The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Peterson. The ancestor of the Peterson Family of Bergen and Rockland Counties was Claes Pieterse, or Pieterszen, a patronymic meaning Nicholas, son of Peter. He was b. about 1680 and was a “young man” from Hamburg, when he married, 5 February 1701 at New York, Catalina Andries “young woman” from New York.

Hamburg, Germany was a port from which people embarked to America from different places of origin in Europe. This may have been the birthplace of Claes, or just his place of residence before leaving. — Durie, Howard, The Kakiat Patent, p. 199.

In her will, she wrote: ...[I], Sarah Van Gelder, late Sarah Peterson, widow, to my sons, John Peterson, Cornelius Peterson, Peter Peterson so much money as will purchase each a complete suit of mourning; all the remainder of my estate to my seven children, John, Cornelius, Peter and Sarah, wife of Tunis Kranck, Mary, wife of William Waterhouse, Elizabeth, wife of John Payne and Nelly, wife of Abraham Preshler, to be equally divided among them. I am not indebted to any of my children except my son Peter for board; I order my executors not to allow any claims that may be brought by any of them against my estate, except the balance due to my son, Peter; if any of my daughters should die before a division of my estate is made the share of the one so dying shall be put out at interest by my executors for the benefit of the child or children of the one so dying. I appoint my sons, John and Cornelius Peterson executors. Dated September 22, 1798. Witnesses Peter McCarlen, Thomas Dawson, Peter Peterson. Proved, March 19, 1799.

On 14 March 1678, Adam Peterson took up land on which Middletown (in New Castle County) now stands. He died in 1741 and left two sons Andrew and Adam and a daughter Hermania, who married -?- [Matthias? handwritten into text] Van Bebber.⁴

Adam Peterson was executor of the will of Dirk Williams, dated 27 Feb 1686, probated 10 Aug 1686 (Book A, p. 75). In his will Dirk Williams mentioned wife Funcha and children (not named).²

In his will, dated 6 Dec 1702, probated 17 Feb 1702 (Book B, p. 279), Peterson, Adam. Newcastle on Delaware. December 6, 1702. Children Garrett, Adam, Andrew, Armentie, Eleanor and Elizabeth. Brother and sister Isaac and Eletic Vigerou. Executors: Sons Garrett and Andrew.¹ In his will he bequeathed his home plantation of 300 acres to his eldest son Garrat, 100 acres to his "little boy Adam Peterson." The rest of his land to be divided among his other children, Andrew, Armentie, Elenor and Elizabeth. He mentioned "y loving brother and didter Isaac Vigerou and Eleice Vigerou."³

In 1850 they purchased 2 acres on the east side of River Vale Road in River Vale, Bergen Co., NJ, at the southwest corner of the small farm owned by Joseph J. Blauvelt in lot 7 of the Kakiat Patent, which he had bought in 1838 from John A. Demarest. They made their home at this location (now #220 River Vale Road), until the property was sold to James P. Collignon in 1868.

He listed his occupation as "chair maker" in Jan 1852.¹ He gave his occupation as "mason" in May 1855.¹ After his death in 1871, she lived in Jersey City, NJ.

They were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Washington Township: Albert A. Peterson, 37, mason; Maria Peterson, 23; Mary M. Peterson, 7; Joseph Peterson, 3.

Albert Peterson, 54, mason, b. NJ was listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed with him were: John Henry Peterson, 17, laborer, b. NJ; Jane Ann Peterson, 15, b. NJ; and Charity Peterson, 10, b. NJ.

Claes & Catalina moved to Tappan by 17 Jan 1705, when they joined the Tappan church (she under the name of Jonckbloedt). Claes and Catalina were soon followed by her parents, who joined the Tappan Church in Oct 1708. Claes and Catalina probably moved to Tappan because of family ties with those already making their homes there: Catalina's mother

was a sister of Grietje Cosyns who married Jan Pieterse Haring and Daniel DeClark, two of the Tappan patentees. Cornelius Cosyns, son of their brother Garret, married Deborah Perry. Catalina's sister Vrouwtje, who married Jan Adrianse, also settled at Tappan.

Claes Pieterse became a tenant farmer on land in the Tappan Patent, but there is no evidence that he ever purchased any real estate there. was a member of the Orange Co. Militia in 1715. By 1727 he was living in the Closter, Bergen Co., N.J. area.

The family name changed from Pieterszen or Van Wesel to Bras by the third generation.

