

-- POST, A-H --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Post

The progenitor of one of the Post families in Bergen and Passaic Counties was Adrian Post, who came to New Netherlands in 1650. The name "Pos" in Dutch means "seagull" or "gull."

Adriaaen Post, a pioneer settler of New Netherland, was from The Hague, South Holland.

Lodewyck Corneliszen Post, a pioneer settler of New Netherland, was from Amsterdam.

There also was a Long Island Post family, of English origin.

The following is an expansion of Nelson's work and includes some of Captian Adrian Post's ancestors.

THE EARLY POST FAMILY

The Dutch word for seagull is "pos" and this seems to have been the correct way of spelling the surname of this family. As to how and why they obtained this as a surname remains a mystery. At this time in the Netherlands only the nobility or people of special worth were given surnames. Because the Pos name is mentioned and kept for serval generations back, it is assumed that they were a family of particular worth. In the United States the name of this family name evolved to "Post". It appears that from the 13 th century they lived within the 20 mile area; Leiden, The Hague, Delft and Rotterdam.

The "Algemeen Nederlandsche Familieblad" a genealogical publication in Holland, year 1883, No. 23, contains proof of the connection from Claes Pieterse Post, magistrate of Leyden 1448 and Pieter's Adrian's Post who died in The Hague, 1637. That Captain Adrian Post was the son of Peter Adrian's Post who died in The Hague in 1637 is inferred only, from circumstances. Captain Adrian Post must have been born about 1600, and he came to America from The Hague. Moreover, according to Dutch custom, he was probably named after his grandfather, while the name Pieter appeared in his branch of the

Pos or Post family in America. However, as there is "many a slip of the lip" in genealogical forecasts as in other things, it must be accepted with the usual reservations until documentary proof of the connection is forthcoming. But regardless of the exact steps of descent, it is practically certain that Captain Adrian Post sprung through one channel or another from this old Leyden and Delft Post family and that the coat-of-arms borne by the Posts of Leyden would be the correct armor of this branch of the family in America.

There was another Post family living in New Amsterdam in the late 1600s. This was the family of Jan Jansen Post (or Postmael). He took the surname of Post because he was a letter carrier. His children were born in New York 1680-1688. This family is not related to the Captain Adrian Post who arrived in New Amsterdam in 1650. (Revised History of Harlem by James Riker, 1904, page 389.)

The first documented record is that of Gerrit Post born somewhere in the Netherlands about 1275. His son Peiter Post was born about 1300 and was a magistrate of Drecht, Holland in 1352, 3, 4 and 7. (Ref. Boitet, History of Delft.) There is another generation of Post here but the particulars are unknown at this time.

The records show a Pieter Post who was born about 1360-75. His son was Claes Post born about 1400 and was a magistrate of Leyden, Holland, as well as a member of the Vroedschap (the patricians of the city) 1448-49 (Ref. Orler's History of Leyden). Claes' son was Cornelius who was born in Leyden about 1430. His son was Pieter born about 1460 and married Styntje Joosten. both of them died in Rotterdam before 1518 leaving Adrian. Adrian was born about 1500 and was a member of the Orphan's court in Rotterdam, 1559. Pieter, Adrian's son died in the Hague in 1637 and he was the father of Captain Adrian Post who came to America in 1650. (The Genealogical Magazine of New Jersey, Volume X, No. 1 pages 1 & 2.)

The first Post that came to America was Adrian Crijnen (possibly Quirijen) Post who with his wife, Claartje (Clara) Mookers, and family first resided in the West India Company's colony in Recife, Brazil. Their daughter Maria was baptized there in 6 June 1649. (Dooptregister Der Hollanders in Brazilië 1633 - 1654, by C. J. Wasch, Genealogisch en Heraldisch Archief, 1889, p 30.) There was no record of any other Post children born in Brazil. However, there records of children born to a Geertrujt Mookers (possible relative). It is therefore assumed that either married Clara in Brazil or they did not stay in Brazil very long. By the time Brazil fell to the Portuguese, the family had left for the Netherlands.

