The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Daniel Perry owned property, with a grist and saw mill, crossed by East Saddle River Road at a location now partly in Ridgewood and partly in Ho-Ho-Kus, Bergen Co., NJ. He continued the milling business until his death. The homestead and mill property were sold by son Daniel in 1849, and Sarah, Daniel's widow, may have moved to Wisconsin with son Daniel in that same year.

11 Nov 1659 -- Madeleen Jans [wifer of Hendrick Jansen Spier], pltf. v/s Aafje Leenders, deft. Pltf. demands from deft. thirty guilders balance of rent remaining due. The Court order the pltf. to get her husband's procuration, or her husband must come himself. Aafje Leenders requests, that the goods taken last year from her house and brought in deposit of this City may be again taken by her. Whereupon, she was informed by the Court, that order should be taken thereupon. The Court resolved to sell such goods and to deposit proceeds thereof with the City. The Schout requests, inasmuch as the goods brought from Jan Perie's house and removed to the City Hall of this City, have remained there one year and six weeks, that they be sold for the benefit of the creditors or heirs, the proceeds to be brought in deposit of this City, until it shall be determined who is entitled thereto. The Court appoint Pieter Rudolfus and Mr. Jacob Vuges in the presence of the Schepen Cornelis Steenwyck, as curators of the monies proceeding from Jan Perie's good brought in deposit to the City Hall of this City.¹

10 Feb 1660 -- Pieter Rudolfus and Mr. Jacob Hugues appear in Court, requesting whereas they have been appointed in the presence of Schepen Cornelis Steenwyck, as curators over the deposited chest with *Krett* (?) and the beaver coat of Jan Perier, that they may take the same home and sell them for the benefit of those having jusy claims thereon. Burgomasters and Schepens grant the petitioners their request providing they comply with the demand of the Heer Schout de Sille, dated 11 November 1659.¹

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their (2) banns and marriage, they were: John Perry, Wedr. Van Marie Thomas, en Sara Jans, j.d. Van de Gujanes, beyde woonende alhier.

John Perry speculated in land in New Jersey. In "Patents and Deeds...of New Jersey 1664-1703" (edited in 1899 by William Nelson), on 1 Oct 1696 John Hooke sold to John Pike, gentleman; William Vaughan, Merchant; and John Perry, gentleman -- all of Tipperary County, Ireland -- five eighths of a share [of land] in West Jersey.³

On 22 Sep 1697 John Pike of Widdngstone, gent.; William Vaughan of Clonmell, merchant; and John Perry of Knocklofty, all in the County of Tipperary, Ireland, to Jeremiah Basse and Samuel Jenings, to take up and improve the land belonging to five eighths of a share of land in West Jersey bought of John Hooke.³

On 30 Oct 1699 Joshua Barkstead, by warrant for John Pike, William Vaughan and John Perry, [bought] 6,250 acres on the Delaware River, above the Falls, part of Dr. Coxe's 20,000 acres, over against a small island along Coxe's line.³

John Perry and his second wife moved to the Tappan area of Orange County (now Rockland) before 1702, in which year they were included in the census with one son and three daughters. John Perry was Sheriff of Orange County from 1702-1706.

Jan Pieterszen had adopted the name of Staats before 1697, when his name is found "Jan Pieterszen Staets," as a witness at Brooklyn. John Perry purchased land in the Kakiat Patent in 1749 from John McEvers, and inherited a large part of lot 9 of the Kakiat Patent, along with a grist mill (which he had operated with his father). His interest in the Kakiat lots ceased when he sold lot 1 to his brother Jacobus, and sold the mill property to Mabie in 1773. He purchased other lands on the east side of the Hackensack River, opposite the former family mill property and later in Scheurclaw (NY), Orangetown (NY), and Old Tappan (NJ).

They lived at Old Tappan, NJ in a sandstone house (later whitewashed), on the road between Tappan and Pearl River or Van Houten's Mills. The house came to be known as the "Judge Perry House" and was still standing after 1900.

John Perry was appointed a Judge of the Common Pleas Court of Orange County prior to the Revolutionary War.

James Perry, Esq., of Orangetown, son of the decedent, was granted Letters of Administration on the Estate of John Perry, Apr. 20, 1809. From the minutes: The widow of John Perry is dead; James Perry is the only son of John Perry.

John D. Perry had a grist mill on the west side of Pascack Brook a short distance south of today's Grand Avenue. It was near what is now Mill Road in Park Ridge, Bergen Co., NJ, on the north end of what is now Electric Light Pond. The mill was built by Perry and was in operation before 1796. After his death and that of his wife, the mill was inherited by their former servant, Caesar Thompson, sometimes called Caesar Perry, who sold it in 1849.²

John D. Perry's homestead stands on the west corner of Mill Road and Grand Avenue, at 119 Mill Road, Park Ridge, Bergen Co., NJ.

One record also mentions that John D. Perry had a tannery on the east side of the Pascack Brook, opposite the Pascack Cemetery.¹

Magdalena Perry, widow of John D. Perry, dated her will 5 Oct 1835 and it was probated 1 Feb 1848 (Bergen F:427). In her will she left to her colored servant "now living with me, the homestead farm where I now live, devised to me by my late husband, with all of the houses, outhouses, barns, hovels, grist mill and 25 acres." This was bounded on the north by a public road, south by lands of Gen. Garret Ackerson, across the Pascack Brook to land of Jacob I. Blauvelt, east by Blauvelt's land. Personal estate to Cezar and his brother Thomas Thompson and their sister Sarah Williams. Her executors were her friends John I. Blauvelt, Daniel Smith and John P. Perry.¹
