The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Parsells

The Parsells family are of French origin and originally settled on Long Island in the latter half of the 17th century. The first of the family to come to New Jersey was Nicholas, who settled in Hackensack in the first half of the 18th century. — Tenafly Historic Sites Survey, by Bergen Co. Catherine Bergh wrote, in Oct 2002: Jennie died when my grandmother Edna was 11 and her younger sister Ruth was 8. Their bachelor uncle, Edwin Peter Parcels raised them as their father, Edwin Percy Moore, left the family one-month before Ruth was born and was never heard from again. I am not entirely sure of the story, but it is not good. I subsequently discovered he had other children from a previous marriage and dalliances. During a trip to the National Archives this past summer I found that he re-enlisted (his 4th) in the Army at the time of his disappearance and was dishonorably discharged 1 month later. He subsequently moved to California and remarried....I believe he found his way into the Parcels family via Wilber as they served in the same company during the Phillipine Insurrection.

I leave to my two sons, Thomas and Rowland, so much of my lands in Bethpage Purchase as will, with the rest of the lands I have given them, make 2/3 of all my estate, and they are to pay to my daughters, Phebe Osborn and Anne Willis, £12 4s. 5d. I leave to my son John, so much land in Bethpage Purchase as to make his part of my estate 1/3. My daughter Anne is to have a place of residence in my house so long as she remains a widow. I leave to my three sons all my lands lying in common, in the Town of Hempstead, and the Plain land in (Robert) Williams Purchase in the town of Oyster Bay, and all other places. I make my wife and my brothers in law, Jacob Titus, of Wheatley, and William Titus, of Westbury, executors. Witnesses, Wait Powell, Mary Powell, Samuel Willis. I am well at present and I hope that these few lines may find you the same. Luke family is all well but Martine and himself Luke is some complaing to day. I gues it wont be much Martin is some days quite smart and then he has bad coffing spells and raise a good deal of blood then he will quite down. Caty you roate to me that you wanted to know if old grandfather Concklin was a live yet. he is not. He had died eight years last August. Unkel David Parsels he is dead and so is cusen garrett. Unkel Henry Concklin oldest son is dead fay Concklin. One of unkel Daniel sons is dead Harrison Concklin. You wanted me to let you know ware to write to your brothers sisters. Isaac he lives nere Dwight station Leivingston Co Illinoise. James live fairefield township in Lenewa Co Michagan St. Abagil live in you direct your letters to fling post off, Stuben co. Indiana St. Rebeca and myself was out to James and to unkill John Tallman in october. James gave Rebeca half a barl of sauger and we dried about a half bushel of peaches at unkil John Tallman. We was gone eleven days before we return home. James live about 65 miles from us unkel John about 50 miles. They both live in one co. we have a very dry time this fall with us . we have had two litle fluries of snow and no rain. I shall have to hold up. Uriah received two letters from you to day. Now I wrote this to you all. I shall put my likeness in this for Sary Ann. I have forgot hur sir name so I though I wold direct it to hur father more shuer to git. Write as- soon as you receive this. I like to forgot I received a letter from William H Braford last Sunday and was glad to here from you all. So no more at present

This young Dutch woman had lived with an Englishman, Jan Parcel, at the request of her husband, who himself preferred a certain Geesje Jansen. Despite these mitigating circumstances the court sentenced her to be whipped and banished. When Ytie and Jan -- "two sorrowful sinners" -- appeared two weeks later in court to ask for permission to marry, the magistrates were unrelenting and gave them three months to pack, telling them to "separate from each other at once." It is almost certain that Ytie never had to undergo the whipping. In New Netherlands -- unlike New England -- this sentence seldom got further than a symbolic flogging in the case of women, which meant that the offender was led to the stake, partly stripped, and given two rods on her hands, after which she was untied and banished."