Their son Adrian was born in the Hague, Netherlands. It is not known whether it was before or after their residence in Brazil. However, I would assume that it was after Brazil. While in Brazil, Adrian Post became acquainted with Alexander van der Capellen. It was van der Capellen who commissioned Adrian Post to lead a band of twenty people to colonize Staten Island in New Netherlands. On 30 June 1650 the ship New Netherlands's Fortune sailed from the Netherlands carrying Captain Adrian Post and his family (the records did not identify the members of the family). They arrived in New Netherlands on 19 December 1650. At this point of time the records refer to Adrian Post as Captain. It is assumed that the reason that he was in Brazil was soldering and he must have risen to the rank of Captain. Also in Brazil was a Frans Post who was one of the six artist employed by Johan Maurits (Governor of the Dutch Colony of Brazil). Frans was a well known landscape artist from Leiden (1612 - 80). Frans' brother was Pieter Post(1608 - 69) who was a celebrated architect who design The Hague.20

It is evident that in 1655 Adrian Post was located on Staten Island, as a representative of Baron Hendrick van der Capellen, the owner of one-third of Staten Island. Adrian carried it on with much success, so that in a few years there were one hundred or more persons in the settlement. He cultivated friendly relations with the Indians and familiarized himself with their language, an acquisition which was destined to be of much service to him at a most critical period in his career. As a result of the 1655 Peach Tree Indian War which broke out over Hendrick Van Dyke's shooting of a Native woman stealing peaches from his tree in Bergen, the settlements on the lower North (Hudson) river and around New Amsterdam (New York) were distorted by Iroquois attackers.

The flourishing colony did not escape in the general attack made by the Indians upon the whites, and on the night of 15 September 1655, the colony on Staten Island was burned to the ground by the Natives from Hackensack. Twenty-three persons were killed on Staten Island, and sixty-seven were taken prisoners, among being Captain Post, with his wife, five children (Adrian, Maria, Lysbeth, and two unknown children) and a servant girl. (N.Y. Col Docs, XII, 98)

A pleasant illustration of the confidence the Indians had in his integrity is the fact that in Oct. 1655 the Hackensack Chief, Pennekeck, sent Captain Post with fourteen of his fellow prisoners over to New Amsterdam to ask the Director-General for powder and lead in exchange for these captives. Captain Post made the journey between New Amdersdam and the Native headquarters at Paulus Hook, Bergen, several times before an agreement was reached. On 21 October fifty-six captives were released in exchange for powder, lead, guns, blankets and wampum. Among those freed were Adrian's wife and children. He had another conference with the Hackensack Chiefs, Pennekeck and Oratamy, on October 26, and would seem to have been successful in securing the release of all prisoners after a time. (N.Y. Hist MSS, I, 153; N.Y. Col. Docs., XII.,46,47,48.)

Upon effecting his own exchange, the faithful superintendent returned to Staten Island and hunted the few head of cattle left, but owing to the complete destruction of the crops, buildings and other property, most of the cattle had died, and he was obliged to sell others to obtain means to maintain his wife and children. (N.Y. Col. Docs, XIII.,206.)

When Van der Capellen heard of the great havoc made by the Indians in his colony, he instructed Captain Post to gather together the survivors and to erect a fort on the Island and also to keep the people provisioned. This, however, was impracticable, as the Captain with his starving family during the ensuing winter were obliged to camp out under the bleak sky without any protection or means of defense. The authorities recognized the insurmountable difficulties in the way of protecting the colony, and decided to withdraw the soldiers and abandon him to his fate unless he would remove with his people and his patron's cattle to Long Island. (N.Y. Col. Doc.,XIII, 60-1.) The creditors of Van der Capelle, seeing the desperate condition of the colony, he began to harass Post for the payment of the Baron's debts, and suit was brought by Jacob Schellinger and others against him as agent for the Baron for payment of a note; and Janneke Melyn claimed as hers some of the few cattle still in Post's possession. (Cal. N.Y. Hist MSS I., 164.)

