The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Evert Pels, a pioneer settler of New Netherland, was from Stettin, Pomerania (Germany). He was b. Stettin, about 1616 and m. 15 Dec 1641 Kingston Ref Ch, NY **Jannetje Symons Schepmoes**, dau. of Symon Groot [schepmoes?] & Rebecca Du Trieux. She was b. 1623; d. 2 Sep 1683 Kingston, NY. Some descendant families used the surname Pultz.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Caleb Pell, of the Manor of Pelham, farmer, being indisposed. I leave to my son, Caleb Pell, all that my farm and plantation of lands and salt meadows lying in East Chester town ship, and formerly belonging to my father, Thomas Pell, and where my son Caleb now lives, with all appurtenances, Reserving all the lands that lye to the west of the fence, that runs across the said farm, from the Boston road to the land now, or late, of Jonathan Archer, the use of which I give to my son, James Pell, for the space of one year, and then to my son Caleb, on condition that he pay to my executors £125, when my younger son Elijah is 18 years old, for his use. I also give to my son Caleb a negro boy and my silver watch, "and my large China Punch Bowl." I leave to my wife Mary a negro boy and woman and child, "also my stocks of Bees and all my Poultry," and all the wool that shall be sheared off my sheep this year, also my two best beds with furniture, and a mahogany tea table, and one dozen best chairs, and all linnen and kitchen utensils, and my silver plate, Looking glass, and China. I leave to my daughter, Ann Laurence, a negro girl, and a Mahogany Chest of Drawers, and a dining table and a tea table to be made for her. I leave to my daughter, Mary Rodman, a negro girl. To my daughter Bathsheba a bed and furniture; To my daughters, Euphemia and Fila [Phila], each a bed; To my son Elijah my large chest; To my wife Mary my riding chair and horse. I leave to my son James all that my farm or Plantation lands and meadows, lying in the Manor of Pelham, where I now live, and the rest of my movable estate, and he is to pay all debts, and he is to pay to my wife œ150, and he is to furnish my wife 12 good cows and sheep, and he is to provide for my daughter Phila till married. And he is to provide for my wife 30 bushels of wheat, 50 of corn, 25 pounds of "good swingled flax," a number of swine, "and cyder for herself, children, and servants that shall live with her." And she is to have the use of the west great room in my house, and two bedrooms, and chamber and garret, and use of kitchen, "and the shed where the cheese press stands." And the use of the hen house, mill house, Barracks, and Smoke house, and provision for the unmarried daughters, and he is to pay to each of my daughters £100, and to my son Elijah £500 when of age, and he is to be supported till of age. And my son James is to pay for his schooling, "and give him learning, as reading, writing and common Arithmetick, Navigation, Surveying, and bookkeeping." "In case it will suit my son Elijah to go to a Latin School, and my executors think fit to let him learn Latin, they may let him go." And my son James is to pay for his learning till he is 16, and then bind him out to a merchant. My son James is to give a bond for the performance of all these conditions. My wife is to have the use of the rest of my estate during her widowhood. My executors are to sell 5 negroes and my riding horse, and the money to be paid to my son James to help him pay legacies. I leave to my son James all my rights and improvements which I have in Phillips Upper Patent. Dated March 24, 1768. Witnesses, Joshua Pell, Jr., Gilbert Lawrence, John Bartow. I make my wife and my brothers-in-law, James Ferris and John Ferris, of Westchester, executors. Proved, April 9, 1768. (James and John Ferris were Quakers.) [NOTE.--This will is of great length, and contains very minute directions as to support of wife and daughters.]

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Mary Pell, of the Manor of Pelham, in Westchester County, widow, being of sound disposing mind. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my son, Caleb Pell, my Great Bible. "I leave to my son James one good feather bed and bedding thereunto belonging, which he now lodges in." I leave to my son Elijah one good feather bed, and a negro boy, if my son lives to be 21. "The reason I give my sons no more by this will is they having received the rest of their portion already." I leave to my daughter, Ann Van Kleeck, "the use of 6 large Table silver spoons, to be bought with my money of £8 value, so long as she lives, and then to her daughter, Mary Lawrence." I leave to my daughter, Mercy Rodman, the same number of spoons for life, and then to her daughter Charlotte. I leave to my daughter, Bathsheba Pell, 6 large silver Table spoons that I have marked C. P. M., and £10, and a Damask Table cloth. I leave to my daughter, Euphemia Pell, my silver Tankard marked C. M. P. during her life. If she leave issue she may give it to whom she pleases, but if not, then to my daugh-

ters, Bathsheba and Philena. I also give to my daughter Euphemia a pair of brass candle sticks. I leave to my daughter Helena my Silver Pint Mugg marked T. P. A. and 6 silver tea spoons, one pair of sugar tongs marked M. P., and one Mahogany Tea table, and £10, and a feather bed and furniture. I leave to my granddaughter, Mary Pell, daughter of my son Caleb, one pair of gold sleeve buttons of 40 shillings price, to be bought for her with my money, and my silver shoe buckles. I leave to my grandson, Caleb Haviland, one pair of gold sleeve buttons, 40 shillings price, My negro man, Dick, is to be sold, and may choose his master. The money to be paid to my three daughters, Bathsheba, Euphemia, and Helena, and I leave them the rest of my estate. I make my brothers, James Ferris and John Ferris, executors. Dated April 18, 1772. Witnesses, Charles Vincent, Sr., Joshua Pell, Jr., John Bartow. Proved, May 30, 1772.

In the *Paterson Intelligencer* record of their marriage, they were: Married on the 23rd of March last, by the Rev. Mr. Hendricks, Mr. Casper Pell, of Paramus, to Miss Ann Maria Ackerman of Saddle River.¹

They lived in the "Pell House" on the corner of West Saddle River and Allendale Roads in Saddle River, Bergen County, NJ. The first story of the house had been built in 1790 by John D. Ackerman, who married Leah Van Buskirk; their son, David Ackerman, married Effie Van Buskirk in 1800, and their daughter, Myra married Casper Pell.