30 Nov 1658, Sentence. Iva Dircksen, for adultery, to be conducted to the place where justice is executed, and there to witness the punishments inflicted this day, and then be banished for the term of 50 years [full details p. 1057 vol. VIII]

John Parcell (aka "John Butcher") was from Huntington County, England. He settled at Dutch Kills, L.I. Jo. Passell was living in Newtown by 26 Feb 1667 when his name appears on a list for a rate made by the Constables and Overseers of Newtown for a sessions house.

The will of John Parsell of Maspeth was dated 7 May 1677 (no probation date in Newtown Records). In it he mentions wife Judith, children Thomas, William, John & Katherin. Executors were Capt. In an affidavit, the Parcels family related that a hired man, his wife and baby lived in the stone house [at 439 Piermont Road, Closter]; on 20 Nov 1776 the hired man was working in the fields and saw the red coats coming. He rushed back to the house to tell his wife that he would ride to warn the troops at Fort Lee. The red coats are reported to have come to the dwelling, overturned the milk and smashed dishes and other household items.¹

Mary's father, Joseph Latham, in his will dated 9th day, 9th month 1747, mentioned his daughter Mary Pearsall, and named his son-in-law Nathaniel Pearsall as an executor.

In his will, he wrote: "...I, Nathaniel Pearsall, of Cow Neck, in the town of Hempstead, being this 4th day of the 8th month, called August, 1755, well in body, do make this my will." I leave to my son, Thomas Pearsall, all that land I bought of Samuel Latham and his brother, Joseph Latham. I leave to my son Robert the house and orchard that I now dwell in, beginning at the gate at the south east corner of my orchard and from thence running along below the hill to the corner of my meadow fence, to the north side of my house that Mary Dodge now lives in, and thence by the fence to the water side, Also 10 acres of woodland where my executors may think best. All of the rest of my lands on Cow Neck I leave to my executors to sell to pay debts, and that, together with my negroes and cattle and out door movables, are to be sold. I leave to my wife, Mary Pearsall, the use of the lands I have left to my sons Thomas and Robert until they come of age "to bring them up upon." "If my wife should marry again, my executors shall do the best they can with them, that is, my sons Thomas and Robert, but she is to have the use of 1/2 of the house, and pasture for two cows and one horse." I leave to my son Robert £100 when 20 years of age, and £200 when he is 21, and he is to have £60 in lieu of a negro boy that his grand father Latham gave him. I leave to my son Robert, when 21, £50, and to my wife £200. All the rest of my estate I leave to my 4 daughters, Sarah, Jane, Mary, and Hannah, when they are 18 years of age or married." My wife shall have the clock that her father gave her, and all the plate that I leave," and my wife and daughters shall divide all the rest of my indoor movables. I leave to my son Thomas my negro man John, but he is to work for my wife on the land. My wife is to have 3 cows and a horse "to help bring up the children." My daughters that remain unmarried are to have a home in my house. I leave to my sons all my other rights of land in Hempstead. I make my brother, Thomas Pearsall, of Oyster Bay, and my cousin, Israel Pearsall, and my cousin, Samuel Latham, of Cow Neck, executors. Witnesses, William Latham, William Mitchell, Mary Latham. Proved, May 18, 1758. Mary Latham being a Quaker, and "executors being duly affirmed."

Thomas Parcell was by trade a backsmith. He sold his land at Dutch Kills, L.I. on 21 June 1690 to Bourgon Broucard and Hans Covert, and removed to Great Barents Island. Parcell built a grist mill on the race at the upper side of his island.

Thomas lived on Harts Island, Pelham, Westchester Co., N.Y. The island, off the east shore of Manhattan Island, through its history was called Great Barent Island (Barren Island; Great Barnes Island); Spectacle Island; Parcell's Island; Hart's Island; Ward's Island. Spectacle, or Harts Island, was later owned by the city of New York and part of it was the city cemetery known as "Potter's Field."

The will of Thomas Pearsall "of Spectacle Island, otherwise called Harts Island situate in the Sound, in the Manor of Pelham, in the county of Westchester" was dated 20 April 1723, probated 6 April 1732. In it he mentioned wife Christian Pearsall, son Nicholas Pearsall, sons John and Henry and daughters Hannah and Eda Dobbs.