Under his accumulating hardships and exposures and harassments, Post fell sick, and in the following April his wife was constrained to petition the authorities for a postponement of the suit brought by Schellinger, and to urge that the soldiers

might be allowed to remain for the present on Staten Island. The soldiers who had escorted her to New Amsterdam were directed to return with her to Staten Island, but they become tired of their exposure on that desolate spot, and declared they would not accompany her. (Cal. N.Y. Hist. MSS., I., 165.) Direck van Schelluyne, for and on behalf of Madam Post, in view of her husband's continued illness, petitioned on 27 April 1656 the Director-General and Council at New Amsterdam to send an armed force to the Island for the protection of the rights of Baron van der Capelle de Ryssel, Patroon of that place, and for somebody else to take care of the property during Captain Post illness. The authorities, however, insisted that there was nothing on the Island worth preserving but the cattle, which ought to be removed to Long Island, and as the population consisted of only six or seven persons (Captain Post, his wife, five children, one male and one female servant), it would be folly to send a garrison for their protection. The armed force was accordingly refused. (Cal. N.Y. Hist. MSS., I.165,166,638.) On 20 July 1656, Schellinger recovered judgment against Post on a note signed by Cornelius Melyn and others, claiming to be agents of Baron van der Capelle. (N.Y. Col. Docs.,XII., 170.)

The attempt at colonizing Staten Island by individual enterprise having failed, the Island was purchased by the West India Company, to whom nineteen persons presented a petition, August 22, 1661, for tracts of land on the south side, in order to establish a village, which was allowed by the Company, Captain Post being one of the grantees. (N.Y. Col. Docs.,XIII., 206) It is probable, however, that he did not avail himself of the grant, but removed to Bergen (now Jersey City, N.J.) about this time, if, indeed, he was not already a resident there. In 1662, he was one of petitioners to have a clergyman settled at Bergen, and promised to contribute twenty florins therefore yearly. (N.Y. Col Docs MSS XIII.,233.)

Under date of December 28, 1662, he with others, petitioned the Director-General and the Council to protect the inhabitants of Bergen and Communipaw against the attempts of various individuals to fence in the common lands, (N.Y. Col Docs, XIII,235) and on January 4, 1663, he and two others selected by their neighbors for the purpose, appeared before the Council to support this petition. (N.Y. Col Docs, XIII, 235) Under the date of June 30,1663, upon the nomination of his neighbors, he was confirmed as ensign for the village of Bergen. (N.Y. Col Docs, XIII, 268) On August 30,1663, he petitioned for a grant of some low lands at Bergen, and surveys thereof were ordered to be made. (N.Y. Col Docs, XIII,294)

On 22 November 1665 Adrian Post took the oath of allegiance to the King as an ensign in the Bergen Burgher Guard. In May 1666 New Jersey governor Philip Carteret asked Adrian to be the interpreter at a meeting with the sachem Oraton to discuss a proposed land purchase. Post received from Governor Philip Carteret, 12 May 1668, a patent for fifty-five acres of land about Bergen (Hudson Co L.T., p 81), being probably the same tract which he had received from the Dutch authorities.

According to Charles Winfield's "History of Land Titles of Hudson County" as of 12 May 1668 Adrian Post owned the following parcels of land:

- Lot 100 Village of Bergen probably main residence (now the corner of Tonnele Avenue and Van Rypen Place)
- Lot 35, 21 1/3 acres (now from Tonnele Avenue to JFK Boulevard)
- Lot 48, 7 acres (on what is now Montgomery street)
- Lot 55, 9 1/2 acres (now from Westside avenue to Bergen avenue about 100 feet north of Communipaw avenue)
- Lot 117, 21 acres

