The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Rev. Ithamar Pillsbury began his ministerial labors here [Smithtown?, Long Island] September 9, 1827, and was installed April 21, 1830. He was a native of New Canaan, N. H., graduated at Yale in 1822, and married Mary Mix of New Haven, who died April 16, 1837, aged fifty-three. The following year he married Caroline, daughter of James Miller, formerly of this town. His dismissal took place April 17, 1833, and after spending some time in different places upon the island, he removed with a few other adventurers, and commenced the settlement of Andover, in the state of Illinois, where he was installed April 17, 1841.<sup>6</sup>

Andover, Illinois' founding father the Rev. Ithamar Pillsbury narrowly escaped death in the War of 1812, an experience that convinced him to become a minister. He founded Andover in 1835; his wife planned to join him in 1837, but she died before she could make the trip.

The Samuel Nichols family moved from Long Island to Illinois following Reverend Ithamar Pillsbury. Ithamar Pillsbury was the first Presbyterian minister in Western Illinois (Henry County), and founder of the Andover Colony in Illinois. He also helped organize the Swedish Lutheran Church in Andover. He was, in 1855, president of McDonough college.

In 1835 a rumor was spread through Connecticut and Massachusetts that the Catholics were colonizing the fertile Mississippi valley with the intention of founding a Catholic hierarchy there, and a movement was inaugurated with the object of sending out Protestant colonies and settlements to counteract the Catholic movement. A stock company was organized in Wethersfield, Conn. for this purpose, the Rev. Caleb Tenney, of Wethersfield, and the Rev. Gardner Spring of New York, being among the leaders of the enterprise. Col. Sylvester Blish joined the Wethersfield company, which was called "The Connecticut Association." A fund raised, and in 1836, Col. Sylvester Blish, Elizur Goodrich and Rev. Ithamar Pillsbury were chosen to proceed west and purchase lands. Rev. Ithamar Pillsbury was not a member of the association, but had been in the west the preceding year, in the interest of another similar association, so that his experience was valuable. Elizur Goodrich was a surveyor. They went to Illinois, a trip that was not without considerable hardship at that time. Mr. Goodrich became discouraged by the vastness and seeming endlessness of the prairies, but Col. Blish, encouraged by the zeal and hopefulness of Mr. Pillsbury, pushed the work to a completion.<sup>1</sup>

The Andover colony in Henry Co., IL, was organized early in the year 1835, in the City of New York (called the New York Land Co./Organization), and Rev. Ithamar Pillsbury, and Messrs. Slaughter and Pike were commissioned to select the loca-

tion, which was done in the following summer. Several settlers came shortly afterwards, and the association built a mill, which occasioned many people to go there from great distances....Andover was laid out by Eben Townsend, E. A. Mix and Ithamar Pillsbury, Trustees of the Colony, December 29, 1841....Cambridge was laid out June 16, 1843, by the County Commissioners. Pillsbury's Addition was laid out by Ithamar Pillsbury, Dec. 22, 1851. Pillsbury's Second Addition was laid out by Edward P. Pillsbury, Aug. 13, 1867.<sup>2</sup>