Hendrick Pieterszen Van Duisberg and his wife Geertje Everts arrived about 1638. They lived in Flatbush.¹

On 7 April 1692, his sons and stepsons participated in the following transaction: To all Christian people to whom these presents shall come we peter Hendrickse belonging to fflatbush in Kings County with my brothers viz. William Brimasson, Brinase Hendrickson Brist, Evert Hendrickson, Rutt Brimasson and Harman Hendrickse Brisse, Walter Brimsey and Garrett Hendrickse Brissa sendeth greeting, Know yee that we the above said peter Hendrickson, William Brimase, Hendrickson Bristes, Evert Hendrickson, Rutt Brimason, & Harman Hendrickson Brisse, Walter Brimasse and Garrett Hendrickson Brissa

for severall reasons and Causes us and all of us thereunto moving but more Especially for a valuable satisfacon to us in hand payd by Garrett Coertee [Van Voorhees] of fflatlands in Kings County abovesd. Have given granted covenanted alienated released Enfeofed Bargained made over and sould and doe by these presents acknowledge to have from us and Every of us above Named our heyres Executors administrators and assignes given granted Covenanted alienated released Enfeoffed Bargained made over and sold unto the abovesd. Garrett Coerte his heyres Executors administrators and assignes; A certaine dwelling house standing and being in the towne of fflatlands in the County aforesd. with a parcell of land lying & belonging thereto Containing twenty six acres more or less, being bounded on the sides thereof East & west by the lands of the sd. Garrett Coerten, the sd. land being within the bounds thirteen morgans or in English twenty six acres more or less, as alsoe twenty acres of upland lying in the neck being butted & bounded as ffolloweth, on the south of John Peterson, and on the north by Rutt Brimassen, and bounded on the west by the Common roade to fflatlands, & East by the undivided lands with one allotmt. of meadow lying and being in a place Commonly knowne by the name of friezen hooke, being alsoe bounded as ffolloweth , on the East by John Peterson and on the west by John sivensye, & at the south End by the Creeke & north by the upland, we say that that we the partyes above Named peter Hendrickson, William Brimassen Brimas, Hendrickson Brissa, Evert Hendrickson, Rutt Brimassen and Harman Brissa, Walter Brimsay & Garrett Hendrickse Brissay, have as abovesd. sold as abovesd. unto the abovesd. Garrett Coerte we doe owne now to be in the right & givethe possession of all & Every the premises abovesd., and the same to have and to hold occupy possess & Enjoy for Ever as his or their owne proper right of Inheritance without fraud or hindrance in Confirmacon whereof we the partyes above named doe subscribe our names & sett to our seales this seventh day of Aprill in the fourth year of the Reigne of our soverigne Lord & Lady King William and Queen Mary, & in the year of our lord Christ one thousand six hundren and nynety two. For full text and au-

thorities, see Chronology."¹

"The last reference to this bouwery found in the Dutch records is in the grant to Annetje Jans of the farm on the north side, July 4, 1654. The 'Post and Rail fence', on the north side of the 'Company's land', is there recited to have been 160 rods long from the road to the river. It was really less than 120 rods long."¹

On 3 Nov. 1661, "before the board appeared Teunis Cray who produced a bill against the widow of Hendrick Pietersen van Hasselt for board and attendance given to her during time said widow was living with him." In December 1661, "Tryntje van Campen says that there are due her from the widow of Hendrick Pietersen van Hasselt, 27 fl.--," etc. "---Whereas Grietje Adams, widow of Hendrick Pietersen van Hasselt---, etc." (Colonial History of New York, 1853)²

Laurens Pietersen, from Toonsberg, in Norway, was in New Amsterdam as early as 1639, when his name appears in the following document: Roeloff Roeloffsen, in his will, wrote: 16 July 1639. "...I, Roloff Roeloffsen, lying sick in bed, yet being in full possession and having the full use of his mind and memory, as was apparent to us...Proceeding now to the disposal of his property, means and effects, together with his earned monthly wages and other profits and gains, he, the testator above named, bequeaths, devises and leaves them to **Laurens Pietersz** from Tonsback [a seaport town of Norway] on Condition that he shall pay twenty-four guilders to Hans Noorman for the service which he is rendering him in his sickness, and this in recompense for his brotherly services and kindness which the testator has received from the aforesaid Laurens Pietersz, his legatee; he, the testator, desiring that after his decease his property shall belong in free ownership to the said Laurens Pietersz, who shall have power to dispose thereof according to his pleasure...¹

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their banns, they were "Laurens Pieters, j.m. van Tonsbergen in Noordwegen, en Annette Pieters, j.d., Van Brutsteen in Duijtslant."