On May 18, 1671, we find him sworn on a jury to serve at a special Admiralty court at Elizabethtown. (N.J. Archives, I.66) On 7 June 1673 Adrian was elected one of Bergen's two representatives to the New Jersey General Assembly. On September 4, 1673, when the Dutch reoccupied New Jersey as part of New Netherlands, the Council of War appointed Post ensign for Bergen. (N.Y. Col Docs, II, 597) This does not seem to have affected his standing with the English, for after they recovered possession of New Jersey and New York, Post was commissioned, July 16, 1675, Lieutenant of the militia at Bergen. (E.J.Deeds, Libre 3,f.117) His adventurous life ended at Bergen, February 28, 1677. During his lifetime, Captain Post had executed two mortgages upon his estate, moveable and immovable, October 17, 1662 and May 9, 1662, for twenty-nine thousand six hundred and fifty-six guilders, to Cornelius Steenwick, an eminent merchant of New York. His family were unable to pay these obligations, and he having died intestate on 28 February 1677, they declined to administer, whereupon Governor Carteret appointed Steenwick administrator of his estate. (E.J.Deeds, Libre 3f, 133)

Adrian Post son of Captain Adrian Post through the urging of the Michielson (later known as Vreeland) brothers (Elias, Hartman, Johannes and Cornelius) and Jacob Stoffelson purchased along with others in 1679 an Indian deed from "Captaham, Indian Chief and Sachem", for the lands beginning from the Northwest bounds of the town of Newark, from the lowermost parts thereof to the uppermost, as fare at the steepe rock or mountains, and from thence to run (blank) all long, the said Pisawyck river to the white oak tree standing neere the said river on the northside of the small brook, and thence to run up to the steep rocks or mountains. Which said tree was marked by said Captahem in the presence of La Prarie, Surveyor General.

On 25 March 1684 the Lord Proprietors of the Province of East New Jersey granted the Acquackanonk Patent based on this Indian deed. This tract of land included what is now Passaic City, Clifton City and the greater portion of Paterson City in the state of New Jersey. This tract of land was approximately 5,520 acres. There were many (at least five) major divisions of the Patent of Acquackanonk on different occasions.²²

The Patentees divided the Patent into twenty-eight farms. Just how the division of the Patent was accomplished is unknown. From the earliest settlement of the Posts at Acquackanonk they appear to have been a family of millers; in every generation wherever there was a stream capable of affording water power, there was a Post with a gist mill or a saw mill or both. Thier mills were on the Passaic river, from Third river to Signac; also on every considerable stream flowing into the Passaic - the Wesel or Vreeland Brook, from the Notch to the river; the Peckamin river, the Pequannock, the Wanaque and the Ramapo. --Information online 15 January 1998 from BCSS08A@prodigy.com (MR JOHN A MOLLER)

POST - ADRIAN POST was the pioneer of this family, and he arrived in this country from the Hague, Holland, in 1650, and settled in Communipaw. He was very prominent in public affairs in Staten Island till 1655 and then settled in New Jersey. He was elected ensign of the first militia company, under Captain Caspar Steynmets. His son Adrian married, in 1677, Catrintje Gerrits, daughter of Gerrit Gerritsen (Van Wagenen). The other sons went out to Acquackanonck, and the numerous families of that name in Bergen and Passaic Counties are descended from these. The Post homestead site on the shores of New York

Bay is still occupied as a home, in which, until very recent years, resided a lineal descendant of one of Bergen's First Settlers.

Aaron Post, 46 (or 40?), machinist, b. NJ, and Mary A. Post, 42, b. NJ, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in the Township of Paterson, Passaic County, NJ. Listed living with them were: Emeline Post, 12, b. NJ; Wm. H. Post, 10, b. NJ; and Elizabeth Post, 8, b. NJ; Mary Post, 5, b. NJ; and Louisa Post, 3, b. NJ.

They were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, New York, Chautauqua Co., Dunkirk, p. 112-113, enumerated 6 July 1860, Dwelling 894, Family 860 (all b. NJ) -- Aaron Post, 50, machinist, value personal estate \$500; Mary [Post], 52; Emma [Post], 22, School Teacher; William [Post], 21, Fireman R.R.; Elizabeth [Post], 18; Mary Post, 15; Louisa [Post], 13.