Casper A. Pell, 43, farmer, was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township, Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near Arcola). Listed living with him were: William John Pell, 21, laborer; Eliza Augusta Pell, 13; Elizabeth Romeyne, 70 [Casper Andrew Pell's mother, who as a widow had m. (2) Rev. James Van Campen Romeyne]; and Maria Jackson, 36, black.

David Ackerman Pell had what was believed to have been consumption when he was young, and in order to be outdoors in the open, he became a drover who brought cattle from the west. He attended school in Saddle River when it was located at the site of the present Parish House of the Zion Church. He also learned the blacksmith trade from his grandfather.

David A. Pell was interested in Bergen County politics and his political career began when he was elected assessor of Hohokus Township in 1868. He was Sheriff of Bergen County, first elected in 1871 and later elected again in 1878. He also was a Surrogate Judge of Bergen County from 1883-1893 and again from 1898-1908. He was the first person not a lawyer to hold that position in Bergen County.

David A. Pell, 67, Surrogate, and Catherine A. Pell, 59, his wife, were listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living in Saddle River Borough, Bergen County, NJ, in a house they owned. Listed with them were: Katherine A. Pell, 25, Daughter, single; D. A. Pell Switzer, grandson, 6; and two servants.

In the marriage intentions, they were: Evert Everts Pels from Statijn, sailor, aged 25 years, living in Hasselaersteeg, having no parents (living in Amsterdam), accompanied by his uncle Pieter Smit, and Jannetje Sijmonsdr (Sijmon's daughter), aged 18 years, living in the same place, accompanied by her mother Claertje. 31 November 1641." Stettin was located near the mouth of the Oder River and was part of the Slavonic dukedom of western Pomerania until 1637 when it passed to Brandenburg. Today, this Baltic port is called Szczecin and lies in northwest Poland.

On 5 June 1642, Evert Pels, from Statijn, or Steltijn (Stettin, Pomerania), was engaged at Rensselaerswyck as a brewer for a term of six years, and sailed from Texel in June 1642 on *den Houutuyn* with his wife and servant. The ship also carried between 200 and 300 bushels of malt for Evert Pels. *Den Houutuyn* reached New Amsterdam 4 Aug 1642.⁵

Evert Pels built a brewery in Rensselaerswyck colony. He leased the farm formerly of Symon Walichsz on Papsance Island for 6 years. There he built a house and barn. He turned the lease over to Juriaan Bestval and Jochem Kettelheym after two years. In 1649, he leased for himself the farm formerly of Crijn Corneliez in Greenbush. He lived at Greenbush until 1661 when he removed to Esopus (Kingston). From 1649 until 1658 he leased the saw and grist mill in Greenbush. Evert Pels owned a sloop on the Hudson River and a lot on Manhattan which he sold in 1656. In 1657 he sent 2100 beaver skins down the river to New Amsterdam. At Esopus, Evert Pels with 11 others attacked the Indians camped around the Esopus stockade. This attack in 1659 brought on the raid on Esopus by 500 Indians six days later resulting in a massacre. Evert Pels was appointed one of three members of the first court in Kingston and was a Schepen or Magistrate, of Esopus in 1661 and 1662. He was appointed grain measurer in 1669. He was granted land at Kingston in 1668 and also land on the "Strand". He was member of the Coroner's Jury on Nov. 16, 1683. On Feb. 10, 1684 he was a juror. His name is on record in several law suits in the Kingston area.⁵

If any of my lands and meadows should be recovered out of my right, I leave the remainder to my two sons, Joseph and Thomas. I make my wife, Phebe, and my loving friends, John Bartow, Esq., of Westchester, Samuel Sneden, Esq., of East Chester, and John Bleecker, of New Rochelle, executors. Witnesses, Daniel Deain, Rachel Deain, Robert Rolf. Proved, before Israel Honeywell, Esq., September 28, 1752.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were: William Pell, en Elisabeth Thuyl, j.d. Van N. Yorck, beyde wonende alhier.

William Pell established a shipyard at "Golden Hill" on the East River, NYC.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...I, William Pell, of New York, "ship carpenter, being very antient and weak in body." I leave to my son Samuel 20 shillings in full for his claim as heir-at-law. I leave to my daughter Hannah, wife of William Bogert, of New York, carpenter, all my furniture and household goods. All my real estate is to be sold by my executors, of the proceeds, and all the rest of my estate, I leave 1/5 to William, Catharine, Francis, and John, the children of my son Samuel Pell, and 1/5 to each of my daughters, Gertie, Elizabeth, Deborah, and Hannah. And whereas the 2 lots now in the possession of my son in law, Simon Van Syce, are part of my estate and distinguished on a map of my estate as No. 3-4, and upon which he has built a dwelling house and made improvements at his own expense, my executors are to convey the same to him at the same price that the other lots sell for. I make my daughter Deborah, and my sons in law, Simon Van Syce, Johannes Meyer, and William Bogert and my friends, Richard Waldron, baker, and Samuel Pell, cordwainer, executors. Dated July 17, 1745. Witnesses, Cornelius Tiebout, Cornelius Beekman. Proved, May 22, 1747. [NOTE.--William Pell owned several lots near the south-east corner of the Beekman Farm, at the corner of Fulton and Pearl streets.--W. S. P.]

William Pell lived in New York City until his retirement, then moved to Midland Township (now Paramus). He was the captain of the ship *Columbus* of the Royal Philippine Co. of Madrid.

He lived in NYC until his retirement; then moved to Paramus, NJ.
