# -- PALMER --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

David Palmer lived at North Salem, Westchester County, N.Y. His Will, dated 10th day, 2nd month 1795 (which suggests he was a Quaker) was recorded at Westchester Co. (Liber B) and probated March 10, 1795. The will of David Palmer of North Salem "yeoman being at present unwell as to bodily health but sound in mind and memory but being convinced of the uncertainty of life...Principally I will my soul to the Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner...and to what temporal estate I may be possessed of I give and devise in the following man-

Item 1. Son John Palmer—10 acres and a house and shop.

Item 2—Son Daniel Palmer—30 acres including the house, barn & all the buildings thereon and likewise---all my horses, cattle, sheep and swine except what is hereafter mentioned and likewise all my farming [utensils?]

Item 3—son Sylvanus Palmer—8 acres of land "with his dwelling house and all buildings thereon"

Item 4—son David Palmer—between 8 and 9 acres which was formerly purchased from Benjamin Close.

Item 5—son Elias Palmer—twenty five pounds York money.

Item 6—I give to my daughter Hannah her choice of two cows and six sheep and likewise the privilege of one half of the house and all the household furniture and her cows and sheep kept and privilege of firewood so long as she remains single and in case she should marry she my said daughter Hannah shall give up any privilege to the house to be to Daniel Palmer and one half of the household furniture in the house to be equally divided between my two daughters Elizabeth Stevenson and Deborah Smith, etc.

Item 7—It is my will that all the remainder of my Real Estate be equally divided between my five sons namely John Palmer, Sylvanus Palmer, David Palmer, Elias Palmer and Daniel Palmer.

The land devised to sons John and Daniel Palmer were adjoining lands in North Salem and were bounded by land of Jesse Palmer.

The witnesses to the will were James Webb, Nathaniel Baxter and Thadeus Crane. Executors were sons John, Silvanus and

In Third Month, 1760, a Committee of Oblong Monthly Meeting was appointed to visit Friends at Peach Pond and "consider if it will not be convenient & for the Honour of Truth to have a Meeting settled in that neighborhood & have a Meeting House of their own." The Committee reported favorably and had selected the site for the house Sixth month, 1760. The house was built in 1760 and enlarged in 1778. The Preparative Meeting was established Eleventh Month, 1779. Valley Preparative Meeting was set off Sixth Month 30th, 1785. Peach Pond Preparative Meeting was laid down Eighth Month 6th, 1792, and the members attached to Valley Preparative Meeting. In 1800 the Yearly Meeting directed that the Indulged Meeting of Peach

Pond be joined to Amawalk Monthly Meeting. Peach Pond Meeting was laid down in 1810, and the members attached to Salem Preparative Meeting near Goldens Bridge. The property is on the east side of Peach Lake, one mile south of Putnam County line, and one mile West of the Connecticut line. The deed is dated 6th of 8th month, 1762 from David Palmer of Salem, Westchester County, to Samuel Field of the Oblong in Dutchess County, "In behalf of Friends who are in scorn called Quakers, and their assigns forever."3

In 1793 David Palmer and Samuel Field were the principals mentioned in the erection of the Quaker Meeting house at North Salem (Peach Pond/Peach Lake Meeting). This meeting house burned down about 1978/79 (arson, a fire set by youths). It stood adjacent to the house that later belonged to Clayton Worthington Nichols; then David Hargan; and in 1989 occupied as a summer home by Elizabeth Hargan Kennedy and Eleanor Hargan Weiner.

Clayton Worthington Nichols acquired 1 April 1896 from the estate of Walter Palmer, dec'd (his stepfather) approximately 50 acres, known as the Walter Palmer farm. Elizabeth Hargan Kennedy talked of the house being enlarged and renovated by 1904, when her mother and father were married at the house.

In March 1661/2, Bridget Baxter petitioned for divorce, and a letter alleged to have been written by Baxter to his wife in England was put in evidence, Mr. Gould, Mr. Sherman, and Mr. William Hill were ordered to compare the letter with Baxter's other writings. In May, the divorce was granted: "and whereas the estate that her husband Baxter left with her is sold to pay debts, all excepting a bed and her wearing aparell," the Court prohibited the creditors from "seizing ye remainder, vntil ye Coun see cause to ye contrary."

