The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Daniel Perrin set sail on board the "Philip," in April, 1665, from a port of the Isle of Jersey, under the command of Governor Philip Carteret, and arrived at New York Harbor on July 29, 1665. Governor Carteret brought over with him in the ship 'Philip' eighteen male servants, belonging to Sir George [Carteret] and himself, a portion of whom were Frenchmen,--probably, from the Isle of Jersey,--John de Jardin, Doctr Rowland, Claude Vallotte, Richd Pewtinger, Richard Mitchell, Richard Skinner, Wm. Hill, Henry Hill, Erasmus House, John Taylor, John Clarck, Wm. (???), Claude Barbour, Charles Seggin, Danl. Perrin, John Mittius, Robert Wallis, John, alias Peter, besides several others, the same time imported, and many others since." (East Jersey Records. Whitehead. iii e. 0 30; N. J. Archives, 1st Series, Vol. 21, p. 47.) Among the female servants on board the same ship was Maria Thorel, soon to be Daniel's wife.

Daniel Perrin lived on the Elizabethtowne Plantations, in New Jersey, the site which became Elizabeth, and Elizabethport, NJ. After their marriage, Daniel and Maria removed to Staten Island, on a tract of land granted him by the English Governor, Benjamin Fletcher. This was on the western shore of Staten Island, opposite Elizabethtowne, at a place then called Smoking Point. Smoking Point was the first point of land extending out into Staten Island Sound, southwesterly from the place now known as Rossville. It was first mentioned as Smoking Point in the State Land Papers (Albany, N. Y.) on April 5, 1684.

On March 1st, 1687-8, Paul Richards, merchant of NYC, gave Daniel Perrin a mortgage on this tract of 80 acres of land for the sum of £50. Boundaries cited for the land included: on east side Clauss Smith; on west by land formerly belonging to Martin Hardwin.

To perfect, or ensure, his title to this land, on May 16, 1695, a Grant was issued from the Crown to Daniel Perrin, of this same 80 acres, confirming him in the full possession thereof. On March 19, 1696, we find the record of a conveyance of this same tract of 80 acres by Daniel Perrin and Elizabeth, his wife, to one Rquea Pepane Le flore.

In the Marriage Bond his name is spelled "Paranque."

His Will was dated Nov. 13, 1748, proved Dec. 13, 1748. In it, he wrote: ...I, Daniel Perrine, of the County of Richmond, being sick. All my movable estate is to be disposed of and divided among my wife and children. My wife is to have a share and a half, and my eldest son is to have 10 shillings more than the rest (names of wife and children not given). Dated November 13, 1748. Witnesses, Daniel Lake, Benjamin Britton, Peter Pullen. James Guion and William Walton, executors. Proved, December 13, 1748.

Inventory of estate, dated Nov. 25, 1748, amounted to £877.7.6, in personalty, a large amount for that period, real estate was not included in inventory.

Peter Perine lived and died at New Dorp, Staten Island. On May 1, 1713, he bought a tract of about 400 acres on the Raritan River in then Monmouth Co., N. J., from John Hampton. (Ibid, vol. 21, p. 33; East Jersey Rec., Liber A2, p. 316.)

On June 5, 1717, he sold 300 acres on the Raritan River to David Besset. (See East Jersey Records, Liber A. 2, p. 319.) On May 28, 1740, Peter Perine, of Richmond Co., conveyed to his son, Peter Perine, of Perth Amboy, N. J., a piece of land on Matchaponix Creek, Middlesex Co., N. J. Witness to deed was William Perine. (Liber F 2, of deeds, p. 108, Trenton.) On Dec. 17, 1741, William Perine, of Perth Amboy, N. J., conveyed a piece of land, adjoining the above piece, being the same as conveyed to him on May 27, 1740, by Peter Perine. John and Peter Perine witnesses to deed. (Liber F 2, of deeds, p. 95, Trenton.)

In 1715 Peter Perine was a member of Captain James Poillon's South Company of Colonial Troops, Richmond County, N. Y.

In his will, he wrote: March 10, 1752. I, Peter Perine, of Richmond County, being in good health. "My wife Mary is to have that part of my real estate, as long as she lives, as the Law directs," and the use of the east room in my house, and the bed and furniture for the room, and two cows, and fire wood, and the use of £125. I leave to my son Peter my silver hilted sword. To my son James £40. To my daughter Mary, wife of Thomas Arrowsmith, £50. To my daughter Margaret, wife of John Poillon, £50. These to be paid by my son Henry. To my daughter Sarah, wife of John See, £50. To my daughter Dinah, wife of Thomas Lee, £50, to be paid by my son Edward. I leave to my two youngest sons, Henry and Edward, all my real estate on Staten Island, having formerly disposed of my lands in Middlesex County, East New Jersey, to my sons Peter and William. My son Henry is to have the east part of my farm with the buildings, and he is to pay to my son Edward £30 towards building and improvements. I leave to my son Henry a gun, and a horse and saddle. I leave to my son Edward my long gun, and a horse and saddle. I leave to my three grand children, Nicholas, Ann, and Mary Britton, each £10. All the rest to my children, Peter, William, James, Mary Arrowsmith, Margaret Poillon, Sarah See, Dinah Lee, and the children of Daniel Perine. My executors are to sell personal estate at public vendue, except my apparell, which I give to my sons Peter, William, and James. I make Thomas Arrowsmith, John Poillon, John Lee, of Somerset, and Henry Perine, executors. Witnesses, Daniel Stillwell, Isaac Mone, John Mesereau. Proved, November 29, 1756.
