The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Epenetus Platt joined his brother Isaac at Huntington, Suffolk County, Long Island, NY, before 12 May 1664 on which date the both became freemen of Connecticut, which then had jurisdiction over Huntington. He owned land at Huntington in 1666. On 30 November 1666 Gov. Nicholl required the inhabitants of Huntington to take out a patent of confirmation; the names of Isaac and Epenetus Platt appear as patentees. On 22 January 1672 Thomas Skidmore Sr., blacksmith, sold all his accommodation at Huntington -- his six acre home lot, house and shop, and eight acres of meadow on Santepauq Neck to Epenetus Platt. In 1681 Gov. Andrus imprisoned Isaac and Epenetus Platt and others for attending a meeting of delegates of the several towns to devise means to obtain "a redress of grievances under his arbitrary rule." After their release, a vote was

passed at a town meeting to cover their expenses.

On 4 August 1683 he was mentioned as son in the will of Richard Platt of Milford, receiving £20 and three Bibles for his children, plus £5 toward bringing up his son to be a scholar.

In 1688 when a new patent for Huntington was taken out, again both Isaac and Epenetus Platt were among the patentees. He was made Captain of a company of militia on 3 May 1689 in Suffolk County, Long Island, NY, was a Justice of the Peace, and held other offices of honor and trust.

His Will was written 1 Sep 1693 and proved 13 Nov 1693.

### **Elizabeth Smith**

He became very prominent. He was made a trustee of the town in 1699 and later served as its president. He represented Suffolk County at the Colonial Assembly from 1723 to 1737, and was a military officer and extensive landowner.

In his will, he wrote: ...January 17, 1741/2. I, Epenetus Platt, of Hunthuntington in Suffolk County, calling to mind the mortality of my body, I leave to my son, Epenetus Platt, during his natural life, all my lands at Dicks Hills and adjoining thereto, and all my lands and right of lands in the Eastern Purchases, both Crab meadow Purchase and Squaw Pit Purchase; Also a lot of fresh meadow on the East Neck lying between the Town Lots and the lots formerly belonging to Richard Brush, deceased; Also another lot of fresh meadow lying between the aforesaid Brushes lot and the lot of Samuel Brush; Also a lot of salt meadow lying between the lots of said Richard and Samuel Brush; Also a lot of salt meadow joining to the south side of the lot of Timothy Brush from the pond to the pond to the east creek. The above lots are all on the east side of the neck; Also a lot of upland lying near the middle of said neck of about 6 acres, which I bought of Jeremiah Wood, Robert Brush, and Thomas Brush; Also two £100 rights in the old Purchase with all privileges, And 1/3 of my rights on the South Beach. All these are to my son Epenetus for life, and then to his two sons, Solomon and Epenetus. I leave to my son Uriah Platt all my lands lying at or near Cold Spring which I bought of Benjamin Tead and Stephen Brush and John Rogers, with all lands laid out on my right joining thereto; Also a certain lot of land of 80 or 90 acres joining to the west side of the land of John Wood, "from the Sabbath Day path to the path near Joseph Wickes house;" Also a lot of 28 or 30 acres at the Hollow joining to the west side at the north side of the land of Joseph Wood; Also a lot containing 70 or 80 acres bounded north by the Sabbath Day path, east by the South path, partly by the highway, and part by land of Samuel Smith, west by land of John Wood, Jr.; Also all my land and meadow on a certain Neck commonly called Neguntatogue that is laid out south of the neck fence; Also 3 1/4 shares of the land north of said fence, yet to be divided; Also a small lot of land lying on the East Neck, being 1 acre, lying between the land of Nathaniel Ketcham and the west creek; Also a lot of salt meadow lying between the lot of the sons of Samuel Smith and of Thomas Brush; Also all my right in the Baiting Place Purchase; Also 1/3 of my right on the South Beach. I leave to my son Zophar Platt all my homestead lying between the lots of Isaac Brush and John Woolsey with all the privileges; Also all my land at or near the East Old Fields, both cleared and uncleared lying between Cow Harbor path at the highway on the north side of Joseph Smith's house; Also a lot of land joining to the south side of Eliakim Smith's lot; also all that my Hill Lots, orchard, and wood land, in all 22 or 24 acres; also two lots of wood land at the Hollow ponds, one on the east side of the path, and the other on the west side, containing 70 acres; Also a lot containing 20 or 30 acres lying on the west side of the path to the Long Swamp, and on the north side of the Sabbath Day path; Also about 80 or 90 acres of land lying joining to the south side of said path and on the east side of the South path; also all my lots of land and meadow of every kind lying on the East Neck not given to my other sons, And 1/3 of all my rights on the South Beach; Also two £100 rights in the Old Purchase of the Town with all privileges. I leave to my grand-children, that is to say, the children of Elizabeth, Uriah, Zophar, Epenetus, Phebe, and Mary, £5 each. I leave to my wife Elizabeth £100 and the use of 1/3 of all lands during her widowhood, which are given to my son Zophar; Also £15 a year. I leave to my 3 sons-in-law, Benjamin Tredwell, Micaiah Townsend, and Timothy Tredwell, to each £100, and they are all to give security for the payment of £5 yearly to my wife. I leave to Eliphalet Wickes, 5 shillings. I leave all my wearing apparell and guns to my 3 sons. Of all the rest of my estate I leave 1/3 to my