On 30 May 1702 John Wogkum conveyed to Thomas Possell 160 acres of woodland on the north west side of Staten Island near Smoking Point, with 16 acres of salt meadow, and on the same date Thomas Possell and his wife Christien sold the same property to Daniel Lake. They soon moved to New Jersey, settling on the Raritan. by Jan 1707 he was called "of Piscataway" and by June 1717 he was a resident of Woodbridge, NJ. Thomas lived at Hempstead Harbor, L.I. and was a member of the Society of Friends of Westbury, L.I.

In his will, he wrote: I, Thomas Pearsall, of the town of Hempstead, yeoman, being this 9th day of the 8th month, called August, 1759, but weak of body. I leave to my wife Sarah all my money and money due to me, and she is to pay all just debts except what I owe on bond. I leave all my wearing apparell to my sons Thomas and Samuel and to the widow of my son Nathaniel. I leave to my son Thomas "my Great Book, set out by Isaac Penington," and my half of the Still and tub. I leave to my grand son, James Mott, a horse. I leave to my wife 2 horses, and all grain, flax, and wool, and all provisions, and a negro man and woman, And she is to keep and maintain my old negro man "Jack." I leave all my printed books to my wife Sarah and my children, Susanah, Sarah Alsop, Hannah Hawkshurst, and Mary Seaman, and my daughter in law Mary, widow of my son Nathaniel. All the rest to be sold. From the money there is to be paid to my son Samuel £10, To my daughter in law, Mary Pearsall, œ10, To my grand daughter, Elizabeth Hicks, 1/5, provided her father, Benjamin Hicks, pays the money he owes to me. I leave to my son Thomas the houses, land, and buildings where I now live in Hempstead, bounded west by Hempstead Harbor, north by Jacob Mott, east by Mosquito Cove road that leads to the Plains, south by Sylvanus Townsend and Michael Mudge, and partly by the highway that leads to the landing by my house, and partly by William Kirbie's land, to Hempstead Harbor, Also a piece of woodland lying under the Harbor Hills, bounded east by Timothy Townsend, south by Michael Mudge, west by Richard Valentine. My wife is to have the best room in my house, and another room and her fire wood, and feed for her horses and 2 cows, and a sufficient piece of ground for a garden, and apples from the orchard. And my son Thomas is to pay £1,200 in 3 payments, £20 to my wife, £20 to my executors, and he is to pay the charges in the Law for the defence of my title to land. To my son Samuel £60. To Sarah, daughter of my son, Nathaniel Pearsall, £30. "My son Thomas is to have £80, to make satisfaction to him for the land I bought of George Weeks, which my son lost." My executors are to put £300 at interest for the use of my wife. I leave to my son Samuel 2 cows. To my grand daughter Jane, daughter of my son Nathaniel, £25. To my daughter in law, Mary Pearsall, for her two youngest children, Mary and Hannah, £85. Whereas I have been at great charge in bringing up my grand son, James Mott, he is to be charged for the same. I leave to my son Thomas a small piece of land lying on the east side of and near the land of Hendrick Onderdonck's mill swamp, being in partnership with Richard Valentine. "I leave to my wife Mary the use of my Clock and my Cockle sieve." I make my son Thomas, and my grand son, Israel Pearsall, and my kinsmen, Daniel Underhill, Samuel Underhill, Abraham Underhill, and Thomas Underhill, executors. Witnesses, William Kirk, Samuel Willis, Henry Burtis,

Rachel Kirke. Proved, March 5, 1760.

They probably lived in the sandstone house at what is now 639 Piermont Road, Closter, Bergen County, NJ. In 1789 the

land (34-1/2 acres) "together with all houses, outbuildings, orchards, gardens, meadows, waterways..." had been sold by Captain Aaron Gilbert to Daniel A. Vervalen to Daniel A. Vervalen. During the early years of the 19th century, the dwelling was known as the Lone Star Inn and its owners were Walter Parcels and his wife, Annetje Westervelt Parcels.²