She was listed in the 1880 Federal Census, New York, Chautauqua Co., Dunkirk, District 046, p. 25, enumerated 10 June 1880, Dwelling 199, Family 200 (all b. NJ, all their parents b. NJ or NY except as noted) -- Post, Mrs. Mary A., 71, Widow, Keeping House; [Post], Emma, 40, Daughter, Single, Teacher; [Post], Libby A., 35, Daughter, Single, Teacher; [Post], Mary, 32, Daughter, Single; [Post], Louisa, 30, Daughter, Single, Clerk in Store; Neuwiner, Minnie, 20, Single, Servant, b. NY, her parents b. NY.

Abraham Postmael returned from Kingston to Harlem, NY and became a farmer for Captain DeKey in 1701. In 1709 he was a witness in a suit to which DeKey was a party, and at that time used the name Post. He married , probably as early as 1704, Elizabeth Van Dans---, whose correct family name is not known. On 24 Oct 1708 at Kingston, they were sponsors at the baptism of Abraham, third child of his brother Jan Post, Junior and Cornelia Isselsteen, and a torn page in the record leaves the name Van Dans--- incomplete. It possibly could be Van Dansich, signifying "from Danzig," as mentioned in the Passenger Lists under date of 20 Jan 1664, but found in no other early record as a family name.^{2,4}

Abraham and Elizabeth had no children baptized at New York, Kingston or Tarrytown. Although he was at Harlem as late as 1709, they are thought to have lived on the Manor of Fordham in what is now Bronx County. There an early Dutch Reformed Church had been organized in 1696. The church building was erected in 1706 and functioned until shortly before the Revolutionary War. After years of inactivity the congregation was reorganized in 1802, but the earlier records are not extant. The definite records for this family, based on the assumption that they lived within the jurisdiction of this church and attended it, are therefore missing. This seems to be the only explanation for the fact that no baptismal records have been found at New York or elsewhere.²

Abraham Post was a witness to the 15 June 1710 (probated 1723) will of Anthony Brockholst of Pompton, Bergen County in the Province of East New Jersey. Brockholst had been Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New York.³

Riker, page 389, states that Abraham was believed to be the ancestor of the Post family in Westchester County. The lines that remained there are also not substantiated by dates in this particular early period. The names of Abraham and Elizabeth, however, were perpetuated in the known grandchildren. The names of other children, if any, are unknown.²

Abraham Post for whom extant records are almost completely lacking, died at an unknown date and without a recorded estate. The following children are assumed.

Abraham's father, Jacob Post bought in 1765 a 90-acre farm at what is now Palisades, Rockland County, NY from James Lawrence. This farm he bequeathed to his son, Abraham, whose descendants still lived on the land in 1968. Jacob Post, Sen., of Yonkers, Westchester Co., N.Y., in his will dated 2 April 1771, probated 23 May 1771. Mentioned To son Abraham, a small tract of land in Rockland in Orange County, which land he now lives on.

Bolton gives the name of Abraham's wife as Rebecca Merrill.

Rebecca Grace (Gracey) was bp. 8 March 1775 at Tappan Ref Ch, Tappan, NY (as an adult) at the same time as her children.

Abraham Post served in the Revolution as a soldier in the 2nd Regiment of Orange Co., NY. He served for the duration of the war, when needed, under command of Col. A. Hawk Hay, Capt. Henry Tenure, Lieut. Walter Van Orden, Ensign John Myers and Orderly Sgt. John Acker. He hired Peter Smith to serve as a substitute for him for one month in April 1779. He applied for a Rev. War Soldier's pension 23 March 1835 in Bergen County, NJ; he was aged about 93 on 2 Jan 1835. He testified that he was born 1 Jan 1742 in Bergen County, NJ and later moved to Rockland, where he lived during the Revolutionary War. Afterward he moved to Franklin Township, NJ and then to West Milford Township. Abraham Post signed with power of attorney as heir of the deceased soldier.

