The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Elie Pelletreau and Marie Benoit were both from Bourg et Paroisse d'Arces en St. Onge, France.

5 April 1710 -- Pater Machett of New York City, mariner, son and heir of John Machett of New Rochelle, shipwright, dec'd., and Lydia his wife, to Elie Pelltreau of ye city aforesaid, tallow chandler; land in New Rochelle. (Westchester Liber D, Land Records, p. 86)<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: ...This first day of March, in the year of Our Lord God, 1728. I, Elie Pelletreau, of the city of New York, shop keeper, being in good health of body and of sound mind, ...my body I recommend to the earth, to be therein buried in a decent and Christian like manner. I give and bequeath unto Mary Pelletreau, one of the daughters of my son, John Pelletreau, late of New York, joyner, deceased, the sum of £15, when of lawful age, or at the day of her marriage. I bequeath to Elizabeth Pelletreau, another of the daughters of my son, John Pelletreau, the like sum of £15. I leave to John Maury [Manny?], the son of John and Jane Maury, £15, and to his brother, James Maury, £15. I bequeath to my son, Benjamin Pelletreau, all that my Garden spot or parcell of land, in the north ward of the city of New York, and now in my own occupation and possession, if he shall arrive at lawful age. But if he shall die before he comes of lawful age then it shall be sold by my executors. I leave to my daughter-in-law, Elizabeth Pelletreau, widow of my late son, Elias Pelletreau, 1/4 of estate after payment of debts. And to my son, Francis Pelletreau, 1/4. To my son, Paul Pelletreau, 1/4, and 1/4 to my son Benjamin, if he come to lawful age, but if not, then his share is to be divided among my daughter-in-law, Elizabeth Pelletreau, and my sons, Francis and Paul Pelletreau, and John and James Maury [Manny]. I appoint my daughter-in-law, Elizabeth Pelletreau, and my sons, Francis and Paul Pelletreau, executors. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal in New York, the day and year above written. Elie Pelletreau. Witnesses, Henry Vanderspiegel, Daniel Bonticou, Edward Pennant. Proved, March 6, 1730. [NOTE.--Elie Pelletreau was one of the sons of Paul Pelletreau, and was a native of Arces in Xaintonge, France, and with other Huguenots fled from Roman Catholic persecution, and came to this country in 1686. His son Francis settled in Southampton, Long Island. From Paul Pelletreau are descended the families of the name now living in Brooklyn. Benjamin, the youngest son, probably died when a young man. The place in the north ward of New York where Elie Pelletreau lived is now No. 30 Spruce street, he bought these lots from Henry Brughman, 1717.]

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Francis Pelletreau, of Southampton, in Suffolk County, being indisposed at present in my body, but in sound and perfect mind. First. All those debts and duties as I do owe in right or conscience to any manner of persons are to be satisfied and paid. I leave to my brother, Paul Pelletreau, £12. To Jane Ronalds, £8. I leave to my son, Elias Pelletreau, all my lands, buildings, and commonage, also my watch, sword, and gun, and my best bed and furniture. I leave to my daughter, Hannah Pelletreau, £150, and a bed and furniture, and my best chest of drawers, and the chany (china) that is on them, and my great looking-glass with the things about it. I leave to my wife, Mary Pelletreau, 1/2 of the rest of my movable estate, and to my son Elias, the other half. I leave to my daughter Hannah "18 of the best pewter plates, and 6 pewter dishes, two large and two small, and two midling ones." If my children should both die without issue, I leave my estate to my brother, Paul Pelletreau, and to the children of my brother, Elias Pelletreau, deceased. "It is my will that my executors do improve that part of my estate given to my children to the best of their discretion, for the bringing of them up to good education and for their interest." I make my true and loving friends, Abraham Halsey, John Mackie, and my wife Mary, executors. Dated March 11, 1736/7, in the 10 year of King George II. Witnesses, Hugh Gelston, Joseph Pierson, Jonathan Pierce. Proved before Brinley Silvester, January 18, 1737/8. [NOTE.--Francis Pelletreau lived in the village of Southampton, on the present homestead of Josiah Foster. He was a son of Elie Pelletreau, and was born in New York, about 1696. Married Jane, widow of Richard Osborne, September 16, 1721. Their only son, Elias Pelletreau, was born May 31, 1726. Jane Pelletreau died September 6, 1733, aged 38. Francis Pelletreau married Mary King, widow of Joseph King, of Southold, September 4, 1734. Their only child, Hannah, was born November 12, 1735. Francis Pelletreau went to London, to undergo a surgical operation, and died in St. Thomas's Hospital, September 26, 1737. His son Elias was the great grandfather of William S. Pelletreau.]

Jean Pelletreau and his brother Paul were natives of Arces, in the Province of Xaintonge, France. Paul died in France. Jean Pelletreau came to America with his two nephews, Jean and Elie, the sons of Paul in 1686.

Jean Pelletreau born at Arse [Arces] in Saintonge, Magdalen (Vincent), his wife born at St. Martin's, and Elie Pelletreau (his nephew) were naturalized in New York, September 27th, 1687.<sup>1</sup>

In her will, Magdalena Pelletreau of New Rochelle, alias Vincent, widow of Jean Pelletreau, mentions nephew Elias Pelletreau and to his son John Pelletreau my plantation at New Rochelle with houses, etc. Mentions niece Magdalena, daughter of Elias Pelletreau; nephew John Pelletreau; niece Esther David (alias Vincent); her brother John Vincent, her sister Esther David; the children of her brother Francis Vincent. Makes brothers John and Francis Vincent, and brother-in-law John David,

executors. Dated 2 June 1701, probated 20 Sep 1702 (Westchester Co., Liber 7, p. 6).
