692-3. 1692-3 Feb. 20. Inventory of the personal estate, £110.3, incl. silverplate £10, a great Bible £3, books £8; made by Clauss Johnson and William Shute.

In his will, dated October 11, 1738, Hendrick Oothout, of the Manor of Rensselaerwyck, wrote: "considering the frailty of my body." I leave to my eldest son, Volkert, £10 for his right of primogeniture, this is to be taken from his bond for £100 due to me. And as for my son Jan, he likewise hath already had his full share of my estate. I leave to my son Jonas "all that my farm land or Bowery commonly called Turkey, where I now dwell," on the west side of Hudson river; Together with Greenen island, and 3 other islands in Hudson river, and all the woodland or upper message and tract, as the same is granted unto me by Colonel Peter Schuyler, as by transport may appear; Also 1 waggon, 1 pleasure sled, 1 wood sled, etc. And my son Jonas is to pay to my daughters Dorothy, wife of Cornelius Bougard, Hendrike, wife of Isaac Bougard, Margarette, wife of Dominie Jan Van Driesen, Anattie, wife of Peter Wouters Quackinbos, each 1/5 of the value of the farm as appraised. But my son Jonas is to have £160 over and above his 1/5. I give to my daughter Dorothy, wife of Cornelius Bougard, my little pasture land lying near to the city of Albany, to the south, bounded by the pasture land of Anthony Korsler, and the land of Garrett Lansing. I leave to my daughter Margaret, wife of Dominie Jan Van Driesen, 1/2 of my lot of ground in Albany, near the City Hall or Court House which I had of Poullis Martense Van Benthuyzen, being the south 1/2, bounded south by Frederick Visger, west and east by common street. I leave to my grandson, Hendrick Oothout, son of my son Jan, £10, out of the £100 due to me from my son Volkert. All the rest of my estate I leave to my son Jonas, and my daughters. I make my son Jonas, and my son-in-law, Cornelius Bougard, executors. Witnesses, Petrus Vander Bergh, Cornelys Oudenkerk, Rutger Bleecker. Proved, April 26, 1740.

Page 155. Petition (25 Mar 1805) of John Oothout, Jr., Eliza Oothout, and Cataline Oothout, infants, praying the appoint-

ment of a guardian (X, p. 46) -- Petition (25 Mar 1805) of John Oothout, Jr (age 16 and upwards), Eliza Oothout (age 17 and upwards) and Cataline Oothout (age 11 and upwards), children of John Oothout, late of New York City, dec'd. They pray that their mother, Magdalen Oothout, may be appointed their guardian. Report (29 Mar 1805) states that their only relation on their father's side is Myndert Van Schaick, Jr. Relations on their mother's side are the following: Ann (widow of Jacob Lansing, late of Albany) and Catharine and Cataline Quackenbos, both of Albany (all three being children of Margaret Quackenbos, of Albany, who was a sister of John Oothout, dec'd), John, Edward, Mary and Cataline Van Harlingen (all four being the children of Mary Van Harlingen, who was the wife of Annetus Van Harlingen, of Milestone, NJ, and a sister of John Oothout, dec'd), Mary (widow of Goose Van Schaick, late of Albany), Catharine (wife of David Landon, of Albany) and Margaret Ten Broeck, of Albany, spinster (which said Mary, Catharine and Margaret are children of Elizabeth, now dec'd, who was the widow of John Ten Broeck, late of New York City, and one of the sisters of John Oothout, dec'd) and William Vandewater, of New York City, gentleman, and Elizabeth his wife (maternal grandfather and grandmother of the infants) (BM 224-0)--Appointment (10 April 1805) of Magdalen Oothout (mother of John Oothout, Jr., Eliza Oothout and Cataline Oothout, infants) to be their guardian (X, pp. 97-98, 680-681).¹

Page 158. Appointment (7 Jun 1805) of Magdalen Oothout as guardian of her infant children, John, Jr., Eliza and Cataline Oothout. Her sureties are Abraham Brinckerhoff and William Rhineland, both of New York City, merchants (X, P. 144; see also XI, p 496).¹