Abraham Post moved to the Newfoundland area by 1808.¹ Abraham Post Sr. purchased land in Passaic County from John Kenner on 1 May 1808 and from Leml Cobb on 21 Feb 1815. These purchases were cited in later transactions (Passaic Deeds, Book F, pp. 302-310) involving his sons, John A. Post (of Franklin Township); and Abraham A. Post, Peter A. Post, and Jacob A. Post (of West Milford).³

According to his will, dated 6 Jan 1837, probated 8 April 1837, Abraham Post was of West Milford, NJ when he died.

Abraham named his children in his will: John; Abraham Jr.; Peter; Jacob A.; Sarah Eckhart; Hannah Nelson; Catharine Crouter; Maria Hawry; and Jane Davenport; and his daughter-in-law, Saphrona Post. Witnesses were G. V. Dien Junior, Robert Rutan, John B. Van Dien, and James Van Orden. Executors were Abraham Post Jr. and Jacob A. Post.

The four sons of Abraham (John, Abraham, Peter and Jacob) exchanged deeds on May 7, 1842 recorded in book F, pages 302 -307 at Paterson, for the lands they had inherited by the will.

Cornelis Melyn was preparing to return to New Netherland and on 18 May 1650 bought the ship *New Netherlands Fortune*, (Nieu Nederlants Fortuyn) which he equipped under the leadership of Captain Post. The ship sailed on 30 Jun 1650. Both Adriaen And Lodewyck Post were on this ship. No relationship has been proven, Adriaen from The Hague, Lodewyck from Amsterdam.³

Adrian Post came to New Netherlands in 1650 (sailing on the *New Netherland's Fortune*, sailing from the Netherlands on 30 June 1650 and arriving in New Netherland 19 Dec 1650¹) with his wife Clara, and five children, as an agent for Baron Von der Capellen, in charge of his colony on Staten Island. Adriaen was from The Hague, Netherlands. He and his wife Clara had resided in the West India Company's colony in Recife, Brazil before returning, after June 1649, to the Netherlands. Adriaen Post was, with his family, on Staten Island by 1655; later (by 1662) Post was one of the founders of a colony at Bergen, NJ.

Adrian settled in Communipaw. Communipaw was a tract of land Michael Paauw, Lord of Achttienhoven caused to be purchased for him from the Indians (the tract on which Hoboken now stands and also Ahasymus and the entire land stretching to the Kill Van Kull) and on Aug 10th 1630 had also acquired Staten Island. The entire Tract was called Pavonia.³

Adrian Post was very active in politics of Staten Island. He was the progenitor of the Post families of Bergen, Essex, and Passaic Counties, NJ and of Orange and Richmond Counties NY. When he removed from Staten Island NY to Bergen NJ, His son Adriaen remained (in Old Bergen) and his other sons went to acquackonk, (Bergen & Passaic).³

In the summer of 1655 the Peach Tree War began over Hendrick Van Dyke's shooting of a Native woman stealing peaches from his tree in his orchard in Manhattan. As a result, the settlements on the lower Hudson River and around New York were

destroyed by Iroquois attackers. Capt. Adrian Post, his wife, five children, one servant and one girl, were saved, but captured in an Indian raid on New Amsterdam 15 Sep 1655 (23 people were killed and 67 taken prisoner)¹. Post afterward acted for the Dutch government in redeeming captives taken by the Indians.

He settled in Bergen. There he was ensign 30 June 1663; and ensign of the Bergen Burgher Guard 22 Nov 1665 when he took an oath of allegiance to the King; representative 10 June 1673, the first prison-keeper in East Jersey 19 July 1673 (the prison was in the home of Capt. John Berry) and lieutenant 15 July 1675.

An erroneous assumption that Adrian Post's father was Pieter Post seems to have begun with a speculative article in the New Jersey Genealogical Magazine of Jan. 1935 which the author himself, Mr. De Young, indicated was only a theory.¹

On 7 April 1677, Bergen, NJ, Administration on the estate of Captain Adrian Post was granted to Cornelius Steenwyck of New York.

