The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He was a general contractor.

At the time he registered for the WW I draft (1917-1918) he was single and lived at 2 Jones St., Arlington, NY.<sup>2</sup>

Sometime in or after 1922, Florence L. Storms, widow, sold the house at 723 West Crescent Avenue to Harry James Pinckney and Neva Pinckney, his wife.

Crescent Avenue, Dwelling 133, Family 135 -- Pinckney, Harry J., Head, owne home valued at \$10,000, age 37, married at age 24, b. NY, his parents b. NY, Carpenter, Building; [Pinckney], Neva, Wife, age 36, married at age 23, b. NY, her parents b. NY; [Pinckney], Thelma, daughter, age 10, b. NJ.

On 29 Sep 1969 (Hackensack 5369: 269) an easement was conveyed from Neva Pinckney, widow, to the Borough of Allendale.

John Pinckney signed the articles of agreement at Eastchester in 1665, and contributed towards the support of a minister in 1674. His name appears on the assessment roll for 1675, at which time he owned "2horses, 8 cows, and 9 acors of land." In 1686 he was elected sipervisor of the town, and the same year he was appointed a resrepresentative. He was a grand juror in 1688 and again in 1695.<sup>1</sup>

John Pinckney was named in the 1694 will of his father-in-law, Thomas Hunt.

They were listed in the 1698 census for Eastchester: John Pinkne, abigail pinkne, sarah Pinkne, abigail Pinkne, mary pinkne, sisillea pinkne. On 31 Jan 1698, John Pinckney at Eastchester took the Oath of Allegiance to the King.<sup>1</sup>

John Pinckney and Abigail, his wife, sold land at Eastchester, bounded by "the meado of David Osburne, deceased," to Joseph Drake, on 27 Nov 1697 (Westchester Co. Deeds, Liber B:397). On 1 April 1701, John Pinckney confirmed a deed to Samuel Ferris and dis daughter, Sarah Pinckney, "now Samuel's wife." In this deed, John Pinckney mentions a meadow "which belonged to our father Philip Pinckney deceased." (*NYG&B Record*, LI:39-43)<sup>1</sup>

11 Dec 1699 -- John Pinkney of Eastchester, yeoman, and Abigail, his wife, "for a valuable consideration paid and to be paid by Samuel fferris and Sarah Pinkney his intended wife" deeded all house and home lots with orchard [etc.] in Eastchester, "their heirs forever at the decease of said John Pinkney and Abigail his wife." (Liber C, Westchester Co., Land Records at White Plains, p. 48)<sup>3</sup>

He was of Fairfield, CT by 1650; had a grant of land from the town, 14 Feb. 1666 [1666/7]. Sold to Nathan Gold, 13 Feb. 1669 [1669/70]; sold also to James Beers. He and his wife Jane were perhaps drawn to Fairfield by the marriage of their aunt, Mrs. Sarah Phippen, to George Hull. They rem. to Eastchester, N.Y.

Philip Pinckney's brother Henry Pinckney (a goldsmith in Fleet St.), died in 1678 and his will was dated in August 1678. In it he bequeaths: "My shop, plate jewels and all loose stones to my brother William, to my brother John £10; to my brother Philip now in New England £5, to my brother Thomas' son Philip £20, and his son Israel £10." Mention is made of "sister Brazier, sister Handady and my brother Brett. My body to be buried in St. Dunstan's Yarde."

Will 9 Jan. 1688/9, proved 28 Feb. 1688/9; son Thomas, Exec'r; sons John, William, Thomas, lands in Eastchester; unmarried daus., Elizabeth, Jean, Ann, Deborah, £10 each; daus. already married, 12 pence each.

Of the older married daus., one was Abigail who m. (1) (say 1670) David Osborn (d. 1679), and (2) -?-; another was Hannah who m. Thomas Pickering of Eastchester. The dau. Elizabeth m. by 1695, Daniel Burr, of Fairfield; and the dau. Jane m. by 1697 Moses Dimon, of Fairfield.

Philip Pinckney came from Fairfield, CT in 1664 and became one of the first ten proprietors or patentees of Eastchester, in Westchester County, NY. He originally probably came from the west of England with the Rev. John Warham and company, and was a lineal descendant of the Pinckneys of Tatterset, Pinckney Manor, Norfolk County, England. whose ancestor, Gilo de Pincken or Pinckenie, came to that country in the time of William the Conqueror.

Thomas Pinckney was elected a Justice in 1691, and again in 1698, and was always called "Justice Pinckney." He owned much land in Eastchester, some of which he obtained from his father, and some acquired through purchase. He had a pew in 1696 in St. Paul's Church in Eastchester (Episcopalian).<sup>1</sup>

They were listed in the 1698 census of Eastchester: Thomas pinkne, hana [pinkne], William [pinkne], hanna [pinkne], susanna [pinkne], Jean Pinkne. Thomas Pinckney gave his age as 48 in the census taken in Eastchester in 1710.<sup>1</sup>

In his will dated 16 Nov 1754, probated 6 March 1755, he wrote: I, William Pinkney, of East Chester, in the County of Westchester, being sick. I leave to my son Israel £5, "in full of his pretensions he may have to my estate as heir at law, I having already provided for him according to my ability." I leave to my grand daughter Mary, wife of Peter Vermillye, £10. To my daughter Sarah, wife of Caleb Hunt, I leave a negro boy, "Frank." My executors are to sell all the rest of my real estate at public vendue, and the money to be paid to my 5 daughters, Ithamer, wife of Joseph Conkling, Jane, wife of John Jones, Mary, wife of John Hunt, Sarah, wife of Caleb Hunt, and Jemima, wife of Israel Honeywell, Jr. After the death of my wife, my executors are to sell the real estate I have given her, and the money to be paid to my 5 daughters. I make my sons in law, Captain John Hunt and Israel Honeywell, Jr., executors. Dated November 16, 1751. Witnesses, Elisha Bartow, Isaac Lawrence, John Bartow. Proved, March 6, 1755.<sup>1</sup>
