The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: Abraham Paaling, j.m. V. N: York, met Maria Cousyn, j.d. V. N: York.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Palding, of New York, being weak in body. I leave to my son, Joseph Palding, £100, "as my eldest son and Heir at Law." I leave to my sons, Gerritt and Cornelius Palding, all that certain tract or parcel of land, about 200 acres, in Orange County, and whereon my said two sons now live. I leave to my son James all that certain lot of ground in New York "commonly known by the name of the Block House lot." I leave to my wife £50 yearly, "free and clear of all charges." My executors are to sell all the rest of my real estate, and the proceeds to my children, Joseph, Gerritt, James, Cornelius, Belatie Jones, Catharine Ogilvie, Mary Ackerman, Rebecca Leahie, and Nelly Palding. Also all the personal estate. I make my son Joseph, and my son-in-law, William Ogilvie, and my brother Joseph, and my friend, Peter Montainie, executors. Dated September 14, 1762. Witnesses, Philip Pelton, Joseph Palding, John Woods. Proved, September 21, 1762.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Albert Pawling, of Ulster County, Esq., being sick. I leave to my wife, Catharine Pawling, all the household goods and personal estate that she had before our marriage, and which I did become entitled to since her marriage; Also all my undivided right and interest in those tracts of land lying in Dutchess County, called De Myers Purchase, and which were conveyed to me by one John Low, to her and her heirs and assigns for ever; Also my two negro slaves. I also give to her during her widowhood 1/2 of the rents and produce of all that my farm or plantation on which we live in Ulster County, and the use of 1/2 my negroes, stock, etc. If she and my nephew Levy Pawling, son of my brother Henry Pawling, shall be willing to live together on said farm. I leave all the said farm and plantation in Ulster County (subject as above) to my wife and mother, and a competent and sufficient provision shall be made for the support of my mother, Neeltie, during her life, one-half from my wife and the other half from my nephew. If my wife should die during the life time of my mother, I leave all the said farm to my nephew, Levy Pawling, and he is to maintain my mother. I leave to my mother my negro-girl "Bess," "to wait and attend her." If my wife or nephew do not agree to live together, and she removes to some other place, I give her £15 a year. After the death of my wife and mother, then all my estate in Ulster County shall descend to my nephew, Levy Pawling. I make my wife, Catharine, and my brother-in-law, Henry Beekman, Esq., and my nephew, Levy Pawling, executors. Dated August 27, 1745. Witnesses, W. Furman, Joseph Wells, William Williamsen. Proved, November 15, 1745.

[NOTE.--Catharine Pawling was the daughter of William Beekman. She was born September 16, 1683. She married Captain John Rutsen, and after his death she married Albert Pawling--W. S. P.]

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Catharine Pawling, of Rhinebeck Precinct, in Dutchess County, Gentlewoman, being of sound and perfect mind. I give my body to the earth from which it was taken. As for my burial, I desire it may be decent at the discretion of my loving daughter and executors, whom I doubt not will manage it with all requisite Prudence." I leave to my daughter, Catharine Ten Broeck, wife of Captain Petrus Ten Broeck, a certain great lot of land in Beekman's Precinct, known on the map of Beekman's Precinct as Lot No. 5. Bounded south by Lot No. 4 of Colonel Henry Beekman, north by Lot No. 6 of Colonel Livingston, and east by the Colony of Connecticut and the Oblong, west by the purchase of Mayer & Co., called Poohgrajawonk, and in Lot No. 8 now in tenure of Peter Roesner and Daniel Lighthart, each containing 100 acres. Also 2 lots of ground in the North Ward of the city of New York, "by Dick Cook's corner," each lot being 25 feet 5 inches wide and 80 feet long. I leave to my granddaughter Cornelia, daughter of my son, Jacob Rutsen, deceased, a certain lot in Beekman's Precinct, called Lot No. 9, bounded east by Connecticut or the Oblong, west by Lot 22. I also leave her œ500, to be paid by her brother, my grandson, John Rutsen, as follows, viz., £100 when she is 20 years of age, and then œ100 yearly till paid. I leave to my daughter, Catharine Ten Broeck, and my granddaughter Cornelia 1/2 of the use of the rest of my lands in Beekman's Precinct except as above bequeathed until my grandson, John Rutsen, is of age, and then to him. The other 1/2 I leave to my granddaughter, Cornelia Rutsen. Enough of the income to be used "to give her good Living and a handsome Education and other accomplishments suitable to a woman of her fortune." "I will and positively order that the income of all my lands and messuages and tenements in Rhinebeck Precinct shall be laid out for my grandson, John Rutsen, to give him good learning and handsome education until he is 20." All my chattels, goods, movables, plate, and, in short, all my personal property I leave to my daughter Catharine and my grandson, John Rutsen, and my granddaughter, Cornelia Rutsen. I leave to my grandson, John Rutsen, all my other lands and tenements in Dutchess and Ulster counties. If he die, they are to go to my daughter Catharine and my granddaughter Cornelia. I make my daughter Catharine and her husband and my brother, Henry Beekman, Esq., executors, and I give to my said son-in-law £100. If my real estate shall be affected by law suits my daughter and grandchildren shall bear the expenses together. Dated October 9, 1753. Witnesses, Christian Schults, Hannes Hendrickse, Wilhelmus Heermans. Proved, March 22, 1764.

[NOTE.--Catharine Pawling was the daughter of Colonel Henry Beekman...[who] owned a large tract of land in the south-east part of Dutchess County, of which the lands described are a portion.--W. S. P.]

John Paulding was one of the three captors of Major John Andre in 1780. He was a poor man, infirm and unable to do manual labor, and with 15 living children about Jan 1817 (according to Pierre Van Cortlandt), when he applied for an increase in his Revolutionary War pension; it was denied.¹

On his burial marker: "On the morning of the 23rd of September 1780 accompanied by two young farmers of the County of Westchester, whose names will one day be recorded on their own deserved monuments, he intercepted the British Spy Andre. Poor himself, he disdained to acquire wealth by the sacrifice of his County. Rejecting the temptations of great rewards, he conveyed his prisoner to the American camp; and by this act of self-denial, the treason of Arnold was detected; the designs of the enemy baffled; West Point and the American Army saved, and this United States now by the Grace of God Free and Independent, rescued from most imminent peril. "The Corporation of the City of New York, erected this tomb as a memorial sacred to Public Gratitude."