Cornelius H. Post was a Private in the NJ Militia in the Revolutionary War. He applied for a Revolutionary War Pension (No. S29389) at Bergen County, NJ Common Pleas Court 25 March 1834, when he was age 72, a resident of Franklin Township. He testified that he was b. 1761 and his birth was recorded at Acquackanonk Ref Dutch Ch; he served under Lts. Abraham Post and Ryer Ryerson; he served as a substitute for his brother Aaron H. Post. He testified that the British had possession of Brouwer's Hill, near Hackensack; he guarded prisoners at the Log Jail near Ramapough; he was stationed at Slotterdam and quartered horses at the house of Cornelius Van Houten. In 1827 he moved to Parma, Monroe County, NY to be with sons [not named]. In 1834 he returned to Bergen County. On 1 March 1836 he was living in Wayne Co., MI. Others mentioned in the pension papers were: Abraham Garrison, Rev. Wilhelmus Eltinge, of Saddle River; Albert [G?] Lydecker, of Franklin Twp. Testifying as fellow soldiers in the Revolutin, John H. Post, age 75, of Essex Co., NJ and brother of Cornelius H. Post; John S. Bertholf, age 73; both on 22 Feb 1834; John Packer, age 73, Thomas Hammond, age 83, both of Franklin Township, Bergen Co., NJ as of 24 March 1834.¹

When Cornelius H. Post testified (prob. in the 1830-40s) as to the marriage date and place of his brother John Post and Elizabeth Ackerman, he (Cornelius) made the statement in Wayne County, Michigan.

Elias Post was probably a young child when his father emigrated to America. He resided on Broadway in New Amsterdam and his wife Marritie Cornelis was admitted to the New York Dutch Church, May 31, 1677. Some time after 1686 it appears he removed to the upstate district as on April 18, 1738 his name appears in connection with furnishing provisions for the gar-

rierson at Oswego, and on April 12, 1734, and Elias Post was admitted to membership of the Reformed Dutch Church of Schenectady.

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Fredericus Post refused or neglected to sign the Haverstraw Patriot Association on 11 July 1775, along with John Post, Isaac Post, Abraham Post and John Post, Jr. Frederick, Isaac and Abraham Post enlisted 3 Jan 1777 in the Kings Orange Rangers together and served in Camp Haarlem and Fort Kniphausen (Fort Washington), just across the river in New York.

Frederick Post was found on Tax Ratables Lists for 1789, 1792, 1794 and 1794, in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ.

Frederick Post was in Fredericksburgh Township, Midland District, Upper Canada (later known as Lennox & Addington Township, Ontario) by 1795, where on 9 June 1795 he purchased one hundred acres of land from John Hart for an unspecified amount. The document reads as follows - "I, John Hart of Fredericksburgh do hereby make over to Frederick Post all my right and title forever to the within one hundred acres of Land and have received the value thereof as witness by my hand this 9 Day of June 1795". This document is witnessed by James Forshee, Jacob Tice and Alex Clark. An accompanying document showing John Hart originally bought the property from Michael Bartley identifies the property as "Lot #1 in the additional in the third township (Fredericksburgh) in the ___ Concession".

His children all petitioned for land as the sons and daughters of Frederick Post, United Empire Loyalist.¹ On 23 May 1797, John Post, Frederick's oldest son, petitioned for 200 acres of land as the "son of Frederick Post, late private soldier in Colonel Bayard's Regiment of His Majesty's Forces in New York." This document is signed by John Post in Fredericksburgh Township and it is interesting to note that he could sign his name. This document proves the relationship between Frederick Post and John Post and also proves that Frederick Post was definitely a United Empire Loyalist.

The March, 1808 Fredericksburgh Township Assessment Roll shows Frederick Post as having 100 acres of land, 65 acres uncultivated and 35 acres cultivated, living in a round log house and owning 2 horses and 4 head of cattle.

