The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Petit, Pettit

Members of this Huguenot family settled early in Newtown, L.I., NY. About 1742, six brothers, Jonathan, Amos, John, Nathaniel, Isaac, and Charles, came to Sussex County and Warren County, NJ. Johnathan Pettit settled in Hardwick; Amos in Brighton; John in Newton; Nathaniel in Newton, and Isaac and Charles in Newton.

Isaac and Charles, during the Revolutionary War, were royalists and moved to Canada.

 (The SS Rochambeau arrived in New York on February 28, 1919, bringing troops home.) He enlisted in the Army on June 27, 1916 in New York. He served in Co. A 102nd Engr. Div. 27 and served overseas from May 17, 1918 until his death. The person notified of his death was his wife, Gabrielle Smith and the address listed was 134 W. 15 St., NYC. On September 15, 1920, Jessie Pettit applied for a Victory Medal on behalf of her son, George W. Smith. In the application it states he participated in the Somme Offensive in France.
 George W. Pettit fathered an illegitimate child with a woman named Edna Bogert. This child, b. 5 July 1909 NYC was a daughter, adopted by Robert Mowerson & Ursula Ackt (the child was Sandy Van Benschoten's mother). Jessie had sent George "out of the country" when she found out about his affair with Mrs. Edna Bogert. He was still Pettit when he returned on January 24, 1910 (aboard the "Bermudian" from Hamilton, Bermuda) and he was still Pettit at the time of his child's adoption in July of 1910.
 At the time of the 1920 census, Gabrielle Smith, widow, was living in Los Angeles. Born in Belgium, as were her parents, her language was French, theirs was Flemish. She was a privately employed tutor.

The 1899 Statistical and Historical Directory of Jeff. Co. lists George Pettit as owner of 220 acres in Rock Creek Twp. The 1899 Jeff. Co. Atlas shows Geo. Pettit est. as owner of land 2 miles directly north of Rock Creek village. Since he had died prior to this time, the land ownership appears to still be in his name. This land is in Section 16, Twp. 9, Range 17. The Santa Fe railroad was along the E. boundary of his property. By the 1916 Atlas, the land ownership was then listed as D. E. Council, so had moved from that location.¹

From Jefferson County Tribune, 16 September 1910 -- Death -- Mrs. Harriett Pettit was born in Long Island, N.Y. and died at son's residence near Ozawkie, Kan., Sept.4, 1910, age 74 years, 5mo. 4 days. She was married to George T. Pettit in Ill. and moved to Kansas in the early 60's near Valley Falls, Jefferson Co., where she has since resided. To them were born two sons and four daughters of whom three are living, one daughter, Mrs. Jennie Miller, Topeka, Kas., two sons J.W. Pettit of Topeka, Kas., H.T. Pettit of Ozawkie township. She united with the United Brethren church a number of years ago. The funeral was held from her son's residence north east of Ozawkie Tuesday morning, September 6, 1910, Rev.F.M. Testerman, pastor of the united brethren church at Meriden officiating and interment was at Valley Falls, Kas.

Nathaniel Pettit purchased 800 acres at the falls of the Delaware, comprising ground on which the New Jersey State Capitol at Trenton now stands. He moved from the falls of the Delaware probably around 1692. This area was called "Little worth."

As a Quaker, Nathaniel Pettit refused to take the Oath of Allegiance on September 13, 1673. This is the first record of the "Pettit" name with the Society of Friends (Quakers).