All the rest of household goods to my wife Rebecca, and to my daughters Esther and Martha. I leave to my sons Philip and Marcus all my salt meadow that lies within the bounds of their deed from me, heretofore made, except 2 coves of meadow that lie on the lower end of the Cove, on the south side of the brook. I leave to my sons Lewis and Benjamin, all the rest of my real estate, house, barn, orchard, etc.; Also a £25 right in the Sheep Pasture; Also my negroes, horses, and cattle, and they are to pay to my wife £40, and to my daughter Martha, £40. I leave to my son John £5, and to my son Isaac £5; to my son Thomas £10; I having already provided for these sons according to my ability. My wife is to have the use of the Old House that I built first, except the cellar, to live in during her widowhood, and then to my sons Lewis and Benjamin. I make my son Philip and my friend Anthony Bartow, executors. Dated November 15, 1747. Witnesses, John Bartow, Moses Mullinex, Nathaniel Lewis. Proved, before Israel Honeywell, Esq., December 30, 1747.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Rebecca Palmer, of the Borrough Town of Westchester, widow, being advanced in years. I leave to John Palmer, son of my eldest son, £3. I leave to my granddaughters, Rebecca, Easter, and Rachel, the children of my son, John Palmer, £4. To Sarah, daughter of Joshua Pell, "one silver table spoon, of the value of 21 shillings." To my daughter Martha, wife of Benjamin Morell, I leave all that my dwelling house and lots situate upon Minifords Island in the Manor of Pelham, which I bought of Enoch Hunt and Joseph Mullinex, during her life and then to her daughter Mary. If she dies with-

out issue, then to Ann, daughter of Benjamin Palmer. I leave to my daughter Martha "one small Iron Pot, and one hog and my Poultry, and the bed I commonly lie on." My executors are to put on good security £50 for my daughter Martha, and all my wearing apparell. My executors are to sell all the rest and divide among my children. I make my sons, Philip and Benjamin, and my grandson, Joshua Pell, Jr., executors. Dated October 18, 1771. Witnesses, Samuel Seabury, James Lewis, Enoch Hunt. Proved, April 10, 1773.

Thomas Witherell Palmer, senator, was born in Detroit, Mich., Jan. 25, 1830; son of Thomas and Mary Amy (Witherell) Palmer; grandson of Thomas and Hannah (Barber) Palmer, and of Judge James and Amy (Hawkins) [p.183] Witherell, and a descendant of Walter Palmer, who emigrated from England with John Endicott in 1629, and became an original founder of Charlestown, Mass. He afterward removed to Pawcatuck (afterward Stonington), Conn., where he died in 1661. Thomas Palmer was a native of Wind ham county, Conn., one of the pioneer American merchants of Detroit. Thomas Witherell Palmer matriculated at the University of Michigan in the class of 1849, but was not graduated owing to the weakness of his eyes. He traveled in Europe, made a pedestrian tour in Spain, and a tour of South America and the southern part of the United States, 1848-50. He was engaged as the agent of a transportation company and as a merchant in Appleton, Wis., 1850-52, and in the real estate business in Detroit, Mich., 1853-55. In 1855 he was married to Lizzie Pitts, daughter of Charles and Francis (Pitts) Merrill. Mr. Merrill was a lumber merchant and mill owner in Saginaw, Mich., and Mr. Palmer became a partner in the business. On the death of her father in 1872, Mrs. Palmer inherited his interest and became a partner with her husband. He was a member of the Michigan board of estimates from Detroit in 1873; president of the waterways convention at Sault Sainte Marie, in August, 1887; a Republican state senator in 1878; was defeated for nomination for governor of Michigan in 1880; elected to the U.S senate in 1883, and at the expiration Of his term, March 3, 1889, was nominated and confirmed as U.S. minister to Spain, which office he resigned in 1890. He was president of the World's Columbian commission, 1890-93; became a director in the American Exchange National bank, and was also interested in several other important enterprises. He was president of the Detroit Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. He received the honorary degree of A.B. from the University of Michigan in 1876, as of the class of 1849. Walter Palmer came from England and joined the early settlers at Charlestown, MA at an unknown date. He possibly came as one of the Dorchester company, with the grantees of the Edmond, Lord Sheffield Parent, in 1624, settling at Cape Ann, Mass.; thence to Naumkeag (now Salem), Mass. Abother source 1 says that Walter Palmer and Abraham Palmer, borthers, came from Nottinghamshire, England in 1629 along with John Endicott.