The name of Frederick Post appears on a Militia Census for Fredericksburgh Township, dated 3 December 1813. This census states "A return of the Inhabitants who have teams of Horses and Oxen with the limits of my District." Frederick Post and his son Jacob Post are shown as living in Concession 4 and each owning one team of horses.

His obituary notice, from the 5 July 1907 edition of the *Galesburg Evening Mail* reads: "Garret I. Post is Dead — His death removes one of our Oldest Citizens — Garret I. Post died Wednesday afternoon at the family residence in this city after several years of illness, at the ripe old age of 81, and with his passing marks the death of one of our oldest citizens and one of the most beautiful characters, always having had a cheerful word for everyone and seldom, if ever, known to be in a bad temper. He was always an honest and law abiding citizen, a good neighbor and friend. The deceased was born in what is now known as Clifton, NJ, October 24, 1824, where he lived until 1874, when he moved to Illinois. He was married in Clifton in 1846 to Miss Eliza Ann Post, and to this union four children were born, three girls, and one boy, two of whom are deceased. The others are Aaron Post of Newark, NJ and Mrs Mary D Garrabrant of Paterson, NJ. His first wife died in ... On March 2,

1872, he was married to Lucretia C Williams of Caldwell, NJ who survived him. To this union there were no children. He was a member of the G.A.R. having served in the 25th N.J. Infantry during the Civil War. The funeral was held this after[noon] at 3 o'clock from the family residence. Interment in Bushnell Cemetery. He has been a great sufferer for several years, but the immediate cause of his death was complications of kidney and other diseases."²

His death notice from the July 10, 1907 edition of the newspaper *Democrat*, probably from Bushnell, IL, reads: "Death of Garret Post -- Garret I Post died Wednesday afternoon, July 3, at his home in this city after an illness of several months. The funeral services were conducted from the residence Friday afternoon, July 5, by Rev. J.W. Ferris, of the Methodist Church, assisted by Rev. H. Ellerbech and under the auspices of the G.A.R. The Interment was in the Bushnell cemetery. Garret Post was born in Clifton, NJ, October 25, 1825. He was the last of a family of seven children, one brother and five sisters having proceeded him to the great beyond. September 1, 1862 he was mustered into the service of his country and served faithfully, being honorably discharged. He was a member of Co. H, 25th Reg., New Jersey volunteers. Mr Post is survived by one son, Aaron Post, of Newark, NJ and one daughter, Mrs Mary D Garrabrant, of Paterson, NJ, and his wife Lucretia Post of this city. Mr. Post was an honest and law-abiding citizen, a good neighbor and friend. To the widow and children the Democrat tenders its sympathy in their bereavement."

In the M. A. Zabriskie memorandum book entry of their m., he is from Saddle River and she from Chestnut Ridge. His gravestone says he was a veteran of the Civil War.

George W. Post ran a turning mill which stood near Bear Brook at the sharp bend in Glen Road. He made turned parts of furniture and also the first lamp posts used in Park Ridge. The mill existed before 1861.³

My son Abraham is to pay to my son John £25; To my daughters, Magdalen and Elizabeth, £25 each; To my son William £25, and to my daughter Rebecca £25, and to my sons, Hendrick and Tunis, £50 each. I make my wife and my friend, William Nagel, executors. Dated July 5, 1769. Witnesses, Jan Nagel, Henry Odle [Odell], John Cregier. Proved, November 22, 1769.)²

Riker's *History of Harlem*, pp. 614-615 states that son-in-law Henry Tison, and sons Hendrick and Dennis inherited land at Kingsbridge by the will of their uncle, William Nagel, dated 31 Aug 1806. He also left legacies to nephew and niece, Abraham and Lena Post.

Rebecca Post, widow of Hendrick Post, was mentioned in the will dated 6 Jan 1786, probated 8 Aug 1786 of her brother, John Nagel, yeoman, of New York County, New York. He also mentioned a bond against the said Hendrick Post and Abraham Post dated 6 April 1774; and mentioned niece Elizabeth Post, dau. of Hendrick Post.³