daughter Elizabeth Townsend, 1/3 to the 4 children of my daughter Phebe, and 1/3 to my daughter Mary Tredwell. I make Zophar Platt, Micaiah Townsend, and Timothy Tredwell, executors. Witnesses, Isaac Brush, Philip Platt, Adrian Bancker. Proved, August 31, 1745.

In his will, he wrote: ... Epenetus Platt, of Hempsted, in Queens County, and in the Province of New York, yeoman. My executors are to sell part of my personal estate such as they shall think most proper and sufficient to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses, and also the sum of £265 which I leave to my daughter Mary, which sum is equivalent to what I have already advanced to my daughter Sarah. I give equally between my two daughters, Mary and Sarah, one hundred acres of land laying on the east of my farm, running a north and south line through the same, to be equally divided between them, and also all the remainder of my personal estate (excepting my negro man Rodger, my desk and my watch, which I give to my son Epenetus) to be equally divided between my said daughters, and when my said son shall arrive to the age of twenty-one years, which legacies to my two daughters, or the profits therefrom, shall be left in the hands of my executors, for the bringing up and educating my said son in the study of either Law or "Physick," which he may choose, until he arrives at the age of twenty-one years. To my son Epenetus all the residue of my real estate, to be managed and improved to the best advantage by

my executors until he shall arrive to the age of twenty-one years, for maintaining and educating my said son as aforesaid. I make my brother, Phillip Smith Platt, Uriah Platt, my son-in-law, Thomas Applebee, executors (and my daughter, Mary Platt, executrix). Dated November 27, 1775. Witnesses, Isaac Smith, yeoman, Samuel Denton, James Cornwell, yeoman. Proved, March 1, 1777.

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He was of "Fauldringe." (aka "Bauldringe") The first mention of Gilbert Platt occurs 12th of February, 1635, when Elizabeth Parker, a widow, patented 200 acres at Varina within the County of Henrico. Of this land one hundred acres were due to her "in right of her first husband, William Sharpe, who was an ancient planter in the time of Sir Thomas Dale," and the remaining hundred for "the importation of two servants, Gilbert Platt and John Newman." Gilbert Platt thus came to Virginia in an exceedingly humble capacity; and concerning the first forty years of his stay in the Colony no record exists. But about 1660, at latest, he had risen somewhat in the world, and had married a woman well-to-do in her own right--Mary Tanner, the widow of Joseph Tanner of Henrico--and was appointed, 20th of August, 1677, the legal guardian of her four children, Joseph, Edward, Mary and Martha Tanner....Judging from Court records, there were strained relations between Gilbert and his wife and her Tanner children. Gilbert Platt deserted them and was discharged of his trusteeship of "Fauldinge" 1st of October, 1683, and Joseph Tanner was appointed in his place. Gilbert Platt appears to have spent the last years of his life, being then in very ill health, with his son-in-law, Edward Osborne of Henrico. It was at the residence of Edward Osborne that Gilbert Platt died in the spring of 1692. The will of Gilbert Platt aforesaid of "Fauldinge," in Henrico County, is recorded at Henrico Court-House; it is dated 10th April, 1691, and was recorded 1st June, 1692; and it is a laconic document. The testator bequeaths to his wife, Mary Platt, precisely one shilling. The legacy is eloquent. To the testator's daughter, Tabitha Osborne, is bequeathed "my bed and what is belonging to it." And for the rest it is to his son-in-law, Edward Osborne of Henrico, that



Gilbert Platt unconditionally bequeaths "everything else that properly belongs unto me, for and in consideration of his trouble and the care he hath taken of me in my sickness."<sup>1</sup>