On 10 March 1660, Laurens Pieters petitioned for the appointment of guardians and curators over his minor child. On 20 Jan 1661 a petition from the guardians of Laurens Pietersen's children for instructions in regard to the division of the estate. On 10 March 1661 Laurens Pieters gave his consent to the payment of her portion of the estate to his daughter Engeltje, shortly after her marriage to Jan van Cleef.

Emanuel Peterson was alleged to have been a slave of Peter Minuet, the first director-general of the Dutch West India Co. Emanuel Peterson, married to Dorothy D'Angola (aka Etory or Retory; aka Clara Creole), the widow of Paulo D'Angola, received confirmation of the 6-acre Paulo D'Angola property from Gov. Nicolls 18 Oct 1667.

Both Anthony Van Angola and Lucie D'Angola died soon after the 1643 birth of their son, Anthony Van Angola, and he was adopted by his godmother **Dorothy D'Angola**. At age 18, on 21 Mar 1661 he was declared "born free" and given a certificate of freedom, due to a petition filed by his adopted mother and her husband, **Emanuel Peterson**. The son, on 19 Oct 1667, received confirmation of the ground-brief of 1644 to his father.

Peter Stuyvesant issued a ground-brief to Solomon Pieters (son of Pieter Santomee) date of which was not found in the record. In Liber Patents II: 123, Richard Nicolls, Governor, confirmed the patent on 16 October 1667 as "Parcell No. 4." Apparently this property devolved to William Smith of Orange Co. and Maria his wife as indicated in a conveyance to Garrit Onckelbagg, Silversmith in a deed dated 2 October 1721 which cited that it was "Heretofore possessed peaceably by their Grant (sic) father Solomon, free Negro, dec'd." This was one of a number of the "Negro Lots" along the west side of the Bouwery Road between Prince Street and Astor Place which were taken from the Wouter van Twiller plantation when it reverted to the Dutch government. These were all Stuyvesant ground-briefs, but the negroes had been there for a long time before the patents were issued. Solomon Peters, by 1697 deemed to be "one of the most capable men in the city" had bought all of lot 6 and part of lot 7.—"Abstracts on Early Black Manhattanites" in NYG&BR July 1985, p. 171.

Santomee's surname would seem to indicate that he may have come from Sao Tome or Sao Thome (St. Thomas) a Portuguese island in the Gulf of Guinea off the West African coast. His known sons were Lucas, a physician; and Solomon, the first patentee of the John Horn farm. Solomon had a grandson, William Smith of Orange County, N.Y., who with his wife Maria conveyed the property of his ancestor to Garret Onckelbagg, a silversmith, on 2 October 1721.—"Abstracts on Early Black Manhattanites" in NYG&BR July 1985, p. 173.

"But in case she should happen to dye," then to my four daughters. "But I would have it to be understood, that it is so long as she continues in the single state of widowhood; But if she marries, she is to have one-half and the rest to my children. I leave to my four sons, all my iron tools and implements of husbandry, and all my guns, swords, pistols, and the like. I leave to my eldest son £4, and to the rest of my sons, 18s each." I make my wife and John Echerson, and John Clapp, executors. Witnesses, John Hendricksen Brevoort, Isaac Lanser, Vincent De Lamontagne. Proved, June 11, 1724. [Solomon Peters was probably one of the free negroes who had small tracts of land in what was then the far outskirts of the city. The lands mentioned are probably a part of what was afterward the Bayard farm and lands adjoining.]

Solomon Pieters was one of the group of Jews transported from Brazil to New Amsterdam in 1654. This group of Jews was deemed, by the court, liable for unpaid freight to the sailors who brought them to New Amsterdam, and their goods were ordered sold at vendue to pay the freight due of the whole group. Solomon Pieters appeared in court in the autumn of 1654 as attorney for Rycke Nounes/Nunes.

26 Oct 1654 -- Solomon Pieters appeared in Court, and exhibited a declaration from the attorney of the Sailors, relative to the balance of the freight of the Jews, promising to wait until the arrival of the ahips from *Patria*. Wherefore he requests to receive the monies still in the Secratry's hands for Rycke Nunes, whose goods were sold, over and above her own freight-debt, in order to obtain with that money, some support for her. Whereupon was endorsed: Petitioner Solomon Pieters as At-torney, was permitted to take, under Secueity, the monies in the Secretary's hands.