Walter was in this country by 1629, when he and Abraham Palmer, along with Ralph Sprague and his brothers Richard and William, journeyed through the woods to a place called by the Indians Mishawum where an Englishman named Charles Walford, a smith, was living in a thatched house. There they settled, at what became Charlestown, MA.

The settlers, in the early spring of 1629, at Charlestown were: Ralph Sprague, Richard Sprague, William Sprague, William Springer, John Meech, Simon Hoyt, Abraham Palmer, Walter Palmer, Nicholas Stowses, John Stickline, Thomas Walford.

Walter Palmer built the first dwelling house in Charlestown. He was assigned two acres for a home lot and subsequently had more liberal grants. He farmed and raised stock in Charlestown until 1643 when he moved to the Plymouth colony. Walter was a man of note in the Massachusetts colony; admitted a freeman 18 May 1631, and holding various local offices.

In 1643 Walter Palmer and his friend William Chesebrough moved to the Plymouth colony and with others joined in the organization of the town of Rehoboth, where Walter was elected as deputy, selectman, and held other offices.

William Chesebrough removed in 1649 to Stonington, Ct. In 1653, his friend Walter Palmer moved to Stonington, where he built a house on an inlet from the Sound, at Wequetequock Cove. On 22 March 1657, Walter's house held the first religious services by Rev. William Thompson.

William Palmer, accompanied by his son William, a lad of nine years, came from Nottinghanshire, England, in the ship Fortune, in 1621—the second ship after the Mayflower—landed at Plymouth, MA, and settled at Duxbury, Mass., and thence to Scituate. It is supposed he died in 1637. His will was probated March 5, 1638. His wife, Frances, followed her husband to America in the vessel Anne, in 1623. His son William it is supposed migrated to Westchester County, and died there in 1670.

William Palmer came to America in the ship "Fortune" in 1621, followed two years later by his wife Frances in the ship "Ann." He settled in Plymouth, which place is historically famous as the first permanent white settlement in New England. He came the year following the landing of the "Mayflower" and had land in that part which was later set off as Duxbury. Here he was taxed in 1632. In 1633 he was a freeman of Duxbury. When he came to this country he was undoubtedly a carpenter, for in the records he is mentioned as "nailer," and this gives just reason for believing him to have been a welcome addition to that early settlement of pioneers.1

He died probably early in the year 1638, as his will of December 4, 1637, was probated the following March. The will mentions his wife as a young woman, his son Henry, and daughter Bridget; also a grandchild, Rebecca. Among the others remembered were Moyses Rowley, whom he requested should be "put with Mr. Partridge (minister of Duxbury) that he may be brought up in the fear of God"; and Stephen Tracy, also the Plymouth Church. He may have married twice, but the only name recorded is that of his wife Frances, who came to Amercia two years after his arrival. At a General Court at Plymouth, Mar. 5, 1638-9, "It is ordered by the Court that Nicholas Sumpkins, Wm. Palmer, Philip Tabor & Joshua Bangs, of Yarmouth, shall be added to Mr. Anthony Thacher, & Mr. Thomas Howes, Committee of the same place, to make an equal division of the planting lands now to be divided for the first time there to each in & according to his estate & quality & according to instructions. ---children of William Palmer & Frances

William Palmer was among the first settlers of the village of Westchester in Westchester Co., N.Y. These settlers were led in 1642, by John Throckmorton who came with thirty-five English families from New England, and settled at Westchester with the consent of the Dutch who had acquired title from the Indians.

William Palmer registered the number and description of his cattle, with their marks, in the Town of Westchester on 11 June 1665.

The petition of Joseph Palmer, Benjamin Palmer, Samuel Palmer, Obadiah Palmer and Thomas Palmer, sons of William Palmer of Westchester, and Martha Palmer, his widow, to Gov. Francis Lovelace, states "that it hath pleased God to take away our father lately, with a sudden blow of death, and without sickness, only a distemper he hath had on him many years, which wee could not conceive to be mortal. And left no will but verbally stating that having but little property he intended it to go to his wife, in respect she was stricken in years." They request that their mother be made administratrix. Which was granted April 26, 1670. Inventory taken by Consider Wood and Francis Feahs, mentions 20 acres of upland, 16 acres of meadow, 1 House Lot 2 1/2 acres.
